Whereas, During all of this unusually long period of service, he has given comfort and professional aid to the many people within the area without regard to his own comfort or convenience, often under conditions of extreme hardship and, in many cases, without thought of payment, and

Whereas, Doctor, Paul Van Riper has also served his fellow citizens by serving as an official in township government, the local school board and on the County Board of Supervisors from 1916 to 1951, serving as Chairman of the Board of Supervisors from 1936 to 1939, and

Whereas, In all of these endeavors he has exercised the best of judgment, seeking only to help his fellow man, and

Whereas, The Marquette County Board of Supervisors has unanimously agreed that public recognition be given for the many fine contributions made by this outstanding citizen.

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the Board of Supervisors of Marquette County, Michigan, adopt this resolution; that the same be spread upon the minutes of its meeting and that an inscribed copy thereof be delivered to Doctor Van Riper.

Supervisor Sjolholm asked about the Status of Road 476 between Palmer and National Mine. Supervisor Shroeger stated due to the large amount of money that would be required to relocate and rebuild this road, the Road Commission is considering only to re-work 476,



and not to relocate it. To do a proper job would involve expenditure of over a million and one half dollars, and the Road Commission is taking a good look at the situation because it may be advisable to rebuild 480 from the Junction in Eagle Mills to Negaunee as the alternative. The Road Commission feels that this may be the answer to those people West of Negaunee who have to travel to the Empire Mine at Palmer.

Supervisor Walimaa asked the Superintendent about the Speed Limits on U.S. 41 in the West Ishpeming area.

It seems that the present posted area is not extended far enough. The Road Commission has asked the State Highway Department to extend the posted area but that nothing has been done on the matter for over a year.

Supervisor Walimaa moved that a letter to the State Highway Department inquiring as to the delay would be in order. Supported by Supervisor Jenkin. Carried.

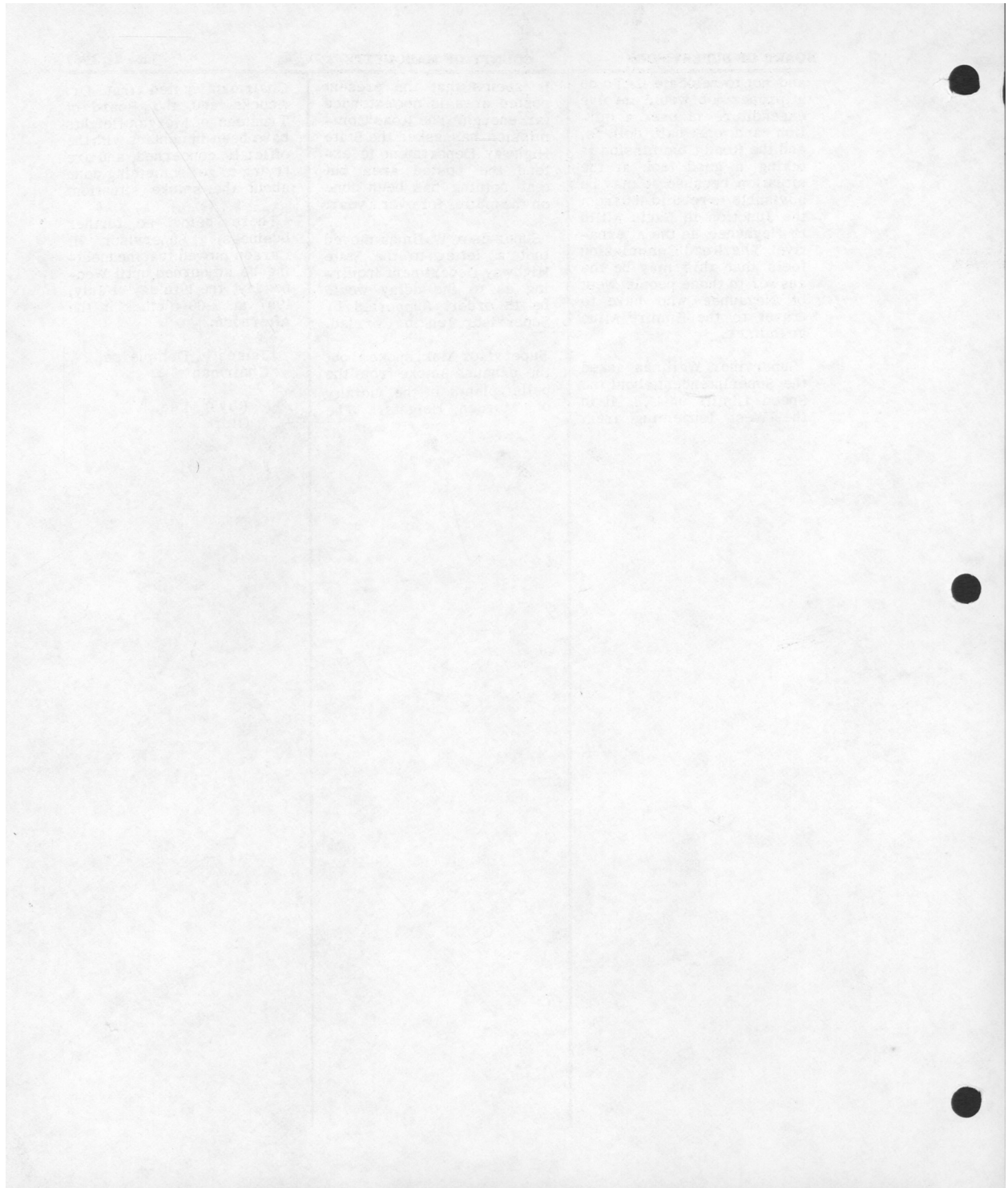
Supervisor Maki spoke about the exhaust smoke from the pellet plants in the vicinity of Morgan Heights. The

✓The Chairman stated that before the regular business was begun, a plaque would be presented to Dr. Acocks of Morgan Heights for the recognition of his services rendered to the people of the County in his capacity as Superintendent of Morgan Heights for the past 20 years. Dr. Acocks was seated beside the Chairman, and after several remarks by the Chairman commending Dr. Acocks for his faithful service and foresight in making Morgan Heights the fine institution that it is, he was presented with the plaque.

The Chairman then proceeded with the regular order of business. It was moved by Supervisor Morrison and supported by Supervisor Altobello that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous

meeting. Carried.

✓A letter from the Michigan Department of State Highways regarding the posting of Speed Limits on U.S. 41 in Ishpeming Township was read and ordered filed.

✓A letter from the Road Commission regarding the road between Ishpeming and Palmer (476) was read. The Road Commission decided that the prohibitive cost of relocating this road was way out of line and have instead decided to proceed with improvement of Road 480.

✓A letter from the County Board of Health regarding payment for meetings was read. Moved by Supervisor H. Larson and supported by Supervisor Altobello that the Board allow them the same rate per diem as all other appointed boards and commissions, that being \$20.00 per diem plus 10¢ per mile. ✓A report from the B & E Committee on the bids for the sewer project from the Jail to Spring Street was read. The only bid received was that of Levine Bros. Plumbing and Heating of Marquette in the amount of \$1,545.00. Moved by Supervisor Altobello and supported by Supervisor Rydholm that the report be approved and the contract be awarded Levine Bros. Before the roll call vote was taken, Supervisor Morrison disclosed that he owned a substantial interest in Levine Bros., and that the Board be made aware of his interest in the contract. ✓A report from the B & E Committee on a special request from Mr. MelNyquist, the County Agent, to attend a summer school at Boyne

Falls on July 24-27 was read. This would not take the place of the regular annual meeting which the Board normally allows and the only cost to the county would be for room and board. No mileage, as the state will pay automobile costs. Moved by Supervisor Altobello and supported by Supervisor Linjala that the report be approved. Carried on a roll call vote, all present voting aye.

✓A report of the B & E Committee recommending the Board support Senate Bill 132 and House Bill 2956, which would provide that the State would pay 50% of foster care services and that this would provide an additional \$10,700.00 to the county annually. Moved by Supervisor Altobello and supported by Supervisor Wiseman that the report be approved and copies sent to Governor Romney, Senator Mack and Representative Jacobetti. Carried.
