Pursuant to Section one of Chapter V of the charter, a session of the common council was held in the recorder's office, and was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the recorder, in the absence of the mayor, the Hon. Rush Culver.

Present—Aldermen Asire, Campbell, Corbett, Donovan, Downey, Ekstrom, Jenks, Peters, Reichel and Siegel-10.

Moved by Alderman Donovan, supported by Alderman Siegel, and carried, that Alderman Asire, be chairman of this session.

Alderman Asire thereupon took the chair.

The recorder presented and read the petition of Edward J. McCarthy for a recount of the ballots cast in the Second and Fourth Wards on the office of recorder, which petition was filed with the recorder at 2 o'clock p.m., April 4th, 1907.

The chairman inquired of the recorder if any proof of ~~service of notice~~ service of notice of said petition upon Daniel S. Donovan, the opposing candidate, had been filed; and the recorder announced that no such proof of service had been filed.

On motion of Alderman Siegel, supported by Alderman Donovan, the following was adopted:

Resolution by Alderman Reichel:

Marquette, Mich., April 29th, 1907.

An adjourned regular session of the common council was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the mayor, the Hon. John Robertson.

Present—Aldermen Asire, Campbell, Corbett, Donovan, Downey, Ekstrom, McCarthy, Peters, Reichel, Schauer, Siegel and Williams-12.

The record of the session of April 15th, approved.

A communication from the Board of Police Commissioners recommending that the salary of Policeman Dennis Hogan be \$65 per month, as formerly, and requesting that the council concur in same was presented.

Moved by Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman McCarthy, and carried, that the council concur in said recommendation and that the salary of Policeman Dennis Hogan be \$65 per month.

The committee on ordinances and rules presented for adoption an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance relative to the use of city property by the Park, Cemetery and Street Commission of the city of Marquette."

Moved by Alderman Corbett, supported by Alderman Asire, and carried, that the rules be suspended and that said ordinance be put upon its immediate passage. Said ordinance was, on motion of Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman Siegel, adopted by the following vote:

Yeas—Aldermen Asire, Campbell, Corbett, Donovan, Downey, Ekstrom, McCarthy, Schauer, Siegel and Williams-10.

Nays—Aldermen Peters and Reichel-2.

President Sherman of the Light and Power Commission and President Shea of the Park, Cemetery and Street Commission appeared before the council and advocated the improvement of the road, from Holy Cross Cemetery to the electric light plant, and submitted profile of same, and stated that the estimated cost of said improvement would be about \$6,000. Said matter was referred to the committee on parks, cemeteries, streets and sewers.

On motion of Alderman Williams, supported by Alderman Siegel, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Marquette, Mich., May 6th, 1907.

A regular session of the common council was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the mayor, the Hon. John Robertson.

Present-Aldermen Asire, Campbell, Corbett, Donovan, Downey, Ekstrom, McCarthy, Peters, Reichel, Schauer, Siegel and Williams-12.

The records of the sessions of April 22nd, 29th and 30th, approved.

The following was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation:

#1.

The petition of Johnson & Peterson, requesting that they be paid \$101.25, for balance claimed due them on contract for the construction of a sewer in Bluff street, between Third and Fourth streets, was presented.

Moved by Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman Peters, and carried, that said matter be laid on the table.

Yeas-Aldermen Asire, Corbett, Donovan, Downey, McCarthy, Peters, Reichel, Schauer, Siegel and Williams-10.

Nays-Aldermen Campbell and Ekstrom-2.

The petition of J.H.Lewis and 18 others, requesting that a committee of the common council be appointed to make a canvass of the business men and citizens in regard to a Fourth of July celebration this year was presented. The mayor appointed Aldermen Downey, Siegel and Schauer as a special committee to confer with the business men and citizens relative to said celebration.

The petition of R. Maher and 18 others, requesting that the wages for team work be raised to \$5.00 per day for the ensuing year was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman Downey, referred to the park, cemetery and street commission.

The liquor bond of Edward J. Bernard, sureties; Peter Boyer and Sinai Faucher, and the druggist bonds of Nelly F. Stafford, sureties; Michael Hagerty and Martin Vierling, and The People's Drug Store, sureties; Samuel R. Kaufman and William B. McCombs, were presented, and on motion of Alderman Donovan, supported by Alderman Downey, accepted and approved.

The monthly reports of the justices of the peace were presented and ordered placed on file.

The committee on finance and taxation requested and was granted further time to report on the matter of the payment of interest on deposits of city monies.

The special committee appointed to investigate and report regarding the organization of an association to invite and encourage the location in this city of industries and business requested and was given further time to make report.

The controller presented the reports of the market keeper and poundmaster, which were ordered placed on file.
