The credentials of Alex Maitland as supervisor of the 1<sup>st</sup> ward of Marquette City vice Johnson deceased and of George Plumar as Supervisor from Ely Township vice La Rue removed were read accepted and order placed on file.

## Petitions.

To the Hon. County Board of Supervisors of Marquette County, Michigan.

Your petitioners (citizens and tax payers of the Township of Crystal Falls in said County) respectfully represent, that to facilitate travel between the Railroad & town and the lumber camps, and the newly discovered mines east of the Village of Crystal Falls, said Township has undertaken to build a bridge across Point River on the Northwest quarter of Section 25, Town 43 Range 32 in place of one which the Township built last year on the same location and which was carried off by the freshet last spring. The bridge which was destroyed cost the Township over \$1000. and the one now building has so far cost \$1852. of which \$1000. has been paid and at least \$500. more will be required to put in wing piers and finish up the structure so that it will be reasonably secure from damage by high water next spring.

As the expenses of building necessary roads and bridges in this new and rough country are very heavy, we ask your Hon. Body to aid us by appropriating \$1000. from the County Treasury towards defraying the cost of the aforesaid Bridge. Dated at Crystal Falls Mich. Dec. 6<sup>th</sup> 1883.

 Gentlemen, — At a meeting of your Board, held August Twentysecond, 1853, a committee was appointed to consider the application of the W. M. & M. R. R. Company to purchase a piece of land off the corner of the Poor farm, for the right of way. The Committee examined the matter and reported



at a subsequent meeting that they had agreed to sell the piece required for three hundred dollars (\$300), which report was accepted and adopted, but no express authority was given to any officer, to make the conveyance. I would like to have a resolution adopted to that effect, so that the deed can be executed, the money paid, and the matter finally closed.

The following is a preamble and resolution which would propose.

Whereas, the Detroit, Mackinac & Marquette Railroad Company, on the twenty second day of August, 1853 presented to this Board a petition to purchase a parcel of land off the North west corner of the poor farm, for right of way for its railroad, and

Whereas, the matter of said petition was referred to a committee of five members of this Board to consider the matter, with full power in the premises, which committee reported at a meeting of this Board, held October Eighth, 1853, that they had examined the property and had agreed to sell said parcel of land to said company, for the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300), and

Whereas, the railroad across said parcel of land has been constructed by the Marquette and Western Railroad Company, which said Company now desires to acquire the title thereto in accordance with said agreement, no conveyance having as yet been made,

Therefore Resolved, that the President of this Board together with the County Clerk, be and are hereby authorized upon the payment of said sum of three hundred dollars (\$300) to execute, under the seal of the county, and deliver to said Marquette and Western Railroad Company, a deed of conveyance of the parcel of land so required, vesting the same in said Marquette and Western Railroad Company, in fee. Said parcel of land is particularly described as follows to, wit: All that part of the East 1-2 of North-west 1-4 of South-west 1-4 of Section 26, in township 45 North of Range 25 west. Known as the "Poor Farm", bounded as follows viz: Commencing at the North-west corner of said "Poor Farm" running thence East along the North line thereof, being the East and West center line of said Section, to a point where the same intersects a line drawn fifty feet distant Easterly from and parallel with the center line of said Marquette and

Western Railroad, as surveyed and constructed, and in accordance with the map and survey then of file in the office of the Register of Deeds: thence South-westerly, along the line so intersected, to a point where the same intersects the West line of said "Poor House Farm" thence North, on said last mentioned line, to the place of beginning.

The Detroit Mackinac & Marquette Railroad Company do not desire such conveyance, and will waive all the right thereto under any agreement made with your committee, upon the same being executed with the Marquette and Western Railroad Company, as requested.
