



Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan

Gentlemen:

Your Budget and Executive Committee has had under consideration the matter of providing additional office space for the State of Michigan Department of Social Aid in the Court House. The recent enactment of the ADC-U bill and the liberalization of the Aid to Disabled program will increase the case load on the Department of Social Aid so that office space will be needed to accommodate a proposed increase in staff from eight to 15 persons and additional office space to accommodate client traffic.

The County of Marquette is obliged by law to provide adequate office space for this agency, and your committee gave first consideration to whatever changes were necessary to accommodate the agency in the Court House rather than secure expensive rental space within the city.

It has been determined that

the requirements Michigan Department of Social Aid can be met by assigning them the additional rooms now occupied by the Agriculture and Extension Service, and by partitioning six of the seven rooms which then make up the offices of the Department of Social Aid, all located in the north half of the lower floor of the Court House. The Agriculture and Extension Service office can be moved into the area composed of the west anteroom to the Board of Supervisors' Room and the south half of the connecting corridor, which corridor will require a partition.

The need for these changes and office improvements was not known at the time of the last meeting of the Board of Supervisors and, since there is a great urgency that the adequate office space be provided with the least possible delay, your committee authorized a call for bids on the construction of the needed partitions. Bids received were as follows:

Menze Construction Company, Marquette, Michigan, \$2,290.00.

Mercure & Diedrich, Marquette, Michigan, \$1,934.41. Your committee recommends that the Board of Supervisors approve the improvement of the office space for the Michigan Department of Social Aid as outlined in this report; that the bid of Mercure and Diedrick, Marquette, Michigan, in the sum

of \$1,934.41 be accepted, and that the Board of Supervisors authorize an emergency budget appropriation from the General Fund to cover the total cost of this improvement.



Your Parks and Airport Contact Committee to whom was referred the request for assured airplane maintenance service at the Marquette County Airport and other problems reported in the administration of this facility, wishes to report that the matter was considered by your committee at its meetings held on January 7, 1964, and April 8, 1964

On the matter of providing assured airplane maintenance service, your commitee wishes to report that an agreement has been com-

pleted between the Marquette County Airport Committee and Northern Airmotive, effective April 1, 1964, wherein Northern Airmotive leases the hangars, line office, gasoline concession and all tie-down areas for the purpose of storage, service, repair and maintenance of aircraft in the hangar buildings, storage in the tie-down area, sales of gasoline and oil, flight activities and sales of aircraft. The term of the agreement extends to September 30, 1965, with provisions for renewal, and should provide airplane owners and operators with adequate maintenance and other services at the county airport.

Your committee wishes to further report that a liaison committee has been formed from among local pilots to contact your County Airport Commitee for discussion and solution to any administrative problems which might require attention. 



The following report of the Budget and Executive Committee was read. Supervisor Altobello moved it be adopted. Supported by Supervisor Rautio and carried unanimously.

August 11, 1964

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan

Gentlemen:

Your Budget and Executive Committee, to whom was referred the matter of dog control for study, wishes to report that this matter has been considered by your committee at its meetings held on July 13 and August 10, 1964.

Because of the tremendous size of Marquette County, your committee believes that it is not economically feasible to establish a county dog warden system here. To effectively cover the entire county would require the building of shelters and the employment of such a staff of personnel as to place an unnecessarily large burden upon the tax roll, causing an increase in property taxes county-wide.

Your committee further believes that the matter of dog control is more effectively and economically handled by each governmental unit. The three cities and many of the townships are now providing their own services and it is your committee's recommendation that this system be continued. The county is now providing the licenses and tags for the yearly licensing of dogs and is also paying claims for livestock damages which from time to time are cleared through our justice courts as provided in the law. Cases involving vicious dogs and other aggravated dog problems have been handled in the past and can continue to be handled by the Sheriff's Department. During a one year period from July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, only 40 dog problem cases were reported to the Sheriff's Department for the entire county. Of these cases 24 were referred to State, City or Township police or the Humane Society; 15 were handled by telephone and one required personal contact involving 6 miles of travel. The small number of cases reported would indicate that in most areas within the County, the dog problem is already under reasonable control.

More than ten years ago, the County of Marquette agreed to reurn to each city or township all dog license


fees collected within their units so that monies collected for dog control could be used for that purpose at the individual unit level. Your committee recommends hat the Board of Supervisors continue the present system of rebating dog license fees and allowing each city and township to plan and operate its own dog control program, this being the most economical and effective way for the taxpayers to handle this problem.



Highways and Bridges Committee was read, and on motion of Sup. H. Larson and supported by Sup. Jenkin, the report of the Highways and Bridges Committee was accepted. Carried unanimously.

Honorable Chairman And Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan

Gentlemen:

The Highways and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour and inspection on September 24, 1964, and wishes to report the progress made to county roads during the 1964 season.

On County Road 553, a re-

location project on 1.7 miles of highway from the Carp River northerly to Pioneer Avenue in the City of Marquette is being carried out by A. Lindberg & Sons at a contract cost of \$161,447.67. The cost is being paid by the Federal Government, the City of Marquette and the County Road Commission. At present, this project is about 75 per cent complete. Also on County Road 553 from the Carp River southerly a distance of 1.1 miles in Marquette City and Sands Township, blacktop surface and crushed gravel shoulder construction is being carried out at a total cost of \$10,245.00. This project is also being paid for by the Federal Government, City of Marquette and the Road Commission.

On County Road 456, highwas improvement is being made by County Road forces on 3.63 miles of roadway from County Road 545 southerly to Little Lake. On this project, blacktop surface and crushed gravel Page 1

shoulders are being constructed. On 2.34 miles of this project, the road grade is being improved by removal of frost heave materials and the placing of sand lifts. Estimated cost of the completed project is \$90, 350.00.

Relocation of a portion of County Road 557 from Road EA southerly a distance of 1.46 miles was carried out by Road Commission forces in 1963. The present paving and shoulder construction project on this portion of highway is being carried out in cooperation with the Federal Government at a cost of \$14,420.00.

In addition, the following projects were started or completed during the 1964 season:

Road 565--0.59 miles of blacktop surface from M-35 in Forsyth Township.

Road 583--0.60 miles of blacktop surface from U.S. 41 to M-28 BR in Ishpeming Township.

Road 601--1.70 miles of blacktop surface from M-95 southerly in Republic Township.

Road 601--5.0 miles of blacktop surface from the Humboldt Mine to Road 478 in Humboldt Township.

In cooperation with the Forsyth, Ishpeming, Humboldt, Republic and Tilden Township Boards, 26.2 miles of blacktop surface were constructed on local roads in these townships. The projects required the placing of 29,261 tons of bituminous aggregate and provided 10.83 miles of blacktop surface in

Forsyth Township, 1.88 miles in Ishpeming Township, 7.06 miles in Humboldt Township, 2.32 miles in Republic Township, and 4.20 miles in Tilden Township. 13,929 tons of bituminous aggregate was also produced for the City of

Ishpeming.

In summary, 40.3/ miles of roads were blacktopped in 1964; 14.08 miles on the Primary Road System and 26.29 miles on the Local Road System.

In addition to the above projects, the Road Commission carried out its normal summer and winter maintenance operations throughout the county.

important part in the further development of our county. It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors approve the project and the request for a pro-rate share of the cost involved; Marquette County's share, however, not to exceed \$200.

Dear Mr. Corneliuson:

The Marquette County Economic Study Committee has been interested in developing a program for the inventory of ground and surface waters in Marquette Coun-

ty. The reason for this definite interest is due to the fact that the shortage of water for the future could create a very definite problem for the continuation of expansion of industries in the Marquette County area.

Meetings with representatives from both the State and Federal Geological agencies indicate that the main cost of this program can be authorized through Federal expenditures, but the preliminary cost would be approximately \$2,000.00. The preliminary cost would be on a 50-50 financial basis with the Federal Gov-

ernment sharing half the cost and private funds sharing the other half of the costs. This means that for the preliminary study, the cost of private funds will be \$1,000.

The Marquette County Economic Study Committee is interested in knowing if the County of Marquette would be agreeable to an expenditure of funds in an amount that would not be more than a maximum of \$200.00, but could be less based on a pro-rata share depending upon the access of the amount of \$1,000.00.

This communication is addressed to your group so that same can be presented to the governing body of your community for further action as soon as possible.

It is requested than an answer to this communication be transmitted to the Marquette County Economic Study Committee in time for its next regular meeting which will be held on October 14, 1964.


