A deed from the Lakeview Realty Company to the city for a right of way for a street in NE_4^1 of SE_4^1 of Sec. 15, Town 48 North, Range 255West; duly approved by the city attorney and the city engineer was presented, and on motion of Commissioner Sherman, Supported by Commissioner Pearce, said deed was accepted and ordered placed on record in the Register of Deeds office for the County of Marquette.
