January 21, 1970

The Marquette County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to a call made by the Clerk on Wednesday, the 21st day of January, A.D. 1970 at the Court House in the City of Marquette.

The meeting was called to order by the Clerk. The roll being called, the following Supervisors were present: Anderson C., Anderson H., Dompierre, Eureti, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jacobson, Jenkin, Jernstad, Krook, Lawry, Linjala, Mattson, McCracken, Morrison, Pellonpaa, Racine, Russo, Selin, Sodergren and Yelle.

Absent: None.

The Clerk declared that nominations were in order for the office of Chairman: Sup. Russo nominated Theodore Mattson. Sup. Racine moved the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast electing Mr. Mattson. Supported by Sup. Linjala and carried.

√The Chairman declared that nominations were in order for the office of Vice-Chairman. Sup. Racine nominated Clayton Anderson. Sup. Lawry moved the nominations be closed and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Clayton Anderson. Supported by Sup. Linjala and carried.

Moved by Sup. Morrison, supported by Sup. Dompierre that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes. Carried.

A communication from Cong. Philip E. Ruppe acknowledging resolution regarding quotas for import of iron ore was read and ordered filed.

Communications from Senate President Thomas F. Schweigert and Rep. Russell Hellman regarding resolutions opposing the shooting of antlerless deer were read and ordered filed.

Resolutions from Roscommon and Baraga counties opposing the shooting of antlerless deer were read and ordered filed.

A resolution from Sheriff Adrian Pequet urging Board support for House Bill 3572 which would provide increased State support to the Marine Safety Dept. was read. Also a resolution from Jackson County recommending support for this bill was read. Sup. Selin moved that a three man study committee be appointed to meet with the Highway Dept., County Road Commission and the Sheriff to study the matter. Supported by Sup. Sodergren and carried by 20 votes. Sup. Hammerschmidt voted No.

A communication from Marquette County Health Dept. informing the Board of action taken by the County Board of Health in clarifying a conflict between the State Ground Water Control Act, which requires a minimum of 50 feet for a water well and sewer system, and the Marquette County Sanitary Code, which requires a minimum of 75 feet of isolation. The County Board of Health has notified the State Director of Public Health of this regulation in Marquette County. Communication ordered filed.

/ A special committee report on the investment of county monies for short term was read. Moved by Sup. Hammerschmidt, supported by Sup. McCracken and unanimously carried that the Board concur with the recommendation of the special committee report

A Budget and Executive committee report was read on a request from UPCAP to have the Board adopt a resolution authorizing the re-organization of UPCAP under Act 46 P.A. of Michigan, 1966. A motion was made by Sup. Jenkin that the Board concur with the recommendation of the B & E committee adopting this resolution. Supported by Sup. Krook and carried by 20 votes. Sup. Yelle voted No.
