It has been suggested that Mr. White may have been indirectly reimbursed in the transactions in which the city acquired the lots now constituting the city rock quarry, and also the thirty odd acres at the neck of Presque Isle, but we have investigated those transcations sufficiently to satisfy us that Mr. White was not so reimbursed for the \$500 in question.

We therefore recommend that a warrant be drawn to the order of the Estate of Peter White, deceased, and that the same be delivered to the executors of said estate with the request that the deliver to the city the original deed from the Lighthouse Board, and also a quitelaim to the city from the heirs of the late Peter White of the parcel of land in question.

Section 1. All sidewalks which shall hereafter be laid in the streets or avenues of the city, shall be constructed under the superintendence and to the satisfaction of the street commissioner.

Sec. 2. All sidewalks constructed on Front street between Bluff and Rock streets; on Baraga avenue between Lake and Third streets; on Washington street between Front and Fourth streets, and on Third street between Main and Bluff streets, shall, unless the Common Council shall otherwise direct, be of the width from the street line to the curb line on either side thereof, and all sidewalks constructed on any other street or avenue in the city shall, unless the Common Council shall otherwise direct, be of the uniform width of five feet and four inches, the outer edge thereof to be ten feet from the street line unless otherwise ordered by the Common Council; and the grade of all sidewalks, unless otherwise ordered by the Common Council, shall be the same as the grade of the center of the street on which they are constructed, opposite the same.

Sec. 3. Unless otherwise specially ordered or permitted by the Common Council, all sidewalks hereafter constructed in any of the public streets of the city shall be of Portland cement and crushed rock, concrete, or of smooth flag stones averaging not less than one square yard each; and of such quality of cement or stone as shall be approved by the Common Council or the Street Commissioner.

Sec. 4. Whenever the Common Council shall by resolution or ordinance order the construction or repair of any sidewalk by the respective owners and occupants of the lots and parcels of land adjoining which said sidewalk is located, it shall be the duty of such owners and occupants, within such time, not less than six days after notice thereof, and the Common Council shall in said resolution or ordinance direct, to construct or repair or cause to be constructed or repaired, those portions respectively of said sidewalk in front of their said lands respectively between the side lines of their respective lots extended at right angles to the course of the street upon which said sidewalk is located.
