The annual report of the State Examiners was presented. The Chairman referred the report to the Auditing Committee and stated the report would be filed in the Clerk's office for examination by any interested party.

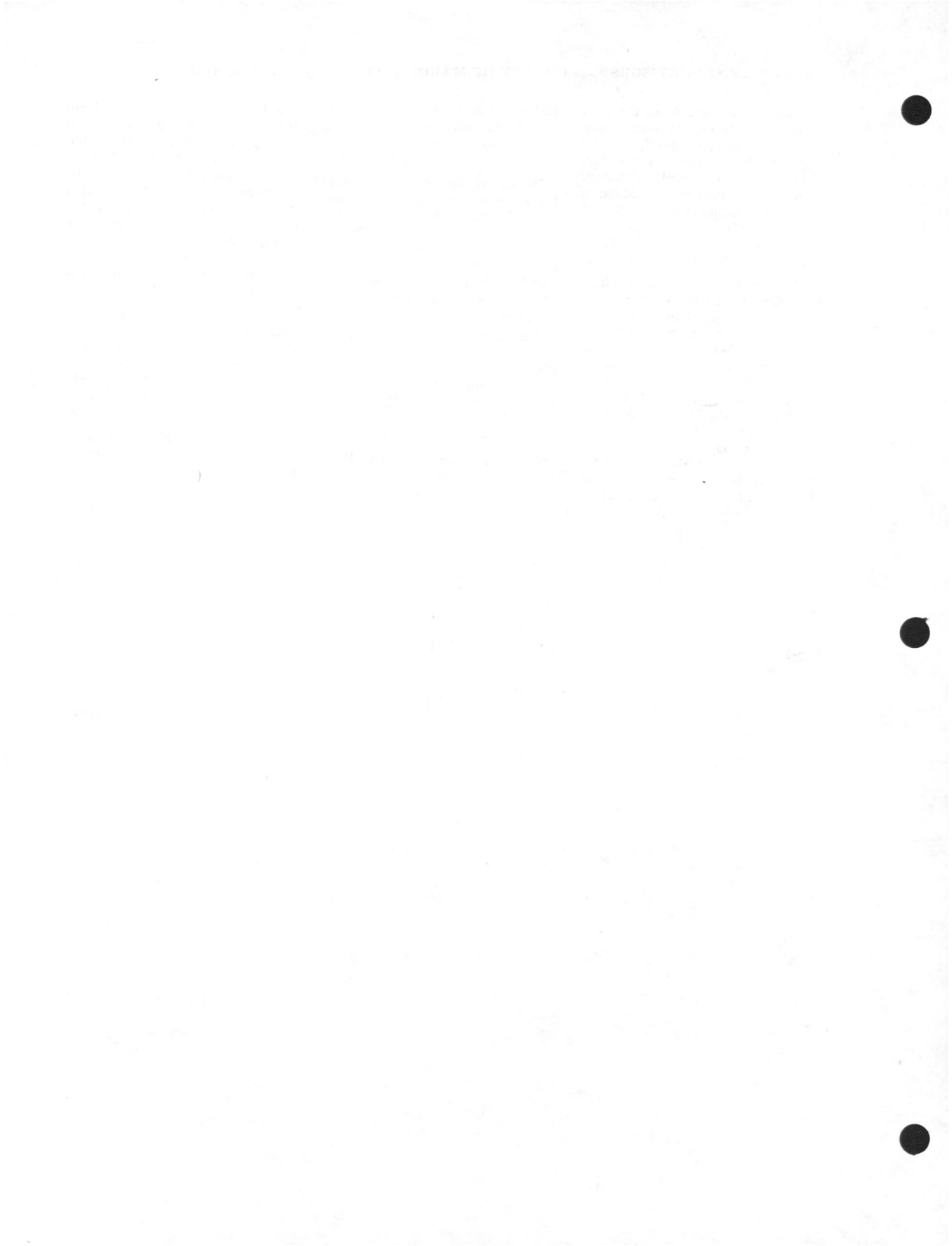
✓ A letter from Mr. D. Hale Brake, Pres. of the Mich. Institute of Local Gov. read at

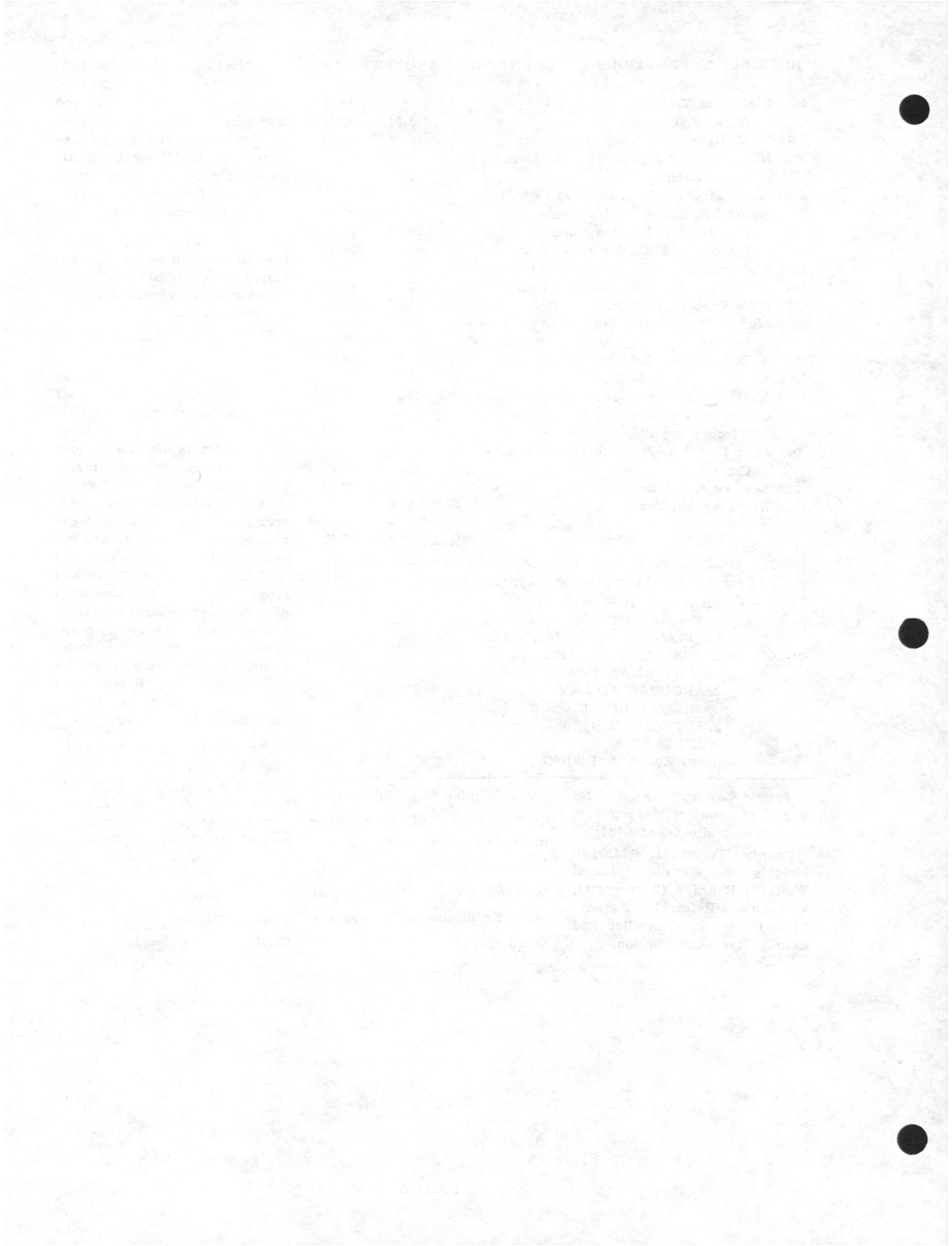
The Chairman congratulated the Mining Journal for its explanatory editorial relative to the resolution submitted by the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors at the January meeting.
