Whereas: The board of supervisors has examined the assessment roll of the several townships and cities of the County to ascertain whether the relative valuation of the real property in the respective townships and cities has been equally and uniformly estimated, and  
Whereas in their judgment it has not been so uniformly and equally estimated, therefore,  
Resolved, that the valuation of the real property of said townships and cities be and the same is hereby equalized by adding to or deducting from the valuation of the taxable property of each township and city such sums as in our judgment will produce relatively an equal and uniform valuation of the real property of the County, which sums so determined by us are entered in the following table in the fifth and sixth columns thereof, respectively, opposite the names of such townships and cities respectively, and that the aggregate valuation taxable real and personal property of each township and city in said County as determined by us be found at the sum set down in said table in the last column thereof opposite the name of such township or city.
