

Gentlemen:

Your Finance and Taxation Committee recommends that the various departments in the Court House and Jail Group keep within the budgets as adopted at the annual meeting and that no clerk hire or salaries be paid beyond the amount fixed by the Board of Supervisors.

In the case of an emergency or increase, a department requires additional funds or needs some special equipment which could not be foreseen at the time of the annual meeting, we recommend that the head of that department, together with the Controller, present the matter to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration and that they grant, where deemed necessary, authority to exceed the figures established in the annual budget.

If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend that authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

It is further recommended that any credit balances existing at the close of the fiscal year in the Social Welfare fund and Direct Relief fund be transferred to the Social Welfare Department Revolving Fund to apply against possible future deficits of the Department of Social Welfare.



Moved by Supervisor Ilo-Maki and supported by Supervisor LaPin that the resolution be adopted and copies sent the Interstate Commerce Commission and the Michigan Public Service Commission. Carried.

Whereas, The Lake Superior and Ishpeming Railroad Company and the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company have jointly operated an interchange track at Republic Junction in the western part of Marquette County from October, 1957, to July, 1965, for the purpose of handling loaded and empty cars between the two railroads at that point, and

Whereas, the right to operate the interchange track was discontinued by order of the Interstate Commerce Commission in July, 1965, cutting off the availability of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad service to the users in the

western end of Marquette County, and

Whereas, The closing of this interchange track has affected the supply of freight cars which, in many instances, is critical, and has caused delay in the shipment of iron ore and wood products from the Republic area, and

Whereas, The use of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad through the interchange track provides a much shorter route from the western end of Marquette County to the Chicago area than is had by the other railroads servicing this area and the resulting savings in transportation costs affects the production and sale of products produced in Marquette County, which in turn directly affects the economy of the area as a whole, and

Whereas, A petition has been filed by the Lake Superior and Ishpeming Railroad Company with the Interstate Commerce Commission on July 29, 1965, (Finance Docket No. 23758) requesting the right to reinstate the interchange track at Republic Junction and pub-

lic hearings on the matter are to be held at some future time.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, That the Marquette County Board of Supervisors in the interest of encouraging economical and rapid railroad transportation in and out of the western part of Marquette County does hereby urge the Interstate Commerce Commission to grant the petition of the Lake Superior and Ishpeming Railroad Company and the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company, and

Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Interstate Commerce Commission and to the Michigan Public Service Commission.

Whereas, the Marquette County Board of Supervisors received notice from the Michigan State Highway Department, dated November 5, 1965, indicating that a study is being made of this highway and that an ultimate trunkline for this area is in the planning state but, due to limited funds, it is doubful that construction will be realized until after 1972; and

Whereas, The Marquette County Board of Supervisors feels that very special consideration should be given this road reconstruction at a very early date for the reasons stated in its resolution dated September 22, 1965; namely, that the high-

way has had only the barest of maintenance for many years and is now in such poor condition that it is extremely hazardous to travel it; that the greatly expanded mining operations in the Negaunee area and the very large concentration of population at K. I. Sawyer Air Force Base, which was developed during the past several years, has caused a tremendous increase of travel on this highway; and

Whereas, The Marquette County Board of Supervisors believes that this extremely hazardous condition should not be permitted to exist, especially not for such a long period of time as is indicated by the State Highway Department in its communication dated November 5, 1965.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the Marquette County Board of Supervisors again petition the State Highway Department to give special consideration to the rebuilding of M-35 from Negaunee to Gwinn with a view to scheduling the construction at an earlier date and to do whatever else may be required to make this improvement immediately.

It was moved by Sup. Dompierre, and supported by Sup. Sandstrom, that Dr. S. J. Bessolo of Negaunee be appointed to succeed himself on the Morgan Heights Board of Trustees. Carried.

It was moved by Sup. Walimaa, and supported by Sup. H. Larson, that the Procedure Manual of the Board be accepted as revised. Carried.

The Chairman made several remarks about the County Clerk and the Register of Deeds going into the abstract business.

The chairman also stated that the Clerk and Register of Deeds actions may be illegal. It was agreed that the Clerk, along with the Chairman, Prosecuting Attorney, and County Controller have a conference to try to attempt to straighten things out.



CORRECTION--DECEMBER 22, 1965 MEETING

The following report of the Budget and Executive Committee was omitted from the minutes of the December 22, 1965, meeting of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors published in the January 7, 1966, edition of The Iron Herald:

December 14, 1965

Honorable Chairman And Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan

Gentlemen:

Your Budget and Executive Committee has had under consideration the audit report for Marquette County, which was recently submitted by the Auditor General and which covers the year 1964. The audit report indicates that transactions and accounting matters are in order with the exception of two items which require the attention of the Board of Supervisors.

For a number of years, the County Clerk has retained one half of the naturalization fees as part of his compensation, as is provided by law, but no provision was made for this retention at

the time the Board of Supervisors set all county officers on salary only basis, with all fees reverting to the General Fund of the county. The auditor general stated that if it had been the intention of the Board of Supervisors to allow the retention of a portion of these fees that it should have been set forth in the proceedings of the board at the time the salaries were established.

Your committee believes that it is not the intention of the Board of Supervisors to allow the retention of a portion of the naturalization fees by the County Clerk and recommends that the Board of Supervisors require the total fees to be deposited in the General Fund of the county in the future.

The other matter requiring action of the Board of Supervisors pertains to two installment contracts which were entered into by the County Airport Committee, one for the purchase of two gasoline delivery trucks, and the other for the installation of underground gasoline storage facilities. Both contracts were negotiated in 1963, and were intended to be paid in approximately 5 years. At the present time, there remains unpaid on the

two contracts the sum of \$5,040.62, of which the sum of \$2,735.88 is included in the 1966 budget appropriation. If this sum were paid on the contracts during 1966, this would leave an outstanding balance at the end of 1966 of \$2,304.74, plus interest. The Attorney General states that installment contracts extending beyond the current budget year are not authorized by statute. In order to comply with his request to correct the matter, your committee recommends that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Airport Committee to make final payment of the contracts by exceeding its 1966 budget allowance by approximately \$2,300.00 and to include the resulting deficit in its 1967 budget.
