Bill Opposes Shutdown Of Job Corps

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Alan Cranston, D-Calif., said Friday 21 colleagues will co-sponsor his bill opposing the shutdown of Job Corps installa-

sponsor ins shutdown of Job Corps installa-tions.

Cranston arranged to intro-duce the resolution which would put the Senate on record as opposing Job Corps shutdowns without congressional approval. Secretary of Labor George P. Shultz said meanwhile a St mil-lion fund is available to provide other training for Job Corps stu-dents in the 59 camps being closed in an economy move. Shultz told a Senate labor sub-committee that enrollees who wish to transfer to other Job Corps centers may do so Others in the affected camps will be given priority to participate in tederally assisted manpower training programs if they wish.
