Marquette, Mich., October 7, 1901.

A regular session of the common council was called to order by the mayor, the Hon. John D. Mangum.

Present-Aldermen Asire, Ball, Bush, Donovan, Ekstrom, Fleury, Gustafson, Jacobs, Jones, O'Neill, Reau, Shea, Siegel, Ward and Werner.

The records of the sessions of September 3rd, 16th and 20th, approved.

The petition of W.A. French requesting permission to plant six trees in front of his hotel and yard on Spring street was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Jacobs, referred to the committee on streets and sewers with power to act.

The protest of Wm. Hoar and nine others against the laying of a sewer in Pine street, between Crescent and Park streets, stating that they had private sewers connected with the trunk sewer was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Ward, laid on the table.

The monthly reports of all the justices ^{of the Peace} were presented, and, on motion of Alderman Asire, ordered placed on file.

The recorder presented a warranty deed to the city from the Northern Land Co. Ltd., for a right-of-way for boulevard across Lots 1 and 2 of Sec. 13, T. 48 N. R. 25 W.,

Moved by Alderman Ward, supported and carried, that said deed be accepted and recorded, and that a warrant be drawn for \$1 in payment for said deed.

Yeas-Aldermen Asire, Ball, Bush, Donovan, Ekstrom, Fleury, Gustafson, Jacobs, Jones, O'Neill, Reau, Shea, Siegel, Ward, Werner and the mayor.

Nays-None.

The committee on finance and taxation reported, recommending that the petition of Zephier Pappa, for a rebate of interest charged on a special assessment, on his lot, on the tax roll of the year 1897, be granted, and on motion of Alderman Reau, said report was adopted and a warrant ordered drawn therefor for \$19.06.

The committee on finance and taxation reported that there were no city funds available for the improvement of Harlow and Front street parks, and that the committee had conferred with the Park and Cemetery Commission and are disposed to recommend that \$1,000 be raised next year for the improvement of Harlow Park and \$500 for the improvement of Front Street Park.

On motion of Alderman Siegel, the following was adopted:

Resolved, That \$500 be borrowed from the library fund to be expended under the direction of the Park and Cemetery Commission under plans and specifications adopted by the park and cemetery *Committee of the Common Council.*

The committee on streets and sewers submitted a proposition from P.W. Keating, civil engineer, for the preparation of plans and specifications for paving.

On motion of Alderman Ward, said proposition was placed on file.

On motion of Alderman Ward, the recorder was directed to procure from Mr. Keating the field notes made by him while in the employ of the city.

The committee on streets and sewers recommended that the committee be empowered to have the cement sidewalk in front of Henry Siegel's residence made rough, which recommendation, on motion of Alderman Reau, was adopted.

On motion of Alderman Asire, the committee on streets and sewers were directed to select a location for the proposed Marquette Improvement Association drinking fountain.

On motion of Alderman Donovan, Fred Jones, sidewalk inspector, was given until Friday, October 11th, 1901, at 8 o'clock p.m. to file his official bond.

The health officer addressed the council on the sanitary condition of the city, and particularly of the several premises mentioned in the resolution following, whereupon Alderman Ward offered the following resolution which was supported and carried:

Whereas, The health officer has called attention to the unsanitary condition of the several premises herein mentioned caused by maintaining therein either of foul privies, or of manure or garbage, to-wit: Nos. 154, 315, 317, 333, 339, 412, 428, 429, 430, 439, 447, 501, 509, 512, 517, 518, 543, 547, 603, 609, and 746 W. Washington street; Nos. 240 and 250 W. Ridge street; Nos. 230 and 238 W. Arch street; Nos. 246 and 247 W. Michigan street; Nos. 401, 409, 415, 512, 520, and 604 N. Fourth street; Nos. 230 and 238 W. Ohio street;

Resolved, That the Health officer cause notices to be served on the owners and occupants of said premises to abate the nuisances thereon.

The controller presented three bids for the purchase of the buildings situated on the land owned by the city, east of Front street and between Superior and Fisher streets, the bid of Wm. Seaman being \$25 for the building at No. 501 S. Front street, on motion of Alderman Ward, said building was sold to the highest bidder Wm. Seaman at the above named figure, said building to be removed within 15 days from date.

On motion of Alderman Asire, the mayor and controller were directed to dispose of the remaining buildings at the best terms obtainable.

The controller presented one bid for the construction of Lake Shore boulevard, said bid was opened, and, on motion of Alderman Asire, action on same was deferred until the next session.

The controller read the reports of the poundmasters, which were accepted and ordered placed on file.

The controller presented the special assessment roll for a sewer in High street. #1.

On motion of Alderman Ward, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That Special Assessment Roll No. 39, for the construction of a sewer in High street, from sewer in Michigan street to a point 300 feet south, be and the same is hereby approved; and that Friday, the 25th day of October, 1901, at 8 o'clock p.m. be fixed for the consideration of objections to said improvement and for the final confirmation of said roll, and that the recorder give notice thereof as required by law.

On motion of Alderman Ward, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:
