

Mr. Begole:

I am handing you herewith signed copy of agreement which as a special committee we made with the Board of Supervisors. It will be necessary now for our committee to draw up an agreement with the Board of Trustees of the Hospital and the City of Marquette. Mr. Miller is out of the City to-day and consequently we will be unable to do this this week.

Mr. Jopling tells me however that they are going ahead on the work, getting the plans at least, and that it will be perfectly satisfactory if this be deferred until I get back.

As far as I am concerned if you care to you might take the matter up with Mr. Miller, and have him draw up an agreement if he cares to have action taken earlier. It might be advisable to have this agreement read at our meeting to-night, so that you can make an announcement that the deal will go through.

It is my understanding now that the City agrees to pay to the Hospital three hundred and sixty dollars (\$360.00) a year for maintenance, and that they will turn over contagious cases given under our direction to the new contagious disease Hospital. Aside from rendering bills through to the County for their cases we will not be concerned in the rate which is charged.

The undersigned, Special Committee appointed by your Board at a meeting held on August 29, 1917, to take up with the City Commission of the City of Marquette, and the Board of Trustees of St. Luke's Hospital, the question of establishing in the City of Marquette a Contagious Diseases Hospital, respectfully report as follows:-

We have met, a special committee representing the City Commission, and a special committee representing St. Luke's Hospital. The Committee representing the Hospital submitted a proposition to erect upon its premises a modern Contagious Diseases Hospital to cost about six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00), and to receive and care for, in such Hospital, all patients sent there on the order of the county physician, or other authorized representative of the county, from the said City or the territory contiguous thereto, at a cost to the county in all county cases of three dollars (\$5.00) per day, and such Hospital shall be recognized officially as the County Contagious Diseases Hospital for said City and adjoining territory. Such arrangement, so far as rates per day is concerned, to be in force until Dec. 31, 1918, and then to be revised if it should prove unsatisfactory to either the county or the said Hospital.
