

Discussion was held on the forthcoming visit of Mr. I. W. Abel, President of the United Steelworkers of America, to attend the mortgage burning ceremony at Thimmes Memorial Building in Negaunee on November 7, 1970. Moved by Comm. Under unfinished business, Comm. Selin brought up the subject of the need for a juvenile detention home and suggested that a special ad hoc committee be appointed to study ways and means of obtaining funds to build this facility. Comm. Hammerschmidt stated that he saw no need for another committee because the matter has already been referred to the Budget & Executive Committee and furthermore, the Building & Grounds Committee would be in charge of matters of this kind. Chairman Mattson suggested that action be delayed until receipt of the report of the Budget & Executive Committee.

Comm. Goldsworthy referred to the fact that the budget contains funds for payment of two assistant prosecutors and suggested the Budget & Executive Committee consider putting the second assistant on a six-month trial basis. Comm. Dompierre also spoke about the prosecutor's office, stating that the committee has discussed the extra burden the prosecutor has in handling district court cases but stated that law enforcement officers and others were very unhappy about the number of dismissals and reductions of charges. Next June, if the situation warrants, he thought a change in the "set-up" should be considered. Prosecutor Quinnell obtained permission to speak and told the board that he felt the request for an increase was reasonable in view of the added work-load but that he wanted no misunderstanding about the functioning of his office. 

Hammer-schmidt and unanimously carried that a resolution be adopted requesting the State of Michigan take over financial responsibilities of the Dept. of Social Services because of the increase in welfare costs but the county income has not kept pace. A copy of the resolution be sent to the Governor of the State, to members of the Legislature who represent Marquette County, to the Director of Mich. Dept. of Social Services, to all counties in the U.P., the Michigan Assn. of Counties and U.P. District of the Mich. Assn. of Counties.

A report from the Budget & Executive committee regarding the Municipal Employees Retirement system was read. Present law provides that employees Retirement system was read. Present law provides that employees with 25 or more years of service, who retire between the ages of 55 and 60 years must have ½% per month deducted from the employee's benefits for each month the employee is less than 60 years of age. Section 47F.P.A.314 of P.A.of 1969, provides that the Board of Commissioners may waive this required reduction if it elects to do so for the employees covered by the County of Marquette group. 

It was moved by Commissioner Jenkin, seconded by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously adopted by a roll call vote, that the Board of Commissioners concur with the recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee, to accept the bid of Frei Chevrolet, Inc. of Marquette, Michigan for a 1971 Blazer, V8, 200 h.p., 307 cu. in. engine, for the bid price of \$2371.50.

The recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to adopting a substitute Ordinance governing Water Well Construction in Marquette County, was discussed. Commissioners Sodergren, Yelle, and Dr. Potter offered comments. Moved by Commissioner Racine, seconded by Commissioner Krook, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee, and approve the Ordinance. Motion by Commissioner Dompierre, seconded by Commissioner Pellonpaa, that one person be appointed to fill the vacancy on the County Road Commission, the Parks Commission, and the Airport Commission, as had been the practice in the past, was passed by a unanimous vote.

Nominations were declared open by Chairman Mattson to fill the vacancy on the County Road Commission, the Parks Commission and the Airport Commission. Moved by Commissioner Selin that the name of Jack R. Rombouts be placed in nomination. Moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy that the name of William Schneider be placed in nomination. There being no further nominations, Commissioner Pellonpaa moved, seconded by Commissioner Dompierre that nominations be closed.

Chairman Mattson then appointed Commissioner Jenkin and Commissioner Pellonpaa as tellers. Nominee Rombouts received 11 votes and Nominee Schneider received 10 votes. Whereupon the Chairman Theodore Mattson declared Mr. Jack R. Rombouts elected a member of the County Road Commission, the Airport Commission, and the Parks Commission for a three year term, commencing January 1, 1971.

Chairman Mattson then declared nominations open for appointment to the Morgan Heights Board to fill the vacancy of Lou Chappell whose term expires Dec. 31, 1970. Commissioner Russo nominated Lou Chappell to succeed himself in this position. No other nominations were made. Commissioner Lawry moved and seconded by Commissioner Sodergren, that a unanimous ballot be cast in favor of Lou Chappell, as a member of the Board of Trustees of Morgan Heights, for a three year term commencing January 1, 1971.

Moved by Commissioner Morrison, seconded by Commissioner Krook, that the following meeting dates, for regular meetings of the Board of Commissioners, be set for the year 1971:
