The following report of the Highways and Bridges Committee and the Marquette County Road Commission was read. Supervisor Muck moved the adoption of the report. Supported by Supervisor Corneliuson and unanimously carried.

Ishpeming, Michigan October 6, 1950.

Hon. Chairman and Members of Marquette Co. Bd. of Supervisors, Marquette County, Michigan.

Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Highways and Bridges met with the County Road Commission on September 19, 1950, to consider several petitions referred by your Board for joint action.

In the matter of the petition from several residents of Tilden Township requesting the elimination of the dust nuisance on a portion of Road PA and on Road PN we find that the section of Road PA has been given a surface treatment of tar, which corrects the condition as requested. On Road PN, on which there are a very few residents, the dust condition has been taken care of by the use of calcium chloride.

In the matter of the petition requesting that the West Branch Road (Road CCE) in Ely Township be graded and the holes patched, we find that the worst spots have been corrected by patching, and that prior to the opening of the hunting season, additional work will be done to improve the condition of the road.

In the matter of the petition requesting surfacing on Road OJ in Skandia Township, we find the road has been graveled with base-course gravel and is given regular maintenance, and that a crushed gravel surfacing will be applied when the crusher is again set up in the Lawson pit.

In the matter of the petition from property owners along Lake Superior in Chocolay Township, requesting the improvement of an addition l_{2}^{1} miles of Road 484, we find that the work requested will take care of only a portion of the area needing service. Inasmuch as County Road 484 is parallel to, and in most cases only a few hundred feet from State Trunk Line M-28, we feel that to build approximately three miles of 484 would be a duplication in both construction and maintenance, at a considerable cost to the County We recommend that the Road Commission together with the Chocolay Township Board, make a study of the situation with the idea of making access roads to the resort area from M-28 at convenient intervals so as to adequately serve the area, instead of building approximately three miles of Road 484.

At the joint meeting, a general discussion was held relative to the demands being made upon the Road Commission for road improvements and additional services and wish to sjbmit, as a part of this report, an analysis of the Road Commission's situation and their ability to meet these demands.

The major portion of the construction and improvement work done in the past two years has been done with the aid of Township funds. These jobs cover several types of work, some tarring, some graveling and others grading and the amount of Township participation depends upon the type of work being done and upon the Township funds available.

In 1940, the Road Commission received \$112,000.00 in County Road taxes and \$196,000.00 from Gas and Weight taxes. In addition to this, there was a cash balance at the beginning of the year of \$215,000.00. These amounts, together with receipts from the State Maintanance contract and other miscellaneous receipts made available to the Commission approximately \$600,000.00 for the year.

In 1949, the year was started with a balance of \$11,000.00. Receipts from County Road Taxes amounted to \$82,000.00 and from Gas and Weight taxes, \$245,000.00. These, with other receipts made a total available for 1949 of \$554,000.00 or \$46,000.00 less than in 1940.

In this same period from 1940 to 1949, wages and salaries increased approximately 85 percent; materials, such as tar, stone, culvert pipe, etc., increased 60 percent and equipment costs averaged 65 percent higher. With decreased revenues and increased costs during this period, it has not been possible for the Road Commission to carry on a normal program of improvements and construction, nor to make needed replacements in equipment.

Another condition which materially affected the finances of the Commission, had to do with the period during the war. During these years, the Commission was not permitted to carry on any construction program, nor were they permitted to purchase new equipment. As a result, on January 1, 1947, there was a cash balance of \$308,000.00 which was to be used for deferred improvements and equipment replacements. In 1947, however, the County Road tax was reduced to \$37,000.00 in 1948, it was \$80,000.00 and in 1949 it was \$82,000.00 as compared with \$112,000.00 in 1940. As a result, the funds which had been accumulated during the war for construction and equipment had to be used for maintenance and routine operations, with operating costs increasing each year.

This is the general situation as it has affected the Road Commission and the highway program in Marquette County over the past few years. In addition to this, some jobs have come in for special considerationand comment, one of which is Road 550 running from Marquette to Big Bay.

This road during the war years and during the period of very active logging operations was almost completely destroyed. The Road Commission recognized the need for re-building this road and negotiated with the Bureau of Public Roads for Federal Aid in restoring it to the point where it would adequately handle the traffic to which it was subjected. During the 1949 season, work costing approximately \$65,000.00 was done on this road, and plans were made to complete the work in the 1950 season, with half of the cost being paid for from Federal funds and half from County funds. The work remaining to be done in 1950 consisted of tarring from the Halfway to Big Bay, which is now gravel and a tar seal on the portion south from the Halfway, which was improved during 1949. In June, 1950, plans were completed and late in June the Eureau of Public Roads requested certain changes in design and plans, which changes were made. The revised plans are now in Lansing awaiting Federal approval and when such approval is received, the work will go on. It should be understood that the Road Commission is taking advantage of the various programs, such as Federal Aid, but where Federal agencies, which pay one-half the cost, are involved, considerable time is required before the work can go on.

Another item of work performed by the Road Commission which should be commented on is the matter of snow removal. In 1940 the cost of snow removal on county roads, exclusive of State Trunk Lines, was approximately \$115,000.00 or 23 per cent of the total expenditure of the Commission for the year. This snow removal cost is entirely a service cost, with nothing to show for the expenditure in the spring after the snow is gone and each year the demand for increased and improved snow removal is growing.

Your Committee on Highways and Bridges and your Road Commission are vitally interested in the highways in Marquette county and in the service to the public in Marquette County but we feel that without additional financial relief provided by the Legislature or other sources, a normal highway program cannot be carried on by the Road Commissions in Michigan.

Supported by Supervisor Altobello. Supervisor Larson moved the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast by the Clerk for his election. Supported by Supervisor Bouley and carried unanimously. The Clerk stated the ballot was cast and the Chairman declared Mr. Heiden duly elected to the Social Welfare Commission for a period of three years.

On motion of Supervisor Kivela, supported by Supervisor Corneliuson and carried, the Board recessed until 11:00 A.M. to enable the Finance and Taxation Committee to complete their report to the Board.

COURT HOUSE

At the Court House we would suggest that the lighting in the offices of the lower floor be checked into with a view of changing over to the newer type of lights in use today.

The outside of the Court House itself should be considered as to the need of painting the wooden window frames, etc.

JAIL:

The jail was in a very neat condition and we are pleased to see that recognition was given Marquette County by the State Dept. for the splendid condition of our County Jail. Certain cell repairs have been completed since our last inspection, by cementing in fixtures.

DETENTION HOME:

The repairs recommended on our last visit have been completed, such as renewing cement work on the outside of the building and repairs to the roof to stop water from running into the windows of the cell block.

A new Holland furnace and a stoker have been installed and this home seems to be in a very comfortable condition.

CITIZENS HOME:

The general appearance of the building is very attractive and it is clean and comfortable for the occupants.

The floor in the large sitting room on the East side needs a covering of some kind, and we would suggest that estimates be received for this work.

Also, the stairway to the women's quarters needs some attention.

In the boiler room, we noticed that the railing around the boiler has been put in place.

MORGAN HEIGHTS SANATORIUM:

The roof of the main building needs some attention for repairs to the covering.

There are a few other items that Dr. Acocks would like such as a combination building of shop, garage and living quarters for the caretaker and wife.

Also, there is the possibility of black-topping the parking area.

The steam line from the boiler room to the Nurses' Home and Doctor's Home should be checked.

Your Committee wishes to thank Mr. Wm. A. Gray and his staff for the assistance given in making our trip possible; also to the attendant at the jail and to all those who helped make our trip worthwhile as far as the County work is concerned.

TO: County of Marquette, Michigan.(herein referred to as the "Sponsor")

FROM: The United States of America (acting through the Administrator of Civil Aeronautics herein referred to as the "Administrator")

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has submitted to the Administrator a Project Application dated August 28, 1950 for a grant of Federal funds for a project for development of the K. I. Sawyer Airport (herein called the "Airport"), together with plans and specifications for for such project, which Project Application, as approved by the Administrator, is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Administrator has approved a project for development of the Airport (herein called the "Project") consisting of the following described airport development:

"Furnish and install elevated runway lighting system on the N-S runway, beacon, lighted wind indicating device and segmented circle marker." (This work is in addition to that included in Project No. 9-20-021-701.)

All as more particularly described in the property map and plans and specifications incorporated in the said Project Application:

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to and for purposes of carrying out the provisions of the Federal Airport Act (60 Sta. 170; Pub. Law 377, 79th Congress), and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances

contained in said Project Application, and its acceptance of this offer, as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the United States and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport, as herein provided.

The Administrator, for and on behalf of the United States, hereby offers and agrees to pay, as the United States' share of costs incurred in accomplishing the project, 50 per centum of all allowable project costs, subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this offer shall be \$8,500.00.
 - 2. The Sponsor shall:
- (a) begin accomplishment of the Project within a reasonable time after acceptance of this Offer, and
- (b) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the terms of this Offer and the Federal Airport Act and the Regulations promulgated thereunder by the Administrator in effect on the date of this Offer, which Act and Regulations are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, and
- (c) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications and property map incorporated herein as they may be revised or modified with the approval of the Administrator or his duly authorized representatives.
- 3. The Sponsor shall operate and maintain the Airport as provided in the Project Application incorporated herein.
- 4. The maximum amounts of building space which the Sponsor shall be obligated to furnish Civil Agencies of the United States for the purposes and on the terms and conditions stated in Paragraph 9 of Part III of the Project Application is set forth in the attached Schedule of Maximum Space Requirements, which is incorporated herein and made a part hereof.
- 5. Any misrepresentation or omission of a material fact by the Sponsor concerning the Project or the Sponsor's authority or ability to carry out the obligations assumed by the Sponsor in accepting this Offer shall terminate the obligation of the United States and it is understood and agreed by the Sponsor in accepting this Offer, that if a material fact has been misrepresented or omitted by the Sponsor, the Administrator on behalf of the United States may recover all grant payments made.
- 6. The Administrator reserves the right to amend or withdraw this Offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.
- 7. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be obligated to pay any of the allowable costs of the project unless this Offer has been accepted by the Sponsor within 60 days from the above date of Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the Administrator in writing.
- 8. (a) The Administrator, in tendering this Offer on behalf of the United States, recognizes the existence of an agency relationship between the County of Marquette, Michigan, as principal and the Michigan Department of Aeronautics, as agent, created by the Agency Agreement entered into respectively between the said parties on February 20, 1946 and January 31, 1947, copy of which Agreement is attached to the Project Application dated February 11, 1948 in Project No. 9-20-021-701 and made a part of this Grant Agreement by reference; and the Sponsor agrees that it will not amend, modify or terminate said Agency Agreement without the prior approval, in writing, of the Administrator or his duly designated representative.
- 8. (b) It is further understood and agreed that Paragraphs (b) through (c) of Section 1 of the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement adopted by the Sponsor in connection with Project No. 9-20-021-701 attached to and made a part of the Grant Offer in such first project executed on August 5, 1948, be deleted therefrom and that the whole of Part III (Sponsor's Assurances) of the Project Application attached hereto be substituted as and for such deleted portions of the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement in such Project No. 9-20-021-701.

Your Committee on County Parks completed their inspection and submit the following report:

PERKINS PARK, BIG BAY

This park can be greatly improved without too great an outlay of money.

It is recommended that the bathing beach be bulldozed for a distance of 75 to 80 feet inland for a width of approximately 300 feet with an elevation of about 5 feet.

It is estimated that this work would require two men and the use of a bulldozer for five days.

In addition to the work at the beach, your Committee recommends that the caretaker's quarters be improved. The four rooms to be papered and painted throughout and the adjoining shed insulated.

The estimated cost for this work follows:

V The following report of the Forestry Commission was read. The Chairman ordered the report filed.

At a regular meeting of the Marquette County Forestry Commission, held on August 1, 1951, plans were instituted to plant suitable trees on a denuded area in $S_{\rm ands}$ Township.

Arrangements were made whereby the actual work involved would be done by the Marquette County Road Commission, with the aid of a tree planting machine owned by the C. & N. W. Ry. Co. and the necessary trees obtained from the Michigan Department of Conservation. The Commission agreed to expend one half of their appropriation this fall to carry out this work.

The area selected included the $SW_{\frac{1}{4}}^{1}$ of $SE_{\frac{1}{2}}^{1}$, $E_{\frac{1}{2}}^{1}$ of $SW_{\frac{1}{4}}^{1}$, and the $E_{\frac{1}{2}}^{1}$ of $SW_{\frac{1}{4}}^{1}$ of $SW_{\frac{1}{4}}^{1}$ in Section 25, T 46, R 25. Work started on this project September 14, when the Road Commission sent a truck to the Conservation Department Nursery at Gaylord, for 90,000 three year old Jack Pine seedlings. The project was completed on October 3rd. A total of $452\frac{1}{2}$ man hours was required to complete the project, indicating a planting rate of 200 trees per man hour. The total cost of the project was \$1,111.04, including the total labor employed, survey crew, trucking and equipment rental for planting or a cost per tree of less than $1\frac{1}{4}$ cents.

The following report of the Marquette County Road Commission was read and ordered filed by the Chairman.

Report for Month of Sept. 1951 -- State Trunk Lines

Work on the State Trunk Lines consisted of routine operations. Nine carloads of black top to be used for pavement widening and shoulder stablization were unloaded and stocked in the Road Commission's yard.

The railing on the Carp River bridge on U. S.-41 was creosoted.

Approximately 200 lineal feet of broken guard rail along U. S.-41 was repaired. The Road Commission assisted the State Highway Department in the renewing the center line markings along M-95 and M-35. Three miles of shoulder reshaping along U.S.-41 were completed. Roadside table and park sites were cleaned weekly.

County Roads

The new steel and concrete bridge on road 550 over the Little Garlic Creek was completed. The new structure is a 40 foot span and is 24 feet wide.
