



Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners Marquette, Michigan

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Your Budget and Executive Committee has had under consideration the various salaries on the County payroll. We, therefore, make the following recommendations for salaries of the several County Elective and Appointive Officers, Deputies, Clerks, Secretaries, etc., to the various departments, effective as of January 1, 1975, for the period up to and including December 31, 1975.

The salary schedule for employees listed herein is intended to apply to fully-trained personnel employed by the County of Marquette for a period of one year or more. New employees are to be employed at a starting salary of 90% of the salary fixed for the employee's position in this schedule and a one-year probationary training period shall follow employment. During the probationary training period, the department head may make such adjustments to the employee's salary as the degree of training and competency of the employee warrants, but not to exceed the salary fixed for the position involved.

It is to be understood that all fees received by the County Clerk, County Treasurer, Sheriff, Register of Deeds and Judge of Probate be turned over to the County Treasurer on the last day of each month for deposit in the proper county funds, excepting, however, that fees for civil process, not payable from county funds, served on off time in private cars by the Sheriff or his deputies may be retained by the serving officer.





Time absent from work by an employee when on sick leave shall not be considered time worked.

In case of an occupational injury, payment for the first six days lost will be made by the County of Marquette, provided that said first six days lost time are not paid by the Com-pensation Insurance Company. Payment for this first six days by the County of Marquette shall be made with no loss of sick leave time to the injured employee.

Sick leave will be granted to an employee when he is actually sick or when there is illness or death in his immediate family. Employees shall be granted sick leave time from their accumulated sick leave when serving as pallbearers when death of friends or anyone outside of the family occurs, in an amount not to exceed five days per calendar year and subject to the approval of the department head involved. It is understood and agreed that sick leave time cannot be taken for anything other than the reasons stated above and cannot be used as additional vacation time. It is further understood and agreed that an employee shall not be entitled to sick leave during the first two work days following vacation time taken by an employee.

Sick leave credits accumulated by employees prior to

November, 20, 1974, shall be carried over as credits and to this will be added one day each calendar work month thereafter.

Appropriate records reflecting each employees sick leave credit shall be maintained by the County Controller.

All employees shall be paid ½ of their accumulated sick leave time upon termination of employment or death but such payment shall be limited to 1/2 of a maximum of 150

Whenever an employee does not report to work because of illness, the County of Marquette reserves the right to have physician, call at the home of the employee to check the case

and make a complete report.

In case an employee is unable to report for work, his department head shall be so notified as far in advance as



RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS RE: ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS (COURTHOUSE ANNEX)

WHEREAS, the qualified electors of the County of Marquette, Michigan, voted on July 16, 1973, in favor of the following proposition submitted at an election held on said date pursuant to resolution of the Board of Commissioners of Marquette County:

Shall the County of Marquette, State of Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed One Million Seven Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$1,710,000) and issue and sell its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, for the purpose of paying a part of the cost of constructing and equipping a courthouse annex, including therein facilities for a district court room and additional county offices, and developing and improving the site therefor?

AND WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners now desires to provide for the issuance and security of said bonds as authorized by the qualified electors;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Bonds of the County of Marquette be issued in the aggregate principal sum of One Million Seven Hundred Ten Thousand (\$1,710,000.00) Dollars to pay part of the cost of the aforesaid facility, said bonds to be designated as GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS (COURTHOUSE ANNEX), to consist of three hundred forty-two (342) bonds of the denomination of \$5,000.00 each, dated as of April 1, 1975, and maturing serially as follows:

\$135,000.00 April 1, 1976;

\$175,000.00 April 1st of each year from 1977 to 1985, inclusive.

Said bonds shall be coupon bonds and shall bear interest at a rate or rates to be determined upon the pbulic sale thereof, but, in any event, not exceeding six per cent (6 per cent) per annum, payable on October 1, 1975, and semi-annually thereafter on the first day of April and October of each year, both principal and interest to be payable at a bank or trust company qualified to act as paying agent, to be designated by the manager of the account purchasing the bonds.

Bonds of this issue shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity

The bonds shall be registrable as to principal only in the manner set forth in the bond form herein approved.

2. The total cost of the project as set forth in the bond authorizing proposition is estimated to be Two Million Seven Hundred Seventy-Nine Thousand (\$2,779,000.00) Dollars and the period of usefulness of said project is not less than fifty (50) years

(50) years.

3. The Chairman of the Board of Commissioners and the County Clerk be, and they are hereby, authorized to execute and sign said bonds in conformity with the above specifications; to cause to be affixed thereto the corporate seal of the County, and to execute the interest coupons to be attached to said bonds by causing to be affixed thereto their facsimile signatures; and that upon due and legal execution of said bonds, the County Treasurer be, and is hereby authorized and directed to deliver said bonds to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of the purchase price therefor.

4. The County Treasurer of Marquette County, Michigan,

4. The County Treasurer of Marquette County, Michigan, be and is hereby authorized and directed to open a special depositary account with the bank or trust company designated by the County, to be designated COURTHOUSE ANNEX BOND DEBT RETIREMENT FUND (hereinafter referred to as the "Debt Retirement Fund"), the moneys to be deposited into said fund to be specifically earmarked and used solely for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the bonds authorized by this Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the bonds"), as they mature or are redeemed.
