The Marquette County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to a call duly made at the Court House in the City of Marquette, the 23rd day of August, A.D., 1967 at 2:00 o'clock p.m. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, James L. Dompierre.

The roll being called, the following Supervisors were present: Altobello, Backlund, Ball, Beaudry, Brunngraeber, Carlyon, DeGroot, Dompierre, Draver, Gasbarro, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Ilo-Maki, Jenkin, Joseph, Krook, Kurin, LaPin, Larson, E., Larson, H., Lawer, Linjala, Maki, Mattson, Menhennick, Moore Morrison, McCracken, Norell, Pearce, Pellonpaa, Phare, Price, Russo, Rydholm, Salmio, Sandstrom, Sjolholm, Swanson, Walimaa, Weiland, Wiseman, Yelle.

Moved by Supervisor Morrison, and supported by Supervisor Rydholm that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting. Carried.

✓ A request was read from the Sheriff to attend an instructional seminar at East Lansing in lieu of the Sheriff's Convention which he was unable to attend because of pressing business. It was moved by Supervisor Beaudry and supported by Supervisor Altobello that the request be approved. All present voting aye on a roll call vote.

✓ In behalf of Santini, Jacobs and MacDonald, attorneys of Ironwood, Michigan, Prosecuting Attorney Edward A. Quinnell presented a claim against the County of Marquette in the sum of \$150,000 resulting from the death of Clarence Saari at the Mar-

quette County Jail on April 13, 1967. It was recommended by the Prosecuting Attorney that the claim be denied and rejected by the Board of Supervisors. Moved by Supervisor Moore, supported by Supervisor Rydholm that the Supervisors concur with the recommendation of the Prosecuting Attorney in this matter. Supervisors Lawer, Menhennick and Walimaa abstained from voting. The Chairman then requested the Prosecuting Attorney to interpret Rule 22 of the procedure manual of the Board of Supervisors, which requires each Supervisor to declare openly and without debate his assent or dissent to the question unless for special reasons he shall be excused by unanimous consent of the Board. At this point Supervisor Walimaa stated he had abstained from voting on the motion for the reason that he lacked information regarding the Saari claim. The Prosecuting Attorney then gave a brief explanation of the circumstances surrounding the claim. **SANITARY CODE  
OF THE  
MARQUETTE COUNTY  
HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

**Article I  
General Provisions**

**SECTION 1  
TITLE**

The rules and regulations contained herein together with duly enacted amendments thereto shall be known as the Sanitary Code of the Marquette County Department of Health.

**SECTION 2  
DEFINITIONS**

When used in the said Sanitary Code, unless otherwise expressly stated:

**GENERAL DEFINITIONS**

When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in singular number include the plural number, and words in the plural number include the singular number. The word "Shall" is always mandatory, and not merely directory. Words and terms not defined herein shall be interpreted in the manner of their common usage.

**Jurisdiction—Section 5 C. L. 1948**

327.205 The county health department shall have jurisdiction throughout the county in both indigent and non-indigent cases, except that it shall not have jurisdiction in non-indigent cases in cities having an organized health department with full time health officer, except that such cities may elect to join with the county in the organization. Subject to the approval of the board of supervisors, the county health department shall have the power to employ such physicians and nurses full or part time as shall be necessary to carry on its work. The above outline powers shall not be deemed to be exclusive and the County Board of Health shall

be vested with powers granted under any other appropriate Act or Acts.

**Board of Health**—The term "Board of Health" shall mean the Board of Health appointed by the Marquette County Board of Supervisors.

**Health Department** — The term "Health Department" shall mean the Marquette County Health Department.

**Health Officer**—The term "Health Officer" shall mean the Director of the Marquette County Health Department, and/or his authorized representative.

**Sanitary Code**—"Sanitary Code" shall mean and comprise the rules and regulations now or hereafter formulated, promulgated and adopted by the Board of Health.

**Person**—The term "Person" shall mean natural persons, individuals, firms, partnerships, corporations, companies, societies and associations, and every agent, officer, or employee of any thereof.

**SECTION 3  
REGULATIONS**

The Health Officer is hereby authorized and empowered to make and promulgate all reasonable rules and regulations necessary to enforce the provisions of this code.

**SECTION 4  
HANDLING OF FEES**

All fees collected by the Health Officer shall be receipted for and be deposited with the treasurer of Marquette County to the credit of the Health Department.

**SECTION 5  
PENALTY**

Any person, firm or corporation who shall fail to comply with any of the provisions herein, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court for each offense.

**SECTION 6  
UNCONSTITUTIONALITY  
CLAUSE**

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of these regulations is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of these regulations.

**SECTION 7  
INTERFERENCE WITH  
NOTICES**

No person shall remove, mutilate or conceal any notice or placard of the Department of Health posted in or on any premises or public place except by permission of the Health Officer or an authorized representative thereof.

**SECTION 8  
SPECIAL PROVISIONS**

The regulations of this Code are supplemental to the regulations, rules and orders of the Michigan Department of Health, Public Health Law, and other laws of the State of Michigan relating to public health and shall as to matters to which it refers supersede all local ordinances heretofore or hereafter enacted inconsistent therewith.

**SECTION 9  
INSPECTION GENERALLY**

a. All premises affected by the regulations of this code shall be subject to inspection by the Health Officer or his authorized representative, and if any violation of the Sanitary Code exists on any such premises, any permit granted by the Health Officer may be suspended forthwith.

b. No person shall refuse to permit any officer or employee of the Department of Health fully and freely to inspect any and all premises and no person shall molest or resist any officer or employee of the Department of Health in the discharge of his duty.

**SECTION 10  
ISSUANCE OF LICENSES**

Nothing herein contained shall be construed to restrict or abrogate the authority of any municipality in Marquette County to adopt and enforce additional ordinances or to enforce existing ordinances relating to the regulation, control of issuance of licenses or the renewal or revocation thereof, or to charge and collect a fee therefore; provided, that whenever inspection relating to health or sanitation is required no such municipality shall issue or renew such license without first having obtained written approval from the Department of Health indicating compliance with the provisions of the Sanitary Code.

**SECTION 11**

**REVIEW OF DECISIONS,  
APPEALS, HEARING**

- 11.1 Review of any decision made by the health officer in the enforcement of these regulations shall be granted by the health officer upon a request for such review stating the reason for such review, by the person aggrieved or by any officer, department, or board having any interest therein. Such request shall be made in writing within thirty (30) days of the ruling. A decision to uphold or revise the action in question shall be rendered in writing within seven (7) days after receipt of such request.
- 11.2 The Board of Health of Marquette County shall serve as a Board of Appeals to act upon appeals arising from the decisions rendered by the health officer in the enforcement of these regulations.
- 11.3 Persons who, after a review is held, remain dissatisfied with the initial decision of the health officer or that rendered after the review, may appeal either or both decisions by filing with the Board of Appeals and with the health

officer, a notice of said appeal specifying the grounds on which the appeal is made. Such notice shall be filed not later than thirty (30) days following the decisions rendered by the health officer after a review has been held as provided for in Section 11.1.

- 11.4 The Board of Appeals shall fix a reasonable time for hearing of the appeal, within thirty (30) days of receiving such appeal, shall give due notice thereof to interested parties and shall decide the same not more than fifteen (15) days following such hearing. Within the time limits of its jurisdiction, herein above described, said Board shall have all the powers of the health office from whom said appeal is taken, and may make such interim orders as may be appropriate.
- 11.5 The decision of such Board shall be final, subject only to further review by any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 11.6 The Board of Appeals shall meet at such times as the Board may determine and shall adopt its own rules of procedure and keep a record of its proceedings, showing the questions considered. A simple majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

**SECTION 12**

**PUBLICATION OR RULES AND  
REGULATIONS**

All rules and regulations adopted by the County Board of Health, other than emergency measures shall be published at least once in a legally qualified newspaper of general circulation in the County of Marquette, State of Michigan.

**SECTION 13**

**EFFECTIVE DATE OF RULES  
AND REGULATIONS**

All rules and regulations shall become effective on the 30th day

after the first publication unless the rule of regulation prescribes a later date.

**SANITARY CODE  
OF THE  
MARQUETTE COUNTY  
HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

**Article II**

There are hereby provided regulations relating to the construction, location and operation of certain sewage disposal systems within the County of Marquette.

**SECTION 1  
DEFINITIONS**

- 1.1 **Sanitary Sewage**—The term sanitary sewage shall mean human excreta as well as all wastes from toilets, urinals, sinks, laundries, shower baths, bathtub, dishwashers, garbage grinders, and septic tanks overflow or effluent.
- 1.2 **Industrial Wastes**—The term industrial wastes shall mean the liquid waste products from industrial processes as distinct from sanitary sewage.
- 1.3 **Tile Disposal Field**—The term tile disposal field shall mean a means of distributing septic tank over-flow or effluent below the ground surface by means of a line of drain tile or a series of branch lines of drain tile laid so as to allow the overflow of effluent to be absorbed by the surrounding soil.
- 1.4 **Premise**—The term premise shall mean any dwelling, building, or other place where human beings reside, are employed or congregate.
- 1.5 **Seasonal Premises** — Those premises intended for occupancy either continually or intermittently for a total period of not more than six months in any calendar year.
- 1.6 **Sewer**—The term sewer shall mean any enclosed watertight conduit for transporting sewage.
- 1.7 **Privy**—A building or other structure not connected with a sewage system or with properly

installed and operated sewage disposal system which is used for the reception, disposition, or storage, either temporarily or permanently, of feces or other excreta from the human body.

## SECTION 2

### SEWAGE AND EXCRETA DISPOSAL FOR ANY PREMISES

2.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to construct or maintain any premise which is not equipped with adequate facilities for the disposal of sewage in a sanitary manner. Such facilities shall be constructed in accordance with the provisions of these regulations. Under no conditions may the sewage from an existing or hereafter constructed premise be deposited upon the surface of the ground, into the underground water supply, into roadside ditches, water courses, inland lakes, or into any closed drain other than a sanitary sewer.

2.2 No septic tank system or privy shall be constructed on or moved to any premises where the service of a publicly operated sewage system is reasonably available to such premises. All such systems, flush toilets, lavatories, sinks, bathtubs, showers, and laundry drains hereafter constructed on premises where the services of a publicly operated sewerage system hereafter is made available shall connect with said publicly operated sewerage system.

2.3 Where a publicly operated sewerage system is not available, all flush toilets, lavatories, bathtubs, showers, laundry drains, and sinks and any similar fixture hereafter constructed to be used to conduct or receive water-carried sewage shall be connected to a septic tank or some other device in compliance with these regulations and the requirements of the Michigan Department of Public Health and any other applicable laws, ordinances, and regulations: Provided that such facilities existing at the time of the adoption of these regulations which constitute or become a nuisance or men-

ace to public health in the opinion of the health officer shall be connected to a septic tank or other approved device and finally disposed of in compliance with these regulations and the requirements of the Michigan Department of Public Health. Footing, drainage, roof waters and other waste water not defined as sewage shall not be connected to or discharged into the septic tank system or into the sewage disposal area.

2.4 The location, construction, and maintenance of all privies shall conform to the "Privy Law and Regulations of the Michigan Department of Public Health" (Act 273 Public Acts of 1939).

## SECTION 3

### INDUSTRIAL WASTES

3.1 It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to dispose of industrial wastes in a manner which tends to create a dangerous condition, or creates a menace to health or safety, or impairs the use of any person of any lake, stream, or other body of water.

## SECTION 4

### CONSTRUCTION PERMITS REQUIRED

4.1 It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation to construct, install or cause to be installed any septic tank, tile disposal field, cesspool, or other device for the disposal of sewage without first obtaining a permit from the Marquette County Health Department. It shall be necessary to obtain a septic tank permit from the Marquette County Health Department prior to the issuance of a building permit by the local governmental unit. Application for such permits shall be made in writing in a manner and on forms furnished by the Marquette County Health Department.

4.2 **Expiration of Permits**—Permits issued for the installation of a sewage disposal system shall be in effect for two (2) years from date of issue.

4.3 **Permit Fee**—A fee of five

(\$5.00) dollars shall be charged for each permit issued for the installation of a septic tank sewage disposal facility as herein defined. This fee shall be made payable by the applicant to the Marquette County Health Department, which shall be handled as stated in Section 4, Article 1, of the General Provisions.

## SECTION 5

### SOIL SUITABILITY

5.1 All proposed plats and subdivisions shall have the approval of the Marquette County Health Department prior to the acceptance of the plat or subdivisions by the Township, City or Village when so described. Such approval to be based on percolation tests, soil borings and other such tests as may be deemed necessary to determine the suitability of the proposed area for private sewage disposal.

5.2 In the case of subdivisions, percolation tests shall be performed by a registered engineer or qualified Sanitarian.

5.3 On subdivisions, the number and location of soil borings and percolation tests shall be determined by the Marquette County Health Department.

5.4 A minimum of one (1) percolation test will be made on each building site in the area where the proposed tile field is to be located. On individual lots, any person may perform the percolation test in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the Marquette County Health Department.

5.5 The Marquette County Health Department may refuse to issue a septic tank permit when in its opinion the data derived from percolation tests and soil borings reveal heavy soils, long percolation times, or percolation rates less than two minutes, or high subsurface water tables.

5.6 The Marquette County Health Department may refuse to issue a septic tank permit for the installation of a system in frozen soil when in its opinion such installation would not be conducive to

the proper operation of the systems.

#### SECTION 6

##### Requirements for the Construction and Location of Septic Tank Sewage Disposal Systems

It shall be unlawful to alter, construct, or locate a septic tank sewage disposal system unless it conforms to the following requirements:

6.1 Septic tanks shall be located not less than five feet from all building foundations, 10 feet from all property lines, 25 feet from all lakes, streams and other bodies of water, 50 feet from all private water supplies, 75 feet from all water supplies used by or available to the public, 200 feet from all municipal water supplies. By water supply is meant the well casing through which drinking water is obtained by means of a pump and the suction pipe between the well casing and the pump.

6.2 The septic tank shall be constructed of materials not subject to excessive corrosion or decay, such as concrete, heavy weight concrete blocks, hard-burned brick coated metal, vitrified clay or other material approved by the Marquette County Health Department. Tanks constructed of bricks or concrete blocks shall be at least eight (8) inches thick. The tanks shall be of water tight construction and shall have a liquid capacity of not less than 500 gallons except that those used for seasonal premises shall have a liquid capacity of not less than 300 gallons. A straight inlet shall be provided. The outlet shall be so constructed as to permit the withdrawal of liquid from the area of the middle third of the depth of the liquid in the tank, and to prevent the escape of floating or settled solids. The outlet shall be located not less than one inch below the bottom of the inlet.

The tank shall be provided with manholes of sufficient size to facilitate the inspection and cleaning

of the tank. The septic tank may consist of two compartments provided that the first compartment have a capacity equal to  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{2}{3}$  the total capacity. No sewer connecting the building served and the septic tank shall be installed within 10 feet of a private or semi-public water supply or within 200 feet of municipal water supply.

All such sewers installed within 50 feet of a private water supply, or 75 feet of a semi-public water supply shall be of cast iron service weight or its equal, not less than four inches in diameter, shall have leaded joints and shall be laid with not less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch drop per foot.

Such sewers shall contain no 90° ells, and accessible cleanouts shall be provided at all 45° ells. Sewers located more than 50 feet from private water supplies, 75 feet from semi-public water supplies and 200 feet from municipal water supplies may be constructed of vitrified bell and spigot tile with slip seal or cemented joints, or other approved material.

##### 6.3 Tile Disposal Field

All septic tanks shall be connected to a sub-surface tile disposal field complying with the following requirements:

The disposal field shall be located not less than ten feet from all building foundations, 15 feet from all property lines, 50 feet from all lakes, streams and other bodies of water, 75 feet from all private water supplies, 100 feet from all water supplies available to or used by the public, 200 feet from all municipal water supplies. The disposal field shall not drain into any open ditch, highway drain, county drain, storm drain, lake, stream or other body of water nor shall it be permitted to drain to the surface of the ground. Dry wells, seepage pits and other methods of disposing of effluent shall be used only when deemed necessary and ap-

proved by the Marquette County Health Department prior to construction. Construction of disposal trenches in unstable or unsettled filled ground will not be approved.

Tile disposal fields shall contain not less than two lines and the length of each line shall not exceed 100 feet. The minimum trench width shall not be less than 18". Drain tile shall be covered with at least 12" or more than 30" of fill material. The slope or grade of tile lines shall not be less than 2" or greater than 4" in 100 feet. Tile lines shall be laid not less than 4 feet on centers. The subsurfaced tile system shall be constructed of 12" lengths of 4" agricultural drain tile or perforated non-metallic pipe acceptable to the Marquette County Health Department.

The top half of all open joints shall be covered with strips of heavy asphalt treated building paper, or other approved material. Stone fill material shall be 10 A washed stone, crushed stone or other material having sufficient voids and acceptable to the Marquette County Health Department. Such material may vary in size from  $\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  inch. Stone fill material shall be free from dust, sand or other excessively fine material. Tile fields shall not be laid less than 2' above any known water table.

##### 6.4 Sewers

Sewers between the septic tank and header or distribution box shall be bell and spigot with water tight joints or slip seal type of vitrified tile with watertight joints. All sewers used under driveways or other areas subject to heavy loads shall be cast iron or other equally durable material. Such sewers or pipe shall not be included in determining total amount of tile field. Drain tile used in the disposal field shall not be less than 4" in diameter and shall be laid with  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch open joints when field tile is used.



**SECTION 7  
SIZE OF SEPTIC TANKS AND  
TILE DISPOSAL FIELDS**

It shall be unlawful to alter, construct or install a septic tank and tile disposal field unless it conforms with the following requirements:

7.1 The minimum liquid capacity of septic tanks for premises of four bedrooms or less will be 500 gallons without the addition of a garbage disposal unit and 750 gallons when used in connection with a garbage disposal unit, except that for seasonal premises with garbage disposal units, the

minimum capacity shall be 500 gallons.

**7.2 Tile Disposal Field**

The size of the tile disposal field shall be based on the percolation test rate in accordance with the following schedule:

Times in excess of 60 minutes are unsuitable for the use of septic tank systems.

**SECTION 8  
FINAL INSPECTION**

8.1 It shall be unlawful to back fill any septic tank and tile disposal field installation until an inspection has been completed and approval granted by the Marquette County Health Department.

**SECTION 9  
SPECIAL INSTALLATION**

9.1 It shall be unlawful to install or construct a septic tank sewage or disposal system of 2000 gallons capacity or greater without first having a qualified architect or engineer submit plans in duplicate to the Marquette County Health Department for its approval.

9.2 The health officer may require that dosing tanks and auto-

matic siphons or pumps of the type approved by the Michigan Department of Public Health be used in installations where liquid capacity of the tank is over two thousand (2000) gallons.

**SECTION 10  
SANITARY SEWERS**

10.1 At such time as a public sanitary sewer becomes available to a property served by a private sewage disposal system a connection thereto shall be made within six months after receipt of written notification, and the use of all private systems shall be discontinued. The vaults of said systems shall be pumped and filled with rock or earth.

**SECTION 11  
VARIATIONS**

11.1 Where the provisions of these regulations make their application an undue hardship, and in the opinion of the health of-

ficer the public health can be protected by means other than those set forth in this code, variations to the provisions of this code may be approved in writing by the health officer.

11.2 An alternate method of sewage disposal may be approved by the health officer if it provides equal or better treatment than the minimum requirements provided herein.

**SECTION 12  
EFFECTIVE DATE**

These regulations shall take effect on the 1st day of January, 1968. Adopted by the Marquette County Board of Health on the 21st day of August, 1967.

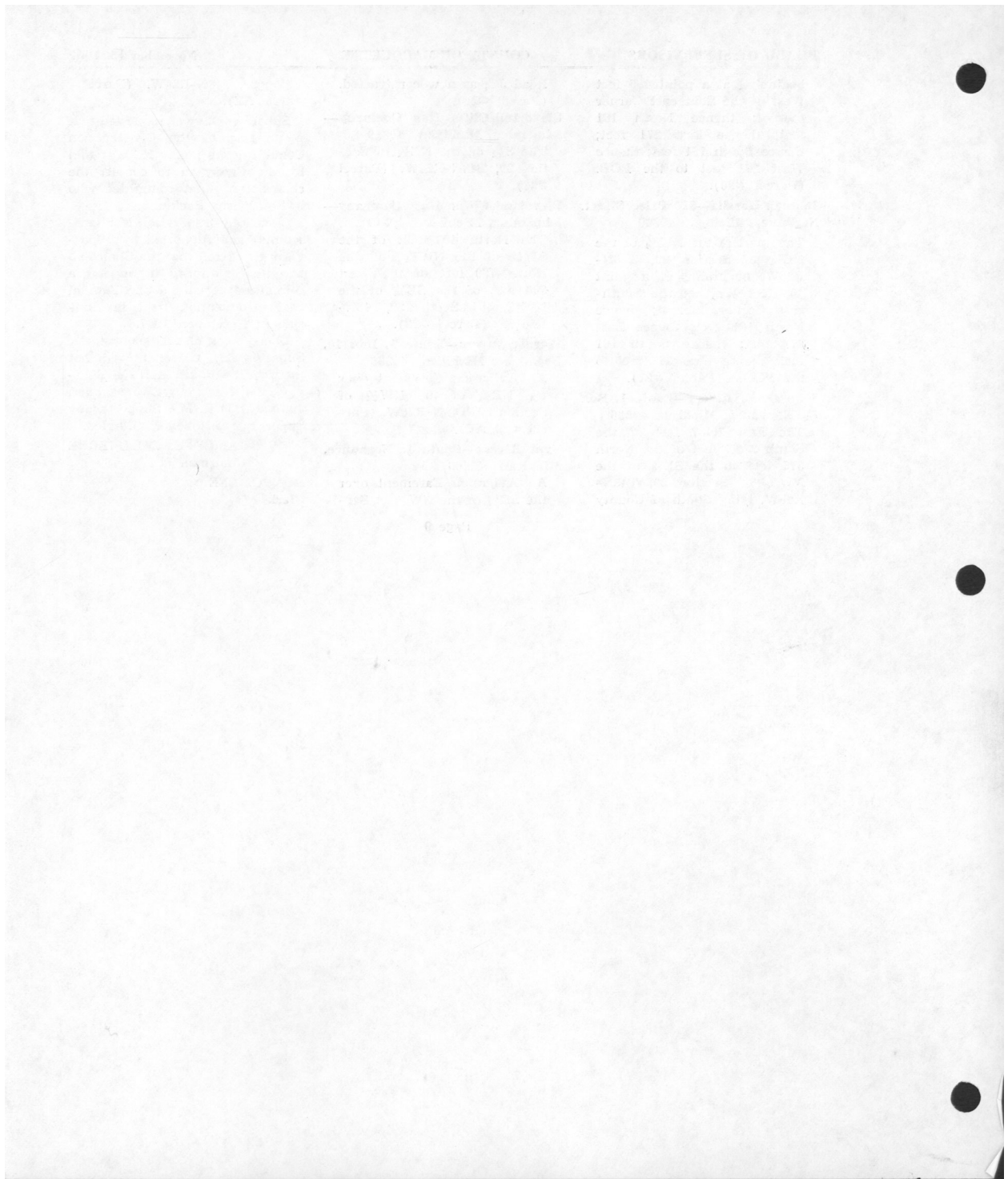
