



To the Common Council:

Your committee on licenses and trade regulations beg leave to report that they have had under consideration the proposed ordinance repealing the ordinance licensing and regulating saloens.

Your committee is of the opinion that whatever merit there may be is requiring a substantial municipal license fee from liquor dealers in ordinarily prosperous years, the conditions at present are such that the exaction ought not to be made this year.

Owing to the depression in the iron and transportation business, and the fact that large number of men of the city are working on short time and many are out of employment entirely, extremely dull business conditions exist in this city, and particularly in the liquor trade, in which there has been a closer observance of law the present year.

We believe that but few dealers are making any money, that most of them are barely making expenses and that many are running behind.

Inder such conditions, the requirement of the extra license fee of \$250 of each liquor dealer, in addition to the \$500 tax already paid, is, in our opinion, an unjust imposition on a majority of such dealers in this city, and would be a burden which conditions do not warrant the city in placing on the trade at this time.

We therefor recommend that the repealing ordinance be adopted.

An adjourned regular session of the common council was called to order at 8 o'clock p.m. by the mayor, the Hon. John Robertson.

Present-Aldermen Asire, Campbell, Donovan, Downey, Ekstrom, McCarthy, Peters, Reichel, Schauer, Siegel and Williams-11.

The record of the session of December 21st, approved.

The petition of Israel Demarais, requesting a rebate of a portion of the taxes of 1908 against his property, was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation.

The petition of the Chronicle Company, publishers, requesting the privilege of attaching a bulletin board two feet in width by three feet in length to the electric light pole at the southeast corner of Front and Spring streets, stating that said company had secured the consent of the superintendent of the light and power commission was presented.

On motion of Alderman Siegel, supported by Alderman Asire, the prayer of the petitioner was granted.

On motion of Alderman Asire, supported by Alderman Donovan, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Nays-Aldermen Donovan, Downey, McCarthy and Reichel-4. The council then, on motion, adjourned.
