 to me of the claim of Sanborn County for \$100, advanced to my
 Superior as appeared in the case of Hammett (fillmore), in case of my
 leave (report): That under section 1920, Statute of the State in reference
 to the confinement and support of an insane person committed by our County
 to the Asylum, may be charged and collected from another County pro-
 vided that the proper steps are taken to notify the officials of the latter
 County that each insane person so claimed as a resident of such
 latter County and no proof to the contrary is made.

I find that the Treasurer of this County had countermanded some
 his commitments in the asylum paid to the Treasurer thereof of
 all bills presented for the support of Hammett (fillmore), and found to be

County, but after considerable inquiry I am unable to find that any statutory provision has been given whereby said persons could demand a proper charge upon this County, although the same might have been given.

The charge made by the Board of Supervisors being found very large and apparently for the purpose stated, and not being on its face sufficient explanation a legal charge, I would recommend that pending further inquiry as to whether the law has been complied with necessary to charge this County for any of such expenses the bill be referred back to the Board of Supervisors for an explanation.

1st. Why so large a sum as \$1000 was required for such assistance to go the distance required.

2^d. Why such assistance was required at all in the first place.
