A-132 and A-132E, consents that the just compensation for said tracts may be the total sum of Four Thousand Six Hundred Fifty and no-100 (\$4,650.00) Dollars, inclusive of interest and costs, and further consents that a judgement may be entered in the United States District Court for the Western District of Michigan determining the just compensation in the above amount without further notice to the County of Marquette;

2. That Dale A. Ruohomaki, Prosecuting Attorney for the County of Marquette, Michigan, be and is hereby authorized to appear in said proceedings on behalf of said County, and is further authorized to execute, on behalf of said County, such stipulations, consents, or other instruments or documents as may be necessary to effectuate and complete the transfer of said property and compensation.

In regard to the appointment of members of a new commission, known as the Marquette County Building Code Board of Appeals, the following action was taken. 


