There were present Aldermen Brown, Blanchard, Carney, Hoch, Hoag, Holley, Krieg, Pendill, Rossetter, Robertson, Schoch, Sherman, Stafford, Shea, Tobin and Vandenberg.

The minutes of the last two preceding meetings were read and amended approved.

The liquor bond of Thomas Coopling, unitard John Carney and William F. Vender, was approved.

The chairman of the committee on accounts and statistics sent the contract of E. J. Erdeling for constructing fence and walling on Champion street was completed and recommended the payment of bid.

The ordinance committee presented an ordinance amending section 16 of an ordinance entitled "an ordinance relative to the grading, paving and improvement of streets, ways and public places passed June 1, 1896" by Alderman Blanchard after a certain clause was stricken out moved its adoption, which was supported.

Alderman Sherman moved that there be added to this ordinance as follows:

"The street commission shall in enforcing this section, act in accordance with such further ordinances or resolutions of this council as may from time to time be in force" which, being supported, was carried.

The said ordinance as amended was then, on motion, adopted by the following vote:

Resolved, That the said commissioners have their proceedings published in THE MINING JOURNAL until the common council orders it otherwise.

Moved by Alderman Rossetter supported and carried that the same resulting in making of specific Creek street between Third and Fourth streets be taken from the table and referred to a committee of three to be appointed by the mayor.

On motion of Alderman Sherman the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the recorder be sent is minutes of each meeting of the council printed on slips sufficient to supply the same to the members of the council and to the aldermen and city officials two days prior to the next regular meeting of the council.

On motion of Alderman Hoch the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the mayor appoint a committee of fifteen or twenty of our business men to consult with the projectors of the proposed bridge across the AuSable river when said committee is ready to report the same to the council, if they so desire, the projectors call a meeting of the common council to hear said report and decide upon the same.

On motion of Alderman Tobin, the following preamble and resolution were adopted:

Whereas, The city of Marquette is about entering upon plans for the improvement of its macadamized roadway, and the same, when completed, will be a great convenience to the citizens, therefore, be it resolved, that the mayor appoint a committee of fifteen or twenty of our business men to consult with the projectors of the proposed bridge across the AuSable river when said committee is ready to report the same to the council, if they so desire, the projectors call a meeting of the common council to hear said report and decide upon the same.

On motion of Alderman Hoch the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the building known as the "Robertson house" on the east side of the street, between the Creek street and Park street in the Eighth ward, be and is hereby designated as the place for holding the annual meeting of the council on November 25, 1898.

Moved by Alderman Tobin, supported and carried that when the council adjourns it adjourn till November 19, 1898, at 1 o'clock p.m.

Moved by Alderman Rossetter and supported that the same be paid \$6 per person, but after discussion no further action was taken in the matter.

The ordinance entitled "an ordinance granting a franchise to the Marquette Gas Light Company" was moved by Alderman Blanchard and supported that it be adopted.
