

January 23, 1974

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met, pursuant to a call duly made, on January 23, 1974, in the Commissioners' Room of the Court House.

Salute to the flag was given and roll call was held by the Clerk, finding all members present.

In regard to the approval of the minutes of previous meetings, it was held by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the minutes of the November 21st and 27th meetings be deferred until they are re-published in their right text in The Mining Journal.

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried, that the County Board appoint a 5-member citizens' committee on animal control to study existing ordinances, facilities and agencies within the county, and recommend to the Board some solution to the problem by August 1, 1974, and further move that the committee members be appointed by the Board at the next regular meeting."

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the January 4th minutes (the re-organization meeting) be accepted as read.

A communication from UPCAP regarding their appearance at the last regular meeting of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners be read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Department of Public Health regarding selection of the County Regional Coordinating Agency for Substances Abuse Services was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mr. Donald A. Snitgen, of Marquette, Michigan, was read regarding supporting House Bill 4926, the use of glass bottle containers, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried, that this matter be referred to the Environmental Quality Control Committee for report at the next meeting.

A communication regarding amending the budget for an additional \$1500 to pay for books for the law library maintained by the county was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that the matter be referred to the Budget and Executive Committee for recommendation and report back at the next regular meeting.

A communication was received from the Department of Natural Resources regarding the approval of a 6-county plan for solid waste management. This communication was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from Mrs. Helen Buswell, Gordon Petersen, Phyllis Pelissier, County of Ottawa and Theodore Kangas regarding the setting of Daylight Savings Time. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Sodergren and carried, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners petition the State of Michigan to exempt that portion of Michigan presently in the Eastern Time Zone from the Federal law imposing year round Daylight Savings Time. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried, that letters be sent to all persons expressing their concern about the time issue, informing them of the position of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners has taken.

A communication was read regarding the acceptance of a

resolution from CUPPADD regarding the adoption of a resolution naming it as the organization to work out a consortium of the three regions in Eastern Upper Peninsula, Western Upper Peninsula and Central Upper Peninsula planning and Development Regions as the organization that would control Title III funds for programs for the aging. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried, that the organization known as CUPPADD be accepted as the agency considered by Marquette County to be the most competent to handle this sort of program. A vote on the resolution was taken, showing all Commissioners voting aye with the exception of Commissioner Goldsworthy voting nay.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding the improper printing of certain paragraphs of proceedings in the Marquette County Board of Commissioners meeting for the past three months was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried, that the County Clerk be instructed to ask the Mining Journal to send copies of all materials sent them regarding the Board of Commissioners meetings so that they may be proof-read before they are published. The County Clerk at this time advised the Board that it was an impossibility due to the fact that the Mining Journal does not have the necessary machinery to send proof-reading copies of any material before it is printed.

It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that, because of the factor mentioned in the foregoing paragraph, the Clerk distribute copies of the Board of Commissioner minutes to each Commissioner for their approval before printing.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee was read regarding Blue Cross-Blue Shield Hospital Insurance as concerned with County Commissioners who may request this service. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and carried by a roll call vote, that the Board accept the recommendation and allow the County Commissioners to participate in the Blue Cross-Blue Shield Insurance as is used in the county at the present time. All Commissioners voted aye with the exception of Commissioners Casper and Leadbetter who voted nay. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that the Prosecuting Attorney's office be asked to investigate whether or not all elected and part-time employees can be included in the Blue Cross-Blue Shield Plan, and that the matter be referred to the Budget and Executive Committee for study and report back at the next regular meeting provided they receive the necessary material from the Prosecuting Attorney's office.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding paying the Central Upper Peninsula Planning & Development District dues in the amount of \$6,000 for the year 1974 was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the 1974 budget be amended to allot \$6,000 for dues as a member of CUPPADD.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding the possibility of not receiving construction materials needed for the new jailhouse complex in time to go ahead with construction in 1974 was read. It was moved that



the Board of Commissioners authorize the County Controller to make payment from the jailhouse complex fund for invoices certified by the building architect as being proper and meeting all the conditions up to the amount of \$60,000.

A report from the Welfare Contact Committee was read and ordered placed on file.

A report from the Transportation Committee was read and ordered placed on file.

It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried, that a letter be sent to our legislation in Lansing regarding the distribution and designation of Welfare funds that are being paid in Marquette County. Commissioner Sodergren felt that a study should be made due to the fact that we have found several cases of welfare fraud in Marquette County.

A communication from the County Lands and Buildings Committee regarding the use of county jail inmate labor for maintenance purposes in the courthouse and the use of social service department work training program workers for maintenance of the court house as opposed to hiring a full time maintenance worker at a yearly salary of \$6,000 to do the maintenance work in the court house, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the County Lands and Buildings Committee and employ a person at \$6,000 per year to act as a full time maintenance man in the court house-jail complex.

A communication from the County Lands and Buildings Committee regarding payment of \$350.00 to Davenport Associates for testing of backfill soil and compaction to be used in the jailhouse construction program was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that they concur with the recommendations of the County Lands and Buildings Committee and authorize this service for the information necessary on back filling.

A communication from the County Lands and Buildings Committee regarding recovery of a parcel of land which had been deeded to the Intermediate School District in years previous for a headquarters building was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Intermediate School District Board be offered the sum of \$6,500 to cover the cost involved in the purchase of a parcel of land that had been purchased from the Clark Estate, and a small parcel of land acquired by deed from the Marquette County Road Commission along with the return of the parcel of land which was originally deeded to the Intermediate School District in past years. The total of this offer would be \$6,500.

A communication from the County Lands and Buildings Committee regarding bidders risk insurance on the new jail complex building was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Russo and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the County Lands and Buildings Committee and purchase this builders risk insurance at an annual cost of \$2,558 per year from the Marquette County Association of Insurance Agents.

A communication from the County Lands and Buildings Committee regarding the payment of bills already owed on

the jail complex building through their construction fund was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the following bills be paid:

1. Miller, Canfield, Paddock & Stone, for their services as bonding attorneys. \$3,781.16
2. Kenower, McArthur Division for their services as bonding advertising specialists, the sum of \$3,914.02.
3. Litho-Art, Inc. for the bonding of the jail complex bonds 759.00
4. Panax Corp. for publishing county notices of the county jail bond sale 68.00.
5. Bond Buyer for the publishing of the county jail building bond sale 468.51.

A communication from the County Lands and Buildings Committee regarding the ear-making of \$300,000 of Federal Revenue Sharing funds for the construction of the jailhouse complex was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the County Lands and Buildings Committee and that \$300,000 be transferred at this time from the Federal Revenue Sharing fund to the jail building complex construction fund.

A communication from the County Lands & Buildings Committee regarding payment of \$1,000 architect fee to Walter J. Myers for his services on the proposed Youth Shelter building was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the County Lands and Buildings Committee and pay Mr. Walter J. Myers \$1,000 for a portion of his services for the Youth Shelter project.

A communication from the County Lands and Buildings Committee regarding the recent letter to the editor of the Mining Journal under the signature of E. Nicholas Bridges regarding maintenance operation of the heating system and lack of interest on the part of the members of the Board of Commissioners in the maintenance of the courthouse was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that a copy of the explanation of what is or is not being done in the courthouse be sent to the Mining Journal and a copy to Mr. E. Nicholas Bridges.

A communication from the County Lands and Buildings Committee regarding the re-decorating of the interior of the courthouse, including repair, cleaning, application of coats of paint and varnish was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the County Lands and Buildings Committee and, during the year 1974, bids be taken covering the cleaning, repairing, varnishing and painting of the walls, ceilings and floors of the courthouse.

The Audit Committee met on January 21, 1974. They audited claims and accounts in the amount of \$88,367.23 and recommended that the claims and accounts be allowed and paid. It was moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by

Commissioner Casper and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the audit report be accepted and that the accounts be allowed and paid.

A report from Chairman Clayton J. Anderson regarding the make-up of the standing committees of the Board for the year 1974 was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the members of these various standing committees be accepted and a list of the names printed and kept on file in the County Clerk's office.

A communication from the committee as a whole regarding changes in the Procedure Manual and the setting up of a new committee to be known as the Personnel Committee was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported

by Commissioner Sodergren and carried, that the amendments to the Procedure Manual be made, and that fold-out inserts be printed by the county to be inserted in the Procedure Manuals that have already been printed.

At this point a public hearing was opened by Chairman Anderson regarding proposed amendments to the Marquette County Junk Yard and Junk Car Ordinances. The proposed amendment would read as follows:

Sec. VIII — Penalty. There shall be inserted in place of Paragraph 1 in the following:

"Any person, firm or corporation found to be in violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be notified in writing to remove or eliminate such violation within ten (10) days after the service of notice upon him. Such notice may be served personally or by mailing the same by registered mail, return receipt requested, to the premises or to the last known address of the owner. Additional time may be granted by the enforcement officer where bona fide efforts to remove or eliminate the violation is in progress."

"Failure to comply with such notice within the time allowed shall constitute a violation of this ordinance."

"Violation of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor which shall be punishable upon conviction thereof by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed 90 days or both fine and imprisonment."

Approval of the Junk Car and Junk Yard Ordinances for Marquette County was received from Acting Governor James Brinkley and also from the Attorney General's office under the signature of Frank J. Kelley. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner May, that the amendment be adopted, and this was unanimously carried by a roll call vote.

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the Chairman of the Board, Clayton J. Anderson, be instructed to appoint a 7-man committee rather than a 5-man committee to study existing ordinances, facilities and agencies within the county regarding animal control. At this point Chairman Anderson informed the Board that the committee would be made up of Dr. David Engstrom, Marquette, Mich., Ann Trudell, National Mine, Mich., Monica Zehnder, Marquette, Mich., James Jacobson, Marquette, Mich., Donald Hermanson, Chief of Police, Marquette Twp., Mich., Sheriff Adrian Pequet, Marquette, Mich., and Jean Trombley, Marquette, Mich. It was requested that letters be sent to members of this committee instructing them as to the fact that the Board would expect a report from them on the animal control problem on or before August 1, 1974.

There being no new business to be brought before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the meeting be adjourned.

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met, pursuant to a call duly made, on February 20, 1974, in the Commissioners' Room of the Marquette County Court House.

Salute to the flag was given and an opening prayer given by Reverend Pruette of the First Baptist Church of Marquette.

Roll call was held, finding all Commissioners present with the exception of Commissioner Russo, who was absent.

In regard to the re-printing of the November 21st and November 28th Board meeting, in The Mining Journal, for the purpose of correcting the minutes was referred to the Budget and Executive Committee for report and study on a motion by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried.

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that the January 23rd minutes be approved, with the following correction, "the communication from the County Lands and Building Committee regarding the payment of an amount for approximately \$350.00, for the testing of back fill soil and compaction to be used in the jail construction program was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, that the Board concur to the recommendations of the County Lands and Building Committee, and authorize this service.

A communication from the National Clearing House for Criminal Justice Planning Architecture was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from J. Kerwin Werner, of Marquette, in regard to the red dust fall-out in the Marquette area from Eagle Mills and Pioneer Pelletizing Plants was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that a letter be sent to the Marquette County Health Department and to the Air Pollution Control Commission in regard to this matter, and that the matter also be referred to the Environmental Quality Committee for study and report and further that the letter be sent to Mr. Werner advising him of a possible hearing that will be held June 18, 1974, and advise him that he would be invited to attend.

Communications from Donald L. Schaner, Chief of the Soil and Water Conservation Division, State of Michigan, and Mr. Melvin Nyquist, County Extension Director in regard to meetings to discuss and explain the updated rules for the implementation of Act 347 was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Sodergren and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, that the Board authorize John Farrell, Chairman of the Planning Commission, and Melvin Nyquist, Secretary of the Planning Commission, to represent the Board of Commissioners at this meeting and to report back to the Planning Commission so that the Planning Commission can make a report and recommendations at the March 20th meeting of the County Board of Commissioners.

A communication from the First National Bank of Marquette, asking that a resolution be adopted setting up a system of payment for processing County Jail Bond redemptions and interest coupon payments, due to the fact that they are acting as a principal paying agent, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by

Commissioner Goldsworthy and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, that the Board adopt the resolution.

An amendment to the resolution to the Federal grant application, at the Marquette County Airport, for funding under Project 9-20-063-C906 which would increase the grant amount from \$400,000.00 to \$401,028.29 was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, that the Board adopt the amendment to the resolution.

A communication from Louis Negrinelli, of Gwinn, Michigan in regards to the gasoline shortage was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Casper, and carried that letters or telephone calls, if necessary, be used to advise Representatives on the State and Regional level, and also the Office of the U.S. Energy Commission, to find help to alleviate the gas problem within the whole county.

A communication from the Department of Management and Budget, of the State of Michigan, giving notice of a meeting to be held by the Federal Regional Council, at Lansing, Michigan on March 1, 1974 at the Law Building auditorium in Lansing, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Trapp and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, that the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, and other Board members that he may designate, attend this meeting.

A recommendation from the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to a request from Circuit Judge B.H. Davidson, that the sum of \$1,500.00 be appropriated for the law library fund, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, that \$1,500.00 be transferred from the general fund to the law library fund.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to the publication costs of the synopsis of the comprehensive plan for Marquette County, in the Mining Journal at a cost of \$960.00, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, that the Board of Commissioners amend the 1974 budget of the Planning Commission by adding \$1,000.00 to provide funds for this advertising.

A communication from the Welfare Contact Committee, in regard to the method of distributing food stamps in Marquette County, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy, and carried, that the Board of Commissioners concur with the recommendations of the Welfare Contact Committee and go on record opposing the proposed distribution of food stamps through the post office and recommend that the program by which the distribution of food stamps by the County Social Service Department be continued and that a letter be sent to the State Department of Social Service expressing their views.

A report of the Transportation Committee was read and ordered placed on file.

It was reported by Commissioner Sodergren that he had received several complaints from persons in the Big Bay area, in regard to private roads being jammed with cars with persons either fishing or snowmobiling in that area. He suggested that a parking lot at the Perkins Park be opened up

for the parking of fishermen and snowmobilers vehicles. He was informed by the Superintendent-Engineer of the County Road Commission, that the lot was being plowed and that parking in the Perkins Parking lot would be more advantageous to the sportsmen.

A report of the Auditing Committee on their February 19, 1974 meeting, at which time they approved claims and accounts in the amount of \$92,391.51 was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, that claims and accounts in the amount of \$92,391.51 be allowed and ordered paid.

A communication from Dr. W. L. Casler, in regard to feeding and food storage spaces in the Marquette County Jail kitchen, was read and ordered placed on file.

Notices of public hearings in regard to Range Corporation and revision of changes relating to the underground extension of the uniform underground electric extension policy were read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried that these communications be placed on file.

Public notice from the Department of Natural Resources in regard to a request from Mr. Einar K. Olesen, Republic, Michigan for a permit to construct a boat shelter in Witch Lake, and from the Michigan Bell Telephone Company, to lay underground cables in the bottom of the Yellow Dog River in Ishpeming Township, and in the bottom of Alder Creek in Powell Township, were read. It was moved by Commissioner Gaboury and carried, that these matters be referred to the Environmental Quality Committee for study and report.

A resolution from Livingston County Board of Commissioners supporting House Joint Resolution CC was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that the matter be referred to the Budget and Executive Committee for study and report.

A request from the Menominee County Board of Commissioners, asking that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners pass a resolution opposing the hunting of antlerless deer, was discussed. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that the matter be referred to the Environmental Quality Committee.

The Board was informed, through an Attorney General's opinion, that Blue-Shield, Blue-Cross Medical Insurance was available at no cost to all full-time County elected employees, the total cost to be paid by the County.

Commissioner Casper called to the attention of the Board the fact that there is car parking on the emergency strip on County Road 553 near Cliff's Ridge and wondered if this matter should be referred to the Transportation Committee and the County Road Committee. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Casper and carried that a letter be sent to the Marquette City Police Department, requesting them to look into this problem due to the fact that this parking area is within the City limits.

Commissioner Sodergren introduced a resolution in regard to Project Sanguine. This was supported by Commissioner Leadbetter. The resolution asked that the Board of Commissioners support the Navy in the research and development phase so that an accurate evaluation of the feasibility and ecological study of Sanguine be determined. After a lengthy discussion, a roll-call vote was held in which the

following Commissioners voted aye: Doucette, Goldsworthy, Anderson, Leadbetter, Racine and Sodergren and the following Commissioners voting nay: Casper, Coombs, Gaboury, May and Trapp. The Clerk then ordered that a 6 to 5 vote in favor of the project was registered.

WHEREAS, the Navy has demonstrated the need for a low frequency underground communication system, and

WHEREAS, at a public hearing in Marquette on Sanguine a large number of concerned citizens had questions relative to the ecological effects of same, and

WHEREAS, the Navy has not completed all of its studies which they estimate will take up to three years: now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners does hereby support the Navy in the research and development phase so that an accurate evaluation of the feasibility and ecological aspect of Sanguine can be determined.

Copies to: U. S. Navy, Ruppe, Hart, Griffin, Jacobetti, Mack, and Milliken.

Commissioner Sodergren then introduced a resolution in regard to heating fuels in the Marquette County area. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried by a roll-call vote that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners request the Legislature to place all propane gas dealers, and fuel oil dealers, under the Public Service Commission until such time as the energy crisis is improved and the free enterprise system is restored. All Commissioners voted aye with the exception of Leadbetter, who voted nay.

WHEREAS, the energy crisis has destroyed the free enterprise system in purchasing heating fuels, and

WHEREAS, the price of heating fuels continues to skyrocket, and

WHEREAS, the service is sometimes questionable, therefore be it, RESOLVED, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners does hereby request that the legislature place all Propane dealers and fuel oil dealers under the Public Service Commission, until such time whereby the energy crisis is improved and the free enterprise system is restored.

It was noted by Commissioner Sodergren that public notice from the Public Service Commission and the Department of Natural Resources, in regard to public hearings held on projects in the County, should be given to the Environmental Committee as soon as possible after being received by the County Clerk. It was moved by Commissioner Soderberg, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried that the County Clerk be authorized to pass these notices on to the Environmental Quality Committee prior to the meeting of the Board of Commissioners.

A communication from the Budget & Executive Committee on the possibility of extending the state grant for the misdemeanor probation office was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the application be made for an Offices of Criminal Justice Program grant to continue the misdemeanor probation office for another year on the basis of adding one part-time probation officer to the staff, and provide for \$15,843.00 in county funds as the county's share of this grant, and that the Chairman and County Clerk be authorized to execute this application on behalf of the County of Marquette and, if approved, the District Court 1974 budget be amended to provide the \$15,843.00 additional necessary funds.

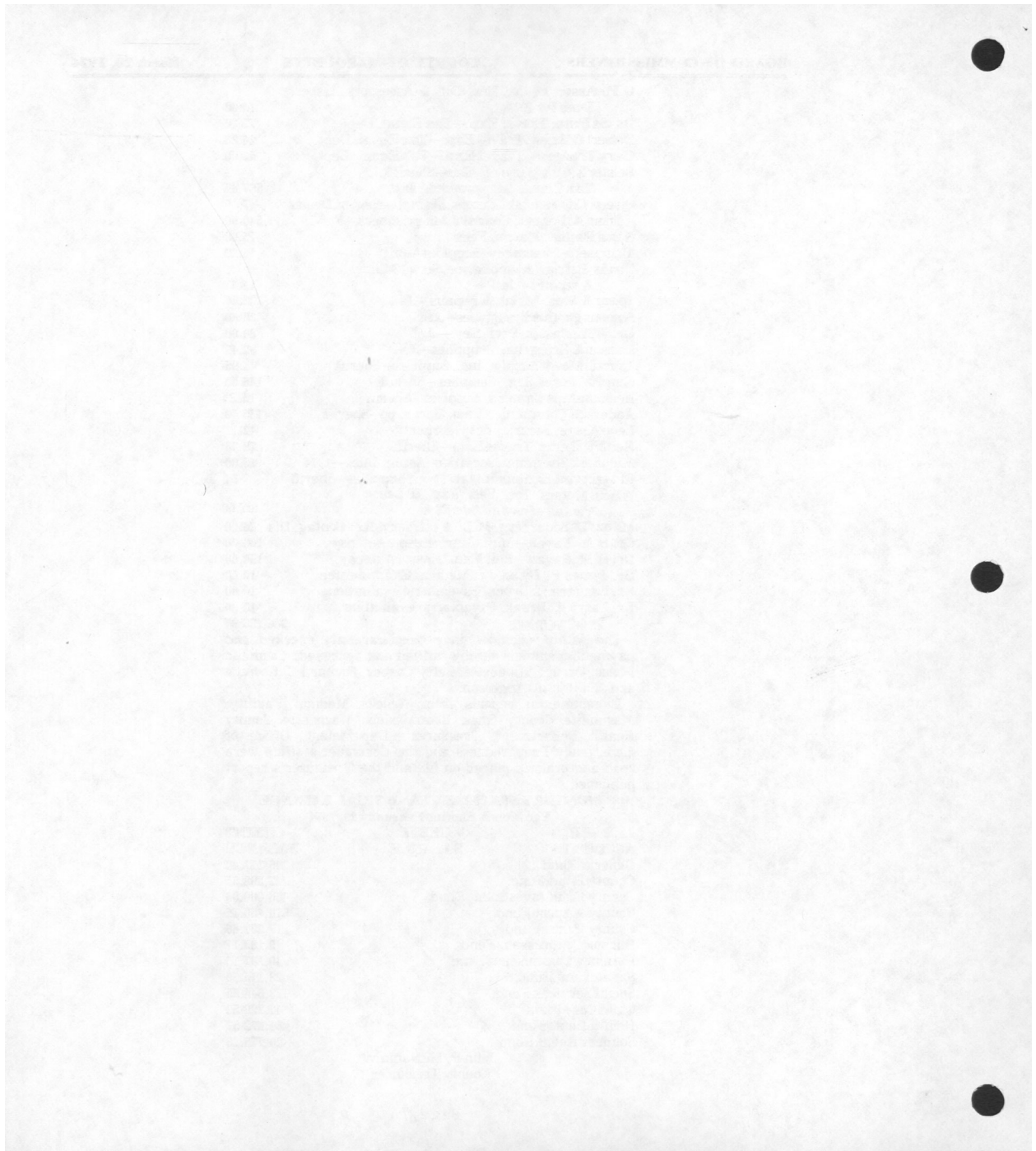

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, On or about March 1, 1974, a meeting between Representative Dominic Jacobetti, representatives from the office of the Governor and the mining industry, was held to attempt to resolve the critical gasoline shortages in Marquette County; and,

WHEREAS, It has been determined that two or three major oil companies have arbitrarily withdrawn their supply

from several gasoline stations within the County of Marquette; and,

WHEREAS, Due to the construction of the Tilden Mine and the expansion of the Upper Peninsula Power Company within Marquette County, there are presently over 2500 construction workers, causing a large increase in the present traveling population; and,

WHEREAS, The fuel allocation is being made on the basis of the 1972 allotments, at which time no such large group of construction workers were located in Marquette County; and,

WHEREAS, There is at present a severe and critical shortage of gasoline for the people of Marquette County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the County urges the Congressional Delegation from Michigan to immediately implement the Federal Energy Act by establishing a Federal Energy Office in Michigan; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be sent to the office of the Governor, to State Representative Dominic Jacobetti, to Congressman Philip Ruppe, and to Senators Philip Hart and Robert Griffin.

On motion by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo, the above Resolution was unanimously adopted.

A communication from the Tax Equalization Committee regarding their recommendation to create a position of Deputy Director in the Tax Equalization Department, effective immediately, at a salary of \$10,500 per year, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Coombs and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the position be created and Mr. Dennis Waarala (senior member of the staff) be appointed to fill this position, and the budget of the Tax Equalization Department be amended in the amount necessary to pay Mr. Waarala his new salary effective April 24, 1974, and that the budget also be amended to leave the position of one field-man entirely out of the budget.

Reports of the Environmental Quality Committee and the Personnel Committee were read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from your ad hoc committee on aging regarding the make-up of members on the advisory committee for aging for Marquette County, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Trapp and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Marquette County Board adopt the following recommendations and create a committee on aging for Marquette County.

The committee wishes to make the following recommendation:

1. That a Marquette County Commission on Aging be created, effective May 22, 1974, to provide leadership and assistance to interested groups or individuals who foster the well-being of our senior citizens; to provide information concerning services and programs having to do with social, economic, health and other needs of the aging; to serve as a central agency for the County of Marquette in matters

concerning the needs of its senior citizens, including, but not limited to the co-ordinating of efforts of the several organized groups of its senior plans and supervise the execution of such plans; and to assist and act in behalf of all of its senior citizens in matters emanating from the Michigan Commission on Aging and other existing government and private agencies.

2. That the Commission on Aging consist of twenty-one members to be appointed by the Board of Commissioners as follows:

a. One member from each of the ten existing Senior Citizens Centers; five members who represent existing service agencies or organizations within the county; four senior citizen members at large; one County Commissioner and the Director of the County Health Department.

b. The terms of seven members shall be for one year; the terms of six members shall be for two years and the terms of six members shall be for three years; the term of the County Commissioner shall be appointed yearly and the term of the Director of the County Health Department shall be unlimited.

c. After the first year, appointments shall be made for three year terms, excepting the appointment of the County Commissioner and Health Department Director whose terms are specified in paragraph b. above.

d. Vacancies in the membership of the Commission on Aging shall be filled by the Board of Commissioners, based upon recommendation of the Commission on Aging.

3. That the Commission on Aging draft by-laws for its operation, consistent with this recommendation, and subject to the approval of the Board of Commissioners.

4. That the General Fund provide the sum of \$800.00 to the Commission on Aging for its initial internal operations.

5. That the Ad Hoc Committee on Commission on Aging be authorized to serve as a nominating committee to present a slate of candidates for membership on the County Commission on Aging to the Board of Commissioners for its consideration at the May 22, 1974 meeting of the Board of Commissioners.

Monthly reports of the Marquette County Road Commission, Office of Civil Defense, Acocks Medical Facility, Marquette County Health Department, Treasurer's Department and the office of Controller, were read and ordered placed on file and the Treasurer's report published.

A communication from the Messiah Lutheran Church, Marquette, Michigan, regarding the need of a short term juvenile home for youth in the Marquette area, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren supported by Commissioner May and carried, that the matter be referred to the County Lands and Buildings Committee.

An announcement that an Upper Peninsula Labor Relations Conference would be held at the Holiday Inn in Marquette May 7th and 8th, 1974, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried by a roll call vote, that the Chairman authorize the Personnel Committee to attend, and any other commissioner could also be authorized to attend with permission of the Chairman, all Commissioners voting aye with the exception of Commissioner Coombs.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners urge our Congressman Philip Ruppe and Senators Philip Hart and Robert Griffin to do what is possible to see that legislation providing such funds be reported out of committee and acted upon before this legislative session adjourns and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to Congressman Ruppe; and Senators Philip Hart and Robert Griffin.

Commissioner Anderson requested the Board to send a letter to the Manpower Board asking that two members of the Marquette County Board be seated on the consortium of counties. Commissioner Anderson also reminded the Board that June 13th has been designated as County Commissioners' Day.

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met on May 22, 1974, at 1:30 p.m. in the Commissioner's Room.

Opening prayer was given by Rev. David Kallio, of Marquette, Michigan. Salute to the flag was given and roll call held by the Clerk, finding all Commissioners present with the exception of Commissioner Leadbetter, who is vacationing in Florida.

It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the minutes of the April meeting be approved and accepted.

It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried, that the notice of cancellation of license for installation at K.I. Sawyer Air Force Base, Michigan, on Tract No. A-100-L1, A-100-L2 and A-100-L3 be accepted and the materials be placed on file, these properties being the minor tracts of land where lighting posts have been placed and are now being removed.

A communication and resolution from the Michigan Association of Counties Committee on Energy Crisis was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Casper and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the resolution be adopted and copies sent to the proper authorities.

WHEREAS, a proposal by the United States Department of Transportation would close 37 per cent of Michigan's existing railroad lines serving 8 million persons;

AND WHEREAS, a reduction in existing railroad lines would tend to increase the cost of freight which would ultimately increase the costs of goods to consumers;

AND WHEREAS, the abandonment would aggravate the existing fuel shortage by requiring more transportation by gas and oil burning vehicles;

AND WHEREAS, this forced shift to trucking would overburden our already crowded highways;

AND WHEREAS, this would also mean a great loss of employment in the rail and allied industries which would add to our already worsening employment problem, in Michigan;

AND WHEREAS, increased truck traffic would add to the air and noise pollution of the state;

AND WHEREAS, many business and small industries would be forced to move or close down their operations causing economic hardships for their owners, their employees and their local units of government;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Marquette County expresses the greatest concern over this proposed abandonment and calls upon public agencies including the Department of Natural Resources, Michigan Public Services Commission and Commerce Department and private agencies such as the Farm Bureau and Chamber of Commerce to develop meaningful statistical information for hearings to be held in Michigan and Washington, D.C. in order to protect our basic rail system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT Marquette County URGES the Governor of Michigan to call upon our sister states of the Great Lakes Region to join in a common effort to protect the rail system of the region which is so vital to our economic and ecological survival.

A communication from the Upper Peninsula Areawide Comprehensive Health Planning Association regarding being included in the 1975-1976 fiscal project was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Russo and carried, that the matter be referred to the Budget

A communication from Peter J. Ghiardi, a member of the Special Election Scheduling Committee, regarding his resignation was read. It was moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and carried, that the Board accept the resignation with great regret that a letter of commendation be sent to Mr. Ghiardi for his many years of service on the Special Election Board. Re-appointment to this position will be made at the June meeting of the Board of County Commissioners. This re-appointment is required by statute to be a member of the school board in Marquette County.

A resolution regarding the allocation of gasoline received by the Marquette County Airport and the possibility of obtaining a larger number of gallons for the year, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Trapp and carried by a roll call vote, that this resolution be adopted.

WHEREAS, The County of Marquette, Michigan, is experiencing considerable economic and industrial growth, and  
WHEREAS, this economic and industrial growth has created such increased demands on the Marquette County Airport that it has required the expansion of the airport facilities, and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Commerce through the Economic Development Administration and the Michigan Aeronautics Commission has provided funds for the construction of a new airport terminal building and allied facilities for the Marquette County Airport, and

WHEREAS, the County of Marquette has programmed construction projects in excess of \$2,000,000.00 which included Federal, State and County funds for the improvement of the airport facilities, and

WHEREAS, the present allocation of aviation fuels as projected on the 1972 Base Period Supply Volume is inadequate to meet the increased demands of the airport users in Marquette County, and

WHEREAS, the daily supply of aviation fuels to airport users as prorated and based on present allocations has on many occasions been exhausted by noon, thereby resulting in a lack of fuels for many aircraft, and

WHEREAS, it appears that other airports not experiencing this economic and industrial growth have an adequate supply of aviation fuels, and

WHEREAS, the present allocation is such that the airport has not provided its users any 80/87 octane gasoline since February 26, 1974, and

WHEREAS, the Marquette County Airport has applied for additional aviation fuels by submitting an application for additional aviation gas, Case No. 05-011825, and for additional aviation jet fuel, Case No. 05-011648, to the Federal Energy Offices located in Chicago, Illinois and Washington, D.C.,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County commissioners for Marquette County, Michigan, hereby petitions and urges the Federal Energy Office to increase the aviation fuels allocation in sufficient amounts to adequately serve and satisfy the needs of the users of the Marquette County Airport,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be sent to Federal Energy Director Sawhill, Senator Griffin, Senator Hart, Senator Jackson, Congressman Ruppe, Chief Jack Frielink of the Michigan Aeronautic Commission's Operation's Divisions, State Senator Mack and State Representative Jacobetti.

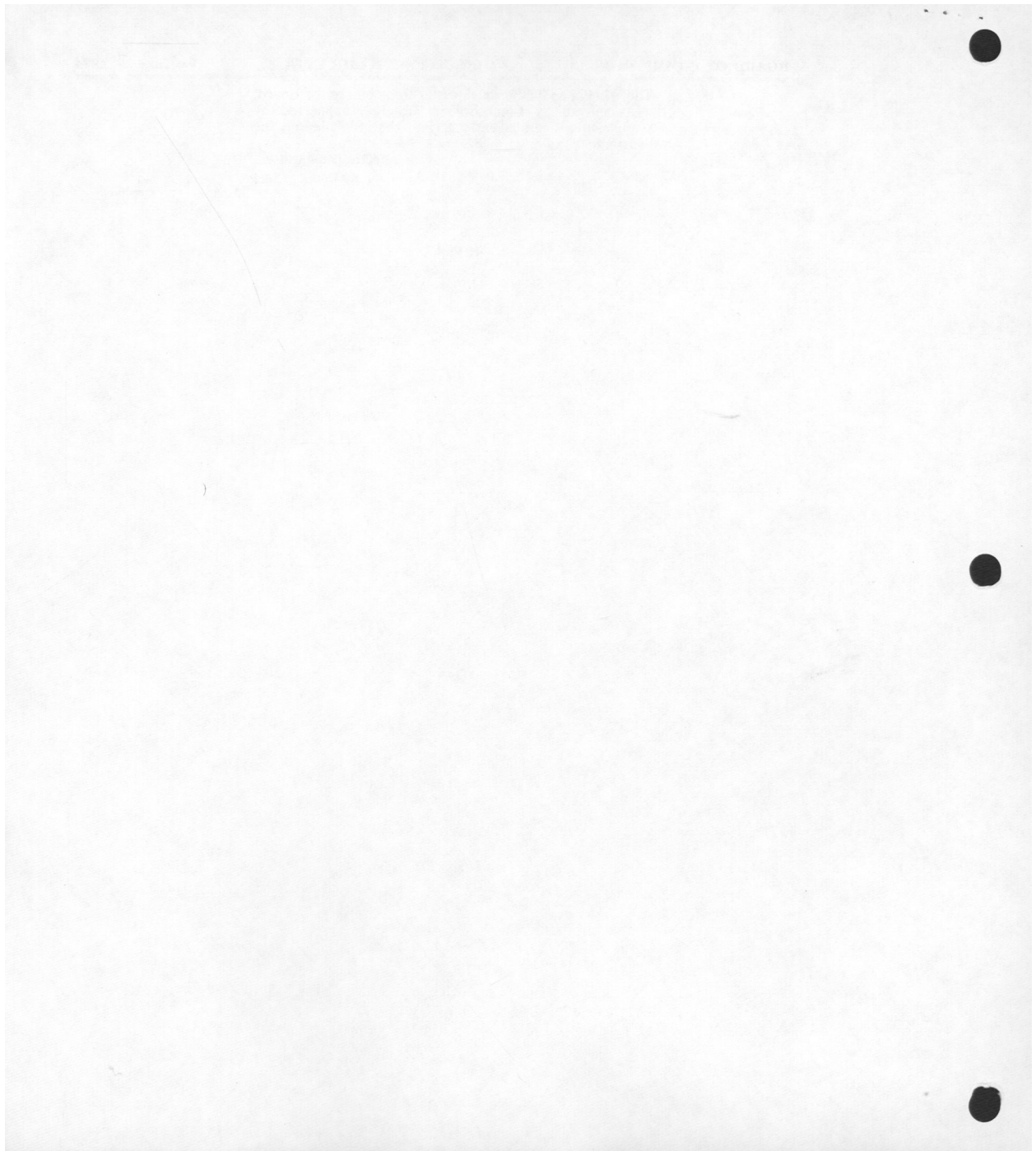

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met on July 24, 1974, at 1:30 p.m., at the Court House in the City of Marquette.

Opening prayer was given by Rev. Al Ulner of Ishpeming, Michigan. Salute to the flag was given and roll call held by the Clerk, finding all Commissioners present with the exception of Commissioner Casper.

The Chairman called for correction of the following printers errors in the minutes published for the June 1974 meeting:

(1) On the adoption of a resolution approving the execution of grant agreements by the County of Marquette with the United States of America, for the Marquette County Airport. The YEA votes were incomplete as published. The following YEAS should be recorded: Commissioners Anderson, Coombs, Doucette, Gaboury, Goldsworthy, May, Racine, Russo and Trapp.

(2) A portion of the motion regarding a resolution affecting participation in a Community Disaster Readiness Program was omitted by the printer. This motion should read as follows: "A resolution affecting participation in a Community Disaster Readiness Program (CDRP) was then considered. At no cost to the County the Emergency Services Division, Michigan Department of State Police, will review the existing emergency preparedness program within the County and make recommendations for its improvement. Moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Russo and unanimously adopted by roll call vote that the resolution in this matter be adopted."

(3) In the motion regarding the Budget and Executive Committee recommendation to add a half time clerk in the District Court, and to amend the 1974 budget, the printed figure of \$1,500,000.00 should be amended to read \$1,500.00.

It was then moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Russo and unanimously adopted that the minutes of the June 1974 meeting, as amended herein, be approved.

A communication from Governor William G. Milliken regarding court action being taken against the Reserve Mining Company to halt dumping taconite tailings into Lake Superior was read and placed on file.

MICHIGAN COUNTY SOCIAL SERVICES ASSOCIATION  
RESOLUTION ON OFFICE SPACE COSTS

WHEREAS the number and size of programs managed by County Departments of Social Services in behalf of Federal, State and County governments have increased rapidly in recent years, and

WHEREAS this increase in size and number of programs has resulted in an increase in staff and therefore, in an increased need for office space, and

WHEREAS the Federal Government has recognized this increase and has increased its reimbursement to counties for the actual cost of office space, and

WHEREAS various employee groups have taken Civil Service grievance action including court action against counties to obtain adequate office space as defined by the Michigan Department of Social Services in their administrative handbook, and

WHEREAS many County Boards of Commissioners have been financially unable to build or, otherwise provide for either the increased space or the improvements required, and

WHEREAS the problem has become an increasing concern to the Michigan County Social Services Association, the Michigan Association of Counties, Local County Social Services Boards and Boards of Commissioners, and

WHEREAS this problem could be solved by having the Michigan Department of Social Services reimburse counties for adequate space provided.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Michigan County Social Services Association Board of Directors go on record urging the Legislature, the Governor and the House of Representatives' and the Senate's Appropriations Committees to resolve this problem beginning with the 1974-1975 budget by appropriating funds to the Michigan Department of Social Services to reimburse counties for office space determined by the Michigan Department of Social Services to be adequate.

FURTHER THAT the amount of said reimbursement be based on the Michigan Department of Social Services formula for reimbursing the county administrative costs minus the Federal allowance for office space thus allowing for a fair and equitable sharing of responsibility by the Federal, State and County units of government.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AND APPROVING THE EXECUTION OF A GRANT AGREEMENT BY THE COUNTY OF MARQUETTE, MICHIGAN, AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION, FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE MARQUETTE COUNTY AIRPORT, UNDER PROJECT NO. 8-26-0063-03.

BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners:

Section I. That the County of Marquette, Michigan, shall enter into a Grant Agreement for the development of the

Marquette County Airport and that such Grant Agreement shall be as set forth hereinbelow;

Section II. That the Chairman of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Grant Agreement in seven (7) copies on behalf of the County of Marquette, Michigan, and the County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to impress the official seal of the County of Marquette, and to attest said execution.

A communication from Delta County, furnishing a copy of the minutes of the Delta County Board of Commissioners dated June 18, 1974, indicating the withdrawal of Delta County from the 3-County Act 54 Mental Health Compact, was read. Moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by roll call vote that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners concur with Delta County in their request for withdrawal.
