Marquette, Mich., January 7th, 1907.

A regular session of the common council was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the mayor, the Hon. Rush Culver.

Present-Aldermen Asire, Bush, Cadarette, Campbell, Corbett, Donovan, Ekstrom, Gray, Gustafson, Jenks, McCarthy, Reichel, Shea and Siegel-14.

The record of the session of December 20th, 1906, approved.

The petition of Johnson & Peterson, requesting that they be allowed \$101.25, for balance claimed due them on contract for the construction of sewer in Bluff street, between Third and Fourth streets, was presented and referred to the committee on claims and litigation.

The petition of Thomas Price, janitor of City Hall, requesting that his salary be \$70.00 per month instead of \$60.00 as heretofore, was presented and referred to the committee on purchases, salaries and wages.

The petition of W.G. King and 429 others, requesting the council to incorporate in resolution relative to charter revision, that the offices of marshal and controller be elective instead of appointive, said offices to be filled by the qualified electors of the city, and protesting against the creation of a board of public works, or any other new board or boards, which shall become a part of the city government, was presented and referred to the special committee on charter revision.

A communication from the Light and Power Commission, together with amendments to the law under which said commission is organized, requesting the consideration and approval of the council of said amendments, was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation.

The monthly reports of the justices of the peace were presented and ordered placed on file.

On motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Jenks, the council accepted the grading, curbing and macadamizing of Blemhuber avenue, from west line of Champion street to west line of Division street.

The committee on purchases, salaries and wages recommended that the salary of Thomas Price, janitor at City Hall, be \$70.00 per month, from January 1st, 1907, to May 1st, 1907.

On motion of Alderman Bush, supported by Alderman Siegel, said recommendation was adopted.

Whereas, claims have recently been made and circulated that a fever, epidemic exists in our city, ~~by~~ due to the condition of our drinking water, and whereas the city health officer has made an investigation of the matter and found that no more than the usual number of cases can be found, and whereas the water board has ~~since~~ had many tests of said water made by the highest authority in such matters and found that said water is free from dangerous germs and perfectly safe as drinking water,

THEREFORE be it resolved by the common council of the city of Marquette that the persons circulating such reports are hereby ~~requested~~ earnestly requested to desist in the continuance of the same, as such reports tend to give our city ill-repute and are harmful to its business interests.

The record of the session of January 7th, approved.

The petition of C.L.Brainerd and 81 others, requesting the council to incorporate in resolution relative to charter revision, that the offices of marshal and controller be elective instead of appointive, said offices to be filled by the qualified electors of the city, and protesting against the creation of a board of public works, or any other new board or boards, which shall become a part of the city government, was presented and referred to the special committee on charter revision.

The committee on finance and taxation, recommended that the amendments to the law under which the Light and Power Commission is organized, be approved.

On motion of Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman Jenks, said recommendation was unanimously adopted.

Your committee therefore recommends that the claim be rejected and disallowed.

Resolved, That it is the judgment of this body that the act incorporating the Board of Fire and Water Commissioners should be amended by the legislature now in session, so that said board may be authorized by the vote of the qualified electors of this city to borrow upon the credit of the city such sums of money it may need from time to time, such sums not to exceed ^{ninety}~~seventy~~-five thousand dollars in addition to the present outstanding bonds of said board.

Resolved, That a warrant for \$18.95 be drawn on the general fund in favor of the First Baptist Church, for rebate to said church of one-half the cost of construction of concrete sidewalk on Special Concrete Sidewalk Assessment Roll No. 7.

HON. MAYOR & COMMON COUNCIL

OF THE CITY OF MARQUETTE:

The Board of Police Commissioners of the City of Marquette would respectfully report that it has organized and assumed the duties imposed upon it by the City Charter.

The Board would further report that it has determined upon the following police force: One Marshal, one Deputy Marshal and six Patrolmen, to be known as Policemen.

The Board would further respectfully report for your favorable consideration and concurrence the following salaries for the members of the police force: Marshal, Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per month; Deputy Marshal, Sixty-five Dollars (\$65.00) per month; Day Patrolmen, Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) per month; Night Patrolmen, Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) per month.

The Board would respectfully suggest to the Council that prior to the annual budget required by the Charter to be submitted to your Honorable Body by this Board in the month of June, it will be necessary to pay three months' salaries to the police force, which on the above basis will amount to fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00); and the Board will require printing and other supplies necessary for the proper conduct of the business of the Board to the amount of at least two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) more. Therefore the Board respectfully suggests that the Council appropriate the sum of seventeen hundred fifty dollars (\$1750.00) for a police fund, to be available to meet the needs of the Board.

Alderman Reichel, present, not voting.

The petition of W.D.Healy requesting the use of the city rock crusher, was presented and referred to the park, cemetery and street commission.

Copy of resolution adopted by the common council of Lansing, Mich., recommending the amendment of the Public Acts of 1905 and 1899, relative to the use of the highways and streets for electric lighting, heating and power, wires and poles, etc., was presented and referred to the park, cemetery and street commission.

The following was presented:

Moved by Alderman Bush, supported by Alderman Asire, and carried, that the council concur in the salaries recommended by said commission for the members of the police force.

Moved by Alderman Bush, supported by Alderman Asire, and carried, that \$1750.00 be transferred from the general fund to the police fund.

The report of the Indiana Audit Company of an audit made by them of the books, records and accounts of the city for a period of six years ending March 12, 1907, was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman Ekstrom, ^{400 copies of} said report was ordered printed, ~~printed~~.

Communications from the U.S. Standard Voting Machine Co., and the Abbott Voting Machine Co., relative to their respective voting machines were read.

The petition of F.J. Schultheis and 250 others, requesting that the Abbott Voting Machines be used for the entire election, including city and state tickets, was presented.

Moved by Alderman Donovan, supported by Alderman Siegel, and carried, that the resolution adopted March 4th, 1907, relative to the use of voting machines at the election to be held April 1st, 1907, be rescinded in so far as it requires the use of machines for balloting on city and ward officers, and that the paper ballots be used for voting on city and ward officers.
