January 19, 1972

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met, pursuant to a call duly made, at the Court House January 19, 1972, at 1:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Henry A. Skewis, County Clerk. Roll was called finding all Commissioners present with the exception of Commissioner Hammerschmidt.

The Clerk declared nominations in order for the office of Chairman of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Mattson nominated Commissioner Carl V. Pellonpaa. There being no further nominations, it was moved by Commissioner Jenkin, supported by Commissioner Dompierre, that a unanimous ballot be cast electing Carl V. Pellonpaa to succeed himself as Chairman of the Board.

Chairman Carl V. Pellonpaa declared nominations in order for the office of Vice Chairman. Commissioner Dompierre nominated Commissioner Clayton Anderson to succeed himself. Moved by Commissioner Jacobson, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried, that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot cast for Clayton Anderson as Vice Chairman.

Both gentlemen accepted with thanks and asked for co-operation between Commissioners and County officials.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner McCracken, and unanimously carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A request was made by Mr. Robert Gill, of the Army Corp. of Engineers, for a right of entry on county-owned property at K. I. Sawyer Air Force Base so that construction could commence on a proposed cement ramp addition to the Base. On recommendation of H. L. Shroeger, Superintendent Engineer of Marquette County Road Commission, the Board asked that the Chairman, Prosecuting Attorney and Mr. Shroeger meet to discuss the legal status involved. Moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, that, following such a meeting, a tentative letter of intent would be issued the Corp. of Engineers.

A communication from the Forsyth Board regarding the Gwinn

A communication from the Forsyth Board regarding the Gwinn County Park was read and placed on file.

A communication from the Marquette County Planning Commission regarding the Gwinn County Park was read. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the recommendations of the Marquette County Planning Commission and hold the Gwinn Park in abeyance and the lease retained by the County until we have a plan for total recreation in the county. Moved by Commissioner Selin, supported by Commissioner Mattson, and unanimously carried, that the County and Forsyth Township enter into a co-harness agreement in regard to the maintenance of the park.

A communication from the Department of Corrections regarding the Marquette County Jail was read and ordered placed on file.

A report from the Controller, Robert H. DeRoche, regarding the 1971 budget experience was read. Moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried by roll call vote, that the report be accepted and placed on file.

A communication from the Community Mental Health Center regarding the disposition of \$2500.00 bequeathed to the Community Mental Health Center, was read. Moved by Commissioner Dom-

pierre, supported by Commissioner Eureti, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation and allow the Community Mental Health Center to apply the \$2500.00 bequest on the balance owing for remodelling Brookridge.

A communication from the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee recommending that the Chairman and County Clerk be authorized to execute an application for federal assistance on the County Jail project, was read. Moved by Commissioner Jernstad, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee.

Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee.

A communication from the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee regarding the County's ability to raise taxes for payment of obligations to construct a new jail facility and courthouse annex was read. Moved by Commissioner Jenkin, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the County, City Building Authority be requested to re-examine the feasibility of proceeding with the project with the view of eventually levying millage to cover leasehold payments for the amortization of necessary bonds, in case grants are not obtainable.

A communication from the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee regarding Judge DeFant's request for additional space for the Juvenile Division of Probate Court was read. Moved by Commissioner Jernstad, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee and hold this matter in abeyance until such time as the new proposed building construction program comes into being.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding an additional need of \$30,000 to cover site preparation project, for the installation of an instrument landing system, at the County Airport, by the Federal Government, was read. Moved by Commissioner Jacobson, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that \$30,000 be allotted, and that the Chairman and the County Clerk be authorized to sign the necessary documents in order to proceed with the preparation project for an instrument landing system.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee in regard to the Marquette County Board allotting \$5,916, matching funds money for the County Health Center for psychiatric care of indigent mental patients at St. Mary's Hospital, was read. Moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the County provide the necessary matching funds to cover the service, and that the appropriation to the Act 54 Mental Health Board budget for 1972 be increased by the sum of \$5,916.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding a change in wage structure of the Juvenile Department, Probate Court, probations officers' salaries was read. Moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Jernstad, and carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation and make the necessary salary changes. The following roll call vote was recorded:

Municipal Employees Retirement System was read. Moved by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the Budget and Executive Committee's recommendation and adopt a resolution to clarify the record.

A report of the Audit Committee was read. Moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that claims and accounts in the mount of \$63,404.24 be allowed and ordered paid and the audit report published.



A communication from the Marquette County Joint County-City Building Authority requesting the Marquette County Board of Commissioners to adopt a resolution authorizing the Authority to apply to the Department of Housing and Urban Development and to the Federal Law Enforcement Assistance Administration for grants to cover the cost of the proposed construction of the new County Jail and joint County-City Administrative offices was read. Moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Eureti, and unanimously carried by roll call vote, that the Marquette County Joint County-City Building Authority be authorized to process these two applications with federal and state agencies.

Mr. Peter Embley, a Marquette resident, spoke briefly to the Board of Commissioners regarding the creation of a Marquette County Water Authority and the need for co-operation among municipalities and industries in the use of water.



The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met, pursuant to a call duly made, at the Court House April 19, 1972, at 1:30 pm.

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In the absence of the County Clerk, Henry A. Skewis, it was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Yelle, and unanimously carried, that Robert H. DeRoche be named Clerk Pro Tem to record the proceedings of this meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A communication from Dr. Theodore R. Sudinsky and George M. Roberts requesting permission to address the Board regarding the improvement of County Road EH-TP (Engman Lake Road) was read and the request granted. Dr. Sudinsky explained the problems caused by the seriously poor condition of this road and the fact that the County Road Commission has already advised him that it cannot undertake this improvement in the near future because it lacks the finances to do so. After discussion, it was moved by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Armatti, that the Board of Commissioners recommend to the County Road Commission and the Forsyth Township Board that they come to some agreement, for the health and safety of the people involved, to schedule this improvement during 1972. The motion failed on the following roll call vote:

Ayes: Commissioners C. Anderson, H. Anderson, Armatti, DeJuliannie, Goldsworthy, Morrison, Pellonpaa, Russo and Yelle. Nays: Commissioners Dompierre, Eureti, Hammerschmidt, Jenkin, Jernstad, Krook, Lawry, Mattson, McCracken and Sodergren.

Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner McCracken, and unanimously carried, that the request for improvement of County Road EH-TP be referred to the Transportation Committee for study and report at the next meeting of this Board.

A resolution from the Ingham Board of Commissioners regarding state revenue sharing was read. Moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, that this Board concur with the resolution and that a communication expressing the deep concern of this Board in this matter be sent to the Governor of the State of Michigan, our representatives in the legislature and to the Michigan Association of Counties.

At this point Commissioner Krook was excused and left the meeting.

The report of the Audit Committee recommending claims and accounts in the amount of \$105,405.10 be allowed and ordered paid. It was moved by Commissioner Eureti, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the audit report be allowed and published.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding the request of "Keep Michigan Beautiful" Committee for \$150.00 to cover postage and stationery expense was read. Moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner DeJuliannie, and unanimously adopted by roll call vote, that the request be granted.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding delegates to the May 19 and 20, 1972, meeting of the Upper Peninsula Association of County Commissioners, to be held at Ishpeming, Michgian, was read. Commissioner Sodergren discussed a recent meeting held by public officials within the county with the Motorola Corporation regarding the possibility of acquiring a county-wide radio communication system to be operated by the Sheriff's Department and for which a federal grant may be available to cover a substantial portion of the installation cost Such a system would probably require trained dispatchers to be paid by the county through the ensuing years. He noted that in some counties the Michigan State Police provide this type of dispatcher service. Moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Dompierre, and unanimously carried, that contact be made with the Michigan State Police at Marquette to determine if this can be done, and that their reply be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee so that the matter may be given consideration.

Moved by Commissioner Eureti, supported by Commissioner DeJuliannie, and unanimously carried, that a resolution sponsored by the "Keep Michigan Beautiful" Committee designating April 21 through May 20, 1972, as statewide Clean-Up, Paint-Up, Fix-Up campaign time be adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and carried unanimously, that the following resolution be adopted and that copies be sent to our representatives in the legislature and to the State Highway Department:



It was moved by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried by a roll call vote, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners buy a half page ad for both Michigamme Twp. and Richmond Twp. Centennial as they have done in the past for Republic Twp. when they held their centennial. The following ayes and nays were recorded. All Commissioners voting aye with the exception of Commissioners Hammerschmidt, Jernstad and Sodergren.

Monthly reports of the Marquette County Health Dept., Marquette Road Commission, Community Health Center, Acocks Medical Facility, Controller and Treasurer were read and ordered placed on file and the Treasurer's report published.

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Jenkin, supported by Commissioner Lawry, that the June meeting of the Marquette County

Buard of Commissioners be adjourned.

At this point Chairman Carl V. Pellonpaa declared the meeting open to a public hearing regarding the Tilden Mine Project's application to the County Board for the construction of an earthen dam on the Middle Branch of the Escanaba River. Chairman Pellonpaa set ground rules for the public hearing regarding the length of time and number of times each person may speak for or against the project. The following persons representing various organizations spoke for the project: Mr. James Clancey, Attorney for Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co.; Mr. Robert Markert, Executive Director of the Great Ishpeming Chamber of Commerce; Mr. Duane Beard, Planner for the Marquette County Townships Association; Msgr. David Spelgatti, citizen, City of Ishpeming; Mr. Ernest Ronn, United Steelworkers, C.I.O. District Director; Mr. Carl Rintala and Mr. Donald Symons, Negaunee Business & Professional Association and Negaunee Civic Association.

Mr. Peter Embley addressed the Commission regarding the need of creating a County Water Authority that would have control over all of the water in the County. He felt that a use tax should be charged to the mining company for this specific project with returns to go to finance public water and sewer projects within the County. Commissioner Sodergren addressed the Commission regarding what would be done to make sure that County Road 478 would be built to standards necessary for all county roads. He was assured by Mr. Robert DeGabriele that County Road 478 would be built to standards and all costs to provide this road would be paid for by the Tilden Mining Co.

It was moved by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Armatti, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the application to construct the earthen dam and causeway on the Middle Branch of the Escanaba River in Section 27, Town 47 North, Range 28 West, and create a water reservoir be approved and the necessary permission for immediate construction be granted.
