


The reports of the Superintendents of Poor, School Commissioner and Deputy Game Warden was read in part and ordered placed on file.

The following is the report of J.A.Dresser, Special Auditor.

Marquette, Mich., January 29th, 1908.

Hon. G.E.Frederickson, Chairman and member of the Committee on County officers' Accounts.

Gentlemen:-

According to instructions, I have examined the books and records of the County Treasurer, County Clerk, County Road Commissions, Superintendents of the Poor, Soldiers Relief Commission and the criminal dockets of the Justices of the Peace, in the Cities of Marquette, Negaunee and Ishpeming and the Townships of Republic, Champion and Michigamme from January 1, 1907, to January 1, 1908 and herewith submit my report.

The receipts and Disbursements of the County Treasurer and balance of cash on hand as shown in this report are correct and agree with the books and records in the office of the County Treasurer and the County Clerk and the monthly statements and quarterly reports of the Auditor General.

County Auditor's Report

I find vouchers for all disbursements of the County Treasurer from October 1, 1907 to January 1, 1908. (Vouchers for Treasurer's disbursement from January 1 to October 1, 1907 were previously checked by committee of Board of Supervisors on County Officer's Accounts)

I also find duplicate receipts filed with the County Clerk for the Treasurers Miscellaneous Collections, all of which, vouchers and receipts I have checked with the Treasurer's Cash Book.

The receipts and Disbursements of Charles Sundblad, County Treasurer from January 1, 1907 to January 1, 1908, were as follows:-

I have counted the cash in the Treasurer's office and checked up the bank accounts with the several bank pass books and find that the above balance of \$21,515.30 was on hand in Treasurer's office and in banks at the close of December 31, 1907, and that the several amounts received prior to January 1, 1908 but not entered till after that date were also on hand at close of December 31, 1907.

I have checked the monthly and quarterly statements of the Auditor General and find that they are correct and agree with the County Treasurers books.

The accounts with the Townships and Cities have been correctly kept they having been credited with all Tax Collections of the County Treasurer and Auditor General and with

their respective portions of Primary School Funds, Library Funds and Liquor Licenses and debited with Auditor Generals Refunds and Rejected and Charged Back Taxes.

I have examined the Circuit Court Calanders and Court Journals and find that the fines and Costs amount to \$1,042.20 and the entry, Jury and Stenographer Fees amount to \$111.00 all of which have been paid to the County Treasurer by ex County Clerk Elliott and County Clerk Jenks.

I have checked up the accounts of County Clerk Jenks and Register in Chancery and find that the balance in bank as shown by bank pass book at close of december 31st, 1907 to be correct.

I have checked the criminal dockets of Justices Blanchard, Byrne, Crary and Donovan of Marquette, Justice Kronberg, Thoren and VerRan of Negaunee, Justice Andrews of Ishpeming, Justice Peebles and Extrum of Republic, Justice Gill of Beacon or Champion and Justice Milroy of Michigamme and find that the fines collected have all been turned over to the County Treasurer for the year ending December 31, 1907

I have examined the books of the Superintendent of the Poor and find the records carefully and correctly kept by Secretary C.D. Blanchard and the same is true of the records of the Soldiers Relief Commission of which C.D. Blanchard is also secretary.

I have also examined the records of the County Road Commissioners as kept by the County clerk Jenks and those kept by Superintendent Hillyer and I have checked up the vouchers on file in Superintendent Hillyer's office with the pay rolls and I find time checks properly endorsed by payees for all disbursements on accounts of the same.

In conclusion I desire to mention that the County officers have promptly rendered me any assistance requested.

I have examined the circuit court calendars and court journals, and find that the fines and costs in criminal cases amount to \$1,259.60, and the entry, jury and stenographer fees to \$220.00, all of which have been paid to the Treasurer by the County Clerk, Frank G. Jenks.

I have checked up the account of Frank G. Jenks as register in chancery and find the balance of \$5,373.44 as shown by the records to be on hand to the credit of the register in chancery at the close of business, December 31, 1908.

I have checked the criminal dockets of Justices Byrne, and Crary of Marquette, Justices Thoren, Verran, and Argall of Negaunee and Justice Andrews of Ishpeming, and find that the fines collected as shown by the several dockets have all been paid over to the County Treasurer.

I also find all the dockets to have been correctly written up for the year of 1908.

I have examined the books of the Superintendents of the Poor and those of the Soldiers'

Relief commission, and find the same carefully and correctly kept by C.D. Blanchard Secretary of the Poor fund also of the Soldier's Relief commission.

I have examined the records of the County Road Commission, kept by County Clerk Jenks, and find the same to be correct.

The changes I suggested to the commissioners and Superintendent Hillyer a year ago were practically adopted.

As it seems desirable to issue time checks to a large majority of the employees amounting yearly to from ten to fifteen thousand dollars, and as the same are paid by the banks or county treasurer on presentation, I would suggest that these ^{time} checks be made out on safety paper, also that the balance due be written out on the check and further that the amount be cut or printed by a machine in order to prevent the same from being raised.

When a settlement is made with the County treasurer, and his vouchers for disbursement have been checked by the Auditing Committee or auditor, it is the usual custom to cancel the same with a canceling machine which cuts out the word "audited" or "canceled" after which the vouchers are sealed up and filed with the County clerk. I would again call your attention to the fact, that aside from the manner in which the treasurer cancels these vouchers or orders when paid, and occasionally they are not canceled, nothing further is done in the matter. A machine could be procured for \$15.00 which would answer the purpose made by Jas. H. Cummings & Co. of Chicago. I mention this particular machine because it is inexpensive in comparison with some which are apparently no better.

In conclusion, I desire to say that the county officers have rendered me any assistance required.
