A report of the Audit Committee was read recommending that claims and accounts in the amount of \$65,380.28 be allowed and ordered paid. 



Your Budget and Executive Committee has had under consideration the various salaries on the County payroll. We, therefore, make the following recommendations for salaries of the several County Elective and Appointive Officers. Deputies, Clerks, Secretaries, etc.. in the various departments, effective as of January 1, 1973, for the period up to and including December 31, 1973.

The salary schedule for employees listed herein is intended to apply to fully-trained personnel employed by the County of Marquette for a period of one year or more. New employees are to be employeed at a starting salary of 90% of the salary fixed for the employee's position in this schedule and a one year probationary-training period shall following employment. During the probationary-training period, the department head may make such adjustments to the employee's salary as the degree of training and competency of the employee warrants, but not to exceed the salary fixed for the position involved.

It is to be understood that all fees received by the County Clerk. If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend that authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Commissioners.



A communication from the Marquette County Road Commission regarding a quit-claim deed of a certain parcel of land situated in Marquette County described as the SE¼ of SE¼ of Sec. 36, T. 47 N., R. 28 W., to-wit: a gravel pit in Tilden Township, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried, that the matter be reterred to the Prosecuting Attorney's office in hopes that the County could issue a quit-claim deed themselves to a full one acre tract that had been previously deeded in error in 1956 by the Marquette County Road Commission.

A communication from the City of Marquette regarding the City of Marquette's withdrawal from the City-County Building Authority was read and ordered placed on file.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding the establishment of a County Transit Authority was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding the per diem granted Councy Commissioners and members of Councy Commissioner on and after January 1, 1973, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Budget & Executive Committee and increase the per diem rate to \$35.00 per meeting, effective January 1, 1973, all Commissioners voting aye with the exception of Commissioners Lawry, Selin and Yelle, who voted nay.

A Communication from the Buildings, Ground and Insurance Committee regarding certain recommendations for the new jail-court house annex building stating many recommendations was read. It was moved by Commissioner Jernstad, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendations of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee for the jail-court house annex building complex. The recommendations consist of:

- That the Board of Commissioners resolve to rescind its former resolution, creating a county-city building authority.
- 2. That the County proceed as a single unit with the development of the Court House and Jail expansion program.

- 3. That Daverman Associates, Inc., the firm of architects which has prepared schematic plans under the direction of the County-City Building Authority, be instructed to prepare contracts for consideration by the Board of Commissioners for the development of the proposed building project on the Court House block. 4. That construction plans include a sheriff's residence.
- 5. That jail construction plans be prepared on the basis of a 60 occupancy jail so as to cover the expansion requirement initially.
- 6. That a security passage between the Jail and Court House Annex be included in the construction plan.
- 7. That the proposed size of the Court House Annex remain undiminished, regardless of the departure from the Project of the City of Marquette.
- 8. That application be made under the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (LEAA) for grant to apply against the cost of developing jail construction plans.
- Jail Construction Project be named, consisting of former County-City Building Authority members William Tonkin, Thomas McNabb and Robert DeRoche, together with Thomas Jernstad, present Chairman of the Building, Grounds and Insurance Committee.

Chairman Pellonpaa announced that a 6-year term on the Marquette County Road Commission, Airport Commission and Parks Commission would expire 12-31-72, such appointment now being held by Donald Tripp. Chairman Pellonpaa declared nominations open. The dinner ending, it was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried, that the meeting adjourn.
