
The Chairman congratulated the Mining Journal for its explanatory editorial relative to the resolution submitted by the Dickinson County Board of Supervisors at the January meeting.

Your Budget and Executive Committee, to whom has been referred the matter of obtaining a retirement plan for county employees not already covered, have had the matter under study for a considerable length of time. Your committee wishes to recommend that Marquette County adopt Plan C of the Michigan Municipal Employees Retirement System, to become effective on July 1, 1957, and that the County Clerk be authorized to conduct an advisory election among the employees to be covered by the plan so that they may indicate their acceptance or rejection of the same. #### RESOLUTION

Whereas, It is desired by the Board of Supervisors, the governing body of the County of Marquette, Michigan, to make available to its employees a pension plan as provided by the Municipal Employees' Retirement Act established by Act. No. 135 of the Public Acts of 1945, therefore.

Be It Resolved, That the Board of Supervisors, the governing body of the County of Marquette, Michigan, a Municipality within the meaning of that term as defined in Act No. 135 of the Public Acts of 1945, does hereby, on the behalf of said municipality as permitted by section 6 of said act, elect to come under the provisions of said act. The effective date of this resolution with respect to the making of deductions from the salary and wages of the employees of the municipality and the making of payments required by said act on behalf of the said municipality shall be July 1, 1957, and that the County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to make all wage and salary deductions on behalf of the employees of the municipality required by law and to pay the same to the retirement board established by the Municipal Employees' Retirement Act together with such amounts as the municipality is required to make on behalf of its employees under the provisions of that act. Be it further Resolved, That this resolution become operative upon the affirmative vote of the majority of county employees to be covered by the retirement plan referred to herein, the rules for such election to be prescribed by the County Clerk and the certification of such election results to be placed on file in the office of said County Clerk. The following monthly reports of county departments were read and ordered filed by the Chairman, Social Welfare Dept. (2 reports), County Treasurer, Morgan Heights Sanatorium, Mine Inspector, County Controller and County Road Commission.

A resolution from the Cheboygan County Board of Supervisors urging opposition to a proposed bill that would take away the townships 85 per cent of the liquor license fees now being returned to townships was read. Supervisor Kivela moved the Board concur in the resolution. Supported by Supervisor Rautio and carried.

Another resolution from the above county Board of Supervisors endorsed House Bill No.

285 which provides for fines for violation of proposed township ordinances be returned to the townships for the employment of paid peace officers. No discussion, it was ordered fi'ed by the Chairman.
