Marquette, Mich., January 4th, 1904.

A regular session of the common council was called to order by the president, the Hon. Merwin E. Asire.

Present-Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Donovan, Ekstrom, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, Jones, Mack, Reau, Shea and Ward-14.

The record of the session of December 21st, 1903, approved.

The petition of S. Catherine Robertson, requesting rebate of personal taxes for year 1903, claiming that a certain mortgage should not have been assessed same having been paid and discharged May 27th, 1902, was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation.

The petition of the Marquette County Savings Bank, claiming that they had made an error of \$10,000 in reporting the amount of the undivided profits of said bank subject to taxation for 1903, and requesting that they be allowed a rebate of ^{together with interest and penalties} taxes on said amount, was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation.

The petition of the American Express Co. and 58 others doing business on Washington street, requesting that the Marquette City & Presque Isle Railway Co., be allowed to discontinue the use of its line on Washington street during the winter months, as the operation of said line would greatly interfere with vehicle traffic and business generally by the cutting up of the street, was presented and ordered placed on file.

The monthly reports of all the justices of the peace were presented and ordered placed on file.

The committee on finance and taxation, to whom had been referred the petition of Peter Berch, requesting rebate of taxes on his property, Lot 40 of Harlow's Addition No. 5, also relief from payment of sewer assessment against same, total amount \$24.67, recommended that same be allowed.

On motion of Alderman Bush, supported by Alderman Donovan, said recommendation was adopted and a warrant ordered ^{drawn} on the general fund, in favor of Charles A. Eggers, treasurer, for payment of said amount.

Yeas-Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Donovan, Ekstrom, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, Jones, Mack, Reau, Shea and Ward-14.

The committee on streets and sewers recommended that the city purchase two dump wagons for the street department.

On motion of Alderman Bush, said matter was referred to the committee on purchases, salaries and wages, said committee to make report on same at next regular session.

The committee on railways and public conveyances, to whom had been referred the petition of the Marquette City & Presque Isle Railway Co., requesting that they be allowed to discontinue the operation of their Washington street line until May 1, 1904, recommended that said Washington street line remain closed until May 1, 1904, unless same is ordered opened by the common council prior to said date.

On motion of Alderman Ball, supported by Alderman Reau, said recommendation was unanimously adopted.

The controller presented and read the reports of the street commissioner and poundmaster, which were accepted and ordered placed on file.

A regular session of the common council was called to order by the mayor, the Hon. William H. Greene.

Present—Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, Jones, Moloney, Shea, Van Cleve and Ward-15.

The Hon. Peter White addressed the council relative to grading and improving the grounds at the city pumping station, and submitted an estimate by Street Commissioner French on same, said estimate being \$800.

On motion of Alderman Ward, supported by Alderman Bush, said matter was referred to the committee on parks and cemeteries in conjunction with Mr. White.

The petition of Martin Rustenhoven and sixty-one others, requesting that the macadamizing of Presque Isle avenue from Fair avenue to Holly street be completed, and agreeing to macadamize Holly street from Presque Isle avenue to Presque Isle road, was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of George W. Hager and forty other residents and tax payers of the Third and Eighth Wards, stating that they understood that Hewitt avenue from Front to Spruce streets was to be repaired during the coming summer and requesting that the repairs of said avenue be continued to its junction with Lake Shore boulevard, so as to give access to said avenue and completing the driveway from the city to Presque Isle, was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of Erick J. Johnson, requesting that he be granted an extension of time to June 1st, 1904, in which to complete the grading, curbing and macadamizing of Presque avenue, from Wright street to Hawley street, was presented, and, on motion of Alderman Shea, the prayer of the petitioner was granted.

An adjourned regular session of the common council was called to order by the mayor the Hon. William H. Greene.

The petition of Philip L. Pelissier and nine others, requesting that an electric light be placed at the intersection of Ridge and Oak streets was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of S.A. Williams and eight others, requesting that an electric light be placed at the intersection of Spruce and Ohio streets was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of Andrew Forbes and seven others, requesting that a sidewalk be constructed on each side of Park street, between Front and Third streets, was presented and referred to the committee on sidewalks and crosswalks.

The petition of Albert E. Miller and six others, requesting that the grade of Harrison street, between Sixth and Seventh streets, be established and that said street be graded at the expense of of the property benefited thereby, was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.
