

July 19, 1972

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made, in the District Court Room of the Marquette County Court House, on July 19, 1972, at 1:30 p.m.

Roll was called and all members were found present with the exception of Commissioners Dompierre, Jacobson, Jernstad and Mattson.

The meeting was opened by an invocation by Rev. Randall Mendelsohn, of Negaunee, Michigan.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A communication from the Gwinn Lions Club regarding the rebuilding of County Road 553 was read. It was moved by Commissioner DeJulianne, supported by Commissioner Armatti, and carried, that the matter be referred to the County Road Commission for study and report.

Communication from Congressman Philip E. Ruppe regarding Federal highways funds was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Marquette County Airport Commission regarding a public hearing on the proposed amendment to the Airport Zoning Ordinance was read. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried, that the public hearing date be set for the August 23, 1972, meeting of the Board of Commissioners at 1:30.

A communication from the Airport Drive-In, Inc. regarding a 20-year lease on the property at the Airport Drive-In Movie was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Morrison and carried, that the matter be investigated by the Prosecutor as to the possibility of issuing a year by year lease because of possible airport expansion, and that the Transportation Committee meet with the Airport Commission to find out what long range plans there may be for the Airport.

A communication from the Marquette County Health Board regarding Bancroft Dairy milk wastes flowing into the stream along the Forestville Road was read and ordered placed on file.

A report of the Audit Committee was read recommending that claims and accounts in the amount of \$65,380.28 be allowed and ordered paid. It was moved by Commissioner Euret, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Audit Committee.

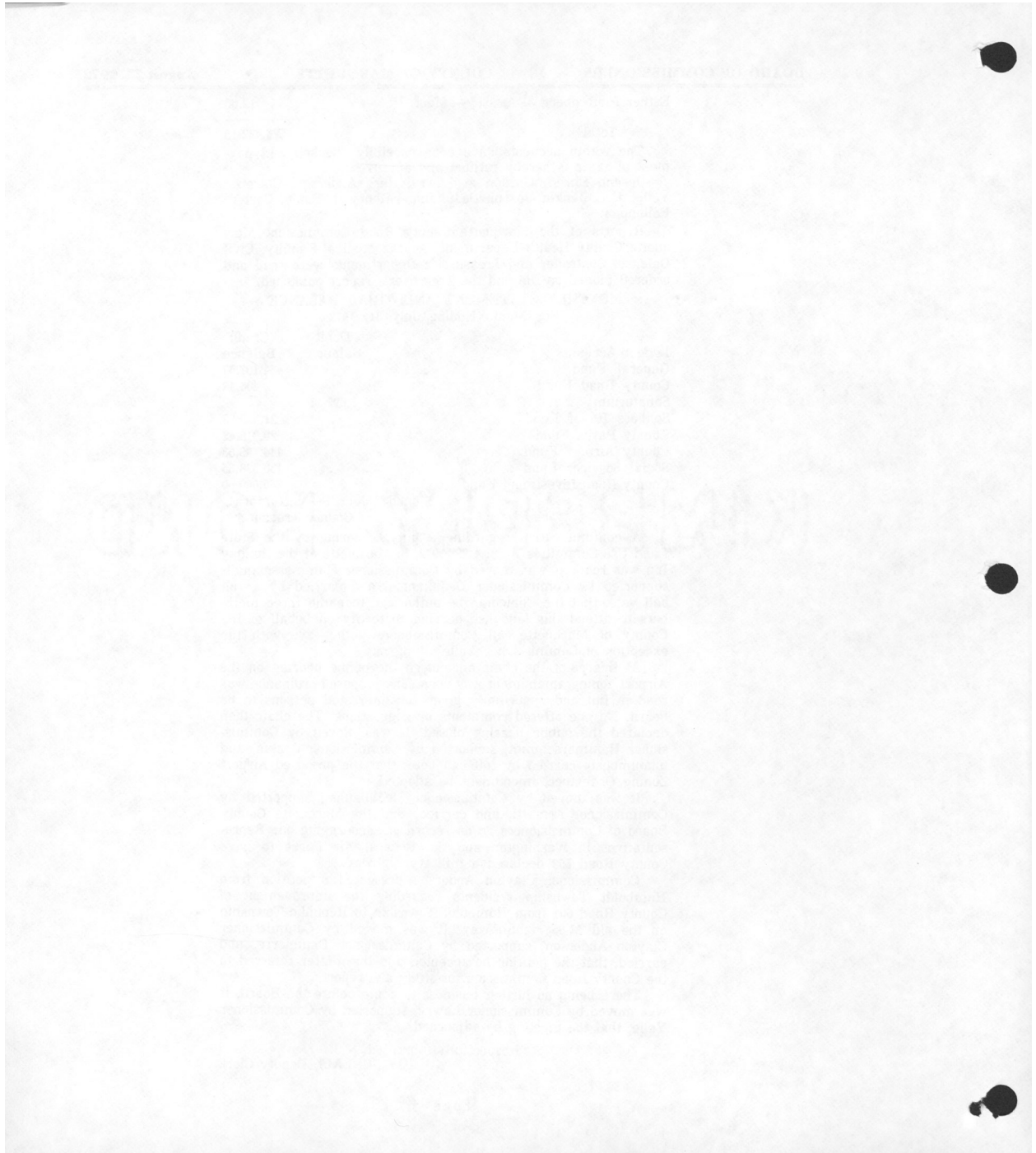

A communication from the Upper Peninsula Association of County Commissioners regarding the October 13th meeting of the Association to be held at Indianhead Mountain, Wakefield, Michigan, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, be authorized to appoint four Commissioners to attend this meeting.

✓A communication from Dr. S. J. Bessolo regarding his resignation as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Acocks Medical Facility was read. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Morrison, that the Board of Commissioners accept with great regret the resignation of Dr. Bessolo, and that a communication be sent him thanking him for his years of service for a job well done.

✓Chairman Pellonpaa opened nominations for the appointment of a person to fill the unexpired term of Dr. Bessolo which expires December 31, 1972. Dr. Joseph P. Bertucci was nominated by Commissioner Pepin. Commissioner Hammerschmidt moved, supported by Commissioner DeJuliannie, and unanimously carried, that the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot cast for the appointment of Dr. J. P. Bertucci.

✓A communication from the Marquette County Airport Committee regarding the amendment to the Grant Agreement Project No. 8-26-0063-01 was read. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendations of the Airport Committee and amend the Grant Agreement to delete Parcel No. 32AE from the project.

A communication from Mr. E. Nicholas Bridges regarding County Road 553 was read. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner DeJuliannie, that a copy of the letter be referred to the Transportation Committee and the County Road Commission for study and report on the feasibility of erecting white crosses along County Road 553 at places where deaths have occurred, and also signs asking motorists to keep their lights on 24 hours a day while driving on County Road 553.

A communication from the Marquette County Township Boards Association regarding using Court House as a monthly meeting place for their organization was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Jernstad, and carried, that the matter be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study and report.

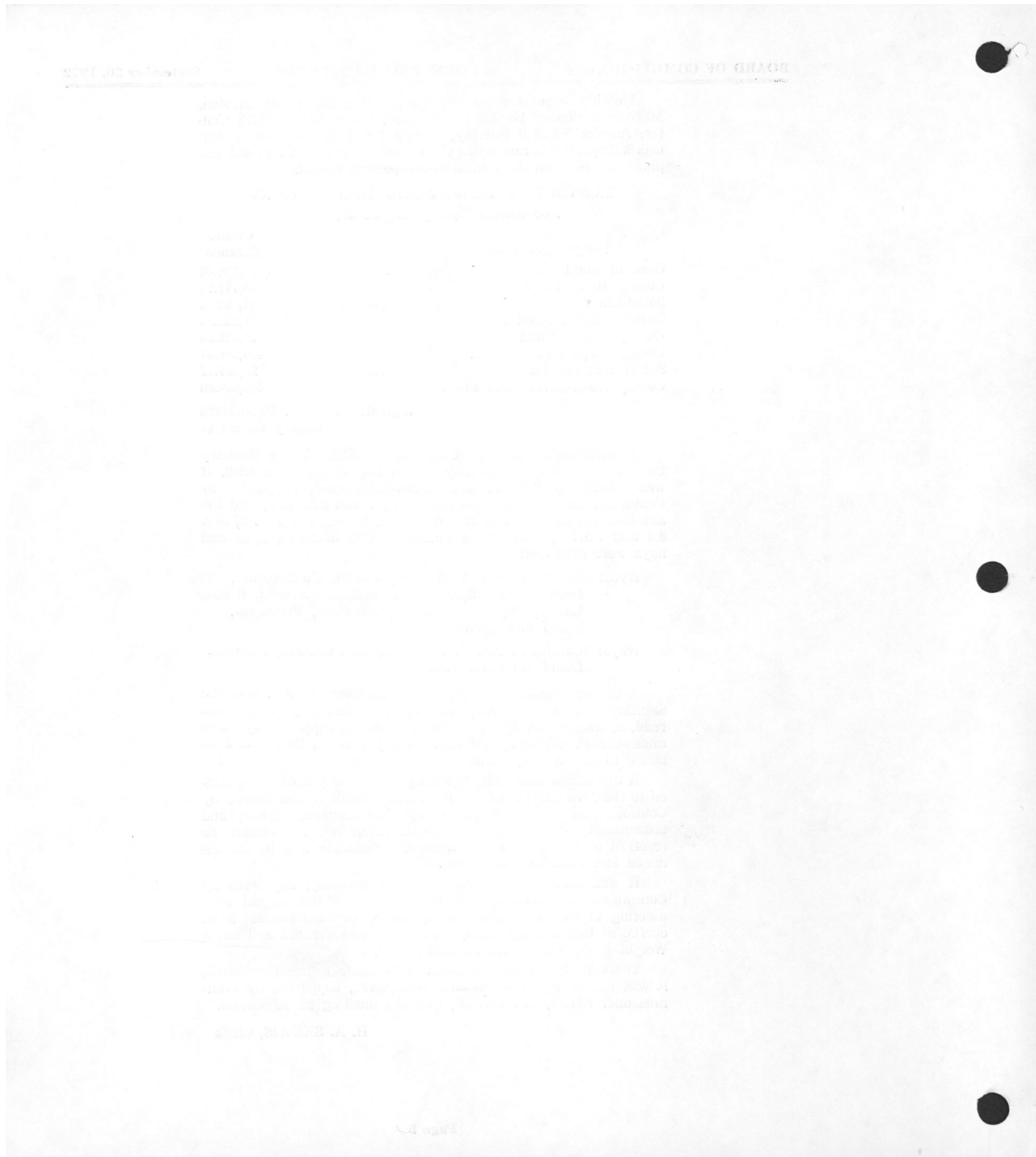

At this time the Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, called the

meeting open for a Public Hearing on the 1973 proposed Budget. Several Commissioners and private citizens spoke on certain items in the Budget. Your Budget and Executive Committee has had under consideration the various salaries on the County payroll. We, therefore, make the following recommendations for salaries of the several County Elective and Appointive Officers, Deputies, Clerks, Secretaries, etc., in the various departments, effective as of January 1, 1973, for the period up to and including December 31, 1973.

The salary schedule for employees listed herein is intended to apply to fully-trained personnel employed by the County of Marquette for a period of one year or more. New employees are to be employed at a starting salary of 90% of the salary fixed for the employee's position in this schedule and a one year probationary-training period shall follow employment. During the probationary-training period, the department head may make such adjustments to the employee's salary as the degree of training and competency of the employee warrants, but not to exceed the salary fixed for the position involved.

It is to be understood that all fees received by the County Clerk, County Treasurer, Sheriff, Register of Deeds and Judge of Probate be turned over to the County Treasurer on the last day of each month for deposit in the proper county funds, excepting, however, that fees for civil process, not payable from county funds, served on off time in private cars by the Sheriff or his deputies may be retained by the serving officer.

In the case of an emergency or in case a department requires additional funds or needs some special equipment which could not be foreseen at the time of the annual meeting, we recommend that the head of that department, together with the Controller, present the matter to the Board of Commissioners for their consideration and that they grant, where deemed necessary, authority to exceed the figures established in the annual budget.

If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend that authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Commissioners.

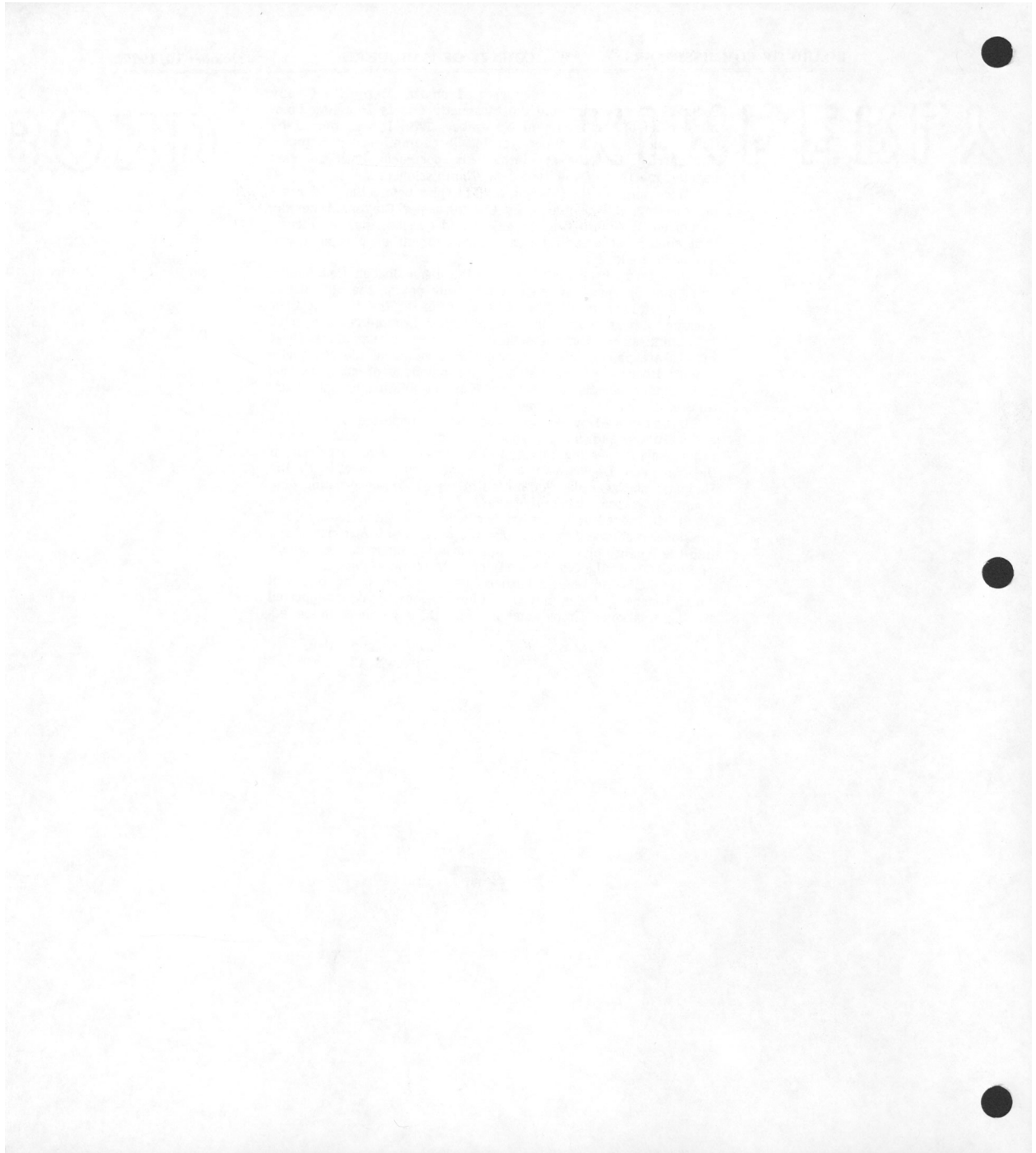

All Commissioners were present with the exception of Commissioners Jimmie L. Jenkin, Jack L. McCracken and Leslie H. Selin.

A salute to the flag was given and the Rev. Sam Stout, of the First United Methodist Church of Marquette, gave the invocation.

Commissioner Joseph DeJullianne submitted his resignation as Commissioner from the 4th District on the Marquette County Board of Commissioners with regret. He resigned because he has taken office as Supervisor of Forsyth Township and the two positions have been ruled to have a conflict of interest. In resigning, he recommended that Joseph O. Racine, who has been elected to take office January 1, 1973, from this same district, be authorized to fill the vacancy. The Board thanked Mr. DeJullianne for his efforts as County Commissioner. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried, that the Board appoint Joseph O. Racine to fill this vacancy.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner Krook, and carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A communication from Probate Judge, Michael DeFant, regarding the appointment of Dr. Robert E. White as Deputy County Psychiatrist, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, that the Board concur with the request of Judge DeFant and appoint Dr. Robert E. A communication from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding the per diem granted County Commissioners and members of County Commissions on and after January 1, 1973, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Budget & Executive Committee and increase the per diem rate to \$35.00 per meeting, effective January 1, 1973, all Commissioners voting aye with the exception of Commissioners Lawry, Selin and Yelle, who voted nay.

A Communication from the Buildings, Ground and Insurance Committee regarding certain recommendations for the new jail-court house annex building stating many recommendations was read. It was moved by Commissioner Jernstad, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendations of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee for the jail-court house annex building complex. The recommendations consist of:

1. That the Board of Commissioners resolve to rescind its former resolution, creating a county-city building authority.
2. That the County proceed as a single unit with the development of the Court House and Jail expansion program.

3. That Daverman Associates, Inc., the firm of architects which has prepared schematic plans under the direction of the County-City Building Authority, be instructed to prepare contracts for consideration by the Board of Commissioners for the development of the proposed building project on the Court House block.
4. That construction plans include a sheriff's residence.
5. That jail construction plans be prepared on the basis of a 60 occupancy jail so as to cover the expansion requirement initially.
6. That a security passage between the Jail and Court House Annex be included in the construction plan.
7. That the proposed size of the Court House Annex remain undiminished, regardless of the departure from the Project of the City of Marquette.
8. That application be made under the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (LEAA) for grant to apply against the cost of developing jail construction plans.
9. That an Advisory Committee for the Court House Annex and Jail Construction Project be named, consisting of former County-City Building Authority members William Tonkin, Thomas McNabb and Robert DeRoche, together with Thomas Jernstad, present Chairman of the Building, Grounds and Insurance Committee.
