Robert Brown, 31, Detroit, has been named assistant deputy warden of the Marquette Prison. Warden Raymond J. Buchko announced today.

Brown, who has been superintendent of a privately-supported halfway house in Detroit for parolees the past two years, will succeed Robert J. Malette of Marquette, who resigned the position here in February and who has returned to this previous position as hallmaster.

Detroit Native: A native of Detroit, Brown graduated from Michigan State University in 1958. He was an officer in the U. S. Air Force in 1958-60 and is now a reserve captain in the Air Force.

Brown began his career in the corrections field in 1960 as a counselor at the Cassidy Lake Technical School. He later was parole officer in Detroit before becoming superintendent at Alexandrine House, the halfway house.

Brown also is a graduate of the National Institute on Police and Community Relations and has served as a liaison officer between Michigan county law enforcement agencies and the Detroit office of the Michigan Parole Bureau.

He now is being oriented at Jackson Prison and Ionia Reformatory in preparations for his duties at Marquette. He is expected here later in the month or early next month.

order to avoid any additional difficulties. The numbers increased rapidly as the march proceeded southward. Chief of Police George G. Johnson reported, and by the time the group came to W. Washington St. it had reached 1,000.

Practically all of them were NMU students, he said, although a few high school students did join the group.

After arriving in the business area, Johnson said, the NMU students moved into the middle of the block between Third and Front Sts. and many of them sat down on the sidewalks.

They congregated between the Delft and Nordic Theaters, blocking all traffic. In about 20 or 25 minutes, the chief said, but quieted down when Dr. Allan L. Harden, chief of police, arrived and spoke to them. He urged them to return to the campus and heard Dr. Edgar L. Harden, NMU president, speak.

While they were milling about and sitting down in the business area, the chief said, traffic was re-routed via Third St. to the south section and most of the motorists coming north on S. Front St. continued going north. Others just stopped on the street to wait for the parade to pass, he said.

Students Orderly: "Fortunately we didn't have much traffic at the time," Johnson said. "The students were, insofar as we could determine, orderly while they were in the downtown area. There was no profane language used, although there was a lot of singing, chanting and shouting."

"However, we cannot tolerate this sort of profane, and in some cases, disorderly conduct. Therefore, an investigation is being made, and we expect to make some arrests if the ringleaders will be prosecuted."

Among other charges, the police chief noted, the ringleaders can be charged with unlawful assembly, obstructing traffic and being disorderly.

Escorted By Leaders: The chief pointed out that while the students' demonstration could be attributed to the bulk of the students being incited by a few leaders, the majority of the students who participated probably were not aware of the dangers involved and of the laws being broken.

"We cannot permit this defiance of the law," Johnson said.

Only Two Incidents: He said the officers on duty at the desk in the police station had notified both the Michigan State Police and the Marquette County Sheriff's Department to remain on a standby notice. It was unnecessary to summon either, however.

There were only two incidents reported during the demonstration, Johnson said. The aerial for a car radio was broken by marchers at the Park St. intersection.

More serious, however, was an incident which took place on N. Third St.

The mother of a high school girl said her daughter, who was walking home, was yanked by the arm by an NMU security policeman into the march. In defiance, she, the man accidentally injured the girl's left arm, the woman reported.

She said that the security officer apparently thought the girl was a university student and wanted her to march with the others.

Want Mayor, Brumm: In the downtown area, the police chief said, the students were primarily chanting, "We want the mayor, we want Brumm," obviously referring to Mayor Robert E. Brumm, and City Commissioner Leonard W. Brumm Jr.

City police also alerted the fire department when the marchers reached the business district, and two trucks were driven to the area, one to the Front St. intersection and the other to the Third St. corner.

Wallace told Roger Rappoport, editor of the University of Michigan student paper, that he will head a "Stand Up for America" party ticket.

"I'm confident a states-rights oriented party could gain enough votes to win the election," he told Rappoport.

"With three parties in the running, all I'd need is 34 per cent of the vote."
