Dear Sir

Having spent sometime looking up
the amounts charged back by the Auditor General and retained from the
Counties in the so called five year lists. and having obtained contracts
from Ontonagon. Gogebic. Ironwood and other counties to make their
settlements and get the amounts paid back. now if your County
should be willing to have my act for them. I will undertake to
make such settlements and get the amounts paid back or credited
to the County for ten per cent when the amount of such settlement is
less than Two Thousand Dollars. and for Five per cent when it is that
amount or over. to be paid to me when such settlement is made
and certified by the proper officers. I to receive nothing unless
such settlement is made and the County gets its credit. You to

Send me statement of amounts and dates of such charging back as appears from your balance sheets. The Attorney General states that each County will have to look out for itself and we will have to go to the Supreme Court and they will contest. But I am satisfied that we can run and the County get what belongs to them. Please call the attention of your Supervisors to this at once if possible and let me know as soon as you can as I wish to get these matters going.

search has been made for it in the Treasurers office and also

at this meeting


Mr. White offered the following resolution which was adopted

Money from time to time between this date and the October meeting of this board

payable in January or February next as may sum most desirable to

Malvill, Merryweather, Mitchell, Pasco, Read, Ridgwick, Stoen, Schmitz, White Chairman. They now

I am in receipt of your favor of 11th inst enclosing copy resolution of your Board of Supervisors requesting my opinion as to "whether it is lawful for the County to pay extra compensation to the Circuit Judge" is at hand. I answer that the Circuit Judge is a State officer. The payment of his salary is by the Constitution made a State charge. It cannot in any way be made a County charge. Your County can only raise money for County purposes, and the payment of salary or extra compensation to the Circuit Judge is not a County purpose. I am therefore of the opinion that the allowance of extra compensation by your board to the Circuit Judge is illegal.

Gentlemen

We call your attention to
certain bills that will be presented to your honorable body for payment
either at this meeting or some other, namely the People of the State of
Michigan vs John Shoney and Thomas E. Cook. we further want to
show to your honorable body, that in either of those cases, there was
no cause of action whatever, which the records will show by the decision
of the Jury. In both cases it was simply a matter of revenge, to
satisfy the desire of the Mayor of the city of Marquette and some of
his pets for some past political matters, at the expense of the County.
There are several cases of the same nature now pending, which is calculated
to be prosecuted in the same way without no cause whatever, if we find
the County or her representatives simple enough to allow the above mentioned
bills, and encourage such an outrage on her citizens. We would
further show that the majority of us have lived here for almost a quarter
of a century, and all we own in the world is on the upper peninsula
of Michigan, and we do not owe any State or County tax yet, nor
never was charged with a criminal offence before the above mentioned
Mayor and his pets. We would further state that even we are heavy
tax payers, and it would come lighter on us to make it a county
matter. Still there is an ordinance in our city charter which provides
for all those offenses, and if the above mentioned party wants to gratify
their desire for personal spite let them do it at the expense of the city
of Marquette, not the County. Whilst we could say a great deal more
on the matter, we do not want to take up your valuable time and in
conclusion would say that all we ask in the premises is what is



strate against granting the petition of P. B. Hasley and others to divide

Ist The expenses of the whole township as it now stands will not mate-
rially exceed those of either township when divided, and therefore a
division would necessarily increase taxation.

II The township as it now stands has two voting precincts and is in
respect to elections as convenient as it would be after division.

III The majority of the permanent residents of the township and the
taxpayers therein, are certainly opposed to any division, and the
wishes of the transient population should not have the same weight
as those vitally interested in the welfare of the township in question
of this character. It has been asserted and we believe it to be true

A change in the mode of giving temporary relief has this year been inaugurated by the board to which though given but a partial trial as yet so far as a measure, the reduction per capita shown in the foregoing statement,

We are aware that the action of the board in this matter has been unfavorably criticized in some quarters, in fact the members of the board themselves have not been of one mind upon this subject but a majority held that Justice to the tax payer demanded a change, their views and the motives prompting their action is expressed in the following Preamble and resolution adopted by the board at a regular meeting held March 7th last after having been amended by adding Peas & Coffee to the list of articles to be furnished

Whereas under the present system of giving temporary relief not only is the highest price paid for goods furnished to the poor but many articles are bought which are commonly and properly considered as luxuries and for which the public ought not to pay; and believing that all times and particularly at the present time when the persons requiring relief within our county are numbered by hundreds and the burden they impose is enormous and is borne for the greater part by business interests that are languishing and by people who in their own living are practicing the most rigid economy in many instances confining themselves to such articles, the poor who are dependent upon the public in whole or in part for their support should be furnished with those articles and those only which are commonly considered as the necessities of life, except in case of sickness or infirmity, and believing further that all purchases made by this board as well as all other public offices should so far as practicable be made by advertising for proposals for furnishing whatever may be required,

Therefore resolved that hereafter only the following articles of food shall be furnished by the members of this board to persons receiving temporary relief except in case of sickness or infirmity viz Flour, corn meal, Beans,

Pies, Pork Potatoes and Butter.

Resolved further that it shall be the duty of each member of this board to ask for proposals from the several dealers in the different towns and locations when practicable each in his own district for furnishing such quantities of these articles as may be required the award to be made to the lowest bidder the board reserving the right to reject any or all bids.

The manner of purchasing supplies proposed by the resolution had been put in practice in the first district previous to its adoption and found to work well, it was at once put in practice in the Third District with the same result. The second District did not adopt it, the trade of the county in each of the towns is considerable, the pay good, but if divided among all the dealers is not sufficiently large with any to warrant a reduction from regular prices. The entire trade when given to one dealer does warrant a reduction and is made, advantage of this it is believed to be the duty of your Supervisors to take
