

The Board of Supervisors met persuant to a call duly made at the Court House in the City of Marquette, on Monday, the 13th day of October, 1969, A. D. at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman Theodore R. Mattson. The roll being called the following Supervisors were present:

Anderson, Herbert E., Dompierre, Eureti, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jacobson, Jenkin, Krook, Lawry, Linjala, Mattson, McCracken, Morrison, Pellonpaa, Racine, Russo, Selin, Sodergren and Yelle.

Supervisors absent:

Anderson, Clayton J., Jacobson and Jernstad.

Moved by Sup. Morrison, and supported by Sup. Linjala that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of previous meeting. Motion carried.

A request from Sheriff Pequet for permission to attend a meeting of Michigan Intelligence Network at Grand Rapids, Michigan on October 23, 1969 was read. It was moved by Sup. Goldsworthy, supported by Sup. Hammerschmidt and unanimously carried by a role call vote that the Sheriff be authorized to attend this meeting.

✓ A request from Tax Director John M. Farmer for permission to attend 24th annual Short Course for Assessing Officers at Ann Arbor, Michigan, on October 27-31, 1969 was read. Motion was made by Sup. Dompierre, supported by Sup. Krook and unanimously carried by a roll call vote authorizing the Tax Director to attend this school.

A report from Budget & Executive Committee recommending adoption of standard resolution to operate Marine Safety Division in 1970 was read and upon motion of Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Pellonpaa and unanimously carried by a roll call vote the board concurred with the recommendation.

A motion was made by Sup. Dompierre, supported by Sup. Linjala and unanimously carried that the Board of Supervisors recommend adoption of a resolution asking for change in the law to provide equity in the State funds distributed to county health departments, copies to be sent the Governor, Senator and Representative in Lansing, Mich.

A report from the Budget & Executive committee recommending that the Board of Supervisors concur in Grand Traverse County's resolution requesting change in law to make the State responsible for providing office space for Dept. of Social Services was read. On motion of Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Lawry and unanimously carried the Board concurred with the said resolution.

A report from the Budge and Executive committee recommending adoption of a resolution to amend law to make State responsible for at least one-half of the cost of Veterans' funeral expenses (\$300.00 per funeral now borne by the County) was read. A motion was made by Sup. Jenkin, supported by Sup. Pellonpaa and unanimously carried that the Board concur with the recommendation and adopt the resolution and that copies be sent to the Governor, Senator and Representative in Lansing, Michigan.

A report from the Budget and Executive committee and a letter from AMCAB was read requesting the Board of Supervisors name two more members to AMCAB's Board of Directors. A motion was made by Sup. Hammerschmidt, supported by Sup. Jenkin and unanimously carried that the Board concur with recommendation. The Chairman then appointed Sup. Clayton Anderson and Mr. Robert Leach as members to AMCAB.

✓A report from the Budget and Executive committee recommending that an Ordinance be prepared for adoption by the Board at a later date to create a Marquette County Planning Commission was read. A motion was made by Sup. Morrison, supported by Sup. Krook and unanimously carried that the Board concur with the recommendation.

✓ A report from the Budget & Executive Committee and a letter from the Dept. of Social Services were read requesting transfer of \$70,000 to Social Services Fund to cover expenses for the remainder of 1969. A motion was made by Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Hammerschmidt and unanimously carried by a roll call vote the sum of \$70,000.00 be transferred from the Social Welfare Revolving Fund to the Social Welfare Fund and that \$24,000 of this amount be earmarked as reimbursement to the Social Welfare Fund for its payment to the Brookridge Project.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee with a letter from Robert E. Menhennick owner of a residence on Baraga Ave. next to the County Jail were read. A motion was made by Sup. Dompierre, supported by Sup. McCracken and unanimously carried by a roll call vote to purchase the residence by the County of Marquette for the sum of \$18,000.00. That the action of the B & E Committee in securing an option to so purchase be approved and that the county serve notice on the seller that it elects to exercise the option to purchase immediately. The B & E Committee further recommends that the Building, Grounds and Insurance Committee be directed to give consideration to the use the building will serve pending the development of a long range program for Court House and Jail facility improvement.

Communications from Marquette County Democratic Party and Marquette County Republican Party each nominating three persons for membership on the County Canvassing Board were read. Terms of Howard Lehto (R) and Fannie Aartila (D) expire on 11/1/69. According to law, one member must be named from each party. The Chairman called for nominations. Sup. Dompierre nominated Howard Lehto (R) and Nina Moffitt (D). Supported by Sup. Jenkin. Sup. Hammerschmidt moved nominations be closed and the Chairman cast an unanimous ballot for those nominated. Supported by Sup. Racine and unanimously carried.

Appointment of member on County Welfare Board was discussed as term of John Backels expires November 1, 1969. Sup. Hammerschmidt nominated John Backels, supported by Sup. Morrison. Sup. Eureti nominated Patricia Micklow, supported by Sup. Linjala. Sup. Racine moved that the nominations be closed. Supported by Sup. Pellonpaa. The balloting proceeded and the Chairman announced the following vote: Mrs. Micklow 11 and Mr. Backels 7. Mrs. Micklow was duly elected term to expire November 1, 1972.

The reports of the following County Officers were read and ordered filed, and the Treasurer's report ordered published: Marquette County Health Department, County Road Commission, Morgan Heights Sanatorium, Controller and Treasurer.

We, therefore, make the following recommendations for salaries of the several County Elective and Appointive Officers, Deputies, Clerks Stenographers, etc., in the various departments, effective as of January 1, 1970, for the period up to and including December 31, 1970.

It is to be understood that all fees received by the County Clerk, County Treasurer, Sheriff, Register of Deeds and Judge of Pro-

bate be turned over to the County Treasurer on the last day of each month for deposit in the proper county funds, excepting, however, that fees for civil process, not payable from county funds, served on off time in private cars by the Sheriff or his deputies may be retained by the serving officer.


In the case of an emergency or in case a department requires additional funds or needs some special equipment which could not be foreseen at the time of the annual meeting, we recommend that the head of that department, together with the Controller, present the matter to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration and that they grant, where deemed necessary, authority to exceed the figures established in the annual budget.

If it developes that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend that authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Supervisors. It is further recommended that any credit balances existing at the close of the iscal year in the Social Welfare Fund be transferred to the Social Welfare Department Revolving Fund to apply against posible future deficits of the Department of Social Welfare.



## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The future plans of steel companies are to step up imports of natural and improved ores from foreign countries; and

WHEREAS, The increase in imports jeopardizes the jobs of miners in the Lake Superior district; and

WHEREAS, The additional closing of mines could be a threat to the defense of our country in case of an emergency, and WHEREAS, Marquette County received \$269,756.24 from the specific tax on iron ore in 1969.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Marquette County Board of Supervisors go on record as being opposed to said imports and that Congressman Ruppe, Senators Hart and Griffin be notified that quotas should be imposed on foreign imports of iron ore.

Morrison and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that report of the Budget and Executive Committee of its action in taking option from Mr. & Mrs. Alex Balwinski for the purchase of their property located at the corner of Baraga Avenue and Fourth Street on the Court House block for the sum of \$18,000.00 be approved and that the Board of Supervisors authorize the purchase of the property under the terms of the option agreement.

A report from the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee was read on proposals from eight firms of architects to complete the preliminary survey of Marquette County's need to improve its Court House and Jail facilities. Moved by Sup. Jernstad, supported by Sup. Lawry and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that the Board accept the bid of Daverman Associates, Inc., at a fee not to exceed \$2,500.00.

VA report from the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee regarding disposition of house recently purchased from Hennessey Estate next west from the Jail on the Court House block was read. Moved by Sup. Jernstad, supported by Sup. McCracken and unanimously carried that the report be adopted.

Moved by Sup. Dompierre, supported by Sup. Pellonpaa and unanimously carried that the following ordinance be and the same is hereby adopted:

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE CREATION, ORGANIZATION, POWERS, AND DUTIES OF A PLANNING COMMISSION FOR MARQUETTE COUNTY, MICHIGAN

THE COUNTY OF MARQUETTE ORDAINS:

- 1. There is hereby created a planning commission to be known as the Marquette County Planning Commission, pursuant to Act 282 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan, 1945, whose office will be located at Marquette, Michigan.
- 2. The Marquette County Planning Commission shall have all powers and duties as provided by law, except that it shall exercise no authority over construction, improvement or maintenance of any part of the County Road system by the Marquette County Road Commission.
- 3. (a) The Commission shall be constituted of 5 members, appointed by the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, who shall serve for a term of 3 years and until their successors are appointed and qualified, except as hereafter provided.
- are appointed and qualified, except as hereafter provided.

  (b) The Board of Commissioners shall be broadly based and representative of the interests of all areas in the planning region, including rural areas. The Commissioners shall individually be representative of important segments of economic, governmental, social life, and development of the county.

  (c) Two Commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 3 years. Two Commissioner shall be appointed for a term of 2 years. One Commissioner shall be appointed for a term of 1 year. Thereafter, Commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 3 years.
- (d) The Marquette County Board of Supervisors shall fill any vacancy in the membership for any unexpired term.
- The County Board of Supervisors may remove any member of the Commission for nonperformance of duties or misconduct, upon public hearing.
- 5. Members of the Commission shall receive compensa-tion not to exceed that paid to members of the Board of Sup-ervisors, any may be reimbursed for actual, reasonable and

necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties.

6. All ordinances, resolutions, and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed and each section of this ordinance and each subdivision of any section thereof is hereby declared to be independent and the finding or holding of any section or subdivision thereof to be invalid or void shall not be deemed or held to affect the validity of any other section or subdivision of this ordinance. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, publication and approval of the Governor as required by law.



The Marquette County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to a call made at the Court House in the City of Marquette at 1:30 p.m. December 17, 1969. The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Theodore Mattson.

The County Clerk and Deputy Clerk being absent from this meeting, it was moved by Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Dompierre and unanimously carried that Controller Robert H. De-Roche be appointed clerk pro-tem for the purpose of recording the proceedings of this meeting.

The roll being called, the following Supervisors were present: Anderson, C., Anderson, H., Dompierre, Eureti, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jacobson, Jenkin, Krook, Lawry, Linjala, Mattson, McCracken, Morrison, Pellonpaa, Racine, Russo, Selin, Sodergren and Yelle. Absent: Supervisor Jernstad.

Supervisor Hammerschmidt noted that in the minutes of the previous meeting held on November 19, 1969, the motion to employ Daverman Associates, Inc. to complete the preliminary survey of Marquette County's needs to improve its Court House and Jail facilities failed to indicate the Board of Supervisors' desire to include officials from the City of Marquette in the planning meetings so that whatever economies might be affected in the joint planning of city and county improvements might be accomplished. The Chair directed the clerk to cause the minutes of the previous meeting to be amended accordingly. Moved by Sup. Morrison, supported by Sup. McCracken and unanimously adopted that the minutes of the previous meeting, as amended, be approved.

A communication from U.S. Senator Philip Hart acknowledge.

A communication from U.S. Senator Philip Hart acknowledging Marquette County's resolution requesting the imposition of quotas on the import of foreign ore was read and ordered filed.

A communication from State Senator Joseph Mack acknowledging Marquette County's resolution regarding the law which now requires the certification of township supervisors as assessors was read and ordered filed.

Moved by Sup. Goldsworthy, supported by Sup. Jacobson and unanimously carried by roll call vote that request of Probate Judge Michael DeFant for permission to attend a conference of Probate Judges at Kalamazoo, Michigan on January 14-17, 1970, be approved.

A communication from the Marquette County Economic Study Committee regarding the preparation of recreation proposals for the various Marquette County political units was then read. Moved by Sup. Hammerschmidt, supported by Sup. Racine and unanimously adopted that the report be accepted and that a letter be sent to the Marquette County Economic Study Committee commending them for the fine report and encourage their further efforts in the matter.

A communication from the County Road Commission regarding the abatement of hazard at the railroad crossing on County Road 456 near Little Lake was read. An order on the matter from the Michigan Public Service Commission has been expected for some time and it was moved by Sup. Linjala, supported by Sup. Racine and unanimously carried that Forsyth Township contact the Michigan Public Service Commission to determine what it intends to do in the matter.

A communication from Ernest Ronn, declining his appointment to membership on the Morgan Heights Board of Trustees, was read. Moved by Sup. Pellonpaa, supported by Sup. Dompierre and unanimously adopted that the resignation be accepted with regret. The Chairman then announced nominations were in order to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Mr. Ronn.

WHEREAS, there is a need for a comprehensive plan for
the physical, social, and economic development and need to
conserve water and prevent and abate pollution in the area; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive plan for the area will promote efficient and orderly development of the communities, provide information necessary to avoid overlapping, duplication, overdesign or underdesign of facilities including those for land use, health, sanitation, water, transportation, and schools; and WHEREAS, Alger, Delta, Dickinson, Marquette, Menominee, and Schoolcraft Counties, desire to have created a Regional Planning Commission pursuant to the provisions of Section 5.3008, of Michigan Statutes Annotated, Act 281 of 1945.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THESE LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS THAT:

1. There be created pursuant to Section 5.3008, Michigan Statutes Annotated, a Regional Planning Commission to be known as the Central U.P. Regional Planning Commission, whose office will be located at Escanaba, Michigan.

2. The area or territory of the planning region over which

the commission has jurisdiction is within the boundaries des-

cribed as follows:

The entire counties of Alger, Delta, Dickinson, Marquette, Menominee, and Schoolcraft. The area Does not include any city, town, or village with a population of 5,500 or more according to the latest population figures.

3. The commission shall consist of 30 commissioners who shall serve for a term of 3 years and until their successors are appointed and qualified. The Board of Commissioners shall be broadly based and representative of the interest of all areas in the planning region including rural areas. Ten commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 1 year. Ten commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 3 years. Thereafter commissioners should be appointed for terms of 3 years. Five commissioners shall be appointed by each County.

Sup. C. Anderson noted that the County Fleasater urging the construction of a 4 lane highway south of Marquette and west from Ishpeming to the Junction of M. 95. He further noted that there were four highway fatalities on U.S. 41 west of Ishpeming recently. Moved by Sup. C. Anderson, supported by Sup. Krook and unanimously carried that the Chairman be authorized to meet with Mr. Claude Tobin, State Highway Commissioner, to urge the construction of 4 lane highways on U.S. 41 south of Marquette and west of Ishpeming without delay and that he work with local city officials and Chambers of Commerce in the matter.

A resolution to the Board from the Northern Michigan Sportsmens Association was read urging the closing of antlerless deer seasons in Marquette County until the deer population has been increased. Moved by Sup. Linjala, supported by Sup. Morrison and unanimously carried that the Board concur with the resolution and direct a copy of same to all State Representatives from the Upper Peninsula. Mr. Roland Juchemich, Jr., President of the Northern Michigan Sportsmens Association then addressed the Board briefly to urge support for a ban on the hunting of antlerless deer.

Memorandum from J. R. Acocks, M.D., Superintendent of Morgan Heights Sanatorium, was read submitting copies of two recent news releases from The Week for Hospitals, a publication of the American Hospital Association, indicating the freeze on reimbursement to hospitals under the Medicaid program in Massachusetts and in New York State were unconstitutional and the states ordered to adjust same to a "reasonable cost" basis so as to conform with Federal regulations. Moved by Sup. C. Anderson, supported by Sup. Krook and unanimously carried that the Board seek an Attorney General's opinion as to whether or not the rates paid by the Department of Social Services for Medicaid patients conforms to Federal law on the matter.
