

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made at the Courthouse, in the City of Marquette, on Wednesday the 22nd day of July, A.D. 1970 at 1:30 o'clock P.M.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Theodore R. Mattson.

Moved by Comm. Morrison, supported by Comm. Jenkin and carried that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes.

✓Communication from Department of Natural Resources Committee stating that the Marquette County Gwinn Park Development proposal does not come within the scope of the Bonding Act was ordered filed.

✓Requests from the Register of Deeds, County Treasurer and Prosecuting Attorney to attend annual conventions of their associations were read. Moved by Comm. Jenkin, supported by Comm. Krook and unanimously adopted on a roll call vote that the requests be granted.

Notice of an Industrial Development Conference to be held at the Holiday Inn in Marquette on July 28, 1970 was read. Moved by Comm. Jernstad and supported by Comm. Dompierre and unanimously adopted by roll call vote that the Chairman be authorized to attend.

✓Communication from Manistee County Chapter, Michigan Townships Association, pointing out that all five members of the State Board for Certification of Assessing Officers reside in Grand Rapids and the area south of Grand Rapids and suggesting that a member, or members, be added to the Board who reside in the northern half of the Lower Peninsula or in the Upper Peninsula was read. Moved by Comm. Hammerschmidt, supported by Comm. Linjala and unanimously adopted that this Board concur with the communication and so notify the Governor and the Manistee County Chapter, Michigan Townships Association.

A billing from the Michigan Townships Association for 1970 membership dues in the sum of \$75.00 was presented. Moved by Comm. Hammerschmidt, supported by Comm. Pellonpaa and unanimously adopted that the matter be tabled.

A communication from Ernest Ronn of Negaunee regarding the deplorable condition of Ann Street in the City of Negaunee was read. Comm. Dompierre reported that inquiry had been made of Mr. Shroeger, Superintendent of the County Road Commission, on this matter and suggested that Mr. Shroeger report to the Board. Mr. Shroeger then stated that the County Road Commission has already spent over a million dollars on this relocation project and that portion which lies within the City of Negaunee is the responsibility of that unit. He stated, however, that this project has been given priority and that everything that can be done to complete it is being done. There is a real legal problem in the acquisition of right-of-way but if all goes well the project should be worked on again in 1971. The letter was ordered filed.

Chairman Mattson then declared the meeting open for public hearing on the budget.

The report of Finance and Taxation Committee was read by the Clerk.

Comm. Yelle asked for an explanation of the funds allocated for Northern Michigan University Advisory Council. Comm. Dompierre and Comm. Selin explained that the money is used to help promote fund requests in behalf of the university — in brief, a "lobbying fund". Comm. Yelle also voiced objection to the \$13,300 salary proposed to be paid to the director of the probate court's juvenile division and made a motion that the juvenile officer's salary remain at \$13,000. Comm. Russo pointed out that the Drain Commissioner is not scheduled for a raise in the proposed budget and that he believed an increase should be granted. The Chairman advised both Commissioners that these questions would be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study after the close of the public hearing.

Moved by Comm. Krook, supported by Comm. Jenkin and carried by the following roll call vote that the budget be adopted:

Yeas: Anderson, C., Anderson, H., Dompierre, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jenkin, Krook, Lawry, Mattson, McCracken, Linjala, Morrison, Pellonpaa, Selin and Sodergren.

Nays: Russo, Yelle.

Comm. Hammerschmidt stressed that the budget as adopted was definite and that no requests for additional funds will be considered in 1971.

Moved by Comm. Russo, supported by Comm. Yelle and adopted that the Budget & Executive Committee review the matter of salary for the Drain Commissioner. Comm. Hammerschmidt dissented.

Discussion was held on the forthcoming visit of Mr. I. W. Abel, President of the United Steelworkers of America, to attend the mortgage burning ceremony at Thimmes Memorial Building in Negaunee on November 7, 1970. Moved by Comm. Sodergren, supported by Comm. Pellonpaa and unanimously adopted that November 7, 1970 be proclaimed "I. W. Abel Day" in Marquette County.

Under unfinished business, Comm. Selin brought up the subject of the need for a juvenile detention home and suggested that a special ad hoc committee be appointed to study ways and means of obtaining funds to build this facility. Comm. Hammerschmidt stated that he saw no need for another committee because the matter has already been referred to the Budget & Executive Committee and furthermore, the Building & Grounds Committee would be in charge of matters of this kind. Chairman Mattson suggested that action be delayed until receipt of the report of the Budget & Executive Committee.

✓ Comm. Goldsworthy referred to the fact that the budget contains funds for payment of two assistant prosecutors and suggested the Budget & Executive Committee consider putting the second assistant on a six-month trial basis. Comm. Dompierre also spoke about the prosecutor's office, stating that the committee has discussed the extra burden the prosecutor has in handling district court cases but stated that law enforcement officers and others were very unhappy about the number of dismissals and reductions of charges. Next June, if the situation warrants, he thought a change in the "set-up" should be considered. Prosecutor Quinnell obtained permission to speak and told the board that he felt the request for an increase was reasonable in view of the added work-load but that he wanted no misunderstanding about the functioning of his office. It would be run according to his best ability and judgment and he didn't want the board to feel that by the power of purse it can run the prosecutor's office.

Comm. Sodergren offered remarks on the request of the Social Services Department for the additional sum of \$81,100 to finance the operations of that department for the remainder of 1971, which request has been referred to the Welfare Contact Committee for study. He recommended that a thorough study of all routines used in granting aid to welfare recipients be made with special emphasis on weeding out numerous abuses by welfare recipients. He further recommended that any persons knowing of such abuses should contact their representatives in Lansing.

Kenneth Walimaa, representative of the Marquette County Townships Association, appeared before the board and made remarks in support of the County Housing Ordinance.

There being no further business, motion was made by Comm. Anderson, supported by Comm. Pellonpaa that the board adjourn until Wednesday, November 18, 1970 at 1:30 o'clock P. M.

Present law provides that employees with 25 or more years of service, who retire between the ages of 55 and 60 years must have ½% per month deducted from the employee's benefits for each month the employee is less than 60 years of age. Section 47F.P.A.314 of P.A. of 1969, provides that the Board of Commissioners may waive this required reduction if it elects to do so for the employees covered by the County of Marquette group. The committee recommends that the waiver be adopted. Moved by Com. Sodergren, supported by Com. Russo that the

report be referred back to the Budget and Executive committee for further study. Roll call was as follows:

✓ Moved by Com. Pellonpaa, supported by Com. Lawry and unanimously carried that the Board make request from the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for matching funds of \$7,100.00 for the Pilot Volunteer of Probation Project (VIP).

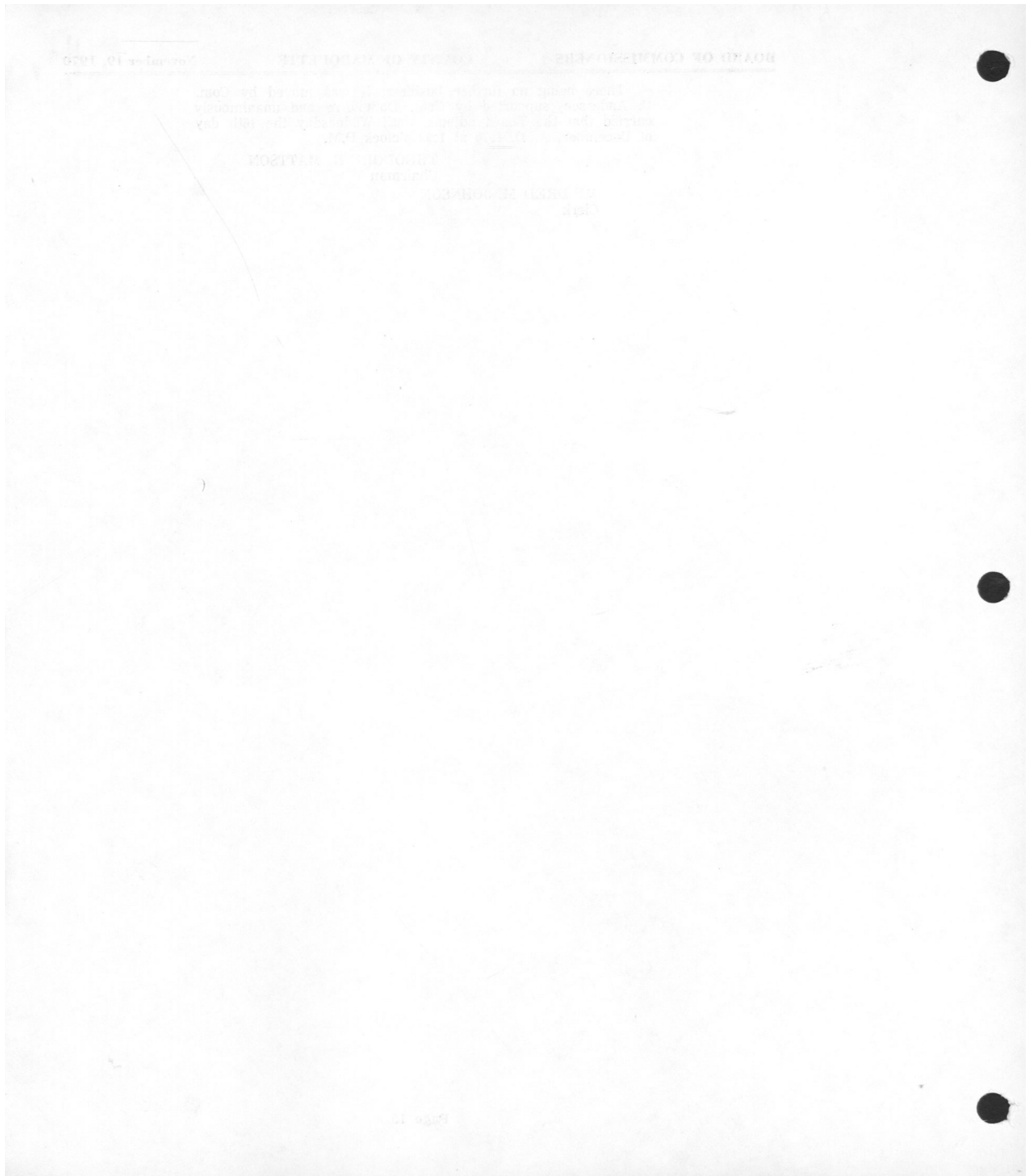
