

Keskey Donates Scholarship

Reacting to the Student Government's adviser, Dr. Lowell Kafer's, refusal to okay the expenditure of Student Government funds as a donation to the legal fund for Dr. Robert McClellan, student body President Don L. Keskey has announced the donation of his \$300 President's Scholarship to the McClellan Legal Fund.

"I make this contribution on the part of the Northern Student government which refuses to be intimidated or be subservient to the student

personnel office, the business office, or the Board of Control in carrying out its responsibility, to faithfully represent and promote a welfare of our student body."

Dean Kafer reaffirmed a position which he took at the offset of this request. Meeting with Keskey and other student government officials, Kafer said that under the present funding policy its principals would not allow this extra-legal expenditure.

He did, however, recognize the need for a change in this policy to make the SGA more autonomous and proposed that Keskey appoint a committee to work with him and re-

view the funding procedures for the SGA in order to let them spend their money the way they see fit in the future.

Keskey has called the action on

the part of Kafer an "unethical, tactic to emasculate a student re-

presentative body whose responsibility it is to work on behalf of the student body."

"It has," continued Keskey, "for some time now been imperative that Northern reevaluate itself and reshape policy to fit the needs of the student body, the faculty, and society at large--in short, the thousands of people who are here--rather than the present Northern practice of fitting the university community around the needs buildings, or around the protection of "efficiency and convenience" for a few seemingly unknowledgeable administrators."

Answering the charges Dean Kafer said in his earlier position that as a matter of principle it would not be right, under the present policy, to authorize expenditure of university funds to file suit against the university.

Again, however, he emphasized his willingness to change the situation the policy so that the SGA could in the future have greater control over their senators.
