The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made by the Marquette County Clerk, Henry A. Skewis, for the purpose of re-organization of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners.

Roll call was held finding all Commissioners present.

The meeting opened with a salute to the flag.

It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

Nominations were declared open for the office of Chairman of the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Carl Pellonpaa nominated Commissioner Clayton Anderson. There being no further nominations, it was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried, that a unanimous ballot be cast for Clayton Anderson as Chairman of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners. Whereupon Commissioner Anderson took over the chair.

Chairman of the Board, Clayton Anderson, then declared nominations open for the office of Vice Chairman. Commissioner Racine nominated Commissioner James F. Sodergren. There being no further nominations, it was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried, that a unanimous ballot be cast for James F. Sodergren for Vice Chairman of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners.

It was moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa, that Chairman Anderson be authorized to select three members of the Commission to act with him as a committee of four to choose members of the standing committees and also to revise whatever rules are necessary in the Commissioners Procedure Manual.

It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter, and carried, that the Commission adopt a list of proposed meeting dates and times submitted by the Marquette County Clerk for the ensuing year of 1973.

Attention was called to the Board of the fact that the appointments of all the members of the Special Election Scheduling Committee expire in January, 1973, and that some thought should be given to the appointment of members to this committee.

It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy, and carried, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners continue in its practice of having a member of the clergy give invocation at all regular meetings.

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried, that the meeting be adjourned until the next regular meeting, January 24, 1973, at 1:30 p.m.

January 24, 1973

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made in the Marquette County Court House on January 24, 1973.

Invocation was given by Rev. D. C. Kalweit of the Messiah Lutheran Church, Marquette, Michigan.

Roll was called by the clerk, finding all Commissioners present.

Salute to the flag was given and it was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that we dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A communication from Joseph S. Mack acknowledging the Board's opposition to the omnibus land use and development act bill was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Michigan Upper Peninsula Snowmobile Association regarding county roads was read. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried, that the matter be referred to the transportation committee for study and report.

A communication from the Airport Drive-In, Inc., regarding the 20-year lease on the Airport Drive-In theatre property was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that a committee made up of the airport manager, the county board chairman, the chairman of the County Road Commission, Prosecuting Attorney and the chairman of the county lands and buildings committee be authorized to negotiate a new lease.

A communication from Probate Judge Michael DeFant regarding over-expenditures from the child care fund was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Russo and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the board concur with the recommendation of Judge DeFant and transfer \$9,034.14 from the county general fund to the child care fund.

A communication from the Co-operative Extension Service in regard to a meeting for the orientation of new county commissioners, clerks and treasurers was read. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and unanimously carried, that any member of the county board of commissioners be allowed to attend this meeting in Marquette if he so wishes.

A communication from the Prosecuting Attorney, Dale Ruohomaki, regarding the architectural services' contract for the new county jail and court house annex was read. After being assured it was the usual standard agreement, it was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the chairman of the board and the county clerk be authorized to execute the contract.

A communication from the Marquette County Board of Public Works regarding the Chocolay Township sanitary sewage system requesting the adoption of resolutions authorizing the issuance of county bonds was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Russo and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the county board of commissioners adopt the two resolutions in regard to the issuance of \$1,210,000 of county bonds. The remaining project's cost of \$727,500 will be funded through the issuance of a HUD grant.

A communication from CUPPADD requesting that a county commissioner be appointed to membership on the 12th District

ancillary manpower planning board was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the chairman, Clayton J. Anderson, be authorized to appoint a person to serve on this board.

A communication from Joseph P. Farrell, chairman of the Marquette County Planning Commission, asking that Gregory Main, Physical Planner for the Michigan Peninsula Development Corp., be granted time at the regular February meeting, to make an oral report on the county's comprehensive plan. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that permission be granted and letters sent to Messrs. Farrell and Main inviting them to attend the February 21st meeting of the board of commissioners.

Reports from the Welfare Contact Committee and Transportation Committee were read and ordered placed on file.

A report of the audit committee was read asking that claims and accounts in the amount of \$81,892.25 be allowed and ordered paid. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the board concur with the recommendation of the audit committee and order these claims and accounts paid.

A report of the special committee for revision of the Procedure Manual of the Marquette County Board was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Sodergren and carried, that the rules be taken up one by one and certain revisions made. All rules will remain the same with the exception of those changes noted as follows:

Whenever the title "Board of Supervisors" appears, this would be changed to "Board of Commissioners." Wherever the title "Supervisor" appears, this will be changed to the word "Commissioner."

It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner May and carried by a roll call vote, that Rule 2 be changed as follows with the following ayes and nays recorded: All commissioners voting aye with the exception of Commissioners Pellonpaa, Racine and Sodergren, who voted nay: Rule 2 would be changed to read: The following standing committees shall consist of that number of commissioners the chair sees fit to appoint:

1. Budget and Executive
2. Welfare Contact
3. Transportation
4. County Lands and Buildings
5. Audit
6. Finance and Transportation
7. Equalization
8. Environmental Quality

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that a new rule be inserted before rule 8 stating "Following the January organizational meeting the commission shall adjourn to a committee of the whole meeting to review and revise the rules and procedure manual."

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that old rule #8 be now designated as rule #9 and should read: "The chairman shall appoint 3 members to serve with him as a committee to appoint members to standing committees within 10 days after his selection to the chairmanship. The chairman shall appoint all special and select committees unless otherwise ordered by the board."

It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried, that old rule 14, to be known as Rule 15, should read: "The county clerk or his deputy shall attend all meetings of the board or its various committees when requested. He shall keep a correct journal of the board's proceedings. In the absence of both county clerk and deputy, the board may appoint a person as clerk pro tem."

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that old rule 24 shall now be known as rule 25 and shall read: "A roll call vote shall be taken on any question when called for by any member of the board."

It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa and carried, that old rule 32 shall now be known as rule 33 and shall read: "No person other than a board member shall be allowed to address the board or any of its committees except with the consent of a majority of the board members present. Permission to address the board or any of its committees on a special matter may be granted to any citizen who submits a letter stating the business to be discussed 15 days prior to the meeting in question. In no case shall any person other than a board member be permitted to speak when a question is before the board unless by invitation of and with the approval of a majority of the board members present."

All other rules shall remain the same and a new rules and procedure manual will be printed, revised as of January 24, 1973.

Monthly reports of the County Road Commission, office of Civil Defense, Marquette County Health Department, office of Controller and Treasurer's report were read and ordered placed on file and the Treasurer's report published.

A request from Mrs. Peter Braamse of the Marquette Bus Service asking that she be given time to speak at this meeting was honored. Mrs. Braamse spoke on the need of a transportation authority as of now. She reminded the Board that they had already missed the first quarter on any funding that may be available. She was informed by the Board that the matter was being taken under consideration by the Budget & Executive Committee in their studies.

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners had granted Mr. John Farrell, chairman of the Marquette County Planning Commission, and Mr. Greg Main, physical planner for the Mid-Peninsula Development Corp., time to speak at this meeting. Mr. Farrell spoke on the over-all comprehensive plan being drawn up for Marquette County. Mr. Main explained the details of the plan by showing slides and bringing the Marquette County Board up to date on how much of the over-all comprehensive plan had been completed. Also expressed by both of them was Marquette County's need for a full time planner once the plan goes into effect.

Commissioner May suggested that some discussion should be held at all meetings of standing committees of the Board in the very near future to consider a proposed formation of an ad hoc committee to study our county government. It would be a temporary committee and dissolved when its task was completed. Task of the committee would be to study the policies and procedures of our county government and, for comparison, other counties' governments of similar size, and to make recommendations to the Board, of policy and procedure changes wherever necessary.

It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that the county purchase copies of the Guide to Michigan County Government for each commissioner, to reimburse those who have already purchased them, and that the County Clerk be instructed to obtain copies of the Governor's Report for all Commissioners.

It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried, that the County Clerk be instructed to send letters to Mr. Weire, CUPPADD's Director of

Law Enforcement, and to CUPPADD Director, George Rush, inviting them to be present at the March 21st, 1973, meeting to discuss a central dispatch communications center.

It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that a resolution be drafted for Mr. Anthony Spratto, Friend of the Court, commending him for his many years of faithful and devoted service to both Marquette County and to the State of Michigan.

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that the meeting be adjourned.

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to a call duly made, in the District Courtroom of the Marquette County Court House, at 1:30 March 21, 1973.

Invocation was given by Rev. Samuel F. Stout, of the United Methodist Church, Marquette.

Roll call was held by the Clerk, finding all members present.

Salute to the flag was given and it was moved Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Casper and carried, that we dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, with the following amendment being made on page 1, 5th paragraph, which should read: "Regarding county road clearance in Chocolay Township."

A communication from the Michigan Association of Counties regarding County Commissioner's Exchange Day was read. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried, that this communication be placed on file.

A communication from the Marquette County Road Commission regarding a quit-claim deed for one square acre in the SE¼ of the SE¼ of Sec. 36, Town 47 North, Range 28 West, Tilden Township, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa and carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation made by the County Road Commission and the Prosecution Attorney, and authorize the chairman of the Board of Commissioners and the County Clerk to sign the quit-claim deed transferring this piece of property from Marquette County to the Marquette County Road Commission.

A communication from AMCAB again offering the services of Jeffrey Bell, VISTA Volunteer, to assist the county in the study of public transit systems and state grants was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried, that this communication be placed on file.

A communication from J. Kerwin Werner suggesting the county consider purchasing some shoreline property north of the City of Marquette was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs that this matter be referred to the Environmental Control Committee for study and response. Finding no support for this motion, the motion was declared dead by Clayton Anderson, Board Chairman. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that this communication be placed on file and that a letter be sent to the owner of this land commending him for allowing the public to use this property with an explanation that the purchase of this property was beyond the scope of county financing, and that Mr. Werner be notified accordingly.

A communication from the "Keep Michigan Beautiful" Marquette County Chapter regarding a county ordinance controlling disposition of junk vehicles was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the matter be referred to the Marquette Planning Commission for study and report, and that copies of the sample ordinance be sent to all planning commission members.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding the hiring of a County Planner was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa and carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Budget & Executive Committee and place advertisements in the proper state-wide publications soliciting applications from qualified professional planners, and that further recommendations would be coming on this subject at a later date.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding the preliminary 1974 county budget was read. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried, that the Board accept the recommendation of the Budget & Executive Committee and refer the budget to the Tax Allocation Board.

A report from the Welfare Contact Committee regarding the appointment of County Welfare Department Directors by the state rather than by local social services boards was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Welfare Contact Committee and adopt a resolution opposing House Bill No. 4166 which pertains to the appointment of a director of County Social Services by the State of Michigan.

A report from the Transportation Committee regarding the adoption of three resolutions was read. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried, that the three resolutions be adopted and letters be sent to all state and federal legislators. Resolution No. 1 opposes Senate Bill No. 38 which would prohibit head taxes or passengers use charges at the airport to apply toward the cost of providing security under new federal regulations. Resolution No. 2 endorses Senate Bill No. 39 which would authorize the FAA to establish an air transportation security force and to enter into agreements with local governments to utilize local enforcement personnel on a cost reimbursement basis at the smaller airports. Resolution No. 3 opposes the transfer of the Michigan Aeronautics Commission to the Michigan State Highway Commission.

A report of the Environmental Quality Control Committee regarding complaint filed by Dr. Jean M. Rutherford regarding right-of-way clearing on county roads and highways in Chocolay Township was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Coombs, that the matter be referred to the County Road Commission requesting that the County Road Commission establish a policy of notifying township officials involved prior to the clearing of road rights-of-way. This would give the township officials an opportunity to notify their residents if they feel that notice is warranted. On a roll call vote the following ayes and nays were reported:

Ayes: Commissioners Anderson, Casper, Coombs, May, Racine and Trapp.

Nays: Commissioners Doucette, Goldsworthy, Leadbetter, Pellonpaa, Russo and Sodergren.

There being a 6-6 tie vote, Clayton Anderson, Board Chairman, declared the motion defeated. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Russo, that this matter be referred to the Transportation Committee for study and report. Motion was passed on a roll call vote, all commissioners voting aye with the exception of Commissioners May and Coombs, who voted nay.

A report of the Audit Committee was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that claims and accounts in the amount of \$78,591.12 be allowed and ordered paid.

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met, pursuant to a call duly made, in the District Court room of the Marquette County Court House, April 25, 1973, at 1:30 p.m.

Invocation was given by Rev. Claude Pulvermacher from the Catholic Diocese of Marquette.

Roll call was held, finding all Commissioners present.

Salute to the flag was given followed by the approval of the minutes of the previous meeting on a motion made by Carl Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Coombs, and unanimously carried.

Communications from Senator Joseph S. Mack regarding the acknowledgment of resolutions in the matter of the U. P. Airport Operations Association, Satellite Crime Laboratory and appointment of County Director of Social Services under Sec. 13 of House Bill 4156 were read and ordered placed on file.

Communications from Representative Dominic J. Jacobetti regarding the Satellite Crime Laboratory and the County's position regarding the appointment of a County Social Service Director under Sec. 13 of House Bill 4156 were read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from U. S. Senator Robert P. Griffin acknowledging the County's resolution on the matter of amnesty was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from Congressman Philip E. Ruppe confirming a \$75,000 grant to assist in providing adequate crash rescue equipment and facilities for the Marquette County Airport from federal funds was read and ordered placed on file.

It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Sodergren and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that Henry Scarffe, County Mine Inspector, be authorized to attend the 49th annual mine safety conference of the Lake Superior Mines Safety Council to be held in Duluth, Minn., on May 24th and 25th, 1973.

A resolution regarding opposing the dual function of the State Tax Commission was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Russo, that this matter be placed on file. A vote was held and the motion was defeated. It was then moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners support this resolution and draw up their own resolution regarding this matter with copies to be sent to the state legislators and the Governor.

A resolution regarding the maintenance and improvement of the State of Michigan, Department of Mental Health facility at Newberry, Mich., for care of the mentally ill and mentally retarded persons of the Upper Peninsula was read. The Board sought the advice of Probate Judge Michael DeFant regarding the need of improvements in this facility. It was then moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that the Board adopt the resolution and copies be sent to our state legislators and the Governor.

A resolution from Delta County Board of Commissioners urging the State of Michigan to build a new exhibition building at the Upper Peninsula fair grounds in Escanaba was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried, that the Board adopt a similar resolution, sending copies to our state legislators, the Governor and head of the State Fair office, Mr. Clifford E. Perras, Sr.

A resolution protesting the action taken by the Wayne County Circuit Court threatening 20 Wayne County Commissioners with jail sentences if they did not comply with the court's wishes to authorize a pay raise for court employees was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that the Board concur with the resolution as favoring the passage of HJRC by the legislature with reservations as to any other legislature that is needed to bring the separation of powers back in legislation.

A communication from CUPPADD regarding the meeting of the Michigan Association of Regional Agencies was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from UPCAP regarding the EEA (now PEP) program not being extended was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa and carried, that the Board adopt the resolution urging Senators Hart and Griffin and Congressman Ruppe to push for a continuation of this program.

A communication from UPCAP regarding the spring conference of the Upper Peninsula Association of County Commissioners to be held in Marquette on May 4th and 5th was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Trapp and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the chairman and any or all of the Commissioners be allowed to attend.

A communication from the Michigan Association of Counties regarding a conference of public planning to be held at Western Michigan University was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa and carried, that the communication be placed on file.

A communication from CUPPADD regarding the Frank G. Miller testimonial dinner was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from William L. Robinson, co-chairman of the "Citizens to Save the Superior Shoreline" regarding making more county-owned lands available for recreation and the possibility of a trade of some of these lands for Superior shoreline property was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that the matter be referred to the Environmental Quality Committee and the Parks Commission for study and report at the May or June meeting of the Board.

A communication from the Marquette County Planning Commission regarding the proposed ordinance dealing with junk cars was read. The Planning Commission will submit a recommendation on this ordinance at the May 23rd, 1973, meeting of the Board of Commissioners.

A communication from the National Joint Commission of the United States and Canada regarding their holding public hearings during May on the future regulation of lake rivers was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Casper and carried, that a copy of the interim report on Lakes Superior and Ontario regulation be kept on file in the County Clerk's office for public inspection, and that the copy of the enclosed news release on these hearings be published.

A communication from the Board of Natural Resources regarding a conference at Troy, Mich., in conjunction with the National Recreational and Park Association to be held May 5th and 6th, 1973, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa and carried, that the

matter be referred to the Marquette County Road Commission for study and action if they deem it necessary to send a person to this conference.

A budget and Executive Committee communication regarding the Upper Peninsula Areawide Health Planning Association asking for fiscal aid from the county toward the Association's fiscal year commencing June 15, 1973, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee and grant the request of UPAHPA for a 3% per capita financial aid amounting to \$1,940.58, and that the County's general fund budget be amended accordingly.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding the possibility of extending the state grant toward the operation of the Marquette County Prosecutor's office was read. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board of Commissioners concur with the recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee and authorize the Prosecuting Attorney, Dale Ruohomaki, to make application for the extension of a state grant to his office for the period from June 1, 1973, through December 31, 1973, and that the chairman of the Board of Commissioners be authorized to execute the required application.

Reports of the Welfare Contact Committee and Transportation Committee were read and ordered placed on file.

A report from the County Lands and Building Committee regarding the jail-court house building project was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that Daverman Associates, Inc., be authorized to proceed with the preparation of the working drawings for the jail and sheriff's office building. The cost involved will be approximately \$40,000.

A report of the Audit Committee regarding the monthly claims and accounts was read. It was moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner May and carried by a unanimous roll call vote, that the claims and accounts in the amount of \$126,409.85 be allowed and ordered paid.

Roll call was held by the Clerk finding all members present with the exception of Commissioner Trapp.

Salute to the flag was given and it was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A communication from Senator Robert P. Griffin acknowledging receipt of our resolution regarding the time question was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Department of Natural Resources regarding the regulation of Great Lakes Commercial Fisheries was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Department of Natural Resources referring the matter of the sanitary sewer disposal system at the Marquette County Airport to the Marquette County Health Department was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Marquette County Planning Commission regarding a proposed County Junk Ordinance was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Planning Commission and publish a copy of the Junk Ordinance and schedule public hearings on this ordinance for the June 20, 1973, County Board meeting.

A communication regarding recommendations of the Civil Defense Director, Mr. Glen Wilson, with respect to changes in state civil defense regulations, and a companion resolution to create a county emergency preparedness department, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that Melvin Nyquist be named delegate to attend one of the three meetings that will be held in the Upper Peninsula during the months of May and June, 1973.

A communication from the Department of Treasury, State Tax Commission, regarding a hearing being held on Tuesday, May 29, 1973, in Lansing concerning the state equalized values of each county was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Pellonpaa and carried, that because the state equalized value of Marquette County is identical to the county equalized value (\$202,982.67), there would be no need to send a representative to this meeting and the communication should be placed on file.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding the summer youth program sponsored by the Michigan Department of Labor was read. It was moved by Commissioner Pellonpaa, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee and authorize AMCAB to supervise this program for 1973 on the basis of a 20-hour work week for each worker, the number of which is anticipated to be 85 persons, and that the general fund budget be amended to provide \$1,000 be paid to AMCAB to cover a portion of the program's administrative expense.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding the possibility of establishing a County Commission on Aging was read. A communication from the City of Marquette requesting an expression from the County Board regarding establishing a transportation Authority for the entire county was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Coombs, that this matter be referred to the Transportation Committee and that the County Board grant authority to the Budget and Executive Committee Chairman, Transportation Committee Chairman and Controller, to go to Lansing, Michigan, and find out what, if any, grants are available for this authority. This motion was defeated by a roll call vote with the following ayes and nays being recorded:

Ayes: Commissioners Coombs, Leadbetter and May.

Nays: Commissioners Anderson, Casper, Doucette, Goldsworthy, Racine, Russo, Sodergren and Trapp.
(Commissioner Pellonpaa being absent.)

It was then moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried by a roll call vote, that at this point of time it would not be necessary to form a County Transportation Committee, and that the Board of Commissioners are not at this time interested in forming this authority because of the unequal opportunity for all county residents to take advantage of this program. The following ayes and nays were recorded:

Ayes: Commissioners Anderson, Casper, Doucette, Goldsworthy, Racine, Russo, Sodergren and Trapp.

Nays: Commissioners Coombs, Leadbetter and May.
(Commissioner Pellonpaa being absent.)

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee recommending that a Wage Study Committee consisting of the Board Chairman and three other commissioners being named to review the salary schedule for 1974 was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Sodergren and carried, that the County Board Chairman be authorized to form this committee with the report to be sent to the Budget and Executive Committee.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding the proposed amended budget for the Prosecuting Attorney's office for the period June 1, 1973, to December 31, 1973, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Sodergren and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Prosecuting Attorney's budget be amended from a total of \$79,836.00 to \$89,836.00, an increase of \$10,000.00. One half of this increase will be paid under the state grant and under proposed amended budget the cost to the county would not exceed \$3,500.00 for the remaining seven-month period of 1973. Under the amended budget the Prosecuting Attorney could employ two

full time Prosecutors and the new arrangement should provide improved and adequate service to the county.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee regarding the per diem allowance for feeding prisoners in the County Jail was read. It was moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that effective June 1, 1973, a per diem allowance for feeding prisoners in the County Jail be adjusted from \$1.40 to \$2.00 per day. No budget increase is anticipated for this adjustment for the reason that a drop in the average number of prisoners housed in the jail would offset the per diem increase.

A report from the Welfare Contact Committee recommending that the County Board of Commissioners go on record in favor of changing the state regulation so as to provide the positions of work and training program co-ordinator and food stamp clerk be included in the staffing of the County Social Services Department as classified employees rather than have them unclassified. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that a resolution be adopted that the State Department of Social Services be required by legislative action to recognize the supportive programs established by the County Boards of Social Services and to staff them by allocation of state classified positions through established Civil Service system.

Reports of the Transportation Committee and County Lands and Building Committee were read and ordered placed on file.

A report from the Audit Committee recommending that claims and accounts in the amount of \$89,131.60 be allowed and ordered paid. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the audit be accepted and these claims and accounts be paid.

A communication from the Environmental Quality Committee regarding the need of Marquette County acquiring some access sites to Lake Superior was read. It was pointed out that some of the desirable areas were owned by the Martin, Clark and Touton families. Discussion was held on the exchange of inland county-lands for access sites on Lake Superior. It was moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that the Board Chairman, Clayton J. Anderson, be instructed to send out letters of inquiry to persons owning land with Lake Superior frontage.

At this point the public hearing on the proposed Marquette County Junk Yard and Junk Vehicle Ordinance was declared open by Chairman Anderson. The ordinance was read in its entirety and a lengthy discussion involving many persons was held regarding two points in particular. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Sodergren and carried, that under Section 3, Definitions, a definition be added known as Junk Farm Equipment be defined as equipment totally inoperable or irreparable.

It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner May, that Section IV A of the proposed ordinance be amended to add item 5.

"5. Motor vehicles in the process of restoration or conversion as so declared by the owner in a statement to the Department of Public Works accompanied by a suitable fee to be determined by the Department of Public Works, said fee to be returned to the applicant upon completed restoration of said vehicle or upon compliance with the provisions of Section 4-A."

It was then moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Casper and carried, that the Marquette County Junkyard and Junk Vehicle Ordinance, as amended, be adopted, phase 1 to begin July 1, 1973.

A resolution regarding Marquette County Board of Commissioners being charged with the responsibility of submitting to the State of Michigan a solid waste management plan in accordance with the rules in Act 89 of the Michigan Public Acts of 1971, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried, that the Board of Commissioners adopt a resolution setting up the goals, objectives and policies to be submitted to the State in compliance with Public Act 89 of the Public Acts of 1971.

Reports from Acocks Medical Facility, Community Mental Health Center, Marquette County Health Department, Marquette County Road Commission, County Office of Emergency Preparedness, Treasurer and Controller were read and ordered placed on file and the Treasurer's report published.

A communication from H. L. Shroeger regarding the appointment of a member of the Airport Zoning Board of Appeals was read. This appointment has always been the Chief of Engineering and Construction Division of K.I. Sawyer A.F.B. and will expire June 30, 1973. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter, that the Chief of Engineering and Construction Division of K.I. Sawyer A.F.B. be appointed to the Airport Zoning Board of Appeals. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried, that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for the Chief of Engineering and Construction Division, K.I. Sawyer A.F.B., term to expire June 30, 1976.

Nominations were then declared open for appointment of a person to serve on the County Board of Health. The term of Dr. James F. Tobin having expired June 1, 1973. It was moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Sodergren, that Dr. Tobin be nominated to succeed himself. It was then moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Sodergren and carried, that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Dr. Tobin to serve on the Board of Health, term to expire June 1, 1978.

Nominations were then declared open for the appointment of a member to the County Library Board. It was stated by Chairman Clayton Anderson that Mrs. Norman Hocking had expressed her desire to no longer serve on this Board. Her term would expire July 1, 1973. It was moved by Commissioner May that Mrs. Sandra Wester be nominated for this appointment. It was then moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Casper, that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Mrs. Sandra Wester as a member of the County Library Board, term to expire July 1, 1978.

The County Board Chairman, Clayton Anderson, called upon Greg Main, Physical Planner for CUPPADD, who is employed by the Marquette County Board through the Planning Commission to draft an over-all comprehensive plan for the county. Mr. Main talked on a short-range plan for Marquette County. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that the Board accept the short-range plan with the intention of its adoption at the July meeting.

Proposed site plans for the Marquette County proposed jail and court house addition were shown along with the brochure on what the buildings would consist of, how they would be financed and how they will be voted upon. After careful study of these site plans and brochure, it was moved by Commissioner Sodergren,

supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the brochure and plans be spread on the minutes of this meeting and be published.

A request was made by Commissioner Coombs to allow Mrs. Julia Tibbitts to speak to the Board regarding the proposed upper harbor coal dock. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Casper and carried, that permission be granted her. After a short talk by Mrs. Tibbitts regarding the July 9th deadline for filing complaints in this matter, it was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that a letter be sent to the director of the Corps of Engineers, U.S. Government, Minneapolis, Minn., asking that the July 9th deadline be extended for at least six months in order that the public could be made aware of what they are developing, what the impact will be and time for submission and compiling of information to be submitted to the Water Resources Commission and to the EPA. Very little public information has been handed out and the public is not aware that any environmental impact statement or environmental assessment plan has yet been filed.

It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that there is a need for a study of the existing road system in Marquette County and that possibly County Road 480 should be classified as a State Road and the Stoneville Road west of Ishpeming be classified as a County Road. The matter was referred to the County Road Commission and the Transportation Committee for study and designation of the present roads in Marquette County in the hope that a recommendation for re-classification of some of these roads would be forthcoming.

It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Casper and carried, that because six or seven communities in the Upper Peninsula draw their drinking water directly from Lake Superior, and that asbestos fibers have been reported to have been found in Lake Superior waters, believed possibly to have come from the operation of the Reserve Mining Co., a letter should be sent to Congressman Ruppe asking him to do all within his power to have all sources of municipal drinking water in Lake Superior checked for asbestos fibers or any other impurities and that especially the water flowing into Lake Superior from the Carp River be checked for impurities due to the fact that the Pioneer Mine is now putting their re-used water into the Carp River.

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried, that the meeting be adjourned.

Dear Mr. Skewis:

The Secretary of the Navy has requested that I answer your letter of June 5 concerning the resolution passed by the Marquette County Board of Commissioners on May 23 which requested that the Navy hold an informational meeting on SANGUINE at Marquette for interested citizens. As you may know, on June 5 I was in Houghton discussing Project SANGUINE at a meeting of the Upper Peninsula Commission for Area Progress (UPCAP). In keeping with normal UPCAP practice, this meeting was open to the public. I would estimate that 150 Upper Peninsula residents were present in addition to the UUCAP delegates. I believe this meeting was most beneficial in explaining the SANGUINE project and the Navy's interest in the Upper Peninsula. Additionally I had the pleasure of meeting Commissioners May, Trapp and Goldsworthy and discussing the resolution.

Based on accounts I have read subsequently, it now appears to be generally understood in Upper Michigan that, in accordance with guidance from the Secretary of Defense, Navy planning assumes that an initial operational SANGUINE system, if built, would be in Texas. If a larger system were to be required than could be accommodated there, we would build as much of the system as is economically feasible in Texas with the remainder at some other suitable location such as Upper Michigan. Decisions on where, how big, etc., cannot be made for several years, however, after we have completed the necessary Research and Development. In view, therefore, of the rather tentative nature of a SANGUINE site in the Upper Peninsula, I feel that another meeting, following so closely on the heels of the recent meeting in Houghton, would be premature.

When future developments warrant, we will be happy to return to Upper Michigan to give the citizens information on SANGUINE at a meeting or meetings such as were endorsed by the Marquette County Board of Commissioners. In the interim, should any of the commissioners or other citizens desire additional information on SANGUINE, I would be most happy to respond to their questions. I do feel that such discourse, even by mail, will enable future decisions on SANGUINE to be prudent ones based upon facts which are known to all.

I am enclosing some informational material to assist in understanding Project SANGUINE.

It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that cushions be purchased for the chairs used by the Commissioners in the District Courtroom, and that a window fan also be purchased for the Marquette District courtroom.

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that the meeting be adjourned.
