The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made at the Marquette County Courthouse, January 20, 1971 at 1:30 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by Henry A. Skewis, Clerk. The roll being called, the following commissioners were present:

✓The clerk declared that nominations were in order for the office of Chairman. Comm. Jernstad nominated Comm. Carl V. Pellonpaa. There being no further nominations, Comm. DeJuliannie moved that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast electing Comm. Pellonpaa. Supported by Comm. Jenkin and carried.

✓The Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, declared that nominations were in order for the office of Vice Chairman. Comm. Lawry nominated Comm. Clayton Anderson. There being no further nominations, Comm. Dompierre moved nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Comm. Clayton Anderson. Supported by Comm. Krook and carried.

Both men accepted with thanks and asked cooperation between commissioners and county officers.

Moved by Comm. Morrison that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting. Supported by Comm. McCracken and carried.

Communication from Governor William G. Milliken regarding resolution from Marquette County Board of Commissioners on financial difficulties most counties were experiencing in connection with the rising cost of welfare was read and ordered placed on file.

Communication from Representative Dominic J. Jacobetti in regard to a joint meeting of Board of Commissioners, Township Supervisors and others concerning need for an inventory of public land was read and placed on file. Meeting to be held in Circuit Courtroom at 3:00 P.M. January 20, 1971.

Communication from Judge of Probate Michael F. DeFaut in regard to Resolution that the State of Michigan assume the cost of all court functions, including those costs now paid by county tax monies was read. The Resolution was presented to the Board. Comm. Clayton Anderson moved that the Resolution be adopted as read and copies be sent to the Boards of Commissioners of other counties in the State, to the Governor, Senator Joseph S. Mack, Representative Dominic J. Jacobetti, Chief Justice of the State Supreme Court and to the Court Administrator. Supported by Comm. Hammerschmidt and carried by the following roll call vote:

The Agreement also covers the right of the Board of Commissioners to approve any future plans that the Intermediate School District might have for this land. Comm. Krook moved that the Board concur with the recommendations of the Budget and Executive Committee and authorize the Clerk and Board Chairman to sign the Agreement. Supported by Comm. Morrison and carried.

/A Budget and Executive Committee report was read in regard to amending Rule 2 of the Board of Commissioners Pro-

cedure Manual to delete the Highway and Bridges, Parks, Airport and Harbor Committees from the list of standing committees and that a transportation committee be formed. Moved by Comm. Dompierre, supported by Comm. Krook and carried by roll call vote that the recommendation be adopted.

A Building, Grounds and Insurance Committee report was read regarding a joint meeting of the County-City Building Authority and members of the Marquette City Commission on January 14, 1971. Moved by Comm. Jernstad, supported by Comm. Lawry that the report be accepted as read.

Moved by Comm. Hammerschmidt, supported by Comm. Jernstad and unanimously carried that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for the appointment of Everett H. Kent to the Election Scheduling Committee for 1971.

✓ Nominations were declared open for the next appointment. Comm. Lawry nominated Robert I. Pascoe, Clerk of Champion Township. Comm. Dompierre offered in nomination Clifford Johnson, Clerk of Chocolay Township. There being no further nominations, it was moved by Comm. Clayton Anderson, supported by Comm. The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made at the Court House in Marquette, Michigan, on May 19, 1971, at 1:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa. The roll was called and all Commissioners were found to be present.

It was moved by Commissioner Jenkin, and supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved without reading.

Communication from the Judge of Probate, Michael F. DeFant, requesting authorization for Elsie T. Cardoni to attend the Registers Seminar to be held in Mount Pleasant on June 10th and 11th was read. A communication from District Judge George E. Hill asking permission for himself and District Judge Stephen Catel to attend the mid-year meeting of District Judges on May 21st and 22nd, 1971, in Grand Rapids, was read. A communication from the County Extension Director, Mr. Melvin Nyquist, requesting permission for Home Economist Phyllis J. Payne to participate in the state-wide economist meeting to be held at Michigan State University on June 13th through 18th was read. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried on a roll call vote, that permission be granted in all 3 communications.

Communication from the Upper Peninsula Area-wide Comprehensive Health Planning Ass'n regarding the U.P. Town Meeting Emergency Health Care Test was read and ordered placed on file by Chairman Pellonpaa.

Communication from Mr. Joseph Vogt, District Wild Life Biologist, was read regarding the survey of the deer herd. On a motion by Commissioner DeJulianne, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, the Clerk was instructed to ask Mr. Vogt to be present at the June 23, 1971, meeting, at which time he could make his presentation to the Board of Commissioners.

Communication from Thomas R. McNabb regarding the County's share of the schematic design phase of the City-County Building Project was read. On a motion by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the balance of \$6,221.35, the County's share of the project, be paid.

Communication from Edward A. Quinell, Prosecuting Attorney, informing the Board that he had talked with Mr. Emerson Fleury regarding the Powell Township pollution, and that he was advised by Mr. Fleury that as soon as road restrictions were lifted, a tractor would be transported to Big Bay and work begun on a drain field north of the present septic tank site.

A communication was read from the Marquette County Planning Commission asking that the County Board of Commissioners support Senate Bill 116, a bill providing for changes in the County Planning Commission Act. The County Planning Commission recommended the adoption of a resolution to support this bill by the County Board of Commissioners. On a motion by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jernstad, and unanimously carried, the Board concurred with the recommendation.

The communication from the Republic Sportsmen Club concerning throwing away bottles was read. After much discussion, the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, called on Asst. Prosecutor, Marvin Heitman, for information regarding the legislation pending in Lansing on this subject. After a discussion on this issue,

it was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried, that this communication be placed on file.

A communication from the Upper Peninsula Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Committee was read asking the Board to appoint one of its members as a representative on their Board. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried that the Chairman be authorized to appoint a member to this Committee.

✓ A communication from the County Clerk informing the Board that petitions had been filed against the ordinance to create a housing commission in Marquette County. A lengthy discussion of this was held and it was moved by Commissioner DeJulianne, supported by Commissioner Dompierre, and carried on a roll call vote, that the issue be placed on the ballot for a vote of the people. ✓ Communication from the Budget and Executive Committee recommending that Stephen Adamini and Robert Washburn be granted permission to attend a boundary commission meeting to be held in Lansing on May 19th was read. On a motion by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, the Board concurred with the Budget and Executive Committee recommendation.

✓ A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee recommending that an additional staff member be authorized for the Equalization Department, and that the 1971 budget be amended by adding \$4000.00 to the annual allowance for this Department, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with this recommendation. The following Yeas and Nays were recorded:

A report of the Welfare Contact Committee was read, accepted and placed on file.

A report from the Transportation Committee was read, accepted and ordered placed on file.

A report from the Morgan Heights Contact Committee was read regarding air pollution in the area of Morgan Heights Hospital. On a motion by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried by roll call vote, Chairman Carl V. Pellonpaa was authorized to appoint a committee of 3 to approach the officers of the Mining Company, County, Morgan Heights Hospital and Federal Bureau of Mines to

discuss the problem and attempt to determine a solution to this pollution problem.

Ruppe and our representatives in the legislature and to the U.P. Association of County Officers.

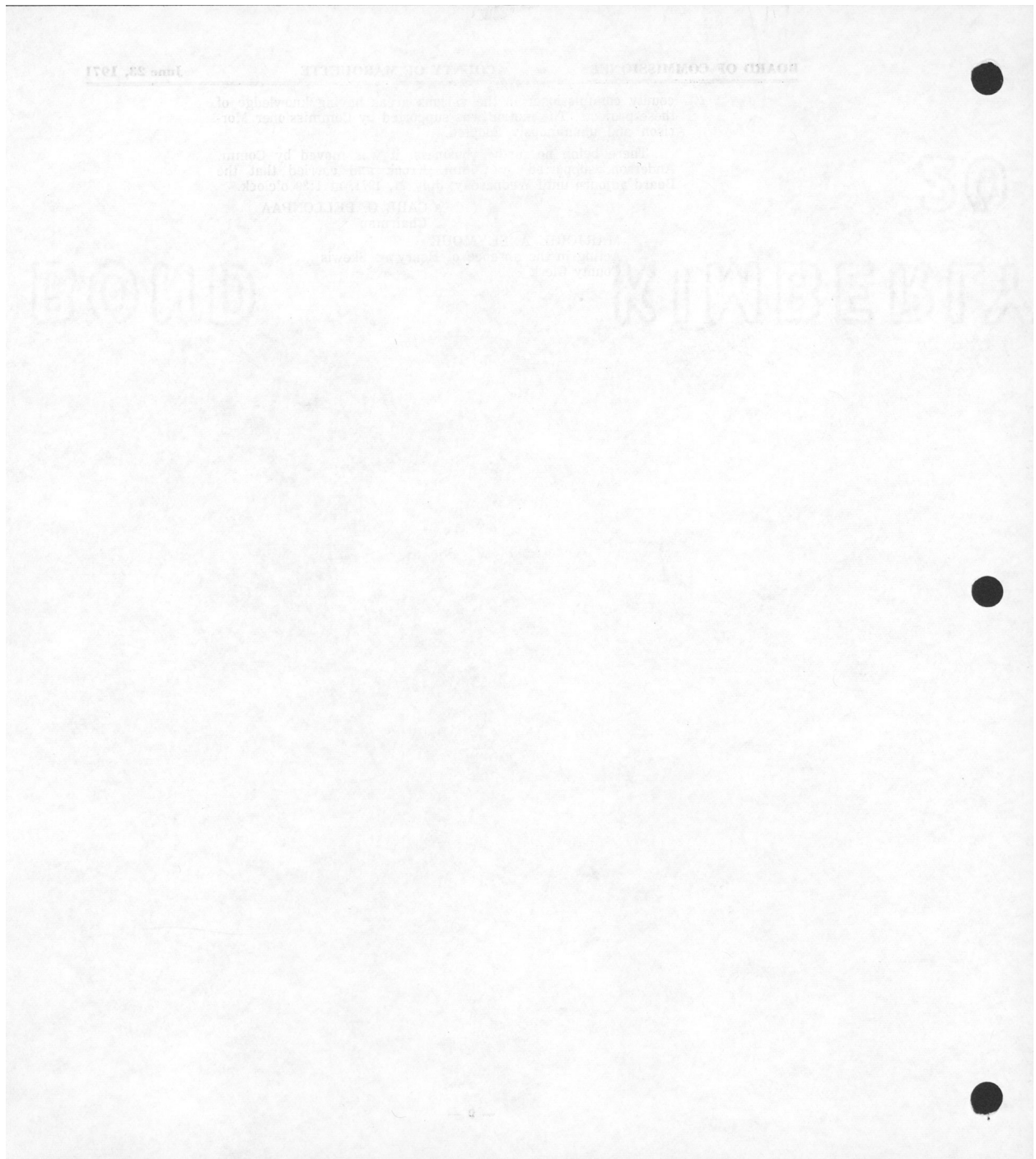

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made, in the Marquette County Court House, July 21, 1971, at 1:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa. The roll being called, the following Commissioners were present: Clayton J. Anderson, Herbert E. Anderson, Lawrence Armatti, Joseph DeJulanie, Joseph Euret, Kenneth E. Goldsworthy, Richard C. Hammerschmidt, Jimmie L. Jenkin, Thomas F. Jernstad, Orvo Krook, Gordon Lawry, Theodore R. Mattson, Jack L. McCracken, Howard Morrison, Carl V. Pellonpaa, Carmello Russo, Leslie H. Selin, James Sodergren and Clarence Yelle. Absent were James L. Dompierre and Albert J. Jacobson.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison and supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved without reading.

Communications from Dominic Jacobetti, State Representative, Joseph Mack, State Senator, and Philip Ruppe, U.S. Congressman, pertaining to investigations that are being made in regard to high price of gasoline and diesel fuel in certain parts of the U.P. were read and ordered placed on file.

A resolution from the Alger County Board of Commissioners in regard to the antlerless deer moratorium was read and, on a motion by Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried, the Marquette County Board of Commissioners adopted a similar resolution and copies will be sent to our Representatives from the U.P.

Requests from John McNamara, County Treasurer, and Henry Skewis, County Clerk, for permission to attend their respective Michigan Association of County Conventions were read. It was moved by Commissioner Jenkin, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, and unanimously carried on a roll call vote, that permission to attend be granted.

A communication from Donald J. Geisen, Administrator of St. Mary's Hospital, Marquette, in regard to hospitalization of welfare patients with psychiatric ills was read. On a motion by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner McCracken, and unanimously carried, the communication was referred to the B. & E. Committee for further study and report at the next regular meeting.

A communication from Fr. Robert D. Wheelock in regard to the establishing of a half-way house for alcoholics in Marquette County was read. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, that the matter be referred to the B. & E. Committee for study and report.

The communication from Mr. Carlton G. Gutman, Director of Economic Development for AMCAB, regarding Little Presque Isle Point, and its preservation was read. A lengthy discussion was held in regard to financing a public park in this park area. It was moved by Commissioner DeJulanie and supported by Commissioner Armatti, that the matter be referred to the Transportation Committee for further study, and also that the County continue to operate the Gwinn Park until another survey would be completed. The Board was advised by Prosecuting Attorney, Edward A. Quinnell, that this was an improper motion and, after taking this under advisement, the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, dismissed the motion. It was then moved by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, and supported by Commissioner Jernstad, that the matter of Little Presque Isle be referred to the B. & E. Committee for further discussion and that Mr. Carl Gutman be invited to attend the meeting to present further facts.

A communication from Bernard H. Davidson, Circuit Judge, asking that \$1500.00 be appropriated from the general fund, to be spent for the law library, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Jenkin, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, that the matter be referred to the B. & E. Committee for study and report.

Monthly reports from the Welfare Contact Committee and Transportation Committee were read and ordered placed on file. A recommendation from the Budget and Executive Committee asking that a Wage Study Committee be appointed by the Board Chairman to study wages for the 1972 budget was read. It was suggested that the Chairman appoint himself and 3 additional members of the Board of Commissioners as a part of this committee. Questions arose as to whether a study committee was necessary and, on a motion by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Jenkins, and carried by a roll call vote, the Board concurred with the B. & E. Committee.

Ayes: C. J. Anderson, H. E. Anderson, Euret, Hammer-schmidt, Jenkin, Jernstad, Krook, Mattson, McCracken, Morison, Pellonpaa and Sodergren.

Nays: DeJulanie, Armatti, Goldsworthy, Lawry, Russo, Selin and Yelle.

A report of the special committee to study dust control in Marquette County was presented and on a motion by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy, and unanimously carried, the report was accepted and placed on file.

A report of the Audit Committee recommending that bills for the month of June in the amount of \$51,991.43 be allowed and ordered paid was read. On a motion by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Lawry, the report was accepted and will be published.
