Your Budget and Execut ve Committee has considered a request from the Morgan Heights Sanatorium to amend the county regulations requiring the retirement of county employees at age sixty-five to exclude registered nurses and physicians. Professional help is at times very difficult to obtain for extra duty, for relief and in times of emergency and there are times when Morgan Heights Sanatorium experiences d'fficulty in obtaining the required number of nurses.

Your comm tiee recommends, therefore, that the regulation adopted by the Board of Supervisors on December 23, 1959, requiring all county employers at Morgan Heights Sanatorium and certain other departments to retire within two months after reaching sixty - five years of age be modified to exclude registered nurses and physicians only in the employ of Morgan Heights Sanatorium.





Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

At the March 18, 1963 meeting of your Budget and Executive Committee, the so-called "Sunday Closing Law", or Public Act 128, 1962, was discussed A memorandum by Prosecuting Edward Quinnell outlining the effects of Public Act 128 is attached.

Your committee feels that this law places unnecessary restrictions on the selling of goods, wares and merchandise by the business houses within our county and that steps should be taken, as provided by the law, to exempt Marquette County from its provisions.

Your committee recommends, therefore, that a public hearing be held before the Board of Supervisors during its next meeting to be held April 24, 1900 at 2:00 o'clock p. m. E.S.T. to hear all persons having an interest in the effects of Public Act 128 of 1962. Action may then be taken by the Board of Supervisors to allow the provis-

ions of the Act to remain in force in Marquette County or to exempt Marquette County from its provisions.

This should enable the count to have this matter properly taken care of with the least possible expense as the Road Commission is already equipped to handle this type of service.

It is recommended, therefore, that the Board of Supervisors designate the Marquette County Road Commission to also function as the Marquette County Harbor Commission.





Your committee wishes to report that the affairs of this county institution are exceptionally well managed and in good order. The case load of tuberculosis patients is still declining, and the incidence of new cases is also on the decline. The institution is still carrying a capacity load of patients in the medical section of the hospital and this continues to provide outstanding care for patients as well as a tremendous saving in tax monies to the county.

During the past year, the following capital expenditures were made by Morgan Heights Sanatorium:

Housekeeping and fixtures, beds, etc., \$9,115.00.

Administrative equipment, \$1,127.00.

Changes required by the Fire Marshall:

1. Fire doors and partitions, \$5,024.00.

2. Sprinkler system expense, \$24,155.00.

Consultant fees on new heating plant design, \$3,000. X-ray equipment, \$13,738. Total Expense, \$57,250.00. These capital expenditures were made from the Sanatorium Fund. In addition, the Morgan Heights Sanatorium Board is contemplating a new heating boiler installation at cost of approximately \$60,000. This improvement will also be made from the Sanatorium Fund. Income from the care of patients in the medical unit as well as the care of tuberculosis patients from several other

Upper Peninsula counties, along with the exceptionally fine management of the institution, have enabled the Sanatorium Board to cover the cost of these improvements without making an additional request for funds from the Board of Supervisors.

Your committee wishes to thank Dr. J. R. Acocks, superintendent of Morgan Heights Sanatorium, for the very fine job that is being done in this county institution.



Honorable Chairman And Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan

Gentlemen:

Your Parks and Airport Committee held its annual inspection tour on September 11, 1963. The inspection began at the Marquette County Airport facilities. During this season the North-South runway was increased from 50 to 75 feet in paved width and holding pads 100 feet square were constructed at end end of the runway. A paved holding pad 150 feet square was also constructed at the west end of the East-West runway, and a 680 by 50 foot paved taxiway was constructed to connect the North-South runway with the Terminal Building apron. Other small paved aprons and taxiways were also constructed.

Along with these improvements, were the items of electrical duct installations. re-routing of electrical cables, relocation of runway lights, fence relocation, earth grading, drainage and turfing. The installation of a High Intensity Runway End Identifier System on each end of the East-West runway provides a positive visual aid to pilots in determining the ends of the East-West runway during instrument weather conditions. An underground gasoline facility with a storage capacity of 12,000 gallons each for 80 and 100 octane aviation gasoline was completed during this season as well as the completion of a street lighting system to provide light in all activity areas. The airport facility is very well managed and maintained and is, indeed, a credit to the people of Marquette County. At the Gwinn Park, the entrance and park roads were reconstructed and provide

for a smoother and easier flow of traffic through the park. An additional picnic area was also provided by removing trees and underbrush near the bathing area. Six new picnic tables were put into service and the bathing beach area was renewed with the placing of a sand fill.

At the Perkins Park, eleven trailer stalls were constructed and provided with electrical, water and sewage disposal services. A gravel ramp for launching small boats was also constructed this season. At the caretaker's home, the entire ceiling was insulated and the front porch and rear steps rebuilt.

Following is the attendance record at the two county parks during the 1963 season:

Perkins Park--10,275 visitors; 8,840 bathers; 414 camping parties.

Gwinn Park-7,575 visitors; 6,895 bathers; 24 camping parties.

Totals, both parks--17,850 visitors; 15,735 bathers; 438 camping parties.

October 9, 1963 Honorable Chairman And Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan

Gentlemen:

The Highways and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour and inspection on October 8, 1963, and wishes to report the progress made on county roads during the 1963 season.

On County Road 553 from the Carp River southerly a distance of 1.1 miles, a relocation project is being carried out under contract with A. Lindberg and Sons at a cost of \$122,675.28. The cost is being paid by the Federal Government, the City of Marquette, and the County Road Commission. As of October 1, 1963, the project was 95% completed. From the south end of this project, another relocation project extending southerly 1.67 miles was completed under contract with A. Lindberg and Sons at a cost of \$155,421.20. This project was paid for equally by the Federal Government and the Road Commission. Blacktop surface and gravel shoulder construction of this portion of Road 553 has been completed this season by County Road forces.

County Road 480 was resurfaced with blacktop from Negaunee City easterly to U.S.-41, a distance of 14.3 miles. The Federal Government and the Road Commission shared the contract cost of \$134,387.00. In addition, road grade improvements in preparation for blacktopping was carried out by the Road Sjoholm, Smith, Swanson, Commission at a cost of

\$42,000.00. All of the work on this project was done by Road Commission forces.

On County Road 583, road base improvements and bituminous aggregate surface

On County Road 583, road improvements and bituminous aggregate surface construction operations were carried out on the road from U.S.-41 to the North Lake Location, a distance of 0.4 mile at a cost of \$4,317.00

In Forsyth Township, 1.5 miles of County Road 557 was relocated by Road Commission forces at a cost of \$85,334.40, and in Humboldt Township 1 mile of bituminous aggregate surface construction was completed on County Road 601.

On the local road system, the construction of a bridge over the Chocolay River on Road BAA and the blacktopping of 1.99 miles of roads and streets was carried out during the season in cooperation with the Chocolay Township Board. The bridge was constructed under contract with the Mattila Construction Company of Houghton at a total cost of \$54, 150.00. Street and road grade improvements and blacktop construction was completed at a cost of approximately \$35,000.00. Also in co-operation with Champion, Chocolay, Marquette, Negaunee and Sands Townshkps 17.31 miles of bituminous aggregate surface construction was completed during this season.

In summary, 34.58 miles of roads were blacktopped, 17.27 miles on the Primary Road System, and 17.31 miles on the Local Road System.

Future projects include improvement of the following roads:

County Road 456 from M-35 to County Road 545 in Forsyth Township.

County Road 553 from the Carp River Bridge to Pioneer Road in the City of Marnuette.

County Road 557 from the County Road EA southerly for 1.5 miles in Forsyth Township.

County Road 601 from the Humboldt Mine to County Road 438 in Humboldt Town-

County Road 601 south of the Village of Republic in Republic Township.

Local road paving projects will be carried out in cooperation with the Townships of Forsyth, Humboldt, and Republic.

In addition to the above projects, the Road Commission carried out its normal summer and winter maintenance operations throughout the county.

Your Finance and Taxation Committee recommends that the various departments in the Court House and Jail Group keep within the budgets as adopted an the annual meeting and that no clerk hire or salaries be paid beyond the amount fixed by the Board of Supervisors.

In the case of an emergency or in case a department requires additional funds or needs some special equipment which could not be foreseen at the time of the annual meeting, we recommend that the head of that department, together with the Controller, present the matter to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration and that they grant, where deemed necessary, authority to exceed the figures established in the annual budget.

If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget or any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend that authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

It is further recommended that any credit balances existing at the close of the fiscal year in the Social Welfare Fund and Direct Relief Fund be transferred to the Social Welfare Department Revolving Fund to apply against possible future deficits of the Department of Social Welfare.


