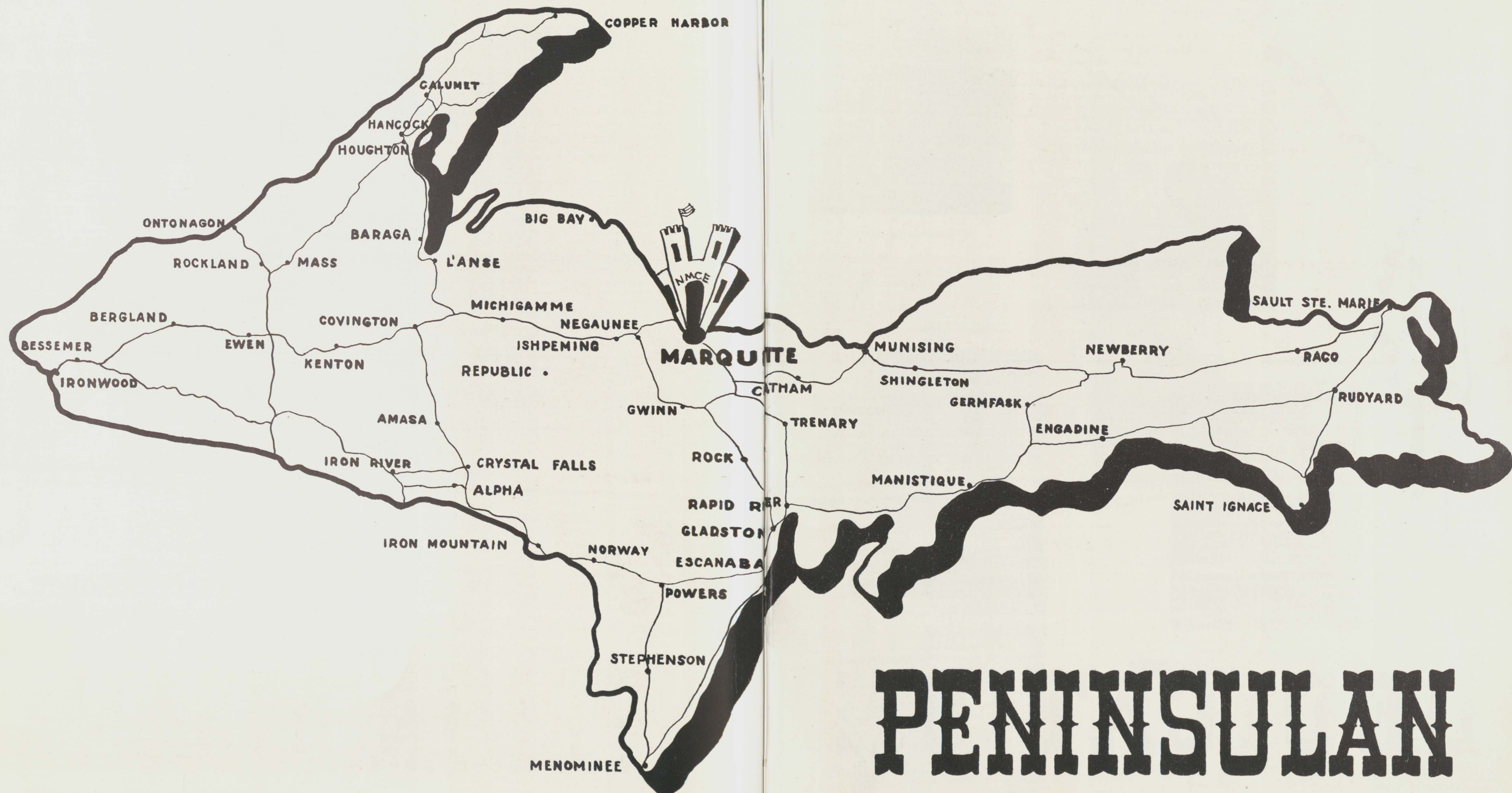

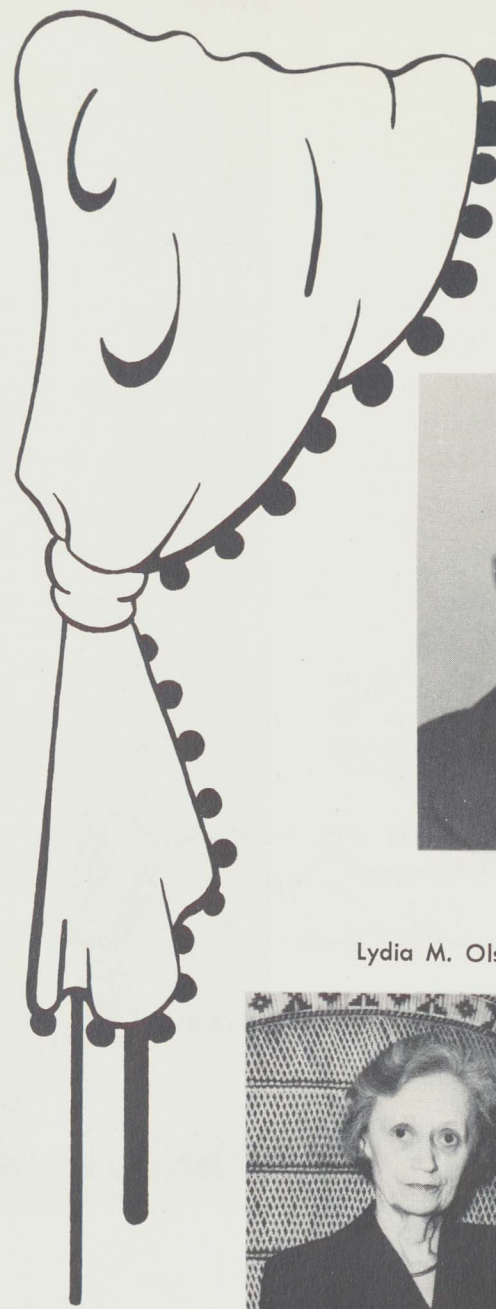

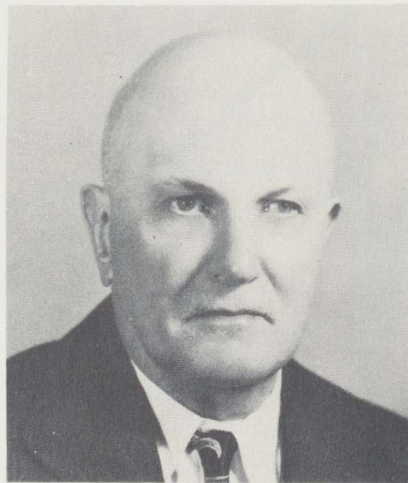

the Peninsulan will be an ever present companion.

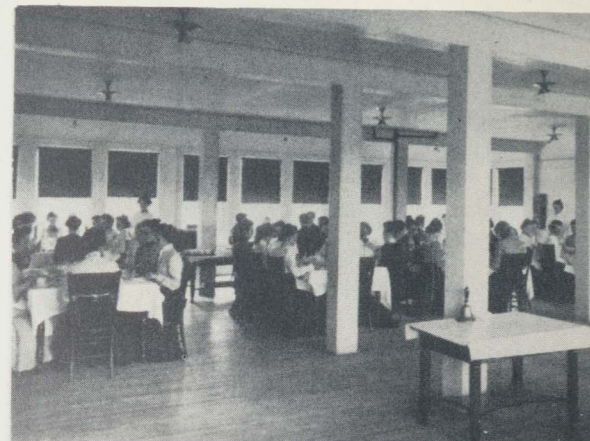

## NORTHERN FIFTY YEARS AGO



In 1900, the first permanent building of the College, known as the South Wing, was completed. Two years later, the North Wing was completed and named after Peter White, a generous friend of the institution. Fire destroyed the South Wing in 1905, but it was replaced in 1907 by the Longyear Building. The John D. Pierce Training School, erected in 1925, was named after Michigan's first Superintendent of Public Instruction. The new Union Building, named after the late Harry D. Lee, and the Residence Hall for women, named after Ethel G. Carey, were dedicated by Northern during the present college year. Sections of the older buildings have been renovated and are now modern offices and classrooms.

Under the direction of President Dwight B. Waldo in 1899, the faculty consisted of six instructors and thirty-two students. Today, with Henry A. Tape as president, there are more than one hundred faculty members and one thousand students.

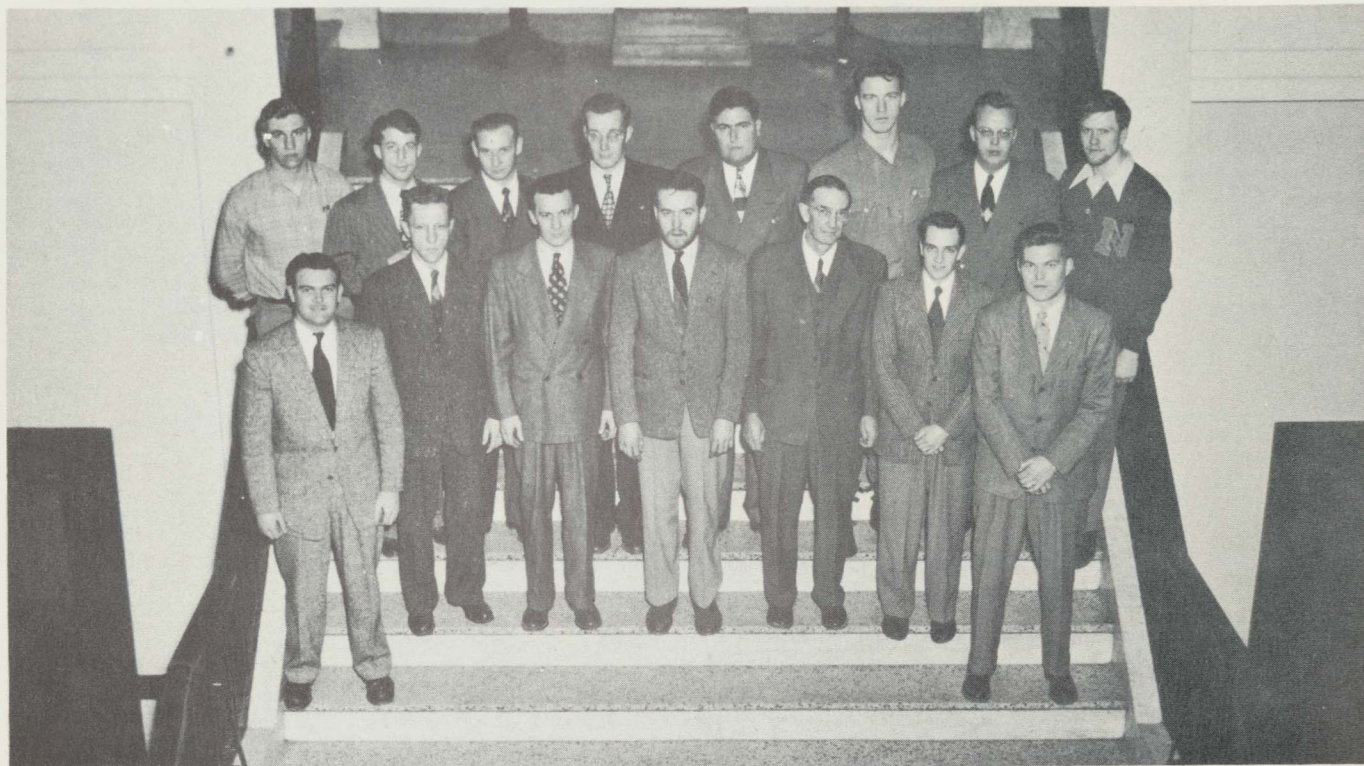
## THE MASQUERS

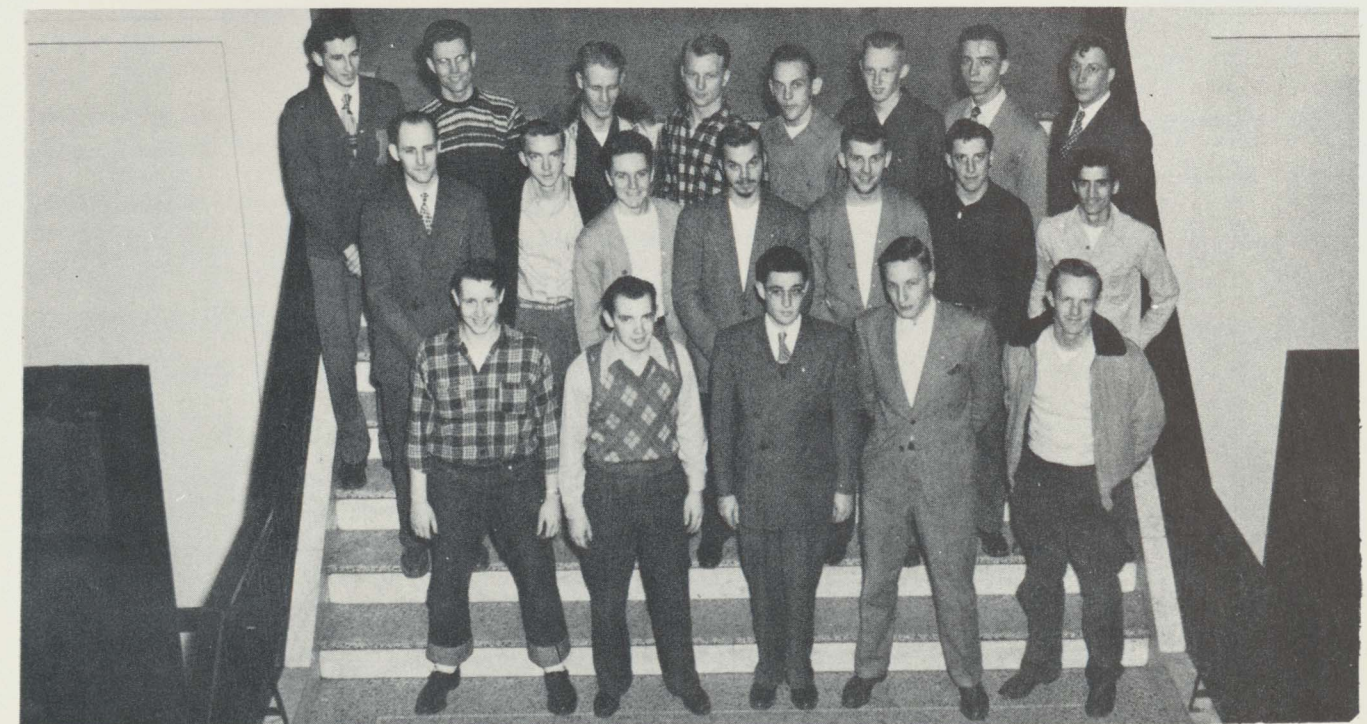

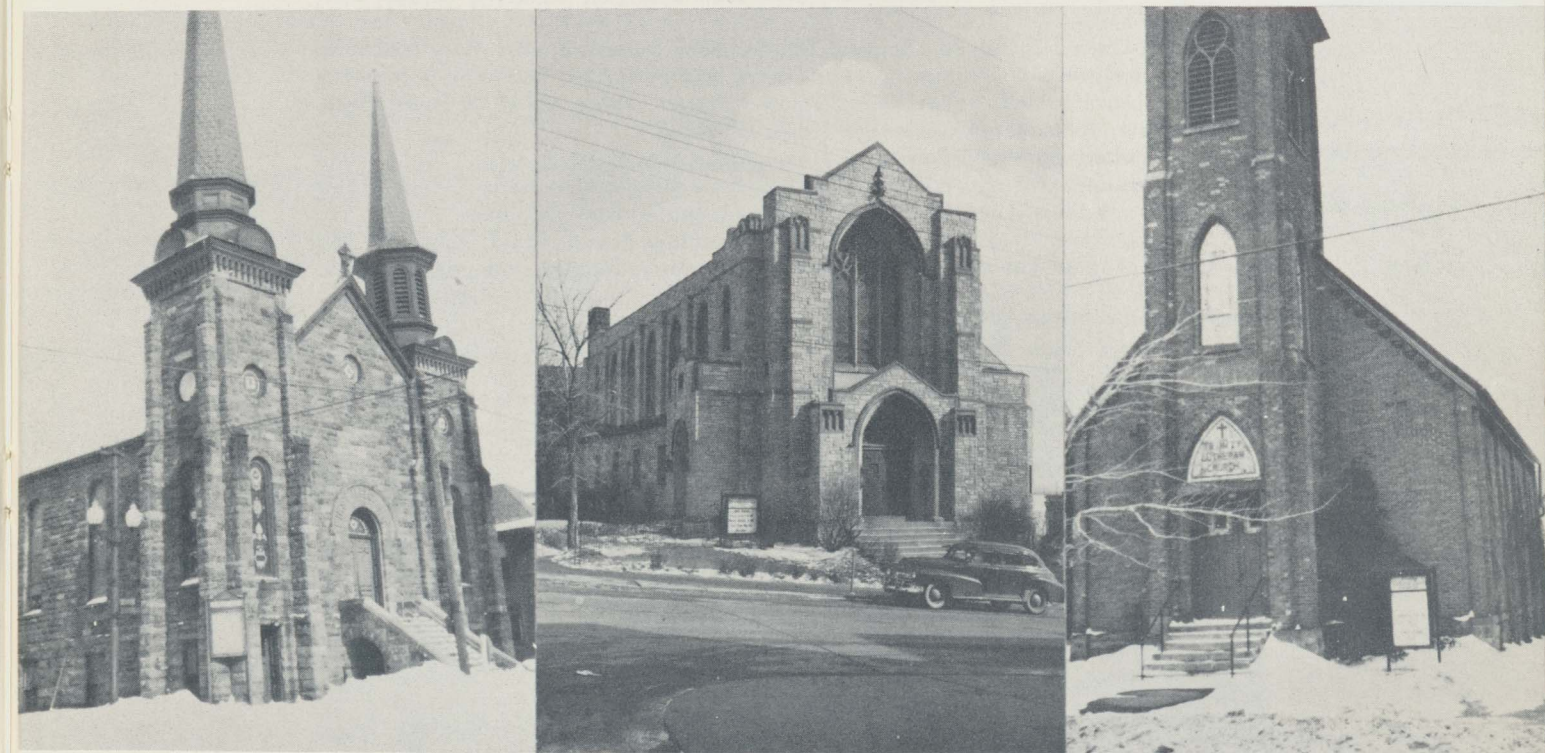
## NORTHERN'S DEBATE TEAM
