#### RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AND APPROVING THE EXE-CUTION OF THE GRANT AGREEMENT BY THE COUN-AGREEMENT BY THE COUNTY OF MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING FEDERAL AID FOR THE DEVELOP-MENT OF THE MARQUETTE COUNTY AIRPORT UNDER PROJECT NO. 9-20-063-C906.

BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors of Marquette, Michigan:

Section I. That the County of Marquette shall enter into a Grant Agreement for the purpose of obtaining Federal aid for the development of the Marquette County Airport and that such Grant Agreement shall be set forth hereinbelow;

Section II. That the Chairman did on July 26, 1968 execute said Grant Agreement in

six copies on behalf of the County of Marquette and that the County Clerk attested said execution, and said execution is hereby confirmed, ratified and approved;

Section III. That the Grant Agreement referred to hereinabove shall be as follows:

#### GRANT AGREEMENT

TO: County of Marquette, Michigan. (herein referred to as the "Sponsor")

FROM: The United States America (acting through the Federal Aviation Agency, herein referred to as the "FAA")

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has submitted to the FAA a Project Application dated January 5, 1968, for a grant of Federal funds for a project for develop-ment of the Marquette County Airport (herein called the "Airport"), together with plans and specifications for such project, which Project Application, as approved by the FAA is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the FAA has approved a project for development of the Airport (herein called the "Project") consisting of the following-described airport development:

"Acquire land (Parcels 14 and 16 through 25, 26 AE through 28 AE) for airport

development, west zone and road relocation. Construct, light (H. I.) and mark west extension to E/W runway, 1500' x 100', (from 5000' to 6500'); Construct and mark E/W parstruct and mark E/W par-allel taxiway approximate-ly 1900' x 50'). Relocate road (approximately 4700'; overlay easterly 100' of E/ W runway, terminal apron, and taxiways to E/W runway. Relocate power lines in west approach."

all as more particularly described in the projerty map and plans and specifications incor-porated in the said Project Application;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Federal Airport Act, as amended (49 U.S.C. 1101), and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratifi-cation of the representations and assurances contained in asid Project Application, and its acceptance of this Offer as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the United States and the public United States and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport as herein provided, THE FEDERAL AVIATION AGENCY, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE UNITED STATES, HERE-LY OFFERS AND AGREES to BY OFFERS AND AGREES to pay, as the United States share of the allowable costs incurred in accomplishing the Project, 75 percentum of such costs relating to the installation of H.I. lighting on the E/W run-way extension, 50 percentum of all other allowable project costs.

This Offer is made on and subject to the following terms and conditions:

The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this Offer shall be \$400,-000.00.

The Sponsor shall:

(a) begin accomplishment of the Project within ninety days after acceptance of this Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the FAA, with failure to do so constituting just cause, for termination of the obligations of the United States hereunder by the FAA;

- (b) carry out and complete the Project without undue delay and in accordance with the terms hereof, the Federal Airport Act, and Sections 151.45-151.55 of the Regulations of the Federal Aviation Agency (14 CFR 151) in effect as of the date of acceptance of this Offer; which Regulations are hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations";
- (c) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications and property map, incorporated herein, as they may be revised or modified with the approval of the FAA.
- 3. The allowable costs of the project shall not include any costs determined by the FAA to be ineligible for consideration as to allowability under Section 151.41 (b) of the Regulations.
- 4. Payment of the United States share of the allowable project costs will be made pursuant to and in accordance with provisions of Sections 151.57-151.63 of the Regulations. Final determination as to the allowability of the costs of the project will be made at the time of the final grant payment pursuant to Section 151.63 of the Regulations: Provided, that, in the event a semi-final grant payment is made pursuant to Section 151.63 of the Regulations, final determination as to the allowability of those costs to which such semi-final payment relates will be made at the time of such semi-final pay-
- 5. The Sponsor shall operate and maintain the airport as provided in the Project Application incorporated herein and specifically covenants and agrees, in accordance with its Assurance 4 in Part III of said Project Application, that in its operation and the operation of all facilities thereof, neither it nor any person or organization occupying space or facilities the reon will discriminate against any person or class of persons by reason of race, color, creed or national origin in the use of any of the facilities

provided for the public on the airport.

- 6. The FAA reserves the right to amend or withdraw this Offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.
- 7. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be obliged to pay any part of the costs of the Project unless this Offer has been accepted by the Sponsor on or before August 23, 1968 or such subsequent date as may be prescribed in writing by the FAA.
- 8. In addition the Sponsor shall:
- (a) Incorporate or cause to be incorporated in each contract for construction work under the project, or any modification thereof, the equal opportunity clause as set forth in Section 202 of Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, or such modification thereof as may be approved by the Secretary of Labor.
- (b) Incorporate or cause to be incorporated in each bid or proposal form submitted by prospective contractors for construction work under the project the provisions prescribed by Section 151.54 (d) (1), Part 151, Federal Aviation Regulations.
- (c) Be bound by said equal opportunity clause in any construction work under the project which it performs itself other than through its own permanent work force directly employed or through the permanent work force directly employed by another agency of government.
- (d) Cooperate actively with the FAA and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of contractors and subcontractors with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (e) Furnish the FAA and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance and will otherwise assist the FAA in the discharge of its primary responsibility for securing compliance.
  - (f) Refrain from entering

into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order No. 11246 with a contractor debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, government contracts and Federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of Executive Order No. 11246.

- (g) Carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon contractors and subcontractors by the FAA and the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of Executive Order No. 11246; and in the event that the sponsor fails or refuses to comply with its undertakings, the FAA may cancel, terminate or suspend in whole or in part any contractual arrangement it may have with the sponsor, may refrain from extending any further assistance under any of its programs subject to Executive Order 11246 until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from such applicant, or may refer the case to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.
- 9. It is understood agreed that each contract awarded for construction work under this project is subject to the provisions of the Work Hours Act of 1962, Public Law 87-581. It is further understood and agreed that each such contract will contain stipulations requiring the contractor or sub-contractor to pay wages to all laborers and mechanics employed on the work in conformance with the provisions of the Act and that the Sponsor may withhold or cause to be withheld from the contractor or subcontractor so much of the accrued payments as may be considered necessary to pay laborers and mechanics employed by any such contractor or subcontractor on the work the full amount of wages required by the contract such sums as may administra-tively be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabili-

ties of such contractor or subcontractor for liquidated damages as provided by the Act. It is also understood and agreed that, in the event of failure of any contractor or subcontractor to pay any laborer or mechanic employed or working on the site of the work all or part of the wages required by the contract, the FAA may, after written notice to the Sponsor, withhold from the Sponsor so much of the accrued payments or advances representing unpaid wages and liquidated dam-

- 10. The Sponsor hereby covenants and agrees that its financial records of the project, established, maintained and made available to personnel of the FAA in conformity to Section 151.55 of the Regulations of the Federal Aviation Agency (14 CFR 151) will also be available to representatives of the Comptroller General of the United States.
- 11. By its acceptance of this Grant Offer the Sponsor agrees that insofar as is within its powers and to the extent reasonable, the Sponsor will take action to restrict the use of land adjacent to or in the immediate vicinity of the airport to activities and purposes compatible with normal airport operations, including landing and take-off of aircraft, in furtherance of its undertaking as set forth in Paragraph 13 of Part III Sponsor's Assurances of the aforesaid Project Application.
- 12. By its acceptance hereof, the Sponsor hereby covenants that to the extent it has or may have either present or future control over each area identified on the Exhibit "A" as "clear zone", and unless exception to or deviations from the following obligations have been granted to the Sponsor in writing by the FAA, it will clear said area or areas of any existing structures or any natural growth which constitutes an obstruction to air navigation within the standards established by Section 77.23 as applied to Section 77.27, Part 77

of The Federal Aviation Regulations; and the Sponsor further covenants that it will control the subsequent erection of structures and control natural growth to the extent necessary to prevent the creation of obstructions within said standards.

- 13. It is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that Paragraph 7 of Part III Sponsor's Assurances of the aforesaid Project Application shall be considered to be amended by deletion of the words "Section A of FAA Technical Standard Order No. N18 or Advisory Circular (AC) No. 150/5300.1, whichever is applicable according to the currently approved Airport Layout Plan", and by substitution therefore of the following: "Section 77.23 as applied to Section 77.27, Part 77 of the Federal Aviation Regulations."
- 14. The Sponsor hereby further covenants that it will not permit any permanent-type structures, other than structures required for aids to air navigation and such other structures as may be specifically excepted in writing by the FAA, to be erected on, and that it will cause any existing structures to be removed from, each area identified on the Exhibit "A" as "clear zone" or any portions thereof, concerning which the Sponsor has acquired a fee interest with Federal financial assistance, irrespective of whether such structures constitute an obstruction to air navigation.
- 15. Notwithstanding the provision of Paragraph 3, Part III, of the Project Application, the Sponsor covenants and agrees that it will not grant or permit any exclusive right forbidden by Section 308 (a) of the Federal Aviation Act of 1958 (49 U.S.C. 1349) at the airport, or at any other airport now or hereafter owned or controlled by it. In furtherance of the policy of the FAA under this covenant, the Sponsor agrees that, unless authorized by the Administrator, it will not, either directly or indirectly,

grant or permit any person, firm, or corporation the exclusive right at the airport or at any other airport now or hereafter owned or controlled by it, to conduct any aero-nautical activities, including, but not limited to, charter flights, pilot training, aircraft rental and sightseeing, aerial photography, crop dusting, aerial advertising and surveying, air carrier operations, aircraft sales and services, sale of aviation petroleum products whether or not conducted in conjunction with other aeronautical activity, repair and maintenance of aircraft, sale of aircraft parts, and any other activities which because of their relationship to the operation of aircraft can be regarded as an aeronautical activity. The Sponsor further agrees that it will terminate any such exclusive right (including any exclusive right to engage in the sale of gasoline or oil, or both) now existing at the airport, or at any other airport now or hereafter owned or controlled by it, at the earliest renewal, cancellation, or expiration date applicable to the agreement that established the exclusive right, and certifies that there is no exclusive right not subject to termination under this provision.

- 16. It is understood and agreed that the terms "Administrator of the Federal Aviation Agency", "Administrator", "Federal Aviation Agency" or FAA wherever they appear in this Agreement, in the aforesaid Project Application, plans and specifications or other documents constituting a part of this Agreement shall be deemed to mean the Federal Aviation Administrator or the Federal Aviation Administration, as the case may be.
- 17. The Federal Aviation Administration in tendering this offer on behalf of the United States of America recognizes the existence of an agency relationship between the County of Marquette, Michigan, as principal, and the Michigan Aeronautics Commission, successor to the Michigan

Department of Aeronautics, as agent, created by the Agency Agreement on Airports entered into on January 31, 1947. The Sponsor agrees that it will not amend, modify, or terminate said Agency Agreement without prior approval in writing by the FAA.

18. The Federal Government does not now plan or con-template the construction of any structures pursuant to paragraph 9 of Part III — Sponsor's Assurances of the Project Application, dated January 5, 1968, and, therefore, it is understood and agreed that the Sponsor is under no obligation to furnish any such areas or rights without cost to the Federal Government under this Grant Agreement. However, nothing contained herein shall be construed as altering or changing the rights of the United States and/or the obligations of the Sponsor under prior Grant Agreements to fur-nish rent-free space for the activities specified in such agree-

19. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that any reference herein or in the aforesaid Project Application to plans and specifications shall mean the plans and specifications approved by the Chief, Airports District Office, Lansing, Michigan, Chicago Area, Central region, FAA, on May 20, 1968.

20. It is understood and agreed by and between parties hereto that the United States shall not make, nor shall it be obligated to make, any grant payment hereunder, or any payment representing its share of the costs of acquiring fee simple title to Parcels 14, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24 and 25, and easement interests in Parcels 26 A-E, 27 A-E and 28 A-E, as indicated by red shading and delineated on the Exhibit "A", until the Sponsor has furnished evidence satisfactory to the FAA that it has acquired the aforementioned property interests in and to each parcel for which grant payment may be requested; it is further understood and agreed that the Sponsor will not permit or suffer the commencement of any construction work under this project until it has submitted evidence satisfactory to the FAA that it has acquired the aforementioned property interests.

21. It is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the United States shall not make, nor shall it be obligated to make, any grant payment hereunder until the Sponsor has submitted evidence satisfactory to the FAA that it has acquired title to Parcel 15 as delineated on the Exhibit "A". It is further understood and agreed that the Sponsor will not permit or suffer the commencement of any construction work under this project until it has submitted evidence satisfactory to the FAA that it has acquired the aforementioned property inter-

22. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that notwithstanding the fact that the plans and specifications provide for the construction of a bitumi-nous pavement for the E/W runway and parallel taxiway extensions to a thickness of 8" of P-209 material in the critical areas, and 7" of P-209 material in the non-critical areas shall not be a part of this project, and if accomplished by the Sponsor, shall be without any participation in the costs thereof by the United States under this project; it is further understood and agreed that the Sponsor shall maintain separable cost records pertaining to the above identified items excluded from Federal participation under this project, and that said records shall be available for inspection and audit by the FAA to the end that the costs of the excluded items may be definitely ascertained.

23. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the United States shall not make, nor shall to be obligated to make, any grant payment hereunder until

the FAA has determined that the lease agreements between Sponsor and Bodenus Limousine Service, Avis Car Rental, Hertz Rent-A-Car, National Car Agency and Airport Drive-In Theater, Inc. have included therein the nondiscrimination assurances required un-der Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Part 15 of the Federal Aviation Regulations, and the Sponsor hereby agrees that it will submit to the FAA copies of said leases for the purpose of making such determination.

24. It is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the Sponsor shall not enter into any contract for the relocation of util-ity lines in the west approach area, until the Sponsor has submitted said contract in proposed form, together with a location drawing, and the same has been approved by the FAA; it is further understood and agreed that the United States shall not participate in the cost of such utility lines relocation unless and until the Sponsor has submitted evidence satisfactory to the FAA that the Sponsor is legally responsible for payment of such costs.

25. It is understood and agreed by and between parties hereto that the United States shall not make, nor shall it be obligated to make, any grant payment hereunder un-til the Sponsor has submitted evidence satisfactory to the FAA that it has removed all obstructions necessary to clear the north and south approaches to the N/S runway to a 20:1 approach slope and the east approach to the E/W runway to a 40:1 approach slope; it is further understood and agreed that any work in connection therewith shall be accomplished by the Sponsor at no expense to the United States and such work shall not be deemed to be within the scope of this project.

26. The Sponsor, the County of Marquette, hereby covenants and agrees with the United States as follows:

The Sponsor, in the operation and use of Marquette County Airport will not on the grounds of race, color or national origin discriminate or permit discrimination against any person or group of persons in any manner prohibited by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Part 15 of the Federal Aviation Regulations.

The Sponsor will include, or require the inclusion, in every lease, agreement or concession pursuant to which any person, persons or concerns, other than the Sponsor, operates or has the right to operate any facility on Marquette County Airport providing services to the public, a covenant obligating such lessee or concessionaire in like manner, and a provision granting the Sponsor the right to take such action as the Federal Government may direct to enforce such covenant.

Noncompliance with the foregoing assurances will constitute a material breach, and in the event of noncompliance, the Federal Government may take appropriate action to enforce compliance, may terminate this Grant Agreement to which this covenant relates, or seek judicial enforcement.

This covenant shall become effective upon execution for and on behalf of the Sponsor of this Grand Agreement to which it relates and shall remain in full force and effect so long as Marquette County Airport continues to be used and operated as a public airport.

27. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that, notwithstanding the fact that the plans, specifications and/or Project Application include therein the work of fencing; a bituminous tack coat between successive lifts of bituminous pavement; approach and back slope clearing and grubbing in the east approach; crack repair and sealing; surfacing, gravel shouldering and marking the west 4000' x 100' of the existing E/W

runway; and relocating the end identifier (REIL); such work shall not be a part of this project and, to the extent accomplished by the Sponsor, such accomplishment shall be without any participation in the costs thereof by the United States under this project. It is further understood and agreed that the Sponsor shall maintain as a portion of the cost records covering this project, separable records of quantities and costs pertaining to all of the above identified items excluded from Federal participation under this project, and that said records shall be available for inspection and audit by the FAA to the end that the costs of the excluded items may be definitely ascertained.

The Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and ratification and adoption of the Project Application incorporated herein shall be evidenced by execution of this instrument by the Sponsor, as hereinafter provided, and said Offer and Acceptance shall comprise a Grant Agreement, provided by the Federal Airport Act, constituting the obligations and rights of the United States and the Sponsor with respect to the accomplish-ment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport. Such Grant Agreement shall become effective upon the Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and shall remain in full force and effect through-out the useful life of the facil-ities developed under the Project but in any event not to exceed twenty years from the date of said acceptance.





If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend that authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Supervisors. It is further recommended that any credit balances existing at the close of the fiscal year in the Social Welfare Fund be transferred to the Social Welfare Department Revolving Fund to apply against possible future deficits of the Department of Social Welfare.



Sup. Mattson moved that a resolution be drawn commending the men who saved the life of a woman who possibly would have drowned following an accident in Negaunee City when a car drove into Teal Lake. Supported by Sup. Walimaa. Carried.

Sup. Trudell asked that consideration be given that Marquette County in conjunction with other counties secure and maintain bloodhounds for search and rescue of lost persons. The Sheriff spoke about the keeping of these dogs and the fact that the public must recognize that these dogs must be called as soon as possible after it has been found that a person is lost in order to give them the best possible trail without a lot of people milling through the area which makes the job of tracking the scent almost impossible.

The Chairman noted that this is the last meeting of the Old Board as it has been noted for the last 100 years or more, as a new Board takes over in January. He commended the county officers and employees for their services and devotion to their jobs and with the Board's guidance, has helped to keep Marquette County in the good Government it has enjoyed the past years. He also expressed his thanks and best wishes to the Board for their services to the County.

There being no further business, it was moved by Sup. Larson and supported by Sup. Joseph that the Board adjourn Carried.
