Several black students were in the office this morning to present me with a list of 95 other blacks who were in on the sit-in. Included in the office group were Charles Griffis, Dave Williams, Charles Moore, and Phil Holder.

Charles Moore came to me and said, "I have a message from all of the black students. They say that if the demand for amnesty is not met, they will leave the campus."

At 4:30 p. m. on January 8 Dr. Rombouts came in and gave me a note which said that David Williams had informed him that the black students had decided to let the twenty-four students be tried by the Faculty-Student Judiciary. A few minutes later I stepped out into the reception area, and Dr. Rombouts and David Williams were there talking and David Williams conveyed the same information to me in a very polite manner.
