The petition of Frank Kearney and six others, requesting that a sewer be constructed in Genesee street, from Adams street to Altamont street, was presented and referred to the committee on parks, cemeteries, streets and sewers.

A Petition from the E. I. duPont Powder Co., was presented and referred to the Parks, Cemetery, and Street Commission for their recommendation

relative to the laying out of establishing and improving of a highway in the said city, commencing at a point in the existing highway at the south-east corner of Sec. 9, Township 48 N., Range 25 west, and running thence in a northwesterly and northerly direction, to the city limits at Dead River, at a point about 500 feet west of the east line of said section 9. Also the proposed construction of a steel bridge across Dead River at the point where the proposed highway touches said river.

Ald. Asire, chairman of the committee on finance and taxation,
recommended the adoption of the following:

Resolved, That there be appropriated for the current year for the following purposes and credited to the respective accounts, the following sums of money; For the use of the Park, Cemetery and Street Commission of the City of Marquette, \$22,000; for the use of the Board of Police Commissioners of the City of Marquette, \$8,500; and that said sums, together with the sum of \$12,000 for the general fund of the city, be raised by general tax: and

Resolved, That the total amount of money to be raised by tax for all local purposes for the year 1907, be and the same is hereby determined to be \$102,122.21, and the city controller is hereby directed to levy the same as taxes upon the taxable property of the city of Marquette on the tax roll of said year, as follows:

First: GENERAL TAX, for the general purposes of the City of Marquette, and ^{uses} ~~purposes~~ aforesaid, Forty two thousand five hundred dollars (\$42,500).

Second: SCHOOL AND ONE MILL TAX, for the use of the Public Schools of the City of Marquette, including therein the one mill tax allowed by law, Forty-six thousand eight hundred and eleven dollars and nine cents (\$46,811.09).

Third: LIBRARY TAX, for the use of the Peter White Public Library of the City of Marquette, the one mill tax allowed by law, viz: Six thousand eight hundred and eleven dollars and nine cents (\$6,811.09).

Fourth: FIRE AND WATER TAX, for the use of the Board of Fire and Water Commissioners of the City of Marquette, Six thousand dollars (\$6,000).

Moved by Ald.Peters, supported by Ald.Williams, as the recommendation of the majority of said committee, that \$8,000 instead of \$8,500, be appropriated and raised for the use of the Board of Police Commissioners and that \$21,000, instead of \$22,000, be appropriated and raised for the use of the Park, Cemetery and Street Commission, and that the resolution offered by Ald.Asire be amended accordingly.




