

Motion passed by the Academic Senate at its meeting on  
Wednesday, May 13, 1970.

Recognizing the hostility faced by some students on campus because of their status as members of a minority group, especially Black students, and recognizing the disruption in the lives of the six defendants and many other Black students who have not been able to function in their normal capacity as students during the period of time since the past sit-in, we urge the faculty to take those difficulties of their situation into account as they determine final grades for the semester. They might consider, for example, an "I" or a "WP".

While the Academic Senate has no intention of suggesting the modification of individual faculty grading procedures which we of necessity recognize as an individual, professional, responsibility, the Senate does wish to call the attention of the faculty to the unusual burdens placed upon some students because of considerations of race and to the burden which these students are under to engage in activities pursuant to their need to protect and establish their identity as human beings in a cultural climate which is often not conducive to the establishment of such identity.

Voting in favor of motion was unanimous.

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
