and not to relocate it. To do a proper job would involve expenditure of over a million and one half dollars, and the Road Commission is taking a good look at the situation because it may be advisable to rebuild 480 from the Junction in Eagle Mills to Negaunee as the alternative. The Road Commission feels that this may be the answer to those people West of Negaunee who have to travel to the Empire Mine at Palmer.

Supervisor Walimaa asked the Superintendent about the Speed Limits on U.S. 41 in the West Ishpeming area. It seems that the present posted area is not extended far enough. The Road Commission has asked the State Highway Department to extend the posted area but that nothing has been done on the matter for over a year.

Supervisor Walimaa moved that a letter to the State Highway Department inquiring as to the delay would be in order. Supported by Supervisor Jenkin. Carried.

Supervisor Maki spoke about the exhaust smoke from the pellet plants in the vicinity of Morgan Heights. The



The Marquette County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to a call duly made at the Court House in the City of Marquette on Wednesday, the 19th day of July, 1967 A.D. at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, James L. Dompierre.

The roll being called, the following Supervisors were present: Altobello, Ball, Beaudry, Brunngraeber, Carlyon, DeGroot, Dom-pierre, Draver, Gasbarro, Goldsworthy, Hammer-schmidt, Ilo-Maki, Joseph, Krook, Kurin, LaPin, Larson H., Lawer, Linjala, Maki, Mattson, Menhennick, Moore Morrison, Norell, Pearce, Pellonpaa, Phare, Price, Russo, Rydholm, Salmio, Sandstrom, Sjoholm, Swanson, Vadnais, Walimaa, Weiland, Wiseman and Yelle. ommends that effective July 1, 1967, a salary adjustment of \$30.00 per month be granted all full time employees as well as the following elected officials: Sheriff, Prosecuting Attorney, County Clerk, County Treasurer, and Register of Deeds; that half-time employees receive an increase of \$15.00 per month and that the salary of the Mine Inspector be increased \$1.50 per work day, not to exceed 5 days per week.

The total cost to the General Fund for the recommended increases in salaries is \$6,-800.00 for the last half of 1967. There are sufficient

funds in the current operating budget, however, to cover this expense.
