

#### RESOLUTION

Whereas, Owners of not less than fifty-one per cent of the frontage of Lake Independence, in Powell Township, Marquet e County, have filed a petition with the Marquette County Board of Supervisors requesting a determination and maintenance of normal height and level of said lake, under the provisions of Act 194 of the Public Acts of 1939, as amended (C. L. 1948, Sec. 281. 101-121; Stat. Ann. Sec. 11.211-241) and,

Whereas, Section 18 of said Pulic Act 194 provides that whenever the waters of any inland lake are public waters and proceedings are commenced for the purpose of determination and maintenance of the normal height and level thereof by the Board of Supervisors of any coun'y, the Conservation Department shall aid and assist in the preparation and presentation of the information, facts and data necessary under the provisions of said Public Act 194, and,

Whereas, It appears necessary to obtain technical information and data as to the condition of the existing dam which controls the discharge from the lake, the elevations of lands adjacent to the lake, beach profiles that are representative of the various existing conditions with respect to water surface, and the most suitable level of the lake for all concerned, and,

Whereas, Said Public Act 194 provides that the es imated cost of the determination and maintenance of the level of said lake, including dam<sup>3</sup>, embankments, locks, gates and any other devices necessary, shall be assessed upon the owners or occupans of real estate deemed to be benefitted thereby and it appears essential to obtain information as to the present and future costs involved in said project.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, That the Marque te County Board of Supervisors does hereby request the Department of Conservation of the State of Michigan to aid and assist in the preparation and presentation of the information, facts and data necessary to determine and maintain the normal height and level of Lake Independence in Powell Township, Marque te County, Michigan under the provisions of said Act 194.

#### RESOLUTION

Whereas, The present statutes governing the licencing and control of dogs, Compiled Laws 1948, Section 287.285, as amended, provides that in cities, the reasonable cost of maintaining a dog control department shall be borne by the county general fund, and

Whereas, Strict adherence to such provisions places an undue financial burden on counties, and

Whereas, The Marquette County Board of Supervisors believes that the dog control problem is one that should properly come within the scope of city and

township administration and that the statutes should be amended so as to permit the various cities and townships within our state to adopt ordinances so to do, and

Whereas, Proposed Bill No. 1072 contemplates a change in the present dog law to allow a greater number of cities, villages and townships to adopt ordinances to regulate the licensing of dogs, payment of claims and to be exempt from the provisions of the general state dog law, except those provisions dealing with kennel licenses.

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved, That this Board of Supervisors urge the adoption of legislation which would permit all cities, village and townships the option of licensing and controlling dogs under locally adopted ordinances, and

Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be sent to Governor G. Mennen Williams, to Senator Phillip Rahoi, to Representative Dominic Jacobetti and to each county in the State of Michigan.

Supervisor LaChance spoke of the severe storms and large snow concentration in the village of Palmer during the recent winter and wondered if the road commission could give the township a little extra service during these severe storms because of fire and other hazards. The Chairman stated that Mr. Shroeger of the Marquette County Road Commission, who was absent at this meeting, could possibly answer the question at the next meeting and Supervisor LaChance agreed to the tabling of same.

Your Morgan Heights Contact Committee met with the Board of Trustees of Morgan Heights Sanatorium on April 15, 1959, and wishes to report that the institu- Carl W. Corneliuson tion is still being operated in a George N. Beaupied very efficient manner and that an excellent job is being done in the treatment of tuberculosis and in the program of prevention and detection of the disease.

Your Committee was informed that the case load is now less than capacity but that the load has not yet dropped to the point where the entire upper floor of the institution can be set aside for non-tuberculosis patients. The institution has been approved by the State of Michigan for this type of care and the Morgan Heights Board believes that the case load will drop sufficiently in the next few months to enable them to commence that program. This will benefit the county since it means an increase in the income without raising overall onerating costs any appreciable amount. This eventually means that a smaller portion of the total operating cost will have to be borne by tax monies. It is also very gratifying to note that the average length of time required to treat a tuberculosis patient has been cut back because of new drugs and improved treatment methods and that the total number of new cases is decreasing.

During the past year an explosion occured at Morgan Heights Sanatorium which was caused by a leak in a gas line entering the building. Very fortunately no one was injured in the explosion and all damage has been repaired and safeguards taken against a recurrence of the accident. Repairs were adequately covered by in-

The Board of Trustees and Dr. Acocks, the administrator, are doing an excellent job in the prevention and treatment of tuberculosis while keeping operating costs at a minimum. Your Committee wishes to express its appreciation to them for their excellent co-operation and for a job very well done.



The following report of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee was read. Supervisor York moved it be accepted and approved. Supported by Supervisor Dompierre and carried.

August 13, 1959 Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Mich. Gentlemen:

Your Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee made its annual inspection tour of county buildings on Wednesday, August 12, 1959 and wishes to report that all properties inspec'ed were found to be in very good order and well managed.

The Marquette County Airport building, together with the new addition which is almost completed, is certainly an installation of which Marquette County can justly be proud.

In checking improvements made at the Citizens Home, your committee found that the recreation room floor has been repaired and tiled, plumbing defec's have been corrected, new stair treads to the men's dormitory have been installed and the whole building was found to be well organized, clean and pleasant. The roofing on the Citizen's Home and accessory buildings, however, are leaking and are beyond repair. Your committee recommends that the roofing on these buildings be replaced and believes that the Social Welfare Board should solicit bids to have the work done this season as further delay will cause a serious maintenance problem on the building interior. It is also recommended that the dormers projecting from the roof on the Citizens Home be painted at the same time the roofing is replaced.

Your committee also discussed the Lloyd Thomas appraisal service which is maintained on all county owned properties. Morgan Heights Sanatorium was reappraised in 1955 but the last reappraisal was made on all other county properties ten years ago. Your committee has received an estimate on the entire job which amoun's to \$1,540.00 for the Court House and Jail group, \$660.00 for Social Welfare Department and Citizens Home and \$1,780.00 on the County Road, Park and Airports Group. It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Lloyd Thomas Co. to reappraise the Court House and Jail group and that they recommend to the Co. Road Commission and Social Welfare Department that the properties under their control also be reappraised. Such service resul's in much better property control as well as regulating the proper insurance coverage on the properties involved. In the event of fire loss claims are much more easily and properly settled.

Your committee feels that those in charge of county buildings should be thanked for their interest and fine maintenance of public property.



The following report of the Highways and Bridges Committee was read. Supervisor Larson moved it be adopted. Supported by Supervisor Carlson and carried.

September 16, 1959

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

The Highways and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour on September 14, 1959, and wishes to report the progress made to county roads during the 1959 season.

The construction of the grade and the blacktop pavemen's on Roads 492 and 553 were completed under the Federal Aid Program. In addition, the blacktop surface construction on Road 510 was also completed under this program. Construction of the blacktop surfaces on Roads 480 and 551 was completed in co-operation with the Michigan State Highway Department.

During the season on the Primary Road System, paving operations have been completed or will be completed on Roads 478, 480, 492, 510, 551, 561, and 601. These

paving operations will account for the construction of 15.38 miles of blacktop surfaces. On the Local Road System, with townships participating in the cost, paving operations have been completed on 10.91 miles in Chocolay, Ishpeming, Negaunee and Tilden Townships and 4.0 miles will be completed in Republic Township by the end of the construction season. This represents a total of 14.91 miles on the Local Road System and a total of 30.29 miles on the entire County Road System that has been blacktopped during the season. In addition to the paving operations, extensive road surface and base corrections were necessary in preparation for paving construction. It is expected that the blacktop plant will again be located in the cen'ral part of the county during the 1960 construction season.

Extensive repairs were carried out on the bridge in the Village of Republic which carries Road 601 over the Michigamme River. This bridge will carry the new business route over the Michigamme River from M-95 to the Village of Republic.

In addition to the above projects the Road Commission car-

ried out its normal summer and winter maintenance programs.

Your Committee made an inspection of the system of ditches in the New Republic Plat. At the time of inspection, the County Road Commission members and interested residents of the plat were in attendance. It was agreed between all concerned that the County Road Commission would cause the ditches to be filled and graded and it is believed that this corrects the problem there.

It was again pointed out to your committee that the Road Commission cannot possibly complete all of the improvements that have been requested on the Local Road System. The state law requires that 75% of the funds received from the State be expended on the primary system, which includes 275 miles, and the remaining 25% of State funds be expended on the local road system that includes 990 miles. Your committee is confident that the Road Commission is using the funds allocated for local roads to the best advantage possible but of necessity, some of the requests for improvement of local roads will have to be put off.

August 31, 1959 Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

Your Parks and Airport Committee held its annual inspection

tour on August 24, 1959. The inspection began by meeting at the Marquette County Airport where the new addition is completed and installation of the weather station equipment is well under way. The use of the airport facility is increasing steadily and it is expected that in the near future, installation of equipment for instrument landings will be installed without cost to the county. The airport is well managed and is providing a fine service to our community.

At the Gwinn Park, your committee found that a considerable amount of work must be done to improve the area. It was believed that the removal of dead trees and some of the needed brushing could be done with inmate labor from the county jail. Arrangements were completed to have some of the work done in this manner. Your committee recommends that the sum of \$2,000.00 be set aside in the Parks Fund to be expended at the Gwinn Park next year in further cleaning and in the improvement of road and parking areas as well as for the placing of picnic tables and outdoor stoves.

At Perkins Park your committee found the area neat, well managed and very presentable. The sewer system for the park has not been installed but arrangements have been made to finance this improvement within the next year or two.

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

Your Budget and Executive Committee has been advised by Probate Judge Michael DeFant that the State of Michigan has requested that a full time employee be added to the staff of the Juvenile Court and that the failure to do so might jeopardize state funds now being paid into the Child Care Fund. Judge De-Fant has further advised your committee that in discussing the matter with a representative of the State office, it was proposed that the additional needed help could be obtained from senior or post graduate students in social science now enrolled at Northern Michigan College in Marquette at much less expense than would be involved in the employ of a full time worker, Arrangements for this part time help have been made, subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors, as follows: Employ two such students for two hundred hours each during the next year, the first one hundred hours of service of each student without salary and the last 100 hours of service of each student's time to be paid at the rate of \$1.50 per hour, There will of course, be some travel allowance involved at the county rate of eight cents per mile. Total expenditures for the additional part time services will be limited to \$1,000.00.

Your Committee feels that this is an opportunity to obtain excellent needed services at a minimum of cost and recommends that the Probate Judge be authorized to proceed with the arrangements as outlined.

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette. Michigan Gentlemen:

The Marquette County Bar Association has made the request to your Budget and Executive Committee that consideration be given to an increase in the county's portion of the Circuit Judge's salary. At the present time the state paid salary of the Circuit Judge is \$12,000.00 per year and the counties within the circuit pay a total of \$3,000.00 in additional salary to make a total of \$15,000.00. By law, however, the Circuit Judge is prevented from engaging in private law prac'ice during his term of office so as to add to his income. We are advised that Delta County has already approved an increase in their allowance for the Circuit Judge's salary from \$125.00 per month to \$250.00 per month, provided that Marquette County will do likewise. This would make a total adjusted salary of \$18,000.00 per year and since no adjustment has been made of the county allowances in perhaps twenty years, your committee feels that the adjustment at this time is justified.

Your Committee recommends, therefore, that the county portion of the salary of Circuit Judge be increased from \$125.00 per month to \$250.00 per month commencing January 1, 1960.

At the November 3, 1959 meeting of your Budget and Executive Committee a discussion was held relative to the establishment of an Adult Mental Health Clinic for tthe Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Judge Michael De-Fant, Finance Chairman of the Committee sponsoring the establishment of such a clinic, explained the great need for a mental health clinic here and stated that there is a very good reason to believe that the State of Michigan will establish one in the Upper Peninsula provided that there is sufficient interest and support.

The greater portion of the cost of operating such a clinic is borne by the State of Michigan, but a portion must be earried by local organiations or governmental units. An effort is being made at the present time to obtain expressions of support from the various locol governmental units. 
