

January 3, 1975

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioner's Room, in the Marquette County Courthouse at 1:30 P.M., for their Organizational Meeting.

Roll call was held finding the following:

PRESENT: Commissioners Anderson, Cheatham, Coombs, Doucette, Gaboury, Goldsworthy, Leadbetter, Racine and Trapp.

ABSENT: Commissioners May and Agnoli. Commissioner Agnoli was not notified of the meeting due to an oversight on the part of the County Clerk.

Salute to the flag was given and the Marquette County Clerk, Henry A. Skewis, opened the meeting by calling for nominations for Chairperson of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners.

Commissioner Racine nominated Commissioner Anderson for Chairman for the year 1975. There being no further nominations for Chairman it was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Trapp and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Commissioner Anderson for Chairman of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners for the year 1975.

At this time the official gavel was presented to Chairman Anderson by Clerk Henry Skewis and the meeting continued under the direction of Commissioner Anderson.

Commissioner Anderson asked for nominations for Vice Chairman. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp that Commissioner Racine be nominated for Vice Chairman. There being no further nominations it was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that nominations be closed and Commissioner Racine be elected Vice Chairman.

A communication from Henry A. Skewis, Marquette County Clerk, reminded the Board that a vacancy existed on the Marquette County Board of Commissioners for the Sixth District. A communication from James R. Alderton of 115 Rose Street, Ishpeming, Michigan, requested the Board of Commissioners for the Sixth District on the Board of Commissioners. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that James R. Alderton be appointed as Commissioner of the Sixth District until such time as an election can be held to fill the vacancy. James Alderton was administered the oath of office by the County Clerk, and was seated as Commissioner for the Sixth District, on the County Board of Commissioners.

A communication from the County Clerk, in regard to setting dates for all regular County Board of Commissioners meetings for 1975, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried by a roll call vote that the following dates be set. All Commissioners present voting aye except Commissioner Coombs who voted nay. A motion by Commissioner Coombs to amend the motion and have every third meeting of the Board of Commissioners held in the evening died for lack of support.

A communication from the County Clerk in regard to the appointment, or re-appointment of persons to serve on the Marquette County Special Election Scheduling Committee for the year 1975, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that the following persons be re-appointed on the Special Election Committee for 1975, Lambert Chard, City Clerk of Ishpeming, Michigan; Robert I. Pascoe, Township Clerk of Champion, Michigan; William Jennings, a member of a School Board; and Henry A. Skewis, Marquette County Clerk.

A Communication from Gary L. Walker, Prosecuting Attorney, in regard to the State Construction Code Act of 1972, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried that the matter be referred to the Budget and Executive Committee for study and report.

A communication from the Michigan Association of Counties regarding the Insurance Trust for Counties, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that pending the obtaining of more information the matter be referred to the Personnel Committee for report.

Presentation of a plaque commending him for six years service as District Judge of the 96th District Court, was made to George E. Hill, by Chairman Clayton Anderson.

A resolution honoring Robert H. DeRoche, Marquette County Controller for nearly twenty-one years of service, now terminated by his retirement effective January 31, 1975, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that the Board of Commissioners adopt the resolution and spread the resolution upon the minutes of this meeting.

WHEREAS, Marquette County is the largest in area in the State of Michigan, and the process of conducting its County business is as complex in nature as that of any other County in the State of Michigan,

AND WHEREAS, it has been the policy of Marquette County to employ the services of a County Controller to handle its business,

AND WHEREAS, Robert H. DeRoche of the City of Marquette has been employed by the County of Marquette as County Controller continuously for nearly 21 years.

AND WHEREAS, the expertise of Mr. Robert H. DeRoche, as County Controller of Marquette County, is well known

throughout the State.

AND WHEREAS, Mr. Robert H. DeRoche has submitted notice of his retirement from the office of County Controller, effective January 31, 1975,

THEN THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners and all other living members of past County Commissions join in expressing their deep appreciation for the opportunity of having had use of the vast knowledge of County affairs possessed by Mrs. Robert H. DeRoche, and wish him good health and happiness in his retirement.

AND BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that this resolution be spread upon the minutes of the January 3, 1975 meeting of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Marquette County Board of Commissioners has requested a Community Disaster Readiness Program be conducted in Marquette County, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of such a Community Disaster Readiness Program is to assist local governments in improving their emergency operational capability to cope with large scale community disaster, and

WHEREAS, a report has been prepared which summarizes the existing status of emergency preparedness in the community, identified areas of need, and includes an action plan

and schedule for meeting these needs,

THEREFORE, we resolve, that all reasonable efforts be expended to improve the emergency operational readiness of Marquette County and its political subdivisions, and

THEREFORE, since said action plan provides a guide for such efforts, the Marquette County Civil Defense Director is instructed to distribute, or otherwise make available, said report to all political subdivisions, departments, agencies, and individuals with emergency responsibilities in the County and to work with them to accomplish those actions indicated. It is understood that State and Federal advisory assistance will be available for such efforts at no cost to the County.



January 22, 1975

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioner's Room in the County Courthouse on January 22, 1975 at 1:30 P.M.

Roll was called, finding:

Present: Commissioners Agnoli, Alderton, Cheatham, Coombs, Doucette, Gaboury, Goldsworthy, Leadbetter, May, Racine, Trapp and Chairman of the Board, Commissioner Anderson.

Absent: None.

Opening prayer was given by Rev. Carl A. Lund, of the Messiah Lutheran Church of Marquette, followed by salute to the American flag.

It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and carried that the board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings and that they be adopted in their present form.

A communication from the City of Marquette requesting that the Marquette County Building Code Department be instructed by the Board of Commissioners to enforce the State Plumbing Code, in the City of Marquette, was read. This action had been requested by the Marquette City Commission. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried that the matter be referred to the County Planning Commission and to Mr. Lyn Johnson, County Planner.

A communication from the Michigan Department of Public Health advised the County Board of Commissioners that Mr. Larry Gould R.S., of the Marquette County Health Department, had successfully passed examination as a Registered Sanitarian. This report was placed on file.

A communication from the Secretary of Transportation, Washington, D.C., regarding advisability of car-pooling to conserve fuel, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried that the County Board endorse car-pooling and encourage the public to participate in car-pooling.

A recommendation from the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to taking bids on a new vehicle for the Tax Equalization Department, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that the Board concur with the recommendation and authorize bids be taken for this new vehicle.

A recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee, regarding the Emergency Medical Services Grant Proposal submitted by Northern Michigan University, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Cheatham and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board endorse the Emergency Medical Services Proposal Grant No. 5-H000464-01 and the Upper Peninsula Area-wide Comprehensive Health Planning Association Grant request for No. 1202 funds to be used for planning aspects of the Emergency Medical Services Proposal.

A recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee regarding increasing the membership, in the County Planning Commission, from five to seven members, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Alderton and unanimously carried by a roll

call vote, that the Board of Commissioners concur with the recommendation and increase the membership on the County Planning Commission from five to seven members.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee, regarding the condemnation of forty acres of land in Sands Township, by the United States of America, and an attached resolution covering this matter, was read and discussed. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board of Commissioners adopt the resolution.

At a regular meeting of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners held in the City of Marquette, Michigan, this 22nd day of January 1975.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the United States of America has heretofore filed a Complaint and Declaration of Taking in the United States District Court for the Western District of Michigan, Northern Division, seeking to condemn certain parcels of land in which the County of Marquette claims an interest, which action is identified as No. M 61-73 C.A., and

WHEREAS the lands involved in said condemnation proceeding are designated as Tracts Nos. A-132 and A-132E, which tracts are more particularly described as follows:

TRACT NO. A-132

A tract of land situated in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 34 and in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 35, Township 46 North, Range 25 West, Michigan Meridian, Sands Township, Marquette County, Michigan, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the west one-quarter corner of Section 2, Township 45 North, Range 25 West; thence North 89 degrees 44'45" West, 398.30 feet to a point on the Easterly Right-of-Way line of County Road 553; thence North 27 degrees 45'25" West, 1,639.39 feet along said Easterly Right-of-Way line; thence 898.45 feet along a curve to the right whose chord bears North 17 degrees 32'25" West, 891.71 feet and whose radius is 2,513.69 feet; thence South 82 degrees 59'35" West, 50.00 feet along a radial line of said curve; thence 771.50 feet along a curve to the right (having the same radius point as the aforesaid curve), whose chord bears North 1 degree 17'51" East, 768.59 feet and whose radius is 2,563.69 feet; thence South 80 degrees 04'53" East, 50.00 feet along a radial line of said curve to the true point of beginning. Thence North 54 degrees 09'44" East, 2,075.06 feet to a point on the West boundary of K.I. Sawyer Air Force Base; thence Northerly along said West boundary 1,200.00 feet; thence Westerly parallel with the South line of said SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 34 to a point on the Easterly Right-of-Way line of said County Road 553; thence Southwesterly along said Right-of-Way line to the point of beginning.

The tract of land herein described contains 40.00 acres, more or less.

Sawyer Air Force Base; thence North 40 degrees 50'16" West 760.00 feet to said radial point.

The tract of land herein described contains 0.11 acres, more or less.

and

WHEREAS the Department of Conservation for the State of Michigan, by Quit-Claim Deed dated January 21, 1948, deeded to the County of Marquette, state of Michigan, approximately 24 acres of said land with the express understanding that the land described in said deed should be used solely for public purposes and in the event it would not be used for said public purposes it would revert to the State of Michigan, and

WHEREAS, at the time said condemnation proceedings were commenced, the County of Marquette held the fee simple title in and to the above-described tracts, portions of said tracts, however, being subject to reservations by the State of Michigan and others of ore and mineral rights, and reservations by the State of Michigan of rights of ingress and egress and aboriginal antiquities; and

WHEREAS it has been agreed among representatives of the United States of America and the County of Marquette that the just compensation to be paid for said Tracts Nos. A-132 and A-132E is the total sum of Four Thousand Six Hundred Fifty and no-100 (\$4,650.00) Dollars, which shall be paid to the County of Marquette for distribution to local taxing units in said County having jurisdiction of said tracts in proportion to their tax interests; and

WHEREAS title to said Tracts Nos. A-132A and A-132E became vested in the United States of America upon the initiation of said condemnation proceedings,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved:

1. That the County of Marquette hereby consents to the taking of the property known and described as Tracts Nos. A-132 and A-132E, consents that the just compensation for said tracts may be the total sum of Four Thousand Six Hundred Fifty and no-100 (\$4,650.00) Dollars, inclusive of interest and costs, and further consents that a judgement may be entered

in the United States District Court for the Western District of Michigan determining the just compensation in the above amount without further notice to the County of Marquette;

2. That Dale A. Ruohomaki, Prosecuting Attorney for the County of Marquette, Michigan, be and is hereby authorized to appear in said proceedings on behalf of said County, and is further authorized to execute, on behalf of said County, such stipulations, consents, or other instruments or documents as may be necessary to effectuate and complete the transfer of said property and compensation.

A report of the Environmental Quality Committee, was
read and ordered placed on file.

A report from the Personnel Committee in regard to filling
the position of County Controller, was read. It was moved by
Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner
Coombs, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that Mr.

Gary R. Yoder, be appointed as County Controller at a salary of \$15,655.00 for the fiscal year 1975, and that at the December 1975 meeting of the Personnel Committee, his performance shall be reviewed and at this time his salary shall become commensurate with the present Controller's salary level, if performance has been satisfactory, and also that Mr. Gary R. Yoder, be authorized to fill the vacancy now existing in the position of Assistant Controller for the fiscal year of 1975.

A recommendation by the Personnel Committee, in regard to Blue Cross-Blue Shield group insurance for retirees, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board of Commissioners extend to the retired County employees the privilege of becoming a part of the County group for Blue Cross and Blue Shield insurance purposed, cost of which would be paid by retirees and not from County funds.

A recommendation of the Personnel Committee in regard to increasing the per diem rate for appointed County Commissioners from \$35.00 to \$40.00 per diem, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Cheatham, supported by Commissioner Alderton and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board of Commissioners set the per diem rate at \$40.00 for all County Commissioners, unless the rate is otherwise specifically set by law, and that this rate be retroactive to January 1, 1975.

A recommendation of the Committee of the Whole in regard to changes felt necessary in the Board of Commissioners Procedure Manual, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Trapp and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the following changes be adopted.

1. A new rule be added as Rule 19, under a new section entitled "Rights and Duties of Committees", this rule to read as follows:

"Any matter referred to Committee remains the property of that Committee until reported to the full Board either by a date specified in the motion or at the earliest convenience of said Committee. Any matter not reported to the Board within a reasonable length of time may be brought upon the floor for consideration by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting."

2. Rule 35, concerning the duties of the Audit Committee, to be moved up and placed under the new heading as Rule 20.

3. In Rule 38, the words "Cushing Manual" to be changed to "Roberts Rules of Order Revised."

Nominations were declared upon for two positions on the Acocks Medical Facility Board. It had already been agreed on in a prior meeting, that one of the two positions to be filled, would be by nominating a member of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners to be seated on the Acocks Medical Board. Commissioner Trapp nominated Commissioner Coombs. There being no further nominations of Board members, it was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and carried that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Commissioner Coombs, as a member of the Acocks Medical Board. It was then moved by Commissioner Trapp that Mr. Lou Chapelle be nominated for the second seat on the Acocks Medical Board. There being no further nominations, it was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried that nominations be closed

and a unanimous ballot be cast for Mr. Lou Chapelle as a member of the Acocks Medical Facility.

Reports of the Acocks Medical Facility, County Road Commission, County Health Department, Controller's Department and Treasurer's Department, were read and ordered placed on file and the Treasurer's Report published.

A communication from the Michigan Power Company, in regard to the notice of a public hearing, of Case No. U-4701, to be held at 9:30 A.M., on February 7, 1975 in the offices of the Michigan Public Service Commission in the Law Building, Lansing, Michigan, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried that the matter be referred to the Budget and Executive Committee for report, with special thought be given to asking the Prosecuting Attorney for an opinion on the conflicting reports of the amount of natural gas available and to the study of the actual rates involved. Also, that if it deems necessary, a special meeting would be held prior to February 7, 1975, at which time action could be taken.

A resolution from the Dickinson County Board of Commissioners, censuring the Department of Treasury for taking unilateral action in declaring that Dickinson County Board of Commission members accepted over-payments for meetings held in 1973, was read, and ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mr. Donald McCormick, Director of the Marquette County Office of Emergency Preparedness,

submitting his resignation, due to his inability to continue work because of ill health, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and unanimously carried that the resignation of Mr. Donald McCormick be accepted with deep regret, and that Mr. McCormick be commended for his years of faithful service to the people of Marquette County. Resignation to be effective January 31, 1975.

Introduction of the new Administrative-Planner for the Marquette County Townships Association, Mr. William Michelin, was made to the Board.

It was moved by Commissioner Alderton, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners adopt a resolution proclaiming 1975 as "Women's Year in Marquette County".

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, 1975 is being proclaimed International Women's year by governments throughout the nation and the world in recognition of the importance of women's increasing contribution in all segments of society,

WHEREAS, the goals for International Women's Year are to promote equality between men and women and to insure the full participation of women at all levels of government, and

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried that the meeting be adjourned.



February 19, 1975

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioners Room in the Courthouse, on February 19, 1975, at 1:30 P.M.

The opening prayer was given by Rev. Gil Martin, of the First United Methodist Church of Marquette, followed by a salute to the Flag.

Roll call was held finding all Commissioners present, with the exception of Commissioner Alderton, who was absent.

It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and that these minutes be approved as printed.

A communication from Dr. R. L. Carefoot, County Medical Examiner, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner May and carried, that the following named Physicians be added to the list of Deputy Medical Examiners for Marquette County: Doctors Roger Perry, M.D., Rex McConnell, M.D., and Donald Snowdon, M.D.

A communication advising the Board of the resignation, effective January 15, 1975, of Dr. Daniel Mazzuchi, from the Act 54 Mental Health Board, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried that the resignation of Dr. Mazzuchi be accepted with great regret and that the Clerk of the County, draft a letter to Dr. Mazzuchi, commending him on his past participation in Act 54 Board actions.

A communication from Lyn Johnson, Director of Marquette County Planning, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a Roll Call Vote, that the County Board of Commissioners adopt the submitted Marquette County Planning Commission By-Laws.

A communication from the Michigan Power Company, advising the Board that a public hearing in regard to Michigan Power Company's application No. U-4696, to the Michigan Public Service Commission for an increase in rates of natural gas, was read, and ordered placed on file.

Resolutions from Alleghen, Manistee, Gratiot and Montcalm Counties, in regard to legislation to effect a moratorium on any increase in State equalized and assessed valuation of all real and personal property, in the State of Michigan, was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Marquette County Township Association, in regard to the Marquette County Health Department, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter, and carried that the matter be referred to the Marquette County Board of Health and copies of the letter be sent to the Board of Health and the Marquette County Health Department, for study and report.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to the County Road Commission and the Airport Commission, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Cheatham and carried that the appointed membership of the County Road Commission shall continue to function also as members of the Airport Commission.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to the County Board of Commissioners contract with Manatron Corporation for Tax Roll preparation, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and carried by a roll call vote, that the County make a contract with Manatron Corporation for Tax Roll preparation, at a specified price of \$1.00 (one dollar) per parcel, set up cost, with the maintenance cost of 50 Cents (fifty cents) per parcel being shared equally by the County and other participating units. The initial cost to the County would be about \$27,000.00. The lone dissenting vote was cast by Commissioner Agnoli.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to Upper Peninsula Power Company's proposed 37 1/2 per cent rate increase, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that Marquette County go on record as being opposed to any exorbitant rate increase, but at this time are reluctant to aid in the request of Ontonagon County for a 50 cent per capita, participation legal expense cost, resulting in a cost of \$32,000.00 to Marquette County, when the entire anticipated cost of this legal action is about \$30,000.00 for all concerned. Only about 1/2 of the County population obtains electricity from the Upper Peninsula Power Company.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to the request for a transfer of the allocated funds for construction of a diversional space at Acocks Medical Facility, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board of Commissioners authorize \$98,000.00 be transferred from the General Fund for payment of bills for expenses incurred in construction of the diversional space at the facility.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to the purchase of a new vehicle for the Tax Equalization Department, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried by a roll call vote, that the Board accept the low bid of \$5,235.00 for a Jeep Universal 1975 Model, from Specker Motor Sales of Marquette, with a trade-in allowance of \$1,900.00 for the old vehicle, a total cost to the County of \$3,335.00. The only nay vote was cast by Commissioner Coombs, who felt a two wheel drive vehicle was all that was needed.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to a request by the Sheriffs Department, for a clothing allowance for the Detective Sergeant, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that the budget for the Sheriffs Department be amended to allow for \$150.00 per year as clothing allowance for the detective Sergeant.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to the purchase of radar speed detection equipment, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously

carried by a roll call vote that the Sheriffs Department budget be amended to purchase one of the radar units at a cost of \$1,375.00 and the Sheriff be authorized to make this purchase.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to a Central Dispatch Communication System for Marquette County, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Doucette and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board of Commissioners appropriate an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 for the County match for the Communications System, which would be 5 per cent of the total cost of the system.

Reports of the Transportation Committee, Welfare Contact Committee and County Lands and Buildings Committee, were read and ordered placed on file.

A report of the Audit Committee on audited claims and accounts at their February 17, 1975 meeting was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that claims and accounts in the amount of \$146,452.04 be allowed and ordered paid.

A resolution adopted by Alleghen County in regard to the County publishing an account of receipts and expenditures each month, was read. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if an immediate interim solution be devised that said solution be only the first step in a long range insurance program that will assure both patient and physician the protection necessary to a satisfactory physician patient relationship.



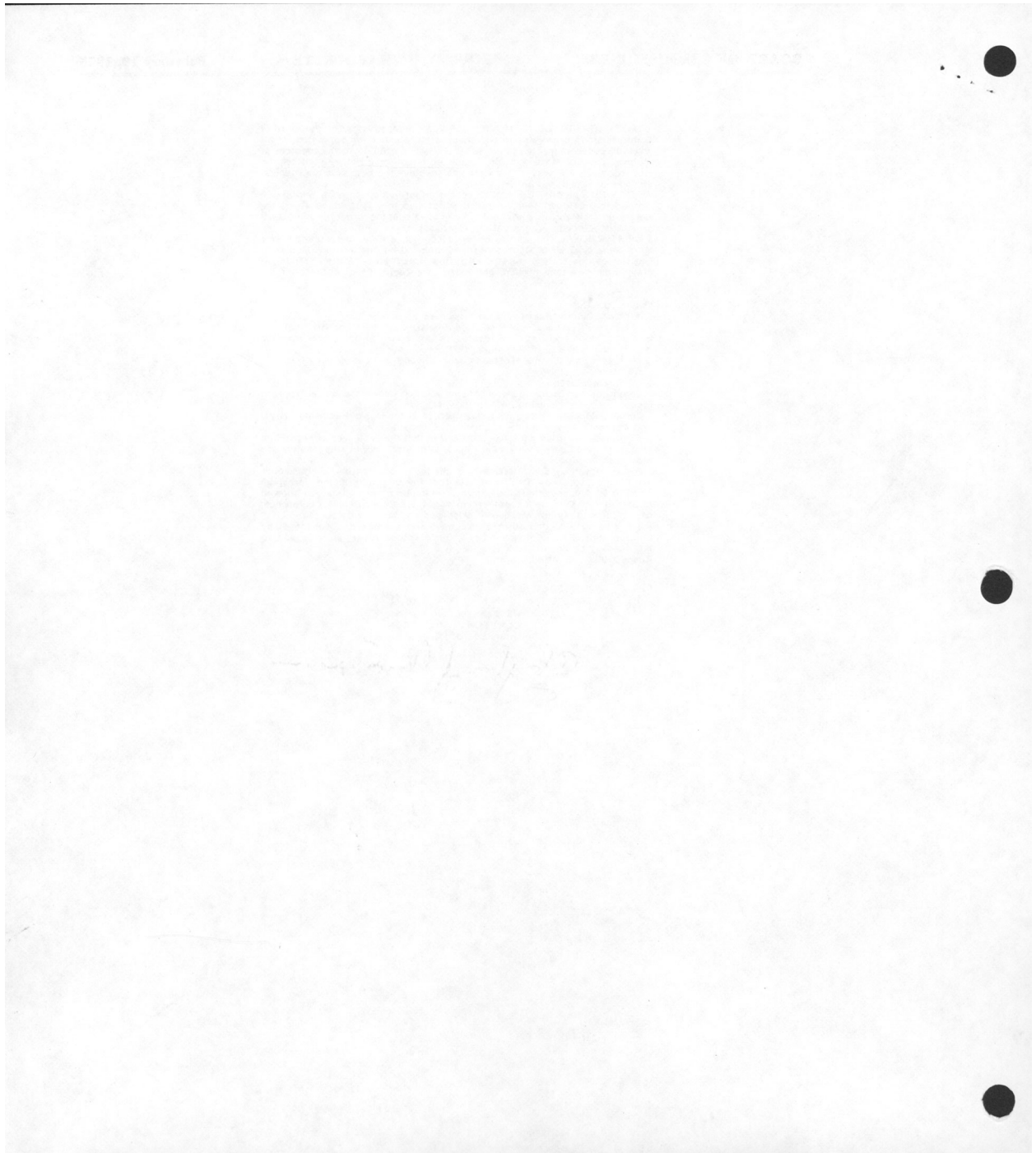

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Constitution has divided the three branches of government into Legislative, Executive and Judicial and

WHEREAS, all three branches were created as co-equals, each with its own powers and duties, thus acting as a check and balance for each other, and

WHEREAS, the Separation of Powers Doctrine has been and always must be a basic concept to prevent the dictatorial usurpation of power by one branch over the other.

WHEREAS, recently the Supreme Court of the State of Michigan has arrogantly overridden this historic concept of Separation of Powers by its dictatorial and self-serving adoption of the Inherent Power Theory, thereby assuming legislative powers, and

WHEREAS, it appears the only redress we have from this rueful precedent is by direct legislative process,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Marquette County Board of Commissioners that we strongly support and recommend enactment by the Legislature of House Joint Resolution F which would add Section 31 to Article 6 of the Michigan Constitution banning any court or judge from ordering the Legislative Body of the State of Michigan or any County, City, Township or Village to appropriate money for any reason.

With copies to be provided to the Governor, the Supreme Court, Legislators, Chairmen of Judiciary Committees of both House and Senate and to clerks of the 82 Counties and Michigan Association of Counties.

WHEREAS, the Marquette County Board of Commissioners is against the present means being used by the Insurance Services Office (ISO) in Detroit, which sets fire insurance rates for Michigan Communities, and

WHEREAS, a large part of the rating has to do with the age of the fire engine and has little or no consideration given to its capabilities to still get the necessary job done. Many small Communities are forced to buy new fire engines to keep their fire ratings, and the old fire engines often have less than 10,000 miles on them and are still like new.

WHEREAS, the County of Marquette is asking that a more sensible approach to the enforcement of fire insurance equipment standards be set. When large sums of money on a new chassis, engine, etc., are spent, when only the pumping equipment and tank requirements should be updated to meet standards, the engine, chassis, ladders, hoses, etc., are basically the same from truck to truck, and a truck with 10,000 miles or less is far from worn out.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County of Marquette join the struggle of Congressman Philip E. Ruppe and the Village of Mineral Hills, and City of Iron River, in bringing about an investigation of Insurance Services Office by the State of Michigan Insurance Bureau.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County of Marquette ask each County Commission to pass a similar resolution and pass it on to their representatives and down to the Municipalities located within its jurisdiction for consideration.

It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner May and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote that the recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee be accepted and the Board amend the Prosecutor's Budget a total of \$1,200.00 for this service.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to a request of Judge Bernard H. Davidson for a \$2,000.00 appropriation to the County Law Library Fund, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Cheatham and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee, and allow a \$2,000.00 appropriation be made to the Law Library Fund, from the General Fund.

A recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to the Prosecuting Attorney's grant for the year 1975, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Alderton and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote, that grant be approved and the County Clerk and the Board Chairman be authorized to execute the same.

A recommendation of the Budget and Executive Committee, in regard to the County Board petitioning the State to act as the County's enforcing agency for the State Plumbing Code, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote that the State be petitioned to act as agent for this enforcement.

On a motion by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote, the Board of Commissioners amend the 1974 Budget for the following Departments:

A report from the Marquette County Health Department, resulting from a letter of complaint sent to the County Board of Commissioners, by Marquette County Association of Townships, and referred to the Health Department, by the Board, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried that the County Board of Commissioners accept this report, pass along a copy of it to the Marquette County Township Association and also send a letter to Dr. Potter commending him for filing such a complete report in such a short time.

Reports of the Welfare Contact Committee and Transportation Committee were read and ordered placed on file.

A recommendation of the County Lands and Building Committee, in regard to a lease on a building to house the Planning Department and Building Code Department, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote that the County enter into a lease agreement with the Dupras-Racine Realty Inc., Agent for Mrs. Rudy Niemi and Mrs. Roy Niemi for upper level of building on US Highway 41, Marquette, for eighteen (18) months, at a cost of \$275.00 per month, and that the Chairman of the Board and the County Clerk be authorized to sign the lease.

A report of a special County Lands and Building Committee, in regard to appropriations of money for capital improvements to the Acocks Medical Facility, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried by a Roll Call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the County Lands and Building and appropriate an additional \$34,311.00 to the Acocks Medical Facility for capital improvements in construction of the diversional space needed. **MARQUETTE COUNTY
COMMISSION ON AGING
PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS**

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1: MEMBERSHIP

There shall be twenty-one (21) members of the Commission as follows:

- a. At least seven (7) members, 55 years of age or older.
- b. Seven (7) experts and or interested citizens.
- c. Six (6) elected officials, which shall include at least one (1) County Commissioner; One (1) Commissioner-Council member from each of the three cities and one (1) from the County Townships Association.
- d. The County Health Department Director.

This amendment does not exclude or remove from membership any person presently serving as a member of the Commission, during that person's term of office.

ARTICLE I

SECTION 4: ADVISORY MEMBERS

Paid directors of programs serving senior citizens shall be Advisory Members. In addition, Advisory Members may be appointed by the Commission in numbers the Commission deems necessary for the purpose of providing the expertise needed to carry out the objectives set forth in the Constitution. Advisory Members may be appointed to represent the following areas in the community, not excluding others:

Community Services	Law
Education and Recreation	Nursing Homes
Employment	Social Security
Health	Transportation
Youth	

ARTICLE I

SECTION 5: ADVISORY MEMBER TERMS OF OFFICE

Advisory Members appointed by the Commission shall serve for one (1) year.

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried that Mr. Joseph Snively, of Marquette, Michigan, be appointed for a term on the Marquette County Commission on Aging; term to expire May 1, 1977, and that Mr. Lawrence Korpi, of Marquette, Michigan, be appointed on the same Commission on Aging, for a term to expire May 1, 1976.

It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Cheatham and carried that the County Clerk request the Cities of Marquette, Negaunee and Ishpeming and also, the Marquette County Association of Townships to select one elected official from each of their Cities and the Township Association for membership on the Marquette County Commission on Aging, subject to approval of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Proposed Revised Juvenile Code has been reviewed in detail by the CUPPAD Criminal Justice Planning Committee, and

WHEREAS, the proposed statute, that provides for a total of six hearings within a 14-day period, would cause a tremendous drain on the financial resources of local communities, and

WHEREAS, school and home truant would no longer be able to be petitioned to probate court, even as a last resort, and therefore, may quit school or may run away from home at will, and

WHEREAS, the proposed juvenile code is extremely cumbersome procedurally, and the rights that it seeks to safeguard would, in fact, be violated because of these difficulties,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the CUPPAD Criminal Justice Planning Committee goes on record in opposition to Representative Jondahl's Proposed Revised Juvenile Code, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to all Upper Peninsula Legislators, to all County Board of Commissioners in the Central Upper Peninsula, and the CUPPAD Regional Commission.

WHEREAS, the Marquette County Board of Commissioners feels that citizens of the County should have an opportunity to question the Corps' on this policy and should be able to have their questions answered, then

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners does hereby urge the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to hold an informational meeting on said policy, in Marquette County, at the earliest possible time, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution go to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Senators Hart and Griffin, Congressman Ruppe, State Senator Mack and Representative Jacobetti.

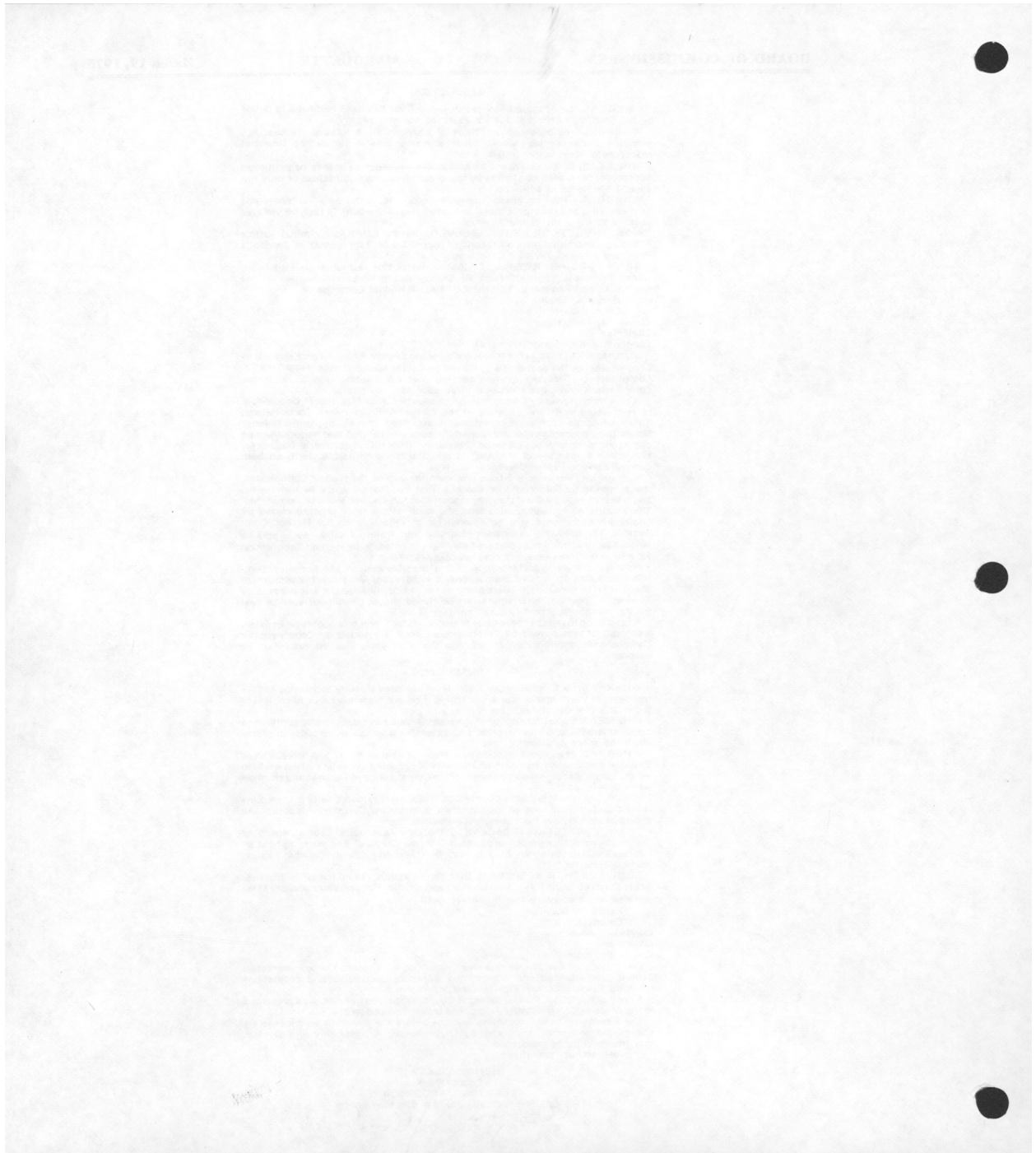

Quality Committee with authorization to contact the Army Corp of Engineers for information on removal of the now existing sediments and pollutants on the lake bottom in the harbor.

A communication from the Department of Natural Resources in regard to a Public Notice on an application by Cliffs Electric Service Company to construct a discharge line in Lake Superior, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried, that this matter be referred to the Environmental Quality Committee for study and report.

A communication from the Department of State Highways and Transportation in regard to Court action on Act 51 Funds, was read and ordered placed on file.

A resolution from the Michigan Northern Counties Association, in regard to inequities in the tax laws, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and carried, that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Budget and Executive Committee for study and report.

Resolutions from Dickinson and Kalamazoo Counties, regarding the establishment of a Passport Office in Michigan, were read and ordered placed on file.

A resolution from Mescola County, regarding the health of livestock and poultry due to them being fed contaminated feed, was read and placed on file.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, recommending the purchase of a sign for the County Planning Commission Offices, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Cheatham, supported by Commissioner Racine and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the County Planner be authorized to purchase the sign for an amount not to exceed \$180.00, and that the Planning Commission Budget be amended accordingly.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee, recommending that the County Board deny payment of Sheriff Adrian Pequet's attorney's fee bill, for the recent court case involving the Sheriff and Sheriff's Department employees union, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that the Board concur with the recommendation and deny this payment.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, recommending that the Commission on Aging be reimbursed for office equipment lost in their recent fire, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Cheatham and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Commission on Aging Budget be amended by \$1,391.85 and a like amount be transferred from the General Fund to the Commission on Aging Fund.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, recommending the purchase of County Zoning Maps and a blueprint machine for the County Planner's Office, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Racine and carried by a roll call vote that the County Planner be authorized to purchase the County Zoning Maps and blueprint machine, for a total cost not to exceed \$2,000.00 and that the Planning Commission Budget be amended accordingly.

A report from the Budget and Executive Committee, recommending budget adjustments to cover the cost of expenses for equipment and services for the Assistant County Planner, was read. A report of the Budget and Executive Committee, recommending the establishing of a full time position, to be known as Director of Emergency Preparedness, was read. A report of the Welfare Contact Committee was read and ordered placed on file.

A report was read from the Transportation Committee, recommending an easement be granted across County owned Lands in Forsyth Township to the Marquette County Road Commission, for the purpose of allowing construction of an access road to K.I. Sawyer AFB, from relocated County Road 533. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Cheatham and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that this easement be granted and the County Clerk and Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, be authorized to sign the easement.

Reports of the County Lands and Buildings Committee's Regular and Special meetings held in March and April were read and placed on file.

A report from the Audit Committee, regarding the payment of claims and accounts for the previous month, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Alderton and unanimously carried by a roll call vote that claims and accounts in the amount of \$147,172.37 be allowed and ordered paid and the audit report published.

Invocation was given by the Rev. Russell Allen of the United Ministries, followed by a salute to the Flag.

Roll call was held finding the following Commissioners present: Commissioners Agnoli, Alderton, Cheatham, Coombs, Doucette, Goldsworthy, Gaboury, Leadbetter, May, Racine, Trapp and Anderson. Absent: None.

It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and approve them as printed.

A report of the Board of Canvassers was read and Mr. James R. Alderton was declared to be elected to the office of Sixth District County Commissioner and was seated as such at this meeting. He has filed his campaign expense statement and taken the Oath of Office.

A communication from Melvin N. Nyquist, County Extension Director, in regard to County Commissioners' Day being held on Michigan State University Campus, on June 12, 1975, was read.

It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner Trapp and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote, that the Chairman, Clayton Anderson, be authorized to allow a member or members of the Board of Commissioners attend this meeting.

A communication from Casmer P. Ogonowski, Chairman of Special House Committee to study Casino Gambling, was read and placed on file. A Hearing date on this matter will be determined at a later date and the Board will be notified.

A communication, from the Department of Treasury, State of Michigan, in regard to the tentative report of State Equalized Valuation and hearing date, was read and placed on file.

A communication from the Department of Commerce, in regard to a one year moratorium, on the Insurance Service Office's Classification, as applies to fire fighting equipment, was read and placed on file.

A communication from Representatives Philip Ruppe in regard to Insurance Service Office's Classification of fire fighting equipment, was read and placed on file.

Communications from Representative Philip Ruppe, and Brigadier General W. O. Backus of the Corp of Engineers, in regard to Lake Superior lake levels, were read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that the County Clerk invite General Backus, or his representatives to come to Marquette for a meeting in this regard. Date of the meeting to be set by mutual agreement.

A resolution from LaPeer County regarding House Bill No. 4704, concerning proposed changes in Probate Court Organization, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and carried that this resolution be placed on file, but that the Board is opposed to House Bill No. 4704 and our Representative in the legislature be so notified.

A communication from Representative D.J. Jacobetti, acknowledging receipt of resolutions passed by the Board at their April meeting, was read and placed on file.

A communication from the Department of Army Corp of Engineers, regarding proposed changes in regulations which would extend their permit authority, was read. It was moved by Commissioner May, supported by Commissioner Coombs and carried, that this matter be referred to the Environmental Quality Committee for immediate action on behalf of the Board.

A resolution from Lake County, regarding foreign aid, was read and ordered placed on file.

A notice of a Public Hearing involving accounting for differences in Book and Tax Treatment relating to Michigan Bell tax depreciation, was read and placed on file.

Notices of Hearing dates on the following matters, were read and ordered placed on file: 1) Revised schedule of rates and service of Michigan Bell Telephone Company.

2) Authority to increase electric rates for Wisconsin-Michigan Power Company. 3) Authority to file revised rate schedules of Michigan Consolidated Gas Company.

A communication from the law firm of Nebel & Revord of Munising, Michigan, regarding the County's possible involvement in a law suit that may be filed by Mr. Raul Revord, was read. The matter was referred to the County's Insurance Carrier and the Prosecuting Attorney.

A communication notifying the County Board of a Seminar on County Budgeting and Financial Management, to be held Friday, June 13, 1975 in Grayling, Michigan, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Doucette, supported by Commissioner Leadbetter and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote, that the Chairman, Clayton Anderson, be authorized to allow the Controller, Mr. Gary Yoder and a member or members of the Commission to attend.

Resolution from Dickinson County pertaining to matters concerning Dickinson County were read and placed on file.

A report from the Marquette County Planning Commission regarding land exchanges between the Cleveland Cliff Iron Company and the Department of Natural Resources, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Trapp, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried that this matter be tabled until further study can be made by the Planning Commission.

A resolution in regard to Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy and carried that this resolution be referred to the Budget and Executive Committee for report and comment at the next Board meeting and that all County Commissioners be sent a copy of this proposed resolution.

A report of the Budget and Executive Committee recommending a Budget be established, effective July 1, 1975, for Misdemeanant Probation in the amount of \$17,523.00, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Cheatham, supported by Com-

missioner Racine and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation and approve the Budget request for \$17,523.00. Also, that the Probation Officer in Ishpeming District Court be hired full time at a salary of \$10,400.00. This \$17,523.00 Budget request is for the last six months of 1975.

A recommendation from the Budget and Executive Committee, regarding a request for an appropriation of \$6,536.61 for the Sheltered Workshop of Alger and Marquette Counties, Inc. to cover their costs from May 14, 1975 to June 30, 1975, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Agnoli, supported by Commissioner Alderton and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote, that the amount of \$6,536.61 be appropriated from the General Fund for this purpose.

A recommendation from the Budget and Executive Committee, asking the Board to go on record as taking no intervening action in the matter of the Upper Peninsula Power Company and Wisconsin-Michigan Power Company rate increases at this time, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Racine, supported by Commissioner May and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote that the recommendation be denied, but that a letter be sent to the proper places expressing the wish to have the 37 per cent increase of UPPCo, and the 36.6 per cent increase of WMPCo more closely studied as these rates could possibly be too high.

A recommendation from the Budget and Executive Committee that no action be taken in regard to the proposed resolution concerning inequities of the real and personal property tax laws, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Doucette and carried that this resolution contains two separate ideas and no action should be taken at this time.

A recommendation from the County Land and Building Committee, on awarding bids for the construction of the Juvenile Detention Home, was read. It was moved by Commissioner Leadbetter, supported by Commissioner Coombs and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote, that the following low base bids be awarded: 1) General Contracting, LaBonte & Oatley, \$162,654.00, 2) Rogers Electric Company, electrical construction, \$42,636.00, 3) Levine Bros. plumbing construction, \$18,765, and firms be so notified.

A report of the Audit Committee was read, it was moved by Commissioner Coombs, supported by Commissioner Gaboury and unanimously carried by a Roll Call vote that claims and accounts in the amount of \$147,305.48 be allowed and ordered paid.
