Marquette, Mich., July 5th, 1904.

A regular session of the common council was called to order by the mayor, the Hon. William H. Greene.

Present-Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, Jones, McKereghan, Moloney, Shea, Van Cleve and Ward-16.

The records of the sessions of June 6th and 13th, approved.

The petition of M.C.Haley and 25 others, requesting that an electric light be placed at the corner of Presque Isle avenue and Union street, was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.

The petition of Peter White and 64 others, requesting that the Sisters of St. Joseph be relieved from the payment of sewer and concrete sidewalk assessments, was presented and referred to the committee on finance and taxation.

The monthly reports of all the justices of the peace were presented, and, on motion of Alderman Asire, ordered placed on file.

The committee on finance and taxation, to whom had been referred the bill of the city against the David Merault Estate for construction of sewer in front of property of said estate on Sixth street, reported recommending that said estate be relieved from the payment of said bill.

On motion of Alderman Cadarette, supported by Alderman Gray, said report was adopted and a warrant for \$17.02 in favor of Chas. A. Eggers, Treas., ordered drawn on the general fund for payment of said bill.

Yeas-Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, Jones, McKereghan, Moloney, Shea, Van Cleve, Ward and the mayor.

Nays-None.

The committee on streets and sewers, to whom had been referred the petition of Philip L. Pelissier and nine others requesting that an electric light be placed at the intersection of Ridge and Oak streets, recommended that the prayer of the petitioners be not granted.

On motion of Alderman Ward, said recommendation was adopted.

The committee on streets and sewers presented the following:

Resolved, That the common council recommends ^{to} the the Light and Power Commission that the arc electric light now located in Ohio street, 200 feet east of Spruce street, be placed at the intersection of Spruce and Ohio streets.

On motion of Alderman Gorman, said resolution was adopted.

On motion of Alderman Ball, supported by Alderman Gorman, the matter of making arrangements to take care of water at corner of Front street and Baraga avenue was referred to the committee on streets and sewers and the street commissioner.

On recommendation of the committee on streets and sewers the council accepted the fifty horse power motor from the Lake Shore Engine Works and the grading, ditching, curbing and macadamizing of Presque Isle avenue from Wright street to Hawley street.

The committee on claims and litigation, to whom had been referred the notice of claim of Phillip Billard, reported recommending that claimant be required to specify the grounds upon which he claims the city is liable, which report, on motion of Alderman Ward, supported by Alderman Ekstrom, was adopted.

The committee on purchases, salaries and wages, to whom had been referred the proposition of the Elmer A. Johnson Map Co., to make a general map of the city, reported recommending that nothing be done with said proposition at the present time.

On motion of Alderman Ward, said report was adopted.

The controller presented the special assessment roll for a sewer in Fourth street, from manhole in Prospect street to the center of Harrison street and in Harrison street from proposed manhole in Fourth street to a point 32 feet east of the east line of Lee street, for final confirmation.

On motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Bush, the following was adopted:

Whereas, The recorder has given due notice by publication in The Daily Mining Journal, a public newspaper of the city, that the common council would meet at this time and place for the review, correction and adoption

of the special assessment roll for the construction of an eight-inch tile sewer in Harrison street, from manhole in Prospect street to the center of Harrison street and in Harrison street from proposed manhole in Fourth street to a point 32 feet east of the east line of Lee street; and

Whereas, All persons interested in said special assessment roll and the assessments therein having been given an opportunity to be heard in relation thereto, and the same having been fully considered, and all needful revision and correction of said roll having been made to the satisfaction of the council:

Resolved, That said special assessment roll and the assessments thereon are hereby confirmed, and the said sums are hereby levied and assessed against said lots and premises respectively, and the collection thereof is hereby directed.

Yeas-Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, Jones, McKereghan, Moloney, Shea, Van Cleve and Ward-16.

Nays-None.

The controller presented the special assessment roll for a sewer in Jackson street, from the manhole in Champion street to the center of Albion street.

On motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Jones, the following was adopted:

Whereas, The recorder has given due notice by publication in The Daily Mining Journal, a public newspaper of the city, that the common council would meet at this time and place for the review, correction and adoption of the special assessment roll for the construction of an eight-inch tile in Jackson street, from the manhole in Champion street to the center of Albion street; and

Whereas, All persons interested in said special assessment roll and the assessments therein having been given an opportunity to be heard in relation thereto, and the same having been fully considered, and all needful revision and correction of said roll having been made to the satisfaction of the council:

Resolved, That said special assessment roll and the assessments thereon are hereby confirmed, and the said sums are hereby levied and assessed

against said lots and premises respectively, and the collection thereof is hereby directed.

Yeas-Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, Jones, McKereghan, Moloney, Shea, Van Cleve and Ward-16.

Nays-None.

The controller announced that he had advertised for bids for the construction of a sewer in Fourth and Harrison streets and a sewer in Jackson street, and that he had received two bids for each.

On motion of Alderman Ward, said bids were opened and read.

Said bids being in excess of the estimated cost, on motion of Alderman Ward, ^{he} the controller was directed to ^{re}advertise for ~~new~~ bids for the construction of said sewers.

On motion of Alderman Ward, supported by Alderman Ball, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the common council hereby directs that there shall be collected on the general tax roll of the city of the year 1904, each and every of the unpaid special assessments levied for public improvements against lots and parcels of real estate on the special assessment rolls hereinafter mentioned, and all proper costs, charges and penalties, and interest thereon, to-wit:

Special Assessment Roll No. 56, confirmed by the common council on July 20th, 1903, for the construction of a sewer in Spring street from manhole in Fifth street to the center of Seventh street and in Seventh street from ~~proposed~~ manhole in Spring street to the center of Superior street.

Special Assessment Roll No. 58, confirmed by the common council on August 3rd, 1903, for the construction of a sewer in Morton street from manhole in sewer in Fourth street to a point 36 feet east of the east line of Lee street.

Special Assessment Roll No. 61, confirmed by the common council on September 8th, 1903, for the construction of a sewer in Ohio street from manhole in sewer in Fourth street to a point 30 feet east of the east line of Oak street.

Moved by Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Gorman, and carried unanimously that said ordinance be put upon its immediate passage. Said ordinance was, on motion of Alderman Shea, supported by Alderman Gorman, adopted by the following vote:

Yeas-Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Cadarette, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, Jones, McKereghan, Moloney, Shea and Van Cleve-15.

Nays-None.

The matter of the acceptance of "Lake Shore Boulevard" from the contractors Mitchell & Sherman, was, on motion of Alderman Bush, supported by Alderman Ball, referred to the mayor, city attorney, street commissioner and the committee on streets and sewers.

Moved by Alderman Bush, supported and carried, that when the council adjourns, it be until Monday, the 18th day of July, 1904, at 8 o'clock p.m.

The council then, on motion, adjourned.

An adjourned regular session of the common council was called to order by the mayor, the Hon. William H. Greene.

Present-Aldermen Anderson, Asire, Ball, Bush, Ekstrom, Gorman, Gray, Gustafson, Holley, McKereghan, Moloney, Shea, Van Cleve and Ward-14.

The record of the session of July 5th, approved.

The petition of Neil Ferguson and four others, requesting that a sewer be placed in Front street, between Michigan and Ohio streets, or in some other way make it possible for them to obtain sewer connections, was presented and referred to the committee on streets and sewers.
