Your Budget and Executive Committee, to whom was referred the communication from the Michigan State Waterways Commission proposing the construction of a harbor of refuge at Big Bay, wishes to report that the matter was discussed at a meeting held on August 12, 1957. Your committee feels that this improvement would be of great benefit to Marquette County and that if it can be accomplished at the comparatively low local cost of \$10,000.00 that the County of Marquette should do whatever possible to bring it about. The Michigan State Waterways Commission has suggested the form of resolution for adoption by the Board of Supervisors to signify its desire for this harbor of refuge and its willingness to participate in the cost of dock construction to the extent of \$10,000.00. Your committee, therefore, recommends that the Board of Supervisors adopt the

resolution submitted by the Michigan State Waterways Commission so that Marquette County's willingness to co-operate in this project may be made a matter of record.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Congress, by Public Law 14 of the 79th Congress, approved 2 March 1945, authorized a project for the construction of a harbor-of-refuge at Big Bay, Marquette County, Michigan, subject to certain conditions of local cooperation set forth in the report of the Chief of Engineers in House Document No. 446 of the 78th Congress; and

WHEREAS, the construction of said project will be a public improvement for the benefit and in the interest of the people of the County of Marquette; and

WHEREAS, the Michigan State Waterways Commission is an agency and political subdivision of the State of Michigan and is empowered by the laws of that State to enter into agreements with agencies of the United States whereby the State undertakes to participate with the Federal Government to accomplish such projects; and

WHEREAS, the County of Marquette, a political subdivision of the State of Michigan, not legally empowered to enter into agreements with agencies of the United States, is desirous of participating with the Michigan State Waterways Commission in completing this project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the County of Marquette does hereby grant and convey its assurances to the Michigan State Waterways Commission that it will:

1. Provide, without cost to the Commission, all lands, easements and rights-of-way necessary for the construction of the project, including suitable spoil disposal areas when and as required.

2. Hold and save the Commission free from all damages due to the construction and maintenance of the works.

3. Participate equally with the Commission in the cost of constructing a suitable and adequate public wharf for the accomodation of transient vessels at the harbor.

Gentlemen:

Your Morgan Heights Contact Committee met with the Board of Trustees of Morgan Heights Sanatorium on August 13, 1957. Your committee was again acquainted with the thorough job that is being done in Marquette County in the treatment and prevention of tuberculosis. The affairs of Morgan Heights Sanatorium are capably and efficiently administered and your committee, therefore, has no corrective recommendations to make.

In discussing the 1958 budget for this department, it was noted that a slight decrease in the anticipated case load and the reduction of State funds to the sanatorium have caused an increase in the need for county funds for the next fiscal year. The 1958 budget request is in the sum of \$75,000.00, which constitutes a \$10,000.00 increase over 1957. Your committee wishes to recommend that everything possible be done to provide Morgan Heights Sanatorium with the funds requested.

The Board of Trustees also explained to your committee that under the provisions of new legislation it is now possible to admit patients for treatment of diseases other than tuberculosis. At the present time the small number of unoccupied beds would not permit the admittance of such patients but the Board of Trustees feels that in the future a possible decline in the number of tuberculosis patients may permit the using of a portion of the hospital for

other patients and have requested that the Board of Supervisors adopt a resolution granting the Morgan Heights Board of Trustees permission to admit non-tuberculosis patients when it deems proper to do so. Your committee wishes to recommend that the Board of Supervisors adopt the attached resolution in the matter.

Gentlemen:

The annual inspection of the Parks and Airport Contact Committee was made on September 10, 1957.

The Marquette County Airport is almost completed and is certainly a credit to our community. Arrangements are underway for the necessary clearing and erection of obstruction lights that will meet the requirements for night flight operations and the required glide angles. This will complete the airport for full operation. Last year, mention was made of acquiring a truck and plow for snow removal work at the airport. Since that time, our airport management has secured equipment on an experimental basis from the federal government which will be adequate for this purpose. The equipment has been loaned for the 1957-1958 season but there is a possibility that future use of the equipment may be extended for further experimentation. Marquette County will be relieved of the additional expense for snow removal

equipment at the airport, for as long as the federal government makes the loaned equipment available to the airport. All civil airport operations in the county are now conducted from the new Marquette County Airport.

During the 1957 season there were 12,965 visitors, 6,581 bathers and 372 camp parties at Perkins Park and at the Gwinn Park there were 2,028 visitors, 2,435 bathers and 11 camping parties. An inspection of Perkins Park shows it to be very well managed. During this season, a 6 inch water main has been installed to connect with the water system of Big Bay to bring water to the park area. It is planned that during the 1958 season the water distribution system throughout the park will be completed. As funds are available for improvement of this area, the Park Committee plans to improve this park in line with the committee's 1956 report. This will eventually mean the completion of the water distribution system, construction of a sewage disposal system and wash house, the development of a new bathing area just south of the present bathing area which is constantly being subjected to erosion, and providing more trailer parking facilities and picnic area tables. The last uncompleted portion of highway between Marquette and Big Bay was completed on September

10, 1957 and your committee feels certain that this now completed roadway will bring ever increasing numbers of guests to Perkins Park during the coming years.

be it THEREFORE resolved that the Marquette County Board of Supervisors do hereby grant approval to the Board of Trustees of Morgan Heights Sanatorium to admit such non-tuberculous diseases as the Board may designate, subject to the approval of the State Commissioner of Health, at such time as the Board of Trustees may decide, provided that

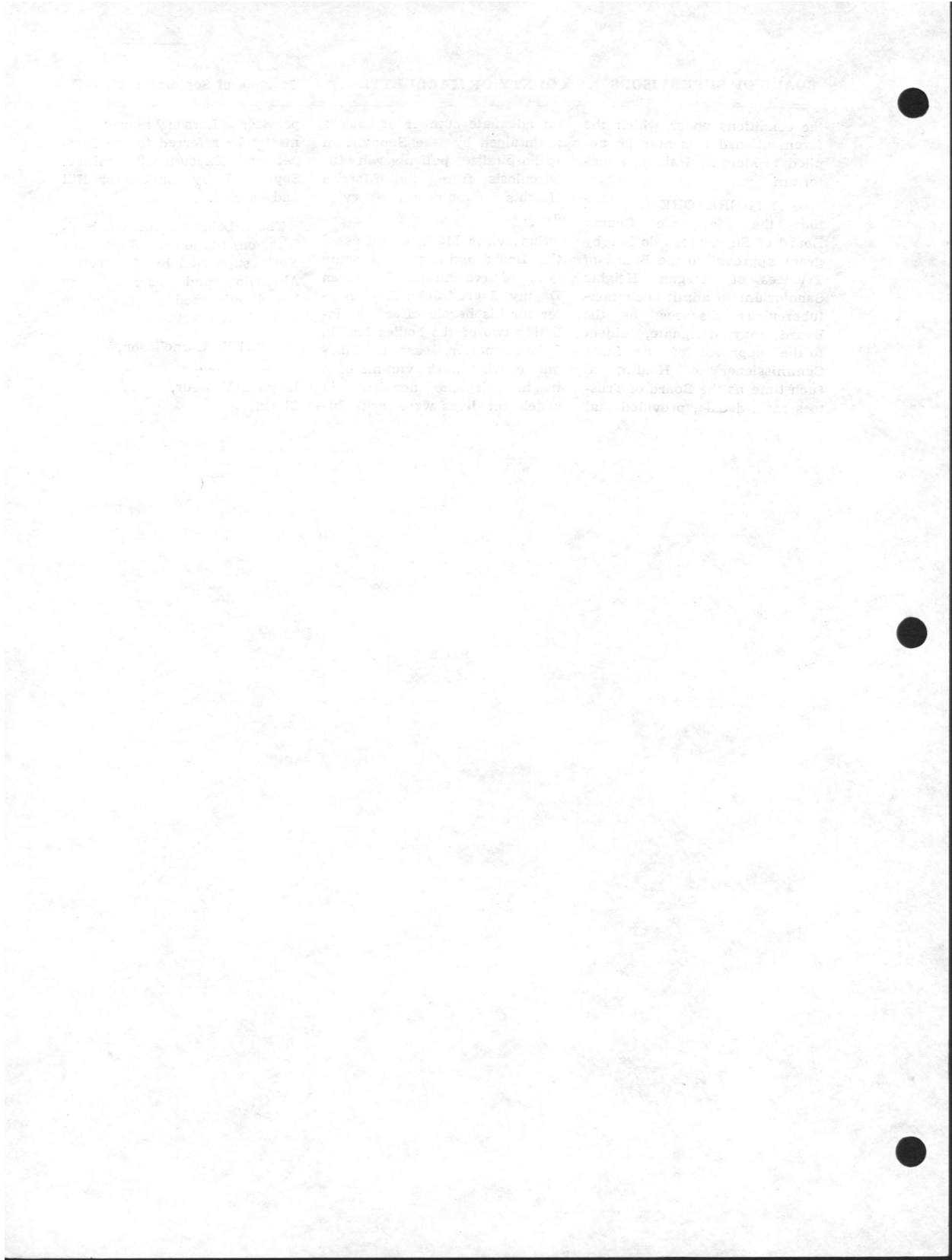
an adequate number of beds is maintained by the Sanatorium to hospitalize patients with tuberculosis from the Morgan Heights Sanatorium service area.

Supervisor York moved the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting. Supported by Supervisor Carlson and carried.

An invitation to attend the 11th Annual Michigan Rural Health Conference was read. The Conference to be held at Ann Arbor on January 22-23, 1958. No discussion, the letter was ordered filed by the Chairman.

✓ A recommendation from Dr. Amolsch, Co. Medical Examiner to appoint Dr. Clifford Sherwood of Ishpeming as an assistant Medical Examiner was read. Supervisor Hill moved the Board concur in the recommendation. Supported by Supervisor Altobello and carried.

✓ A petition signed by Mrs. Eddie Kainulainen of R. 1, Box 992 Negaunee was read. The petitioner requested improvement

to County Road 565 in Richmond Township. Supervisor Aho moved it be referred to the Marquette County Road Commission with power to act. Supported by Supervisor LaChance and carried.

The following report of the Highways and Bridges Committee was read. Supervisor Larson moved it be accepted. Supported by Supervisor Rautio and carried.

September 20, 1957

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan
Gentlemen:

The Highways and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour on September 17, 1957 and wishes to report the progress made to county roads during the 1957 season.

The paving of County Road 550 has now been completed from Marquette to Big Bay. This has been accomplished with Federal participation and is undoubtedly the biggest single improvement to our county road system in recent years.

During this season on the primary road system, paving operations have been completed on County Roads 478, 480, 488, 496, 555, 611 and 601 amounting to a total of 14.25 miles. On the Local Road System, with township participation in costs, paving operations have been completed on 3.57 miles of road in Champion Township, 3.86 miles in Ely Township, 2.80 miles in Humboldt Township, 2.93 miles in Michigamme Township, 1.9 miles in Negaunee Township, and 2.8 miles in Republic Township, making a total of 17.86 miles of Local Roads paved. Adding the 14.25 miles of paving completed on the primary road system indicates total paving for the season of 32.11 miles. In addition to the paving operations, extensive road grade

improvements were carried out in preparation for paving. Our bituminous aggregate plant also produced 9,000 tons of aggregate for the City of Ishpeming and 150 tons of aggregate for the City of Negaunee in their street improvement programs. It is expected that the bituminous aggregate plant will be located in the Forsyth Township area for the 1958 season and plans are under way to improve a number of roads in that vicinity.

In addition to the road paving projects the department carried out its normal summer and winter maintenance programs.

During this season, too, a new bridge has been built over the Carp River on County Road No. 553 and the narrow bridge on County Road 480 near the intersection of U.S. 41, has been replaced with a large culvert eliminating the former narrow bridge hazard there. A new garage has been built in the Republic district. The building project was brought about by the necessity to abandon the existing garage due to mining operations in that area.

It was pointed out to your committee that the County Road Commission cannot possibly complete all of the improvements that have been requested on local roads within the county. State law requires that 75 per cent of the funds received by the Road Commission from the State be used on the primary road system and that only 25 per cent be used on the local road system. The primary road system includes 275 miles, while the local road system on which only 25 per cent of State funds may be used, includes 990 miles of roadway. Your committee is confident that our Road Commission is endeavoring to use those funds appropriated for local roads to the best advantage but of necessity, some of the requests for improvements

will have to be by-passed.
