

August 25, 1971

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made in the Commissioners room of the Marquette County Court House at 1:30 p.m.

It was moved by Comm. Morrison and supported by Comm. Selin, and unanimously carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A communication from Governor Milliken, in regard to the variance of gasoline prices in the State of Michigan, was read and ordered placed on file.

A request from the Juvenile Division of the Probate Court asking the Board of Commissioners to grant permission for Mr. Don Merckx and Miss Barbara Kennedy to attend the annual conference of Michigan Juvenile Court Officers Association September 22-24, 1971, in Grand Rapids, Michigan, was granted on a motion by Comm. Hammerschmidt, supported by Comm. Jenkin and carried by the unanimous Roll Call Vote.

A communication and a resolution from the Forsyth Township Board concerning the Gwinn Park was read. On a motion by Comm. Dompierre, supported by Comm. Mattson and carried by a Roll Call Vote, the matter was referred as requested to the Marquette County Planning Commission.

A communication from the Director of the Marquette County Health Dept., Dr. Richard Potter, regarding air pollution in the Republic area was read and ordered placed on file.

Communication from the Director of the Social Service Dept. asking the Board to support House Bill 5346, as concerns the moneys the State would pay for their share of the cost of office space was read. It was moved by Comm. Hammerschmidt, supported by Comm. Euret and unanimously carried that letters be sent to our State Representative asking support for this Bill.

A communication from the Marquette County Health Dept. in regard to House Bill 4148 transferring costs of care of indigent cases of communicable diseases to the State was read. It was moved by Comm. Hammerschmidt, supported by Comm. Euret, and unanimously carried, that a resolution be drafted and copies sent to the other counties in the State of Michigan and also to the Michigan Association of Counties and our State Representatives and senators.

A Resolution from Dickinson County in regard to the holding of mental patients who have homicidal or other dangerous tendencies for 48 hours in the county jail was read. After much discussion and a recommendation from the Prosecuting Attorney, who stated that this involved 3 to 4 cases per month in Marquette County, it was moved by Comm. Goldsworthy, supported by Comm. Hammerschmidt and carried, that the resolution be adopted and copies sent to all counties and to the Michigan Association of Counties, and also to our State Representatives and Senators.

A communication from UPCAP was read in regard to Data Processing. On a motion by Comm. Dompierre, supported by Comm. Clayton Anderson and carried, the matter was referred

to the Budget and Executive Committee for further study, with a request that the County Controller, Mr. DeRoche, be asked to supply the Committee with information regarding the process.

It was moved by Comm. Russo, supported by Comm. Lawry, and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote, that the report of the Audit Committee be accepted and published.

It was moved by Comm. Krook, supported by Comm. Morrison and carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee.

A report of the Transportation Committee was read and ordered placed on file.

A report of the Welfare Contact Committee was read and ordered placed on file.

Monthly reports of the Treasurer's Dept., Civil Defense Dept., County Road Commission, County Health Dept., Morgan Heights Dept. and Controller's office were read and ordered placed on file and the Treasurer's report published. It was moved by Comm. Dompierre, supported by Comm. Goldsworthy and carried, that the Commissioners receive a copy of the statistical report of the Marquette County Health Dept.

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made, in the Commissioners room in the Marquette County Courthouse, at 1:30 p.m., September 22, 1971.

It was noted that all Commissioners were present.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes for the previous meeting.

A communication from the Department of Commerce in regard to the Michigan Aeronautics Commission and the office of Economic Expansion sponsor an individual aviation seminar to be held at the Catherine Bonifas Civic Center, Escanaba, Michigan, on October 14, 1971, was read. On a motion by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jerstad, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, the Chairman was authorized to select two delegates to attend this meeting.

A communication from AMCAB in regard to the appointment of an additional member on its board to represent the Marquette County Board of Commissioners was read. On a motion by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, Chairman Carl V. Pellonpaa was authorized to appoint the new member.

It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that Melvin N. Nyquist be given permission to attend the annual Extension Conference at Michigan State University Aug. 25-29, inclusive.

A communication from the Marquette County Planning Commission asking the Board of Commissioners to allot one hour's time at either the November or December Board meeting to have representatives of CUPPADD bring the Board up to date on the activities of the past year as to comprehensive planning, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried, that the Board allot the time needed during the November meeting, and that the Planning Commission and Mr. Gregory Main, representative of CUPPADD, be notified. The bi-monthly report of the Marquette County Planning Commission was read and ordered placed on file.

On a motion by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner McCracken, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, permission was granted Mr. Harold Van Overloop to attend the Michigan Association of Probation Services' annual conference in Lansing.

On a motion by Commissioner Selin, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, the Controller, Mr. Robert H. DeRoche, was asked to advise all the department heads that authorization for out-of-county travel should be submitted early enough so that a recommendation could be made in each case by the Budget & Executive Committee prior to the Board meeting.

A report of the welfare Contact Committee for the month of September was read and ordered placed on file.

It was moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Euret, and unanimously carried, that they concur with the recommendation of the Budget & Executive Committee and authorize the proper county officials to execute the application for grant under the emergency employment act as outlined in the Budget & Executive Committee's report.

It was moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, that the Board of Commissioners concur with the recommendation of the Budget

& Executive Committee and express the displeasure of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners in regard to Governor Milliken and State Senator, Joseph Mack's views on county participation in state revenue sharing, and to urge them to reconsider the position of the County in this matter.

The report of the Audit Committee was read and on a motion by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, the bills and claims in the amount of \$54,576.17 were allowed and ordered paid.

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met for their annual meeting on October 12, 1971, pursuant to a call duly made in the Commissioners' Room of the Marquette County Court House.

Roll call was held, finding all Commissioners present with the exception of Commissioner Thomas Jernstad.

It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, seconded by Commissioner Euret, and unanimously carried, that they dispense with the approval of the minutes of the previous meeting until the November meeting.

Two communications were read from the Central Upper Peninsula Planning and Development District Director, George W. Rusch, in regard to plans for water and waste water facilities in the Central District of the Upper Peninsula. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner McCracken, and unanimously carried, that the matter be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for further study and report.

A communication from Dominic J. Jacobetti, State Representative of the 108th District, regarding federal and state owned lands and the amount of taxes or monies in lieu of taxes paid to the county was read. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, that the Controller, Mr. Robert H. DeRoche, be instructed to draw up resolutions to be mailed to Representative Jacobetti to support his thoughts on H. R. Federal Bill 8545, and also request the Tax Equalization Director, in co-operation with Township Supervisors, to complete the public lands inventory as requested by Representative Jacobetti. H. R. Bill 8545 requests action by Congress for payment of ad valorem taxes or monies in lieu of taxes on all federal land.

A communication from the Northern Michigan Sportsmen's Association, in regard to all counties instructing their Prosecuting Attorneys to start suits of injunction against the Department of Natural Resources to halt the hunting of antlerless deer, was read. The Prosecuting Attorney, Edward A. Quinnell, instructed the Commission that Representative Payant did not intend to appeal the ruling in the case. It was then moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried, that the communication be placed on file.

Communications from the Marquette County Democratic Party requesting that Mr. Henry Pepin be re-appointed to the Board of Canvassers and from the Marquette County Republican Party requesting that Mrs. Evelyn Blewitt be re-appointed to serve on the Marquette County Board of Canvassers were read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Mattson, and unanimously carried, that both Mr. Henry Pepin and Mrs. Evelyn Blewitt be re-appointed to succeed themselves, their terms to expire November 1, 1975.

The Board of Commissioners was reminded that the terms of Melvin Nyquist and James Dompierre, serving on the Marquette County Planning Commission, would expire November 21, 1971, and that the term of Dr. S. J. Bessolo on the James R. Acocks Medical Facility Board would expire on December 31, 1971. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried, that the Chairman and Vice-chairman have a list of available candidates for the November meeting.

Chairman Carl V. Pellonpaa called the attention of the Board to the fact that the term of Mr. A. C. Stam on the Social Services

Board will expire November 1, 1971. He declared nominations in order and Commissioner Clayton Anderson nominated Mrs. Miles (Betty) Howe for this position. Commissioner Morrison nominated Mr. A. C. Stam to succeed himself. Nominations were closed and the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, appointed Commissioners Jacobson and Goldsworthy as tellers. A vote was taken showing Betty Howe 12 votes, A. C. Stam 7 votes and 1 ballot spoiled. Whereupon Mrs. Betty Howe was declared elected to the Social Services Board, term to expire November 1, 1974. All bids included the trade-in of the 2-1970 patrol cars now owned by the County. It was moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board of Commissioners concur with the recommendations of the Budget & Executive Committee and purchase from Olson Motors the 2-1972 patrol cars at a cost of \$4,774.00, low bid, plus the trade-in of the 2-1970 patrol cars.

Gentlemen:

Your Finance and Taxation Committee recommends that the various departments in the Court House and Jail Group keep within the budgets as adopted at the annual meeting and that no clerk hire or salaries be paid beyond the amount fixed by the Board of Commissioners.

In the case of an emergency or in case a department requires additional funds or needs some special equipment which could not be foreseen at the time of the annual meeting, we recommend that the head of that department, together with the Controller, present the matter to the Board of Commissioners for their consideration and that they grant, where deemed necessary, authority to exceed the figures established in the annual budget.

If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend that authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Commissioners.



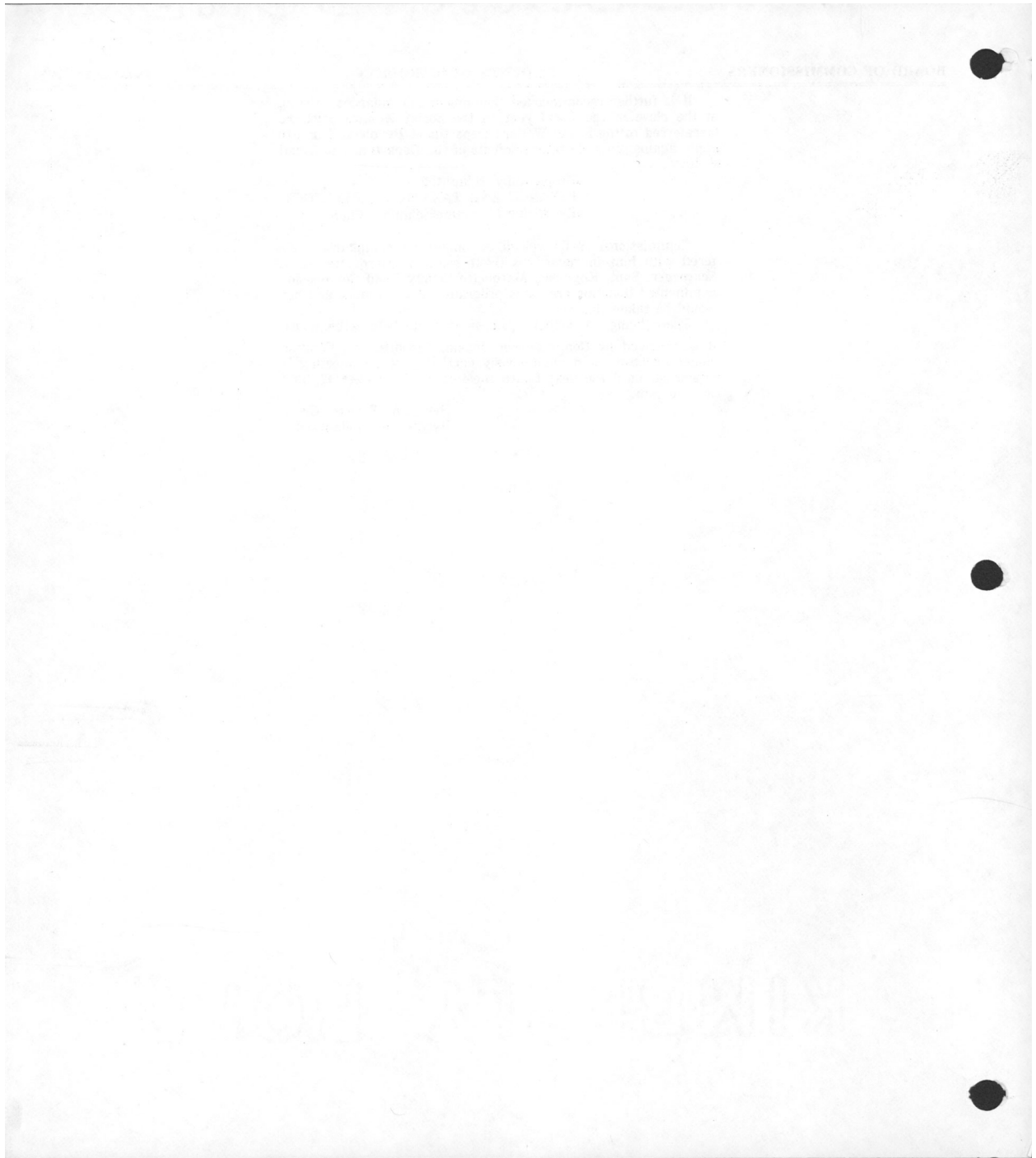
It is further recommended that any credit balances existing at the close of the fiscal year in the Social Welfare Fund be transferred to the Social Welfare Department Revolving Fund to apply against possible future deficits of the Department of Social Welfare.

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met November 17, 1971, in the Commissioners' Room of the Marquette County Court House, pursuant to a call duly made.

A roll call was called finding all Commissioners present with the exception of Commissioner Jimmie L. Jenkin.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner McCracken, and unanimously carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous two meetings.

Communications were read from Governor Milliken and Bernard Houston, Director of the Department of Social Services, in regard to the Regional Social Service Offices not being placed in Marquette, and a reply letter from Mary Louise Fontaine, Director of the Marquette County Department of Social Services, was read informing the Commissioners that the reasons given by both Governor Milliken and Mr. Houston as to why the regional office could not be located in Marquette were actually non-existent. It was moved by Commissioner Selin, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, be authorized to appoint two or three persons from Marquette County to confer with the Governor, Mr. Houston and Representative Jacobetti, the express purpose to be a last minute effort to have the regional office located in Marquette.

A communication from the Marquette County Planning Commission asking for an extension of time until the first quarter of 1972 to consider thoroughly all avenues of support for the Gwinn Park, was read. It was moved by Commissioner De-Julianne, supported by Commissioner Yelle, and unanimously carried, that the Marquette County Planning Commission be allowed the additional time, with the understanding that at the end of this time a firm recommendation in regard to the Gwinn Park would be forthcoming.

A communication from Senator Joseph S. Mack in regard to the resurfacing and repairing of US-41 and M-28, between Marquette and Ishpeming, was read and ordered placed on file.

A request was read from the Upper Peninsula Area-Wide Comprehensive Health Planning Association, in regard to a 3 cents per capita, each year for the next 3 years, from each of the 15 County Boards of Commissioners in the Upper Peninsula, to finance their programs. On a motion by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried, the request was referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study and report.

A communication from E. H. Hamalainen, District Conservationist, in regard to the Escanaba meeting December 1, of the Soil Conservation District Board, was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the State Jail Inspector, Robert J. Russell, in regard to plans and progress of a new county jail, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jernstad, and unanimously carried, that the matter be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study and report.

A communication from Edward A. Quinnell, Marquette County Prosecuting Attorney, in regard to future budgets for the Prosecuting Attorney's office, was read. On a motion by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried, the communication was placed on file for future study by the Budget & Executive and Wage Study Committees.

On a motion by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, a communication from the Probate Court Judge, Michael F. DeFant, in regard to the Probate Court budget, was referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study and report.

A communication from Peter G. Dwyer, Director of children's services from Marquette County Juvenile Court, in regard to Juvenile Court salaries was read and ordered placed on file.

A recommendation by the Budget & Executive Committee in regard to the 1970 audit reports of the Mental Health Clinic, was read. On a motion by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt and unanimously carried, it was ordered that a copy of this report be furnished to the Auditor General as requested by him in his letter of October 12, 1971.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee in regard to the transfer of all monies remaining in the Social Welfare Revolving Fund at the end of each year be closed and transferred to the County General Fund was read. On a motion by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, the Board concurred with the Budget & Executive Committee's recommendation which directs that any credit balance existing at the close of the fiscal year in the Social Welfare Fund be transferred to the General Fund, and that the minutes of the October 12, 1971, meeting be amended to read that if such a balance exists, it be transferred to the General Fund rather than to the Social Welfare Revolving Fund as was directed at that time.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee considering the proposals made by CUPPADD asking the County Board to participate in a survey of solid waste disposal sites at a cost of \$1800.00 over a 2-year period, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, and unanimously carried, that the Board of Commissioners take no action on this problem at this time due to the fact that the Marquette County Health Department checks disposal sites within the county from time to time.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee was read in regard to the appointment of Mr. David Piipo replacing Mr. John Farmer as Director of the Marquette County Tax Equalization Department. On a motion by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried, the Board concurred with the recommendation of the Budget & Executive Committee and appointed Mr. David Piipo Director of the Marquette County Tax Equalization Department, effective January 1, 1972, with the further recommendation that the office of Deputy Director remain vacant for the time being.

Monthly reports of the Transportation Committee for October and November were read and ordered placed on file.

The report of the Welfare Contact Committee for the month of October was read. The Welfare Contact Committee asked for consideration of a resolution urging the change in state and federal regulations so that able-bodied adults benefitting from the ADC-U Program be included in the Work Training Program in the same manner as recipients of direct relief. On motion by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, the Board adopted the following resolution:

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The performance records of federal, state and local agencies show continuous increases in the number of welfare recipients, in welfare costs and consequently, in taxes; and,  
WHEREAS, Welfare hand-outs are an appallingly tragic

misuse of monetary resources; and,

WHEREAS, Programmed and forced idleness of welfare recipients is a cruel insult destructive of the individual and a shameful neglect and abuse of human resources; and,

WHEREAS, Maintenance and beautification projects are often left unfinished or uninitiated in every county in the nation; and,

WHEREAS, County controlled, work-opportunity programs will decrease the number of recipients on welfare, will decrease welfare costs, will accomplish county work projects without increasing taxes; and will allow welfare recipients to earn self-support and self-respect; and,

WHEREAS, Federal welfare agencies prohibit employable recipients within the Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC-U) program from performing county-controlled work assignments in return for aid received.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Marquette County Board of Commissioners that we actively work for the amendment of present federal welfare statutes and proposed welfare bills to provide that each medically-approved employable welfare recipient on federal public assistance shall perform available work as designated by an elected county government without the need for prior approval by a state or federal agency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we seek the support of all counties, Michigan Association of Counties, and our congressional representatives in a united endeavor to give local government the means to solve local problems and to achieve results in helping people through this amendment.

This resolution passed by the Marquette County Board of Commissioners at its November 17, 1971, meeting.

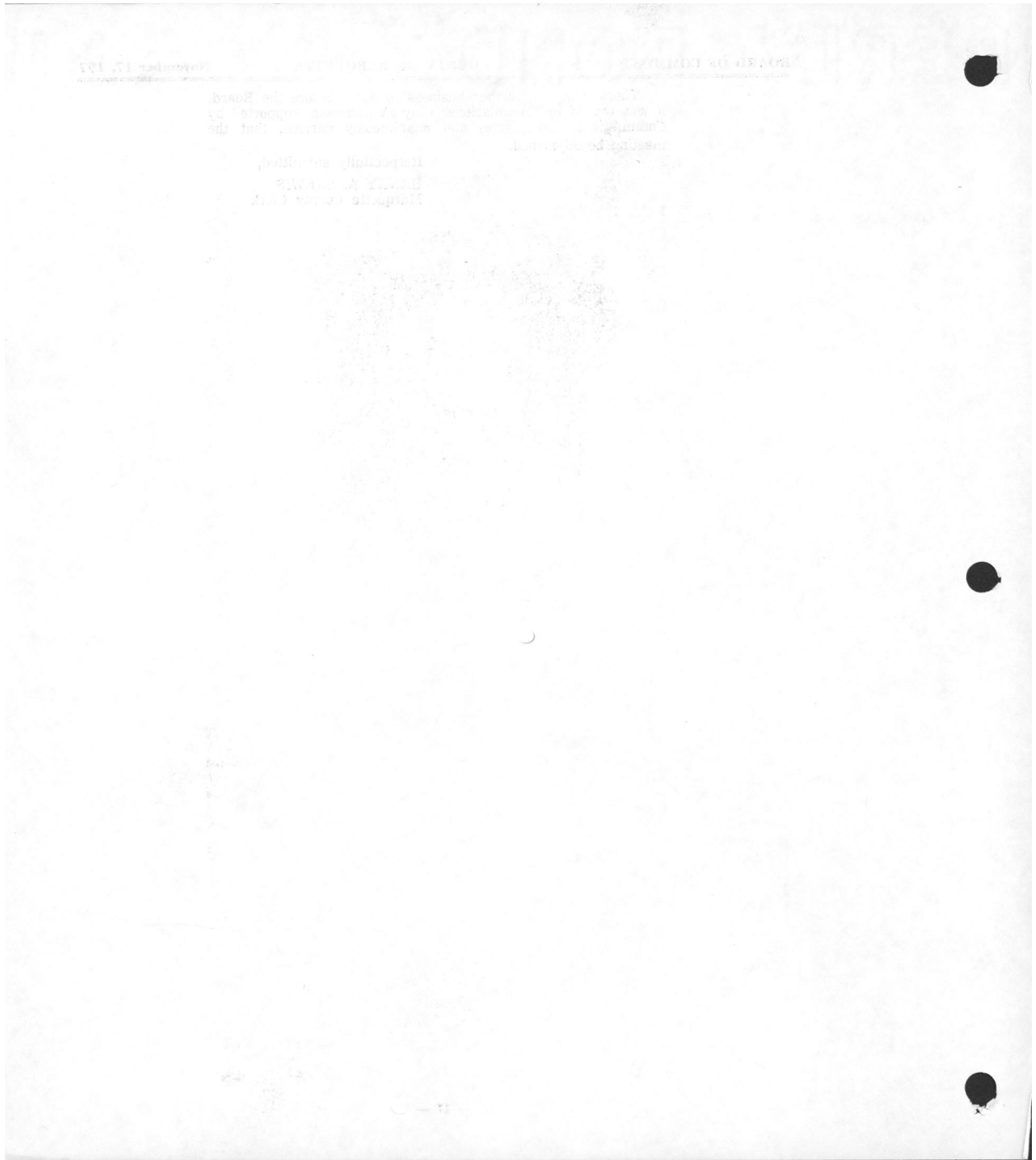

Commissioner Dompierre expressed desire not to be re-appointed to the Marquette County Planning Commission; thereupon Commissioner Herbert Anderson and Commissioner James Sodergren were nominated by Commissioner Pellonpaa and Commissioner Clayton Anderson. A vote was taken with Commissioners Jernstad and Morrison as tellers. Final vote showed Commissioner Sodergren 12 votes; Commissioner Herbert Anderson 6 votes. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried, that all ballots be destroyed, and that Commissioner James Sodergren be appointed to the Marquette County Planning Commission for a term of three years.

It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried, that the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, be authorized to appoint 4 Commissioners to go to the state conference of the Michigan Association of County Commissioners December 6-7, 1971, and that the appointees be authorized by the Board to speak to Bernard Houston, Governor Milliken and Rep. Dominic Jacobetti in regard to the Regional Social Service Office being placed in Marquette.

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Dompierre, and unanimously carried, that the meeting be adjourned.

December 22, 1971

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met December 22, 1971, in the Commissioners' room of the Marquette County Court House pursuant to a call duly made.

The roll was called finding all Commissioners present with the exception of Commissioner Jack L. McCracken.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the November 17th meeting.

A communication was read from G. M. Dahl, Chief of the Law Enforcement Division of the Department of Natural Resources, in regard to Marquette County's actions on participating in a snowmobile law enforcement program. Sheriff Adrian Pequet explained that though monies would be available for law enforcement personnel in the year 1973, the only money that was available this year would be that which would allow the Department of Natural Resources to purchase snowmobiles and related equipment for the counties. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, and carried by a roll call vote, that the Sheriff be authorized to contact the Department of Natural Resources in hopes that the county could receive two snowmobiles and the related equipment for the remaining 1971-72 year, and also that the marine safety officer be used this winter as a snowmobile training officer and enforcement officer. (All Commissioners voted aye with the exception of Commissioner Goldsworthy who voted nay.)

A communication from the Community Mental Health Center, in regard to the amount of their allocation for the fiscal year July 1, 1971, to June 30, 1972, was read. On a motion by Commissioner Euret, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried, the matter was referred to the Budget and Executive Committee for further study and report.

A communication from the Community Mental Health Center, in regard to the County Board's appointing two members to a Selection Committee, which would select members to the Community Health Center Board, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried, that the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, be authorized to appoint two members to the Mental Health Selection Committee.

The question of the appointment of a member of the Acocks Medical Facility Board arose. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried, that Dr. S. J. Bessolo be re-appointed to succeed himself, term to expire December 31, 1974.

On a motion by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried by roll call vote, permission was given Stephen F. Adamini to attend a meeting of the State Boundary Commission, to be held in Lansing January 12, 1971.

A copy of a communication from Dominic J. Jacobetti, addressed to Mr. Bernard Houston, Director of the Department of Social Services, Lansing, Michigan, was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Marquette County Health Department in regard to several amendments to the Marquette County Sanitary Code was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, that a copy of these amendments be sent to each Com-

missioner and that action be postponed until the next regular meeting of the Marquette County Board.

A communication from the Marquette County Chapter of "Keep Michigan Beautiful" was read. It requested that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners designate one of their members to serve on their Board. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried, that the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, be authorized to appoint one member to the Marquette County Chapter of the "Keep Michigan Beautiful" Board.

A communication from Dominic J. Jacobetti, in regard to all counties north of town line 16 initiating action to enact an ordinance prohibiting the hunting of antlerless deer, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner DeJuliamie, and unanimously carried, that a copy of the resolution used by Dickinson County be obtained for each Commissioner and that action be deferred until the next regular meeting.

A report of the Audit Committee was read requesting that claims and accounts in the amount of \$71,114.31 be allowed and ordered paid. On a motion by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, such claims and accounts were allowed and ordered paid.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee in regard to a request from District Court for \$5,000.00 matching funds to provide a full time probation officer for the District Court was read.
