AGENDA

1. An exploratory discussion of means that the faculty wishes to use in determining its position on economic issues that effect members of the faculty organization.
2. An open discussion of the relationships between the teaching faculty and the student body. In light of serious allegations that the faculty has exhibited a disinterest in student problems in general and in the recent experiences of Northern Michigan University Black students in particular, The Academic Senate at its May 5, 1970, meeting endorsed the following:

THE ACADEMIC SENATE HAS INVITED MARQUETTE COUNTY PROSECUTOR, MR. EDWARD A. QUINNELL AND MR. J. KENT BOURLAND, DEFENSE COUNSEL FOR THE SIX DEFENDENTS, TO SPEAK ON THE TRIAL AND ALLIED ISSUES. MEMBERS OF THE AUDIENCE WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO ASK QUESTIONS OF BOTH MEN.
