SUMMARY OF FINDINGS:			

The claimant, a black student, alleged discrimination because of race.

Michigan Civil Rights Commission staff members met with various university officers, administrators, faculty members, and students.

The following summary of certain specific policies and practices institute and developed by Northern Michigan University during the past two or three years from the basis for closing cliss complaint.

STATEMENT OF POLICY

Northern Michigan University fully subscribes to a policy of Equal Opportunity in all areas of education and will continue to maintain and conduct all practices in a manner which does not discriminate on the basis of religion, race, color, national origin, ancestry, sex or age.

In order to assure continued implementation of the above stated policy, the University has taken the following actions, some of which were initiated prior to this investigation:

- 1. The University has authorized the Human Relations Commission to investigate and prepare findings when there is a complaint alleging that bias or racial prejudice was a factor in a decision rendered by a University judicial body. The Revised Student Code provides, in part, that the final disposition of the disciplinary action cannot be made until the Human Rights Commission investigation has been completed and its report acted upon by the President.
- 2. The revised Student Code contains the following provisions:

(a) <u>Fart II</u>, Section II G 2a7 "the members of the All-University Student Judiciary (AUSJ) shall number seven regular members plus one alternate and should consist of at least two member of each sex, and at least one black student..."

Membership: The members of the Student Faculty Judiciary shall number eight and consist of the following: (1) Four students who. shall have a least sophomore standing at the time of their appoinment. At least one should be a black student."

(c) / Part II, Section II G 3a7 states that judiciary members may be recalled where good cause for removal from office is proven. The University concurs with the Michigan Civil Rights Commission that racial, religious, or ethnic bias of a judiciary member may be deemed good cause for removal.

The All-University Student Judiciary and the Student Faculty Judiciary each presently have a black student member; and approximately 10 black students are involved as members in the various residence hall judiciaries.

- The Charter of the Human Relations Commission which is an official policy 3. of the University adopted by its Board of Control, established a procedure for the investigation of complaints of alleged discrimination against faculty, administrative staff, students, or any other member of the University Community.
- 4. The University has hired additional black persons in the following positions:
 - (a) Assistant Professor in the Department of Mathematics
 - (b) Instructor in the Department of Business
 - (c) A Counselor
 - (d) Graduate Assistant in the Department of History
 - (e) A Research Assistant in the Office of Institutional Research
 - (f) Two Graduate Assistants who serve as administrative aides to the

 - (g) A Secretary in the Security Office

- 5. President Jamrich has formally urged the Academic Vice-President, the Deans, and the Department Chairman to recruit and hire black faculty and staff.
- 6. The University has allocated \$4,000 to support a Black Culture Week. Black Culture Week took place the week of November 16, 1970. It consisted of lectures, movies, dances, and entertainment emphasizing black culture. A second Black Culture Week is scheduled for the spring of 1971.
- 7. The University is presently engaged in acting ti its library books concerning black culture and black studies. Several hundred volumes have been added during the last three years. A list of recommended books for initial procurement was provided by a staff member of the Detroit Public Library at the request of the University. Those books were purchased. Additional volumes are on the acquisition list.
- 8. The University sent Dr. McShrine and Mr. Melvin Payne to Africa during the summer of 1970 in order to help them prepare for a Black Studies program.
- 9. Offerings in Black Studies 1970-71.

Fall Semester

- 1. CL III, Humanities I. Several essays deal with the Black Problem (all Freshmen take the course).
- CL II2, Humanities I One of four required books is <u>The Autobiography of Malcolm X.</u> etc. ca. 10%-20% of a multisection course.
 - 3. Common Learning Social Science courses (American Politics and Values; American Society). Multisection course (ca. 1200 students total). The course content related to Black Studies varies, but probably averages around 10%.
